THE 2026 NFL DRAFT

The Los Angeles Chargers made eight selections in the 2026 NFL Draft, selecting five offensive players — including four offensive linemen — and three on defense.

On Day 1, the Bolts took Miami outside linebacker **Akheem Mesidor** at No. 22 overall, the first time the team drafted in the same slot of the first round in back-to-back years since 2013-14. Mesidor was one of the nation's top pass rushers in 2025 for Miami, earning first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors and *Sporting News* second-team All-American recognition. He was a finalist for the Ted Hendricks Award, which annually recognizes college football's top defensive end after posting 12.5 sacks, 17.5 tackles for loss, four forced fumbles and 63 tackles (38 solo) in 15 starts. Mesidor tallied 24.0 sacks during his Hurricanes career, tied for the fourth-most in program history.

Los Angeles kicked off Day 2 by trading the No. 55 selection to New England for the 63rd overall choice and a sixth-round pick (No. 202). The Bolts then used that No. 63 selection to draft Florida offensive lineman **Jake Slaughter**. He was a second-team All-American from *The Athletic* and *USA Today* in 2025, also earning 2024 *Associated Press* first-team All-America honors. Los Angeles then traded the 86th overall pick to Cleveland for a trio of selections — a fourth-rounder (No. 105), a fifth-round choice (No. 145) and a sixth-round pick (No. 206).

The Bolts wrapped up the draft on Day 3 with six selections, kicking off the day by taking Mississippi State wide receiver **Brenen Thompson** (105th overall), Memphis tackle **Travis Burke** (117th overall) and Arizona safety **Genesis Smith** (131st overall) in the fourth round. The Bolts moved up to No. 117 to select Burke after trading the 123rd and 204th picks to Houston. Thompson utilized his speed at Mississippi State in 2025 to set the single-season program record and led the Southeastern Conference with 1,054 receiving yards, earning *AP* second-team All-SEC honors in the process.

Los Angeles then rounded out the draft by selecting South Carolina defensive lineman **Nick Barrett** (145th overall) in the fifth round along with Boston College guard **Logan Taylor** (202nd overall) and Oregon guard **Alex Harkey** (206th overall) in the sixth round.

WHERE THE BOLTS PICKED

ON THE CLOCK AT NO. 22

The Chargers selected Miami **OLB Akheem Mesidor** with the No. 22 overall pick in the 2025 NFL Draft. It marked the second-straight year picking at No. 22, having drafted RB Omarion Hampton with the 22nd overall pick in the 2025 NFL Draft. The team had previously made three choices at No. 22 overall – 1975, 1983 and 1993.

The Bolts traded into the No. 22 spot to select CB Mike Williams in 1975 and owned the selection in 1983 to select CB Gill Byrd. A pair of compensatory selections in the first round of the 1993 NFL Draft pushed the Chargers down from the 20th pick to No. 22, selecting CB Darrien Gordon.

No player selected with the No. 22 overall pick in the common draft era has been inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame. 12 of the 60 players selected with the 22nd pick since 1967 have made a Pro Bowl, while five were named an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro.

Among the players picked at No. 22 overall over the past 10 drafts, three have gone on to make a Pro Bowl and two have been AP first-team All-Pro selections.

Three players – WR Justin Jefferson (Min., 2020), LB Quay Walker (G.B., 2022) and CB Quinyon Mitchell (Phi., 2024) – were named to the *Professional Football Writers of America* All-Rookie team.

DRAFTED PRO BOWLERS

Since the Pro Bowl was instituted in 1970, the Chargers have drafted 43 players that went on to be selected to 118 all-star games while with the team.

Hall of Fame **LB Junior Seau's** 12 Pro Bowl selections are tied for the fourth-most in history by a defensive player. Eight Chargers draft classes ('75, '83, '85, '01, '04, '05, '06, '10) have produced multiple Pro Bowl players for the Bolts, including the 1975, 1983 and 2004 draft classes each producing three Pro Bowlers.

CHARGERS COMPENSATORY PICK HISTORY

The Chargers made two compensatory selections in the 2025 NFL Draft. The team selected Clemson **SRJ Mickens** in the sixth round (No. 214 overall) and Florida **DB Trikweze Bridges** in the seventh round (No. 256 overall).

Mickens was the 12th Clemson Tiger drafted by the Bolts and first since 2023, while Bridges was the ninth Florida Gator ever chosen by Los Angeles and the first since 2007.

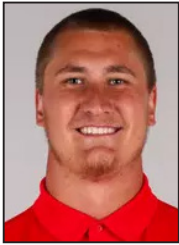

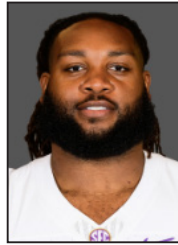

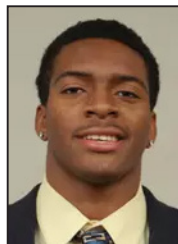

Chargers Select Akheem Mesidor in First Round of 2026 NFL Draft

The Los Angeles Chargers selected Miami outside linebacker **Akheem Mesidor** with the No. 22 overall pick in the 2026 NFL Draft. He is the ninth Hurricane ever drafted by the Bolts and the first since 2017.

Mesidor (pronounced MEH-zih-door) was one of the nation's top pass rushers in 2025 for Miami, earning first-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors and *Sporting News* second-team All-American recognition. He was a finalist for the Ted Hendricks Award, which annually recognizes college football's top defensive end after posting 12.5 sacks, 17.5 tackles for loss, four forced fumbles and 63 tackles (38 solo) in 15 starts. Mesidor tallied 24.0 sacks during his Hurricanes career, tied for the fourth-most in program history.

A native of Ottawa, Mesidor played at Miami from 2022-25 after transferring from West Virginia, suiting up for the Mountaineers from 2020-22. He started 52-of-65 career games, totaling 208 tackles (123 solo), 35.5 sacks and 52.5 tackles for loss. A two-time honorable mention All-ACC recipient with Miami, Mesidor added five forced fumbles and four pass breakups in his collegiate career. As a true freshman at West Virginia, he earned second-team All-Big 12 honors and second-team Freshman All-America from *The Athletic* after posting five sacks, 32 tackles (20 solo) and six tackles for loss.

Los Angeles Chargers Select Jake Slaughter on Day 2 of NFL Draft

The Los Angeles Chargers continued the 2026 NFL Draft by selecting Florida offensive lineman **Jake Slaughter** (63rd overall). The Bolts moved down from No. 55 overall in a trade with New England, acquiring the 63rd overall choice used to select Slaughter along with a fourth-round pick (No. 63) and a sixth-round selection (No. 202). Los Angeles later traded the 86th overall pick to Cleveland for a trio of selections — a fourth-rounder (No. 105), a fifth-round choice (No. 145) and a sixth-round pick (No. 206).

Slaughter capped his Florida career as one of the top interior offensive linemen in the country, finishing the 2025 season with second-team All-America accolades from *The Athletic* and *USA Today* as well as recognition as a finalist for the Rimington Trophy, which annually recognizes the top center in college football. He was the keystone on a Florida offensive line that blocked for running back Jadan Baugh to average over five yards per attempt and total 1,170 yards and eight touchdowns on the ground. Slaughter was a team captain in 2024 and earned *Associated Press* first-team All-America honors, while also earning a pair of *AP* first-team All-Southeastern Conference selections (2024-25), starting 33-of-51 career games played for the Gators.

Los Angeles Chargers Finish 2026 NFL Draft with Six Picks on Day 3

The Los Angeles Chargers made six selections on Saturday to wrap up the 2026 NFL Draft. The Bolts began Day 3 by taking Mississippi State wide receiver **Brenen Thompson** (105th overall), Memphis tackle **Travis Burke** (117th overall) and Arizona safety **Genesis Smith** (131st overall) in the fourth round. The Bolts moved up to No. 117 to select Burke after trading the 123rd and 204th picks to Houston. Los Angeles then rounded out the draft by selecting South Carolina defensive lineman **Nick Barrett** (145th overall) in the fifth round along with Boston College guard **Logan Taylor** (202nd overall) and Oregon guard **Alex Harkey** (206th overall) in the sixth round.

One of the fastest players in the country, **Thompson** utilized his speed at Mississippi State in 2025 to set the single-season program record and led the Southeastern Conference with 1,054 receiving yards, earning *Associated Press* second-team All-SEC honors in the process. He started all 13 games in 2025, hauling in 57 receptions and six touchdowns, averaging a conference-best 18.5 yards per catch (min. 40 rec.). Thompson joined Mississippi State after playing two seasons at Oklahoma (2023-24) and a year at Texas (2022). In 30 career games with the Bulldogs, Sooners and Longhorns, he totaled 1,557 receiving yards and 10 touchdowns on 84 receptions (18.5 avg.). Thompson is the second-ever Mississippi State Bulldog drafted by the Bolts.

Burke ended his career at Memphis in 2025, starting 11 games at right tackle for an offense that produced three different 500-yard rushers. He helped the Tigers to eight wins and blocked for a unit that totaled 34 rushing touchdowns last season, ranking 12th in the FBS. Burke previously spent two seasons (2023-24) at Florida International, starting 22 games for the Panthers. He began his career by at Gardner-Webb, appearing in 14 games total over two seasons (2021-22), helping the Runnin' Bulldogs compile over 2,300 rushing yards in 2022, culminating in an appearance in the second round of the FCS playoffs.

A third-team All-Big 12 selection as a junior in 2025, **Smith** registered a career-high 77 tackles (35 solo), adding three tackles for loss, an interception, nine pass breakups, two forced fumbles and a pair of recoveries. The Chandler, Ariz., native played three seasons at Arizona (2023-25), appearing in 37 career games. Smith totaled 164 tackles in his Wildcats career (87 solo), registering five interceptions and posting 19 pass breakups — including nine in each of the last two years. He added four forced fumbles and three recoveries. Smith earned Big 12 Co-Defensive Player of the Week in 2024 after posting seven tackles and a pick against Houston. An active participant in community service, he was on the 2025 Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year watchlist and was Wuerffel Trophy semifinalist, which annually honors the FBS player who best combines exemplary community service with leadership achievement on and off the field.

Barrett played five seasons at South Carolina (2021-25), appearing in 51 career games. He was voted by his teammates in 2025 as a team captain, a co-Steve Wadiak Team MVP and co-Most Outstanding Senior after starting all 12 games and setting a career high by leading all Gamecock defensive linemen with 42 tackles, adding six tackles for loss, two sacks and a 17-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown. Over his five years in Columbia, S.C., Barrett posted 72 tackles (34 solo), two sacks, an interception, three pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

A team captain in 2025, **Taylor** started all 12 games on the year for Boston College (eight at right guard, three at left tackle), earning *Associated Press* second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors. He helped the Eagles eclipse 500-plus yards in two games on the season, including against No. 14 Georgia Tech. Taylor was a back-to-back honorable mention All-ACC selection in 2023-24, helping the Eagles average 182.9 rushing yards per game over that span. He transferred to Boston College after playing at Virginia for two seasons (2021-22), starting 46-of-49 career games with the Eagles and Cavaliers.

Harkey ended his career at Oregon in 2025, starting all 14 games at right tackle and helping the Ducks reach the College Football Playoff semifinal. He was a key piece of an offensive line that paved the way for three different players to eclipse 600 rushing yards and was named a finalist for the Joe Moore award, which annually recognizes college football's most outstanding offensive line. Harkey blocked for the offense to eclipse 200-plus rushing yards seven times, including a pair of contests with at least 300 rushing yards. He transferred to Oregon after a two-year tenure at Texas State (2023-24), earning third-team All-Sun Belt Conference honors in 2024. Harkey played at Colorado in 2022, transferring to play for the Buffaloes after beginning his collegiate career at Tyler (Texas) Junior College.
