LOS ANGELES CHARGERS vs CINCINNATI BENGALS



Sunday, Nov. 17, 2024 | 5:20 p.m. PT | Inglewood, Calif.

CHARGERS OUTSHINE BENGALS, 34-27

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Cincinnati Bengals, 34-27, at SoFi Stadium on Sunday night.

QB Justin Herbert was 17-for-36 passing for 297 yards and two touchdowns with no interceptions for a 94.3 passer rating. The Oregon product added 65 rushing yards on five carries (13.0 avg). Herbert has not thrown an interception in a franchise record 246 passing attempts, besting his previous franchise record of 233 attempts without an interception from Dec. 26, 2022-Oct. 1, 2023.

RB J.K. Dobbins totaled 56 yards and two touchdowns on 11 carries (5.1 avg.) including a game-winning 29-yard scamper to give the Bolts a 34-27 lead with 18 seconds remaining in the game. Sunday marked his second multi-rushing touchdown game of season and the fourth of his career.

WR Ladd McConkey topped 100 yards for the second time in his career, leading the Bolts with a career-high 123 yards on six receptions (20.5 avg.). It was the seventh-most receiving yards in a single game by a Chargers rookie ever and the most by a Bolts rookie in a game since 2013.

TE Will Dissly and **WR Quentin Johnston** each collected a touchdown in prime time. Dissly totaled 80 yards on four receptions (20.0 avg.) while Johnston hauled in a pair of receptions for 48 yards. Johnston became the first Chargers wide receiver to record a touchdown in three consecutive games since 2021.

Defensively, the Bolts held their opponent to under seven points in the first half for the 10th consecutive game. The Chargers defense totaled 14 quarterback hits and 10 passes defended, marking the second game this season (Cleveland, 12) that the Bolts have broken up 10-plus passes in a single game.

LB Daiyan Henley led all players with 11 tackles (five solo) and one pass defended. **S Derwin James Jr.** added 10 tackles (seven solo), half a sack, one quarterback hit and one pass defended. **OLB Tuli Tuipulotu** recorded his third consecutive multi-sack game, recording 1.5 in addition to five tackles (three solo), 2.0 tackles for loss, and four quarterback hits.

LS Josh Harris competed in his 200th career game over a 13-year NFL career.

HERBERT SETS ANOTHER TEAM RECORD

QB Justin Herbert set a team record for the most pass attempts without an interception, throwing 246 passes from Sept. 15, 2024-Present. He broke his previous franchise record of 233 passes without an interception from Dec. 26, 2022-Oct. 1, 2023.

SEVEN OR FEWER

Over the last 10 games, the Chargers defense has held opponents to seven or fewer points in the first half. It is the longest active streak in the NFL and is the longest since 2001, when the Cleveland Browns held opponents to seven or fewer points in 10 consecutive games. The 2024 Bolts and 2001 Browns are the only two teams with nine or more consecutive games limiting opponents to seven points or fewer in the first half of a game during that span.

TULI GETS MULTIPLE SACKS AGAIN

OLB Tuli Tuipulotu finished the game five tackles (two solo), 1.5 sacks, two tackles for loss and four quarterback hits. The performance marked his third consecutive game with multiple sacks. He is the second NFL player this season and fourth Charger to have three-straight games with multiple sacks since sacks became an official statistic in 1982.

Tuipulotu leads the team with 7.0 sacks this season, including a league-leading 6.0 in the month of November.
