BRONCOS HEAD WEST TO TAKE ON DIVISION RIVAL CHARGERS AT SOFI STADIUM



The Denver Broncos (6-6) head west to take on the division rival L.A. Chargers (5-7) on Sunday at 1:25 p.m. PST at SoFi Stadium. Denver is looking for its second consecutive win against the Chargers after defeating the Bolts, 31-28, at Empower Field at Mile High in the 2022 regular-season finale.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR VS. L.A. CHARGERS

OLB NIK BONITTO (3 career multi-sack games)

*- Needs one game with 1.5 sacks to tie DL Shane Dronett (4) for the third-most multi-sack performances by a Bronco in his first two seasons.

OLB JONATHON COOPER (5.5 sacks in 2023)

*- Needs one sack to record the most QB takedowns in a single season by a player taken by the Broncos in the seventh round or later since Maa Tanuvasa (7.0) in 1999.

WR JERRY JEUDY (197 receptions in 51 games)

*- Needs three receptions to become the fourth-fastest Bronco in team history to reach 200 career receptions.

K WIL LUTZ (95 kicking points in 2023)

*- Needs five kicking points to become the 13th kicker in NFL history to record 100 or more kicking points in seven of his first eight seasons (missed 2021 season due to injury).

K WIL LUTZ (25 made fields goals in Weeks 1-13)

*- Needs two field goals to tie kicker Gene Mingo (27, 1962) and kicker Jason Elam (27, 2001) for the most field goals by Broncos kicker in the first 14 weeks of a season.

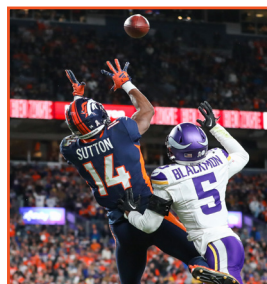

Since being signed by the team as a college free agent in 2022, Broncos cornerback Ja'Quan McMillian has appeared in 12 games (3 starts), including 11 in 2023. This season, McMillian has registered five tackles for loss and posted two games with multiple stops in the backfield.

McMillian is the fifth Broncos defensive back—and first since Pro Football Hall of Fame cornerback Champ Bailey in 2004—to have at least two TFLs in multiple games in the same season.

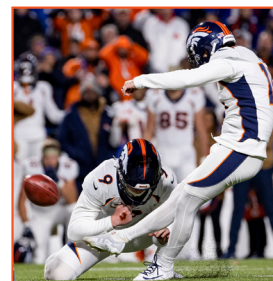
