ARGERS FALL TO CARDINALS. 23–16

The Los Angeles Chargers fell to the Arizona Cardinals, 17-15, at State Farm Stadium on Monday night.

K Cameron Dicker was five-for-five from the field, scoring all 15 of the Chargers points. To open scoring in the second quarter he made a career-long 59-yard field goal, matching the longest field goal in franchise history, to give the Bolts a 3-0 lead. He then scored from 50 yards, marking his second career game with multiple 50-yard scores. He is one of two players in Chargers history to record multiple 50-yard field goals.

QB Justin Herbert completed a season-high 27-of-39 passes (69.2) pct.) for 349 yards, also a season high, for a passer rating of 97.1, distributing the ball to nine different players with seven recording receptions of 14-yards or more. It was Herbert's 26th career 300yard game.

RB J.K. Dobbins paced the Chargers on the ground, running for 40 vards on 14 carries (2.9 avg.).

TE Will Dissly, was the Bolts' leading receiver with a career high eight receptions for 81 yards (10.1 avg.). WR Ladd McConkey added 46 yards on five receptions (9.2 avg.) and WR Joshua Palmer tallied 63 yards on four receptions (15.8 avg.).

S Derwin James Jr. led the Chargers defense with eight tackles (five solo). In his first start, CB Cam Hart totaled seven tackles (six solo), one forced fumble and one pass defensed. **DT Teair Tart** added one solo tackle and his first career interception.

To open scoring in the second quarter, K Cameron Dicker made a 59-yard field goal to give the Bolts a 3-0 lead. Dicker's field goal marked a career-long for the Texas product and matched a franchise record set by K Michael Badgley on Dec. 9, 2018 against Cincinnati.

Dicker was good from 50-plus twice, scoring again from 50-vards in the second quarter marking his second career game with multiple 50-yard field goals. The feat matched a single-game franchise record for 50-plus yard field goals. He is one of only two Chargers to accomplish the feat, joining John Carney who also did so twice.

Dicker ended the game going five-for-five in field goals for 15 points.
