

POSTGAME NOTES

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LOS ANGELES CHARGERS at NEW YORK GIANTS

GIANTS EDGE BOLTS, 21-18

The Los Angeles Chargers fell to the New York Giants in East Rutherford, N.J., on Sunday.

RB Omarion Hampton totaled a career-high 128 yards on 12 carries (10.7 avg.) and 54-yard touchdown. It marked the first 100-yard rushing game of his career and 22nd by a Bolts rookie. He also had 37 receiving yards on five catches (7.4 avg.) for 165 scrimmage yards.

WR Quentin Johnston led the team in receiving with eight receptions for 98 yards (12.3 avg.) and a 36-yard touchdown. Johnston leads the team with four receiving touchdowns in September.

WR Keenan Allen hauled in five receptions for 37 yards (7.4 avg.). The 13-year veteran has 998 career receptions — two away from becoming the fastest player to reach 1,000 career receptions in NFL history.

Defensively, the Bolts had six sacks on the day, led by **OLB Tuli Tuipulotu's** career-high four sacks. He finished the game with career highs in tackles (nine), solo tackles (six) and tackles for loss (five). In the first half, he had 3.0 sacks — the most by a Bolts player in the first half since the turn of the century. With 4.0 sacks on Sunday, Tuipulotu became the fifth player in franchise history to record at least 4.0 sacks in a single game.

LB Troy Dye led the team in tackles, finishing with 12 (three solo), a QB hit and a special teams tackle. **S Derwin James Jr.**, totaled eight tackles (four solo), split a sack with **OLB Caleb Murphy** and a QB hit. **DL Justin Eboigbe** totaled a pair of solo tackles and a sack.

TULI SHINES IN NEW YORK

OLB Tuli Tuipulotu finished the game with career-highs in tackles (nine), solo tackles (six), tackles for loss (five) and sacks (4.0). *His 4.0 sacks tied for the third most in a single game by a Chargers player since sacks became a statistic in 1982.* In the first half, the Southern California native finished with four solo tackles, 3.0 sacks, three tackles for loss and four quarterback hits. *His 3.0 sacks are the most by a Chargers player in the opening half of a game since 2000.*

HAMPTON RUNS WILD

RB Omarion Hampton wrapped with a career-high 128 yards on 12 carries (10.7 avg.), including a 54-yard touchdown run. It marked the longest rushing touchdown by a rookie in franchise history. Sunday marked the first 100-yard rushing performance of Hampton's career and was the 22nd of such games by a rookie in franchise history.
