ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- QB KYLER MURRAY'S record at AT&T Stadium dating back to his sophomore year at Allen (TX) High School, including 8-0 as a starter. In his two wins at AT&T Stadium with the Cardinals, Murray completed 35-of-62 pass attempts for 451yards, 4 TD, 0 INTs and a 100.9 passer ratng. He also rushed for 118 yards and a TD on 19 carries.
 - Games for the Cardinals this season that have been decided by seven points or fewer. Arizona is the only team in the NFL to have every game decided by seven points or fewer in 2025.
- Receiving yards on seven receptions (20.9 avg.) for **WR ZAY JONES** in the last two games. He has more receiving yards in his last two outings (146) than he had in his first 15 games played for the Cardinals (121). Jones has receptions of 21, 24, 24 and 43 yards in the last two games.
 - Primetime matchups between the Cardinals and Cowboys to date. Arizona holds a 7-6 advantage in the primetime series and has won four of the last five games.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would improve to 8-1 in their last nine games vs. the Cowboys.
- Arizona would improve to 4-0 all-time at AT&T Stadium, which opened in 2009.
 The Cards (3-0) and Packers (3-0-1) are the only teams to play at least three games vs. Dallas at AT&T Stadium and remain undefeated.
- The Cardinals would improve to 5-1 in their last six primetime games against Dallas.
- Head coach Jonathan Gannon would improve to 2-0 on Monday Night Football (17-15 win vs. LAC in Week 7 of 2024).

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

LB JOSH SWEAT

 With 1.0 sack, Sweat would have 6.0 sacks in 2025. In franchise history, only Curtis Greer (7.0 in 1982) would have more sacks through the first eight games of his first season with the Cardinals.

TE TREY McBRIDE

- With 5+ receptions, McBride would have at least five catches in 10 consecutive games, continuing the longest streak of his career. His 10-game streak would be the fourth-longest streak in NFL history by a tight end.
- With 1 TD reception, McBride would have a TD catch in three consecutive games for the first time in his career. He would become the first Cards TE with at least one TD reception in three straight games since Rob Awalt accomplished the feat in 1987 (Games 7-9)

QB KYLER MURRAY

- With a rushing TD, Murray would tie RBs David Johnson and John David Crow (33) for fifth place on the franchise all-time list for career rushing TDs.
- With 3 TD passes, Murray would have 16 career outings with 3+ TD passes. That would pass Neil Lomax (15) for the most such outings in franchise history.

WR MARVIN HARRISON JR.

• With a TD reception, Harrison would become one of just five players in franchise history with 11+ TD receptions in his first 25 career games: Sonny Randle (19), Larry Fitzgerald (13), Mal Kutner (12) and Dave Williams (11).

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL

With 1.0 sack, Campbell (114.5) would tie former Cardinals DE J.J. Watt (114.5) for 24th place on the NFL's all-time sacks list.

QB JACOBY BRISSETT

- With 2 passing TDs, Brissett would have multiple TD passes in three straight games for just the third time in his career and for the first time since he did so in four straight (Games 1-4) in 2019 with Indianapolis.
- With a rushing TD, Brissett would have his first rushing TD since a 3-yard run vs. Cincinnati in Week 8 of the 2022 season with Cleveland playing on Monday Night Football.

WR ZAY JONES

 With 50+ receiving yards, Jones would have three consecutive games with at least 50 yards for the second time in his career and for the first time since Weeks 15-17 of 2021 while playing for the Raiders.

LB ZAVEN COLLINS

 With 1.0 sack vs. Dallas, Collins would have back-to-back games with at least 1.0 sack for the first time in his career.

S BUDDA BAKER

 Baker is set to start his 120th game of his career and will become the seventh defensive player and 12th Cardinals player to accomplish the feat in his first nine seasons. He will join former CB Patrick Peterson as the only two defensive backs among the group.

MONDAY NIGHT McBRIDE

In Week 7 vs. Green Bay, **TE TREY McBRIDE** caught a season-high 10 passes for 74 yards and two touchdowns. It was his first multitouchdown game of his career and his sixth with 10+ receptions his last two games, McBride hauled in 18 receptions for 146 yards and three TDs. He also has an active streak of nine straight games with 5+ receptions.

Monday Night Football will feature two of the NFL's top tight ends this season as Cowboys TE Jake Ferguson (51 in 8 games) and McBride (47 in 7 games) rank #1 and #2 in the NFL in receptions among TEs in 2025.



WR ZAY JONES returns to Dallas where his father, ROBERT JONES, was a linebacker for four seasons (1992-95) after the Cowboys selected him in the first round (24th overall) of the 1992 NFL Draft. During Robert's four-year run in Dallas, the Cowboys won four straight NFC East titles, appeared in four consecutive conference title games and won three Super Bowls (XXVII, XXVIII, XXX).

CALAIS KEEPS GOING - 250 AND COUNTING

DL CALAIS CAMPBELL will make his 250th career start on Monday against the Cowboys. He currently leads all active players in starts and ranks 16th in NFL history since 1950. Campbell has more seasons played (18) than games missed (15) in his career.

This season, he has recorded 19 tackles, nine QB hits, five tackles for loss and 3.0 sacks. With 1 more QB hit, Campbell would have 10 QB hits in 2025. It would give him double-digit QB hits in 16 of his 18 NFL seasons - including in each of the last 15 seasons (2011-25).
