LOS ANGELES CHARGERS vs. MIAMI DOLPHINS





ARGERS DEFEAT DOLPHINS AT

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Miami Dolphins, 23-17, on Sunday Night Football to improve to 7-6 on the season. WR **Keenan Allen**, and **OLB Khalil Mack** were the game captains for the Chargers. The Bolts won the toss and deferred to the second half.

On offense, Los Angeles totaled 432 net yards, 24 first downs and converted 50 percent of its third-down attempts (nineof-18). QB Justin Herbert completed a career-high 39 passes on 51 attempts (76.5 pct.) for 367 yards and a touchdown with zero interceptions for a 102.3 passer rating. He completed 24 passes for 222 yards in the first half, setting a career high and franchise record for completions in a single opening half.

WR Mike Williams hauled in six catches for 116 yards (19.3 avg.) and a touchdown, giving him 30 receiving scores for his career. Sunday marked his fourth 100-yard game of the season. WR Keenan Allen had a team-high 12 receptions, giving him an NFLrecord 10 career games of 12-plus catches. RB Austin Ekeler registered his sixth game of the season with 100-plus yards from scrimmage. Ekeler posted 104 scrimmage yards (45 rushing, 59 receiving), ran in a touchdown and caught eight passes.

Defensively, Los Angeles forced three three-and-out drives and allowed just three third-down conversions on 11 attempts (27.3 pct.), the best defensive third down percent allowed by the Bolts this season. OLB Kyle Van Noy registered his first sack of the season for a four-yard loss in the second quarter to force Miami's third punt of the night. **DL Morgan Fox** added a 12-yard sack in the third quarter, giving him 3.5 takedowns on the season.

The Bolts held Miami to a three-and-out on the game's opening possession and allowed just three completions in the first half, tying for the fewest completions allowed in a single opening half by any defense this season. Los Angeles allowed just 19 net passing yards in the opening half, the fewest allowed by a Bolts defense in a single first half in the last decade.

HERBERT STACKS MORE

With 367 passing yards on Sunday night, QB Justin Herbert became the only player ever to eclipse 13,000 passing yards through their first three career seasons. He topped that mark in his 45th game, doing so in the second-fewest games played in history.

Per Elias, Sunday night marked Herbert's 10th career game with 300-plus passing yards and zero interceptions, the most ever by a player before turning 25 years old.

In his 50th career start, **RB Austin Ekeler** caught eight passes for 59 yards (7.4 avg.), giving him 375 receptions in his career for the most catches by an undrafted running back in the common draft era (since 1967). His 93 receptions on the year are a single-season career high and also set an NFL record by a running back through the first 13 games of a season.
