



ARIZONA CARDINALS NOTE CARDS

- 6** TD catches for TE Zach Ertz in eight career regular season games against the Seahawks, marking the second-most receiving TDs against any team in his career (7 TDs in 14 games vs. NYG).
- 846** Rushing yards for the Cardinals in 2023. It marks just the second time in the last 35 years (966 in 2020) that the team has rushed for 840+ yards through the first six games of a season. Arizona has rushed for 100+ yards in five-of-six games in 2023. Only two teams have more games this season with 100+ rushing yards (San Francisco and Baltimore - 6 games each).
- 21** Field goals of 55+ yards for K Matt Prater, which is tied for the most in NFL history (Jets K Greg Zuerlein). Prater hit a 55-yard FG on the opening drive last week in Los Angeles. It was the 19th FG of 55+ yards in franchise history - and the seventh that belongs to Prater. No other Cardinal has more than three.
- 30** Yards covered by LB Zaven Collins on an INT of QB Geno Smith in Arizona's last meeting with Seattle. Collins returned the pick for a TD, giving the Cardinals a 14-10 lead in the third quarter and marking the first INT and TD of his career.

WITH A WIN...

- The Cardinals would claim their 10th all-time win at Lumen Field and seventh since 2012, both of which would extend NFL highs for a road team.
- Head coach Jonathan Gannon would have his first career win against an NFC West opponent and first road win with the team.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH...

TE ZACH ERTZ

- With a reception, Ertz would have at least one catch in 123 consecutive games. Only three NFL players have longer active streaks. Ertz has been held without a catch in just three of his 150 career regular season games.
- With a TD catch, Ertz would have four receiving TDs in his five career games at Lumen Field.

WR MICHAEL WILSON

- With a TD reception, Wilson would join John Brown (4) as the only Cardinals rookies in the last 43 seasons to have 3+ TD catches through the first seven games of a season.
- With two TD receptions, Wilson would join Larry Fitzgerald and Anquan Boldin as the only rookies in franchise history to have multiple games with two TD catches.

WR RONDALE MOORE

- With a rushing TD, Moore would become the first Cardinals WR with multiple rushing TDs in a season since WR Bobby Joe Conrad (2) in 1959.
- With 27 rushing yards, Moore (183) would pass Anquan Boldin (209) for the third-most rushing yards by a WR in franchise history (Bobby Joe Conrad - 441, Vai Sikahema - 215).

K MATT PRATER

- With five points, Prater would reach 1,722 points in his career and pass David Akers (1,721) for 17th place on the NFL's all-time list for career points.
- With two field goals, Prater would reach 387 field goals in his career and pass Akers (386) for 15th place on the NFL's all-time list for career field goals.
- With a field goal of 50+ yards, Prater (37 games) would tie K Neil Rackers (16 in 100 games) for the most field goals of 50+ yards in franchise history.

DL KEVIN STRONG JR.

- With a sack, Strong would have one in three straight games after totaling just one sack in the first 40 games of his career.

LB DENNIS GARDECK

- With a sack, Gardeck would establish a franchise record for sacks by a player who entered the league as a rookie free agent. He is currently tied with LB Ronald McKinnon (12.0) for the franchise mark.

WR MARQUISE BROWN

- With a TD reception, Brown would have four TD catches in the last six games. He would have more TD catches in his last six games (4) than he had in his previous 13 games (3).

RB EMARI DEMERCADO

- With a rushing TD, Demercado would become the only undrafted rookie in franchise history with multiple rushing TDs in a season (excluding strike replacement players). Demercado would also become the only undrafted rookie in the NFL with multiple rushing TDs this season.

QB JOSHUA DOBBS

- With 250 net yards, Dobbs would have 250+ net yards for the third straight game when facing an NFC West opponent (305 at SF and 262 at LAR).

FAIR FIGHT IN THE RUN GAME

Sunday's game will feature one of the NFL's best rushing attacks squaring off with one of the league's top run defenses.

The Cardinals head into Seattle with 846 rushing yards through six games, the fifth most in the NFL this season. The Seahawks have allowed just 79.2 rushing yards per game, the fifth lowest average in the league in 2023.

Arizona's 846 rushing yards have been spread out as the Cards (RB James Conner - 364, QB Joshua Dobbs - 189, WR Rondale Moore - 112, RB Emari Demercado - 59, RB Keaontay Ingram - 55) are one of just three teams to have at least five players with over 50 rushing yards in 2023 (NO and Cle).



CARDS TO PARTICIPATE IN NFL HERITAGE PROGRAM

For the second straight season, the Cardinals are participating in the NFL Heritage Program that allows players from across the league to wear an international flag decal alongside the American flag decal on their helmets in Weeks 7-8 of the 2023 season to celebrate players' and coaching staff's heritage and cultural backgrounds.

There are 18 Cardinals players - representing 14 different countries and territories - participating: **Will Hernandez** (Mexico), **Kyler Murray** (South Korea), **Michael Wilson** (New Zealand, Jamaica), **Leki Fotu** (Tonga), **Hjalte Froholdt** (Denmark), **Emari Demercado** and **Dennis Daley** (Jamaica), **Victor Dimukeje**, **BJ Ojulari** and **Owen Pappoe** (Nigeria), **Jesse Luketa** (Canada, Democratic Republic of Congo), **Zach Pascal** (Grenada), **Marco Wilson** (Puerto Rico, Trinidad and Tobago), **Trystan Colon**, **Bobby Price** and **Elijah Wilkinson** (Puerto Rico), **Keith Ismael** (American Samoa) and **Bernhard Seikovits** (Austria).

Participating Cardinals players began wearing their new international flag decals on their helmets at practice this week and will continue to showcase their respective flag through next week's game vs. the Baltimore Ravens at State Farm Stadium. Players also have the option to represent their backgrounds throughout the remainder of the season.



FLAG FOOTBALL INCLUDED IN 2028 OLYMPIC GAMES

The International Olympic Committee (IOC) voted to include flag football at the 2028 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles. It marks the first time in history that the game of football in any capacity will be a part of the Olympic Games.

An estimated 20 million people in more than 100 countries currently participate in flag football. This year will see 65 national teams participate in the International Federation of American Football (IFAF) Continental Flag Football Competition.

Throughout the Fall, the Arizona Cardinals are celebrating the inaugural season of sanctioned High School Girls Flag Football in the state of Arizona by highlighting a weekly game. Each week, Valley football fans vote to select the Girls Flag Football Game of the Week that representatives from the Cardinals will attend.

Arizona is one of eight states to offer high school girls flag football as a sanctioned sport, while 20 states have adopted the sport as a pilot program. In 2023, 57 Arizona high schools are offering sanctioned girls flag football. The NFL and Cardinals are continuing to emphasize outreach to promote girls flag football and help further grow the game.
