THIS WEEK'S PREVIEW

The Cardinals third road game of the regular season has them flying to Seattle for a divisional showdown with the Seahawks at Lumen Field.

An intimidating venue for many NFL teams over the last decade, the Seahawks home field is a place the Cardinals have had success. Arizona has nine all-time wins at Lumen Field since it opened in 2002, and have a 5-2 record in the last seven visits.

Both teams have 2-3 records and enter this contest looking for their first win within the division. For the Cardinals, Sunday's contest at Seattle begins a six-game stretch that features four matchups vs. NFC West opponents - including three straight in Weeks 9-11. After Arizona travels to Seattle this

week, the Cardinals will host the Seahawks in Week 9 to begin that three-game division run.

The NFL's best road team over the last two seasons (2021-22), the Cardinals are looking for their 11th road win dating back to last season. A win at Seattle would also give Arizona its fourth consecutive regular season road win.

In Week 11 of 2021, the Cardinals took down the Seahawks 23-13 at Lumen Field behind a career performance from backup QB Colt McCoy. Making his third consecutive start in place of the injured Kyler Murray, MCCoy completed 35-of-44 pass attempts (79.5%) for 328 yards, 2 TDs, 0 INTs and a 112.9 passer rating. On the receiving end of both TD passes was TE **Zach Ertz**, who finished the game with eight receptions for 88 yards and the two TDs.

Notably missing from this week's game will be former Seahawks QB Russell Wilson, who started all 20 games vs. the Cardinals in 10 seasons (2012-21) with Seattle. On Sunday, it will have been 3,942 days since the Cardinals last faced a Seahawks QB other than Wilson. That game - against Tarvaris Jackson - came on 1/1/12, in the regular season finale of the 2011 season.

Following Sunday's game, the Cardinals return home for a short week as they host the New Orleans Saints on Thursday Night Football. It is the first primetime game this season for Arizona - and adding to the anticipation is the return of All-Pro WR **DeAndre Hopkins**. The Seahawks hit the road - but stay on the West Coast - as they travel to Los Angeles to take on the Chargers.

THIS WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS

• The Cardinals and Seahawks will face each other twice in the span of four weeks. After squaring off on Sunday, the teams will meet again when Seattle comes to Arizona in Week 9.

One key to the Cardinals success on the road over the last two seasons (2021-22) is the lack of turnovers - and ability to create them. Arizona has just 5 turnovers on the road dating back to last season, while no other team has fewer than 10. The Cardinals turnover margin on the road in that span is +20.

• This week in Seattle, the Cardinals will look for their third consecutive road win to start the '22 campaign. It would also mark their fourth consecutive regular season road win dating back to last year. Should Arizona win on Sun-day, it would mark just the 10th time in franchise history the team had at least four consecutive road wins.

 There are just seven players in the NFL this season with 2.0+ sacks and 3+ passes defensed. Two of them play on the Cardinals defensive line: Zach Al-len (5 PD; 2.0 sacks) and J.J. Watt (3 PD; 2.5 sacks). Allen is the only player in the NFL this season with 5+ passes defensed and 2.0+ sacks. His 5 passes <u>defensed are a career-high (previous was 4 in 202.</u>

• Over the last two games, Allen has 14 tackles, 2.0 sacks, four passes de-fensed, four QB hits and three tackles for loss.

• Two Cardinals players - both newcomers in 2021 - enjoyed great success in their two games vs. Seattle last season. RB James Conner had three TDs (2 rushing, 1 receiving) vs. the Seahawks while TE **Zach Ertz** had 15 receptions for 172 yards and two TDs.

CARDINALS-SEAHAWKS CONNECTIONS

This week, Cardinals All-Pro S Budda Baker returns to his home state of Washington where the Cardinals standout earned countless accolades for his performance in both high school (Bellevue) and college (Univ. of Washington).

Baker's hometown of Bellevue is just 10 miles from Lumen Field.

In three seasons with the Huskies, Baker appeared in 40 games and totaled 200 tackles, 13.5 tackles for loss, 4.0 sacks, five INTs, 24 passes defensed and three forced fumbles. During his junior season in 2016, Baker totaled 70 tackles, 9.5 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks and two INTs.

Cardinals Western Regional Scout Chris Culmer is from West Richland, WA, graduated from Washington State University. He worked for the Seahawks for nine seasons prior to joining the Cardinals, first as a scouting assistant (2000-03) and then as a pro scout (2004-08).

Cardinals OL Kelvin Beachum (2012-15) and Seahawks DT Al Woods (2012-13) played two seasons together with the Steelers.

Seahawks G Damien Lewis (2018-19) and Cardinals DL Rashard Lawrence (2017-19) played together at LSU where they won the CFP National Championship in 2019.

Lumen Field has a well-earned reputation as one of the toughest venues in the NFL for visiting teams.

Over the last 11 seasons (2012-22), Seattle has the third-best home winning percentage in the NFL (.720).

Arizona is one of the few visiting teams that has had success at Lumen during the stretch, with an NFL-high six road wins at the venue since '12.

Those six wins have come with four different starting QBs:

Since Lumen Field opened in 2002, the Cardinals have more wins at the venue (9) than any visiting team.

ARIZONA VS. SEATTLE - QUICK FACTS

FACING A WILSON-LESS SEAHAWKS TEAM FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 2011 For the first time since 2011, the Cardinals will face a Seahawks team that fea-tures a starting QB other than Russell Wilson. The current Broncos signal-caller

made his first career start against Arizona (9/9/12) and started all 20 games vs. the Cardinals during his 10 seasons with Seattle.

During the Cardinals 103 seasons (1920-2022) in the NFL, no QB has started more games vs. the team than Wilson. He joins Cowboys Hall of Famer Troy Aikman (20) for the most career starts vs. Arizona (Cardinals are scheduled to face Wilson for the 21st time when the team travels to Denver in Week 15).

KYLER AND COLT BOTH WINNERS IN SEATTLE The two QBs on the Cardinals roster - Kyler Murray (1) and Colt McCoy (2) - have more combined career wins at Lumen Field (3) than the two QBs on the Seahawks roster: Geno Smith (2) and Drew Lock (0).

MCOY LEADS CARDINALS OVER SEAHAWKS IN LAST TRIP TO LUMEN

QB Colt McCoy had one of the best games of his career in leading the Cardinals to a 23-13 victory at Seattle in Week 11 last season.

McCoy completed 35-of-44 pass attempts (79.5%) for 328 yards, 2 TDs, 0 INTs and a 112.9 passer rating against the Seahawks. His 79.5 completion percent-age is the highest in team history by a player with 40+ pass attempts and ranks as the 10th-best single-game total in team history overall.

ERTZ EXCELS AGAINST SEATTLE

In six career games against the Seahawks, <u>TE Zach Ertz has totaled 37 receptions</u> for 361 yards and five TDs. The only team he has more TD catches against during the regular season is the Giants (7 in 13 games).

In two games vs. Seattle last season Ertz had 15 receptions for 172 yards and two TDs. In Week 11 at Lumen Field, he had 8 catches for 88 yards and a pair of TDs.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN WEEK 6

WITH A WIN THIS WEEK...

• The Cardinals would earn their 10th all-time win at Lumen Field. That would double the total of any other visiting team in the NFL since the venue opened in 2002 (49ers and Rams each have 5 wins there).

Arizona would improve to 6-2 at Seattle dating back to 2015.

• The Cardinals would tie the all-time series vs. the Seahawks at 23-23-1.

MILESTONES WITHIN REACH

TE Zach Ertz With 1 reception, Ertz would have at least one catch in 112 consecutive games. That would extend the fourth-longest active streak in the NFL.

• With 1 TD reception, Ertz would have six TD receptions in seven career games against the Seahawks. He would have three TD catches in three games vs. Seattle since joining the Cardinals in 2021.

QB Kyler Murray

 With 2 TDs (passing or rushing), Murray would have 100 career TDs. Only nine players in NFL history would have reached the mark in fewer games than Murray (52).

• With a passer rating of 120.0+, Murray would have 10 such performances in his career. That would tie Neil Lomax (10 times in 108 games) for the most games with a passer rating of 120.0+ in franchise history.

WR Marquise Brown

•With 9 receptions, Brown would tie the franchise record for receptions through the first six games of a season. The record is currently shared by De-Andre Hopkins (47 in 2020) and J.T. Smith (47 in 1989).

• With 1 TD reception, Brown would have a TD catch in three consecutive games in a single season for just the second time in his career: Games 11-13 in 2020.

DL J.J. Watt

• With 1.0 sack, Watt would have 4.5 sacks in his last seven regular season games played.

 With 1.0 sack, Seahawks QB Geno Smith would become the 44th different QB Watt has sacked in his career.

With 2.0 sacks, Watt would have 5.5 sacks in his last seven regular season games. **DL Zach Allen**

• With 1.0 sack, Allen would have at least 1.0 sacks in three consecutive games for the first time in his career.

• With 1.0 sack, Allen would have 3.0 sacks in 2022. That would leave him just 1.0 sack shy of tying his career high for a single season (4.0 in 2021).

CARDS CONTINUE ROAD SUCCESS

After leading the NFL with a franchise single-season record eight road wins in 2021, Arizona has started the 2022 season going 2-0 on the road. This week in Seattle the Cardinals will look for their third consecutive road win to start the '22

campaign - and their fourth consecu-tive regular season road win dating back to last year.

The Cardinals Week 4 win at Carolina gave Arizona an NFL-best 10-1 road record dating back to 2021.

WIN IN VEGAS WAS A WILD ONE

Arizona's Week 2 win at Las Vegas resulted in one of the biggest comeback wins in franchise history.

The Cardinals trailed 20-0 at halftime and came from behind to earn the OT victory. It marked just the fifth time in franchise histo-ry - and first time since 1999 - Arizona overcame a deficit of 20+ points to win a game.

The Cards 20-point comeback is the largest lead surrendered in Raiders history.

Prior to the victory over the Raiders in Week 2, the Cardinals had never won <u>a game when trailing by 20+ points at halftime. **Including postseason, Ari**-</u> zona was 0-88-1 in games they faced a halftime deficit of at least 20 points.

Arizona became the first team in NFL history to score a TD on the last play of regulation, execute a two-point conversion to force OT, then go on to win in OT.

KYLER DIRECTS THE COMEBACK

<u>QB Kyler Murray put on a historic perfor-</u> mance the Cardinals comeback over the Raiders. In the second half/OT, he com-pleted 25-of-40 pass attempts for 224 yards and a TD, while also rushing for 28 yards and a TD on five carries. He also ran for an unforgettable two-point conversion and threw for another.



He became the first player in NFL history to have a passing TD, rushing TD, a two-point conversion pass and a two-point conversion run in the same game.

On his remarkable two-point conversion run that lasted nearly 21 seconds, he ran a total distance of 84.9 yards according to NFL Next Gen Stats.

In the second half/OT, Murray accounted for 16 of the Cardinals 20 first downs. He threw for 11 first downs and all five of his rushing attempts resulted in first downs.

MURPHY WINS IT WITH A LONG RETURN

The score that won it in OT for the Cardinals in Las Vegas was a 59-yard fumble return TD by CB **Byron Murphy, Jr**. On a 2nd-n-10 play from the AZ 39-yard line, Raiders WR Hunter Renfrow caught a one-yard pass when LB Isaiah Simmons laid a hard hit that forced the ball loose. Murphy picked up the fumble and returned it for the game-winning TD.

Murphy's 59-yard return is the longest OT fumble return TD in NFL history (regular season or postseason) - and just the second-ever of 50+ yards.



In May it was announced that the second half of the Cardi-nals upcoming 2022 season will be featured on television's most acclaimed sports reality franchise Hard Knocks, which last year expanded its pro-gramming platform with the introduction of a multi-episode, in-season edition.

HBO Sports and NFL Films will



team up to bring fans Hard Knocks In Season: The Arizona Cardinals this fall for an all-access primetime docuseries on the franchise.

The first epsiode will premiere on Wednesday, November 9. Additional episodes will premiere each Wednesday through the end of the Cardinals season.

The 18-time Emmy-winning weekly series will deliver its signature all access coverage to document an NFL franchise in-season and in real time, following the Cardinals as the team navigates the challenges of an NFL season and battles to return to the post-season. The series will be available on HBO and to stream on HBO Max during the 2022 NFL season beginning in November.

Hard Knocks In Season debuted last fall with the engaging and eventful drama of the Indianapolis Colts' 2021 regular season journey.

"Last season Hard Knocks made an unprecedented leap, documenting an NFL regular season in real time for the first time ever with the Indianapolis Colts," said Keith Cossrow, NFL Films Vice President and Senior Coordinating Producer. "This season, we are eager to build on that success and go even further with one of the most exciting teams in the NFL."

This will mark the Cardinals first appearance as part of the Hard Knocks franchise, which originally launched in 2001.

A REMATCH IN MEXICO CITY

On November 21, the Cardinals will take on the San Francisco 49ers at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on ESPN's Monday Night Football.

The Week 11 contest will serve as a rematch of the 2005 Cardinals-49ers game at Estadio Azteca which was the NFL's first regular season game held outside the United States.

The Cards earned a 31-14 win over the 49ers in that game in front of a then-record crowd of 103,467.

The Cardinals have a long history with international games and have participated in many global "firsts' for the league:

The franchise played in the first NFL regular season game held outside the United States when they defeated the San Francisco 49ers 31-14 at Estadio Azteca in Mexico City on October 2, 2005.

• The team also played the first NFL game outside of North America on August 16, 1976 against the San Diego Chargers in Tokyo's Korakuen Stadium. The Cardinals won, 20-10.

 The first American football contest played on British soil was a tilt between the Cardinals and Minnesota Vikings in London's Wembley Stadium on August 6, 1983.

CARDS EXTEND THEIR OWN IN 2022

The Cardinals gave out a number of high-profile contract extensions this offseason - beginning with head coach Kliff Kingsbury and GM Steve Keim in March, QB Kyler Murray in July, OL D.J. Humphries in August and S Jalen Thompson in Sentember S Jalen Thompson in September.

Murray (2019) and Humphries (2015) are former first-round draft picks by Arizona. The Cardinals se-lected Thompson in the 2019 Sup-

plemental Draft. Keim has spent his entire professional career with the Cardinals and Kingsbury was made an NFL head coach for the first time when he was hired by the team in 2019.

CARDINALS SIGNING CONTRACT EXTENSIONS IN 2022 <u>S Jalen Thompson</u>: On September 2nd, the Car-dinals signed Thompson to a contract extension that keeps him in Arizona through the 2025 season.

Thompson set career highs last season in tackles (120), solo tackles (78), INTs (3), passes de-fensed (7) and tackles for loss (3). His 120 solo tackles led the team and were the second-most among all NFL defensive backs in 2021.

In his first three seasons with Arizona, the 24year old Thompson appeared in 37 games (25 starts) and had 197 tackles, four interceptions, 11 passes defensed and three tackles for loss.

<u>OL D.J. Humphries:</u> On August 2nd, the Cardinals signed Humphries to a threeyear contract extension. It was the second contract extension Humphries signed with the Cardinals after previously agreeing to a three-year deal in 2020.

A captain each of the last two seasons, the 8th-year pro was selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2021 after starting all 16 games he appeared in at LT. He became the first Cards offensive tackle selected to the Pro Bowl since Lomas Brown in 1996.

<u>OB Kyler Murray:</u> On July 21st the Cardinals announced they had signed their signal-caller to the largest extension in franchise history.

The 25-year old Murray earned NFL Rookie of the Year honors (2019), is a two-time team captain and was named to the Pro Bowl twice (2020-21) in his first three seasons.

He became the first QB in franchise history to be named to the Pro Bowl twice in his first three seasons and joined Patrick Mahomes, Aaron Rodgers and Russell Wilson as the only NFL QBs named to the Pro Bowl in each of the last two seasons (2020-21).

<u>GM Steve Keim & Head Coach Kliff Kingsbury</u>: On March 2nd, the Cardinals signed both Keim and Kingsbury to contract extensions.

Now in his 24th season with Arizona and 10th as the team's GM, Keim has now signed three extensions since being promoted to his current post: February of 2015, February of 2018 and March of 2022.





ELEVATING A FRANCHISE

The 2022 season marks the 16th with owner **Michael Bidwill** steering the organization. His leadership during that time has been instrumental in transforming the franchise both on and off the field.

Highlights of Bidwill's tenure: • Michael continues a tradition of Bidwill ownership of the Cardinals that dates back to his grandfather, Hall of Famer Charles Bidwill, who purchased the team in 1933.

• Of the franchise's seven all-time postseason wins, five have come during Michael's tenure leading the organization. Arizona has played in 10 postseason contests over the last 15 seasons, after having appeared in just seven total playoff games prior.

• Arizona has appeared in the NFC Championship Game twice since 2008 including a victory in the 2008 conference title game that led to the franchise's first-ever Super Bowl appearance (Super Bowl XLIII).

 With an 11-6 record in 2021, the Cardinals reached 11+ wins in a season for the sixth time in franchise history. Three of those six 11-win campaigns came with Michael leading the team: 13 in 2015, 11 in 2014, 11 in 2021.

• Among Bidwill's most substantial accomplishments with the Cardinals is the creation of State Farm Stadium. The world-class venue has proved a critical turning point for the franchise, an economic engine for the state of Arizona, and a crucial resource in the battle against the COVID-19 pandemic.

• At the conclusion of the 2022 season, State Farm Stadium will host Super Bowl LVII – the third Super Bowl held at the venue since it opened in 2006. State Farm Stadium also hosted Super Bowls XLII (following 2007 season) and XLIX (following 2014 season).

• In addition to his role in helping Arizona land three Super Bowls, Michael was also instrumental in getting the 2015 Pro Bowl moved to State Farm Stadium; played a week before Super Bowl XLIX, the two events combined to deliver a record economic impact of \$720 million to the region.

• Since State Farm Stadium opened in 2006, the Cardinals have sold out 157 games at the venue (which is every non-pandemic game played there).

• During the 2022 season, the Cardinals will make their first-ever appearance on Hard Knocks, television's most acclaimed sports reality franchise. Arizona will be the second team to be featured on Hard Knocks In Season, which will document the second half of the Cardinals season in real time.

• In January of 2016, the National Football Foundation (NFF) and College Hall of Fame inducted Bidwill and Governor Doug Ducey into the NFF Leadership Hall of Fame.

REMEMBERING VIOLET BIDWILL

The 2022 season marks the 75th anniversary of the Cardinals historic 1947 season. It was a year in which Violet Bidwill made league history and one that ultimately ended in the team winning an NFL Championship over the Philadelphia Eagles.

The Cardinals suffered a big loss when team owner **Charles W. Bidwill** - having just recently assembled his "Dream Backfield" with the unprecedented signing of All-American running back Charley Trippi - passed away in April. He had run the franchise since purchasing it in 1933 and was credited with pulling the team - and on a larger scale the NFL - through the Great Depression.

THE NFL'S FIRST FEMALE OWNER

With the passing of Charles, his wife, Violet Bidwill - while raising the couple's two teen-age sons Stormy (18) and William (16) - took



over as team owner. It was a historic moment, as she became the first female owner in NFL history and one of the first females to serve as a primary owner in professional sports.

"She was a wonderful person and was in a tough situation with losing her hus-band at a young age," Violet's grandson, current Cardinals owner **Michael Bid-will**, said. "She decided she would take over the family businesses."

"Things worked out well," then-team president Ray Benningsen said of the front office under Violet. "I ran the business end of it, (head coach) Jimmy (Conzelman) ran the team on the field and we both appreciated Vi's (Violet) counsel. I'll tell you one thing. She knew her football and she was a shrewd businesswoman.

"She didn't suffer fools, and she was right there in the meetings with the rest of the owners and held her own," said Michael Bidwill.

Violet Bidwill's first year of ownership saw the franchise win the NFL Champion-ship after defeating the Philadelphia Eagles 28-21 in the Championship Game.

KEIM HAS BUILT SOME OF THE BEST

After 14 seasons working within the Cardinals personnel department, Steve Keim was elevated to GM on January 8, 2013.

AMONG THE NFL'S BEST IN 2021

In 2021, the Cardinals posted an 11-6 record and secured their first playoff berth since 2015.

In addition to winning 11 games during the regular season, the Cardinals also ranked in the top 10 in both offensive points scored and defensive points allowed per game.

- CARDINALS HIGHLIGHTS IN KEIM'S TENURE

• The 2021 season marked the fourth time in his tenure the Cardinals have won 10+ games. That includes the 2015 season when Arizona won a franchise record 13 games and earned its first-ever postseason bye.

During Keim's tenure, Arizona has established franchise records for wins in a season (13 in 2015), points in a season (489 in 2015), led the NFL in total offense for the first time in team history (#1 in 2015) and led the NFL in sacks for the second time ever (48.0 in 2016).

• Arizona has featured a top-10 defense four times and a top-10 offense four times dating back to Keim's first season as GM. The Cardinals had a top-10 defense in three consecutive seasons (2015-17) for the first time since the 1970 merger. In 2021, Arizona ranked 10th in the NFL in offensive points scored (435) and eighth in defensive points allowed (349).

• Selected QB Kyler Murray with the #1 overall pick in the 2019 NFL Draft. Murray was named the 2019 NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year and followed up with Pro Bowl selections in each of the last two years (2020-21), becoming the first QB in team history to earn multiple Pro Bowls in his first three seasons.

 The 2021 free agency period was one of Keim's busiest as GM. The players the Cardinals acquired have a combined 20 Pro Bowl selections and 11 All-Pro nods. Arizona brought in five different Pro Bowlers in the offseason: DL J.J. Watt, WR A.J. Green, OL Rodney Hudson, K Matt Prater and RB James Conner. Conner was selected to the Pro Bowl in 2021.

• Named Sporting News 2014 NFL Executive of the Year and earned backto-back NFL Executive of the Year honors from Pro Football Talk (2013-14).

State Farm Stadium gives us a chance to engage current and potential fans on a year-round basis in a fun, entertaining and responsible way.

Located on The Great Lawn, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium operates on both event and non-event days, offering guests a massive 265-square-foot video wall, 38 TVs and indoor-and-outdoor dining options.

Throughout the year, the BetMGM Sportsbook at State Farm Stadium also will serve as an outdoor music and comedy concert amphitheater, hosting events for audiences gathered on The Great Lawn.

SUPER BOWL RETURNS TO AZ

Valley Will Host 4th Super Bowl in February

The final game of the 2022 NFL season will take place in Arizona when State Farm Stadium plays host to Super Bowl LVII on Sunday, February 12, 2023.

It will be the fourth Super Bowl played in the state of Arizona and the third time the nation's most popular sporting event will be played at State Farm Stadium. The Cardinals home venue last staged the mega event when it hosted Super Bowl XLIX following the 2014 season.

Arizona joins South Florida, New Orleans, Los Angeles and Tampa Bay as the only sites selected to host the Super Bowl at least four times.

ECONOMIC IMPACT: The last time the game was staged in Arizona, it produced a record economic impact for the state. A 2015 study by the Seidman Research Institute, W.P. Carey School of Business at Arizona State University determined that Super Bowl XLIX, the 2015 Pro Bowl and related events produced a gross economic impact of \$719.4 million for the region. That was the largest economic impact of any special event ever held in Arizona. In addition to the games played in Glendale, more than 1 million people visited Verizon Super Bowl Central in downtown Phoenix and more than 500,000 people enjoyed events in downtown Scottsdale.


In a span of just over 26 months in 2015-17, State Farm Stadium hosted a Pro Bowl, Super Bowl, College Football National Championship Game and the NCAA Men's Final Four.

It was an unprecedented stretch for a stadium that generated \$1.3 billion in economic impact for the state during that 26-month span.

"MR. B" ENTERS RING OF HONOR

In a halftime ceremony during the season-opener vs. the Chiefs, the Cardinals in-ducted former owner **Bill Bidwill** into the team's Ring of Honor.

Bidwill, who passed away in October of 2019 at the age of 88, had a life-long association with the Cardinals which spanned eight decades. After his father, Hall of Fame owner Charles W. Bidwill, Sr. purchased the team, Bill worked as a ball boy when he was a child. Upon graduating from Georgetown University and serving proudly in the United States Navy, Bidwill took on a full-time role with the Cardinals in 1960



nature and a preference for staying out of the spotlight, "Mr. B" was recognized often for his contributions and ac-complishments as Cardinals owner. In 2017, he was enshrined in the Arizona Sports Hall of Fame which honors those who have made significant contribu-tions to the state's athletics community. In 2010, Bidwill was inducted into the Sports Faith Hall of Fame in Lake Forest, IL. At its December 2010 commence-ment exercises, Northern Arizona University awarded Bidwill an honorary doctor of humane letters degree for "his contributions to the university, his community and his profession."

During his time as owner, Bidwill was also at the forefront of diversity in employment practices, which was evidenced by the hiring of the NFL's first Afri-can American female executive (Adele Harris), first African American contract negotiator (Bob Wallace) and first African American head coach/GM tandem (Dennis Green and Rod Graves). In 2015, the team established the Bill Bidwill Coaching Fellowship to increase diversity and provide opportunities to gain NFL coaching experience. At the 2010 annual NFL Combine in Indianapolis, Bidwill was honored with the Paul "Tank" Younger Award from the Fritz Pol-lard Alliance, whose purpose is to promote diversity and equality of job op-portunity in the NFL.

Bidwill became the 19th individual inducted into the Cardinals Ring of Honor. Created in 2006 to coincide with the opening of State Farm Stadium, the Ring of Honor also includes Charles W. Bidwill, Sr. (Owner), Jimmy Conzelman (Coach), T Dan Dierdorf, HB John "Paddy" Driscoll, HB/DB Marshall Gold-berg, WR Roy Green, QB Jim Hart, CB Dick "Night Train" Lane, HB Ollie Mat-son, HB Ernie Nevers, QB Carson Palmer, S Pat Tillman, HB Charley Trippi, QB Kurt Warner, CB Roger Wehrli, CB Aeneas Williams, S Adrian Wilson and S Larry Wilson

Murphy was one of just 11 players in the NFL with 12+ passes defensed and 4+ INTs in 2021.



ANOTHER GOLDEN SEASON



Following a standout season in 2021, third-year LB Isaiah Simmons - the Cardinals first round (8th overall) pick in the 2020 NFL Draft - is expected to make another big leap this season.

A rare athlete for his position, Simmons is one of the fastest players on the team - having run a 4.39 40yard dash at the 2020 NFL Combine.

He will continue to be used all over the field in 2022. seeing action at LB, nickel and safety according to de-fensive coordinator Vance Joseph.

"He's a big man who can tackle, run and chase, he can blitz, he could play that edge," Jospeh said at the start of training camp. "But also he's covered guys in the slot like CeeDee Lamb and those guys and he likes it. That's different from most linebackers.

In 2021 Simmons proved to be the versatile defen-

sive weapon the Cardinals hoped he would be. <u>He finished the regular season</u> with 103 tackles, 7 passes defensed, an INT, 4 forced fumbles, 4 tackles for loss, 4 QB hits and 1.5 sacks.

Simmons become the first Cardinals defender since Tim McDonald in 1988 to have 100+ tackles and 4+ forced fumbles in a season.

He also joined Colts All-Pro LB Darius Leonard as the only players in the NFL last season with 100+ tackles, 4+ forced fumbles and 7+ passes defensed.

ALLEN BECOMES A PLAYMAKER ON "D"

Like LB Isaiah Simmons - DL Zach Allen is a young defender who had a breakout season for the Cardinals in 2021. Selected in the third round (65th overall) of the 2019 NFL Draft, Allen emerged as a playmaker last season.

In 15 games (14 starts) last season, Allen established ca-reer highs in tackles (48), sacks (4.0), tackles for loss (5), OB hits (14), passes defensed (4), fumble recoveries (3) and also recorded his first career INT. He scored his first career TD with a 16-yard fumble return in the regular season finale vs. the Seahawks.



Allen had twice as many sacks in 2021 (4.0) as he had in his first two years com-bined (2.0) while also more than doubling his previous career high for QB hits (from 6 in 2020 to 13 in 2021). Allen's three fumble recoveries were tied for the NFL lead among all defenders in 2021, and he was the only defensive lineman in the NFL with three fumble recoveries.

The Cardinals opened the 2022 regular season against the Kansas City Chiefs at State Farm Stadium. The contest reunited AZ head coach Kliff Kingsbury with KC quarterback Patrick Mahomes, whom he recruited to Texas Tech and coached for three seasons there. On this particular afternoon, it was the pupil who led his team to victory with an impressive passing effort. The 2018 league MVP threw for 360 yards and 5 touchdowns with no INTs in steering the Chiefs to a 44-21 win. Kansas City jumped out early with TDs on their first three drives and never looked back. Playing without several regular starters – including DE JJ Watt, WR DeAndre Hopkins, G Justin Pugh – the Cards battled and late in the first half had opportunities to make it a one score game but could not take advantage of them. The victory gave the Chiefs their eight consecutive season with a week 1 win while the Cardinals fell in the regular season opener for the first time in four seasons under Kingsbury and QB Kyler Murray.

Kansas City received the opening kickoff and proceeded to move 75 yards in 11 plays as Mahomes capped the drive with a 9-yard TD pass to TE Travis Kelce. The next Chiefs drive was equally effective, covering 86 yards in 7 plays. It ended on a Mahomes shovel pass to RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire for a 3-yard score that made it 14-0 late in the opening quarter. The Cards desperately needed a scoring drive and Murray delivered. He completed 4 of 5 pass attempts on the ensuing series, the biggest of which was a 24-yarder to WR Greg Dortch that moved it to the KC35. Shortly thereafter, Kyler scampered 21 yards up the middle to the 2, setting up James Conner's TD run that cut the lead in half at 14-7 two minutes into the second quarter. The next drive saw the Chiefs move 71 yards in 10 plays before facing a 4th-n-2 at the 4; KC went for it and Edwards-Helaire's 4-yard completion from Mahomes made it 20-7 after the PAT failed. With 1:05 to go in the half, the Chiefs continued to lead by 13 and took over at their own 20. On the first play from scrimmage, Mahomes connected with WR Juju Smith-Schuster before LB Dennis Gardeck forced a fumble that CB Byron Murphy recovered at the KC43 with :58 left. AZ soon faced a 4th-n-2 at the 43 with turned it over on downs when Murray's pass attempt was incomplete. The Chiefs quickly moved into position for a 54-yard FG try from Harrison Butker, who returned to action after exiting the game via cart in the first quarter. The kick was good and Kansas City took a 23-7 lead into the halftime locker room.

Kansas City's opening possession of the second half also resulted in a TD, this one a 1-yard pass from Mahomes to TE Jody Fortson. The Chiefs increased their lead to 37-7 late in the third on Mahomes' fifth TD pass of the day, this one a 2-yarder to WR Mecole Hardman. Early in the fourth, Murray's 2-yard TD pass to new Cardinals WR – and Murray's former Oklahoma teammate – Marquise Brown was followed by a successful two-point toss to TE Zach Ertz that made it 37-15. After a TD run by Chiefs RB Isiah Pacheco capped the next KC possession, Ertz's 6-yard TD catch from Murray provided the game's final score with 5:11 remaining.

The Cardinals made their first-ever appearance at Allegiant Field for a week 2 showdown with the Raiders and it was one for the ages. Vegas jumped out to a 20-0 halftime lead and led 23-7 after 3 quarters. But the gritty Cardinals battled back. And QB Kyler Murray engineered one of the greatest and most improbable comebacks in franchise history. Arizona would score the game's final 22 points, send the contest to overtime with a TD and 2-point conversion as regulation expired, and win it in the extra period with the longest OT return of a fumble in NFL history. It was the franchise's biggest comeback since 1999 and 5th largest ever; it was also the greatest comeback ever against the Raiders.

While the game ended in thrilling fashion for Arizona, its beginning was inauspicious. The Raiders took the opening kickoff, moved 75 yards in 15 plays and Derek Carr's 1-yard TD pass to WR Davante Adams made it 7-0. The next Vegas drive reached the AZ12 in 8 plays before Daniel Carlson's 32-yard FG made it 10-0. The Raiders increased it to 17-0 on their next possession when Carr capped a 7-play, 59-yard drive with his 3-yard scoring pass to TE Darren Waller. With just over 2 minutes to go in the first half, the Cards faced a 3rd-n-2 at the LV42 when Murray's pass attempt to Hollywood Brown was intercepted by CB Amik Robertson. The return set Vegas up it its own 27 with 1:51 to go. That was enough time to move into position for a 55-yard Carlson FG as the half expired that made it 20-0 at intermission. In their history, the Cardinals were 0-88-1 in games they trailed by 20+ points at halftime.

The AZ comeback began on its 2nd offensive series of the 3rd quarter. Murray completed 5 of 7 passes for 66 yards and ended the 79-yard drive with a scoring pass to WR Greg Dortch, a 5-yarder that was his first NFL TD catch. A 47-yard pass interference penalty on the ensuing Vegas possession led to a 25-yard Carlson FG that made it 23-7 late in the 3rd quarter. Two minutes into the 4th, the Cards trailed by 16 but were at the LV11 when they went for it on 4th-n-1. It ended there, though, as Murray's pass was just beyond the reach of TE Zach Ertz. However, 3 straight incompletions led to a punt and more 4th and down 16. They went for it and converted when Brown made a spectacular 1-handed grab at the 1. A play later. RB Darrel Williams punched it in and the Cards went for 2. What happened on that try was unforgettable and vintage Murray; the 08 kept the pass play alive for 20 seconds, snaking around in the backfield for almost 85 total yards before finally outracing the defense to the pylon for a successful conversion. After another Vegas punt, the Cards tothe vegas the 4th-n-1 at the 6 when a defensive holding foul kept the drive going. It set up a 11s-n-goal at the 3 but after 3 incompletions it was 4th-n-4 at the 6 when a defensive holding foul kept the drive going. It set up a 15-n-goal at the 3 but after 3 incompletions it was 4th-n-4 at the Game to 0T and a delay penalty pushed the try back to the 7. It didn't matter. Murray fired a dart to WR AJ Green in the back of the end zone and the game was tied.

AZ won the OT coin toss and advanced to the LV37. They went for it on 4th-n-1 from there but Brown could not hold onto a Murray pass down the left side and the Raiders took over. On the edge of FG range, they faced 2nd-n-10 at the AZ39 when Carr hit WR Hunter Renfrow with a short pass but LB Isaiah Simmons dislodged the ball with a devastating hit. CB Byron Murphy scooped the loose ball and returned it 59 yards down the sideline to clinch the amazing comeback victory.

In a match-up of 1-1 teams, the defending Super Bowl champion Rams came to State Farm Stadium and jumped out to an early 13-0 lead, thanks to a pair of field goals and a TD. The Cardinals would respond with the game's next three scores. They were lengthy drives of 19, 17 and 16 plays that produced FGs rather than TDs but it still got AZ to within 4 points late in the third quarter. However, LA's second TD of the day made it 20-9 and the Cards would only be able to close to within 8 before running out of time. QB Kyler Murray set career highs in completions (37) and attempts (58) and his favorite target was Marquise Brown. The WR racked up 140 yards on a career-best 14 receptions, a total that tied the 2nd most in franchise history.

The Rams forced a punt on the Cardinals' game opening drive and LA's Michael Hoecht got a hand on it to set the visitors up at the AZ35. Arizona's defense rose to the challenge and limited the Rams to a 22yard Matt Gay FG that made it 3-0. Following a 3-n-out from the AZ offense, the Rams took over their own 42. Six plays later they had it at the AZ20 when WR Cooper Kupp went in motion, took a handoff from QB Matthew Stafford and raced around the left end for 20 yards and a TD that made it 10-0. Gay's 40-yard FG capped LA's next drive and put the Rams up 13-0 early in the 2And quarter. With 11:21 left in the Alf, AZ took over at its own 30 and down 13-0. The Cards would move 65 yards in 19 plays, converting a pair of 4th downs on a much-needed drive. It would reach the 5 but no further and Matt Prater's 23yard FG made it 13-3 with 1:51 before halftime. After forcing another 3-n-out by the LA offense, the Cards took over at their own 28 with :48 left in the first half. Murray moved them 47 yards, the biggest chunk of which came on a 30-yard completion to WR Greg Dortch on the last play before Prater's 45-yard FG made it 13-65 at intermission.

Arizona opened the 2nd half by forcing a 3-n-out that included a JJ Watt sack of Stafford. The Cards offense then took over at its own 11 and soon faced a 4th-n-1 at the 20; they went for it and RB James Conner converted. The drive would reach the LA31 and Prater's 3rd straight FG – this one from 49 – made it a 4-point game with 5:10 to go in the 3rd quarter. On the ensuing LA possession, the Rams soon faced a 3rd-n-11 from their own 24 when Stafford escaped a sack from LB Zaven Collins and hit Cupp for 11 and the first down. A screen to TE Tyler Highee picked up 26 yards and Cam Akers' 14-yard TD run ended the drive to put LA up 20-9 with 16 minutes to play. With 11:30 remaining, the Cards had reached the LA26 where they went for it on 4th-n-4 but Murray's pass attempt to Brown was batted away. Up 11 with 7 minutes to go, the Rams advanced to AZ1 and poised to put the game away; however, S Budda Baker forced an Akers fumble that Jalen Thompson recovered to keep it a 2-possesion game. Murray would move AZ to the LA13 in 16 plays – the longest of which was 14 yards – and Prater's 31-yard FG with 1:07 pulled the Cards to within 8. They would need an onside kick recovery to keep their hopes alive but the Rams dashed them by successfully corraling the kick.



Carolina Panthers 0 The Cardinals traveled to Carolina for a week 4 match-up of teams desperately trying to even their record at 2-2. Arizona had not won a regular season game there since 2002 and the Panthers had won 6 straight in the series. Through two quarters, it looked like they were on their way to making it 7 and took a 10-3 lead into halftime. But the Cards ran off 23 points in the second half as Kyler Murray threw two Tos and ran for another. The AZ defense, meanwhile, was exceptional throughout; it created three takeaways and generally harassed Panthers QB Baker Mayfield all afternoon while limiting RB Christian McCaffrey to 27 rushing yards on 8 attempts. Leading that effort was DE Zach Allen who had a career-day; he finished with 6 tackles, a sack, three knockdowns, two QB hits and a tackle for loss. All of it added up to a 26-16 win that continued Arizona's success on the road with 10 wins in its last 11 opportunities.

On their first possession of the game, the Panthers were stopped on a 3rd-n-1 Mayfield QB sneak and went for it on 4th-n-inches from their own 39; led by LB Zaven Collins, the Cards D stopped McCaffrey and the offense took over. The Cards reached the Carolina 10 where they faced a 4th-n-1 themselves but WR Rondale Moore was tackled behind the line of scrimmage and the threat was extinguished. The game remained scoreless into the 2nd quarter before the Panthers defense created its first points. On 3rd-n-6 from the AZ31, LB Frankie Luvi intercepted a Murray pass intended for Hollywood Brown and returned it 33 yards for a 10. The next series saw the Cards of for it again on 4th-n-1 - this time from their own 42 – but turned it over on downs when the snap went over Murray's head. That gave it back to the Panthers at the AZ42 with 9:02 to go before halftime but they would soon return it. A fumbled exchange between Mayfield and WR Rashard Higgins was recovered by Arizona LB Ben Niemann at the AZ35. The Cards offense then went 50 yards in 8 plays and pull to within 7-3 on Matt Prater's 33-yard FG with 3:34 left in the 2nd quarter. S Jalen Thompson's INT gave the offense the AZ18 with 1:05 to go in the half. After a 3-n-out, Carolina took over at its own 35 with :21 left and advanced to the AZ36 on 4 completions before Eddy Pineiro's 54-yard FG as the half expired made it 10-3.

Carolina got the ball to start the 2nd half but on its 3rd play from scrimmage, Allen's 9-yard sack of Mayfield forced a punt. The Cards would then tie the game with a 9-play, 89-yard TD drive. Key plays were a 22-yard reception by TE Zach Ertz and a 37-yard defensive pass interference penalty drawn by WR Marquise Brown. Ertz ended it with a TD pass from Murray on 3rd-n-goal from the 2. After again forcing a Panther punt, the Cards embarked on another long drive, this one consuming 9:26 and extending into the 4th quarter. Matt Prater capped it with his 39-yard FG that gave AZ its first lead at 13-10. On the next play from scrimmage, DE J.J. Watt deflected a Mayfield pass into the air where LB Dennis Gardeck caught it and returned his first career INT 24 yards to the Carolina 5. A play later, Murray ran it in around the right side for a 4-yard TD that made it 20-10 with 10:26 left in the game. Carolina's ensuing series ended when Allen knocked down another Mayfield pass, this time on 4th-n-1 at the CAR 31. Two plays later on 3rd-n-3 from the 23, Murray hit Brown with an over-the-shoulder throw and the WR artfully tapped his toes just inside the end zone. The connection put AZ up 26-10 with 7:37 to play and the game's only other score came on a Mayfield-to-McCaffrey TD pass of 13 yards.

In week 5, the NFL's only remaining undefeated team came to State Farm Stadium when the 2-2 Cardinals hosted the 4-0 Philadelphia Eagles. The visitors took an early 14-0 but the Cards battled back to tie it at 17 in the 4th. After Philly went up 3 on a go-ahead FG with 1:45 to play, Arizona had a chance to send the game into 0T but a 43-yard FG try in the closing seconds was wide right. The Cardinals defense was exceptional holding Philadelphia to a season-low 20 points and just 6 in the second half. Marquise Brown led the Cards with 78 receiving yards on 8 catches with a TD.

The Eagles drew first blood with a TD on their opening offensive possession. Completions of 14 & 10 yards to TE Dallas Goedert were followed by two to WR AJ Brown (15 & 11) that kept the 11-play, 64-yard drive going. QB Jalen Hurts capped it with his 1-yard QB keeper and Philly led 7-0. On the next play from scrimmage, Kyler Murray's pass down the deep middle intended for Brown was intercepted by SC J Gardner-Johnson, setting the Eagles up at their own 35. However, they would not capitalize as Arizona's defense sent them 3-n-out. Late in the opening quarter, Philly faced a 3rd-n-12 at its own 11 but Hurts found DeVonta Smith for 22 to the 33. A 20-yard connection between those 2 followed and the 16-play, 87-yard drive ultimately concluded with another 1-yard TD sneak. AZ seemed to seize some momentum on the opening play of the next Philly drive when S Jalen Thompson picked a Hurts pass across the middle but replay overturned it. The Cards still sent the Eagles 3-n-out and following the punt took over at their own 43 for their best field position of the day. A 13-yard James Conner run moved it to the 44 and was followed by a 14-yard Brown catch to the PHI32. On 3rd-n-2 from the 25, Murray found Brown in the middle of the field and the speedy WR slipped a tackle before racing into the end zone. AZ forced another Eagles punt and took over at its own 1 but ran a fake instead; the snap went to the up-back, RB Darrell Williams, who ran for 7 and picked up the first down. The very lengthy drive (16 plays, 91 yards) took 9:38 off the clock and Matt Amendola's 20-yard FG as the half expired trimmed Philly's lead to 14-10. Amendola was signed during the week as a replacement for the team's regular kicker, Matt Prater (hip).

Philly increased its lead to 17-10 on the opening drive of the 3rd quarter when Cameron Dicker's 42-yard FG capped a 10-play, 51-yard drive. After the teams traded punts, AZ took over at its own 10 in the final minute of the 3rd quarter. Injuries to starting RB James Conner as well as back-ups Darrell Williams and Jonathan Ward, left Eno Benjamin as the Cardinals only available RB. Thanks largely to Murray completing all 6 of his pass attempts on the drive (for 58 yards), AZ reached the PHI11 in 11 plays; from there Benjamin ran it in to tie the game with 9:43 to go in the game. Hurts then led the Eagles into AZ territory and with 4:28 left, they faced 3rd-n-12 at the Cards 36; they picked it up thanks to a 16-yard Hurts-to-Goedert completion. The drive would reach the AZ5 and Dicker's 23-yard FG put Philly up 20-17. After the kickoff, the Cards took over at their own 25 with 1:45 to go and no timeouts. A 15-yard Murray run and 4 completions covered 31 yards, taking the Cards to the PHI24 with :36 left. A Murray burst up the middle appeared to gain 10+ yards on 2nd-n-10 and the Cards stopped the clock with a spike with :22 left. However, officials spotted it as just a 9-yard gain and after the spike it was 4th-n-1 at the 25. AZ sent out the FG unit to tie it but Amendola's 43-yard attempt sailed right.
