CHARGERS WIN AT WASHINGTON. 20-16

In his first-ever game as an NFL head coach, Brandon Staley led the Chargers to a four-point win at Washington. The Bolts kicked off the season with a 10-play, 75-yard drive capped off by a three-yard rushing touchdown from Austin Ekeler. It was the fourth time since 2000, and the first since 2016 at Kansas City. that the Chargers scored a touchdown on their first offensive drive of the season.

The team converted 14 third-down attempts, good for the most by any team in a game since 2011.

HERBERT KEEPS ROLLING

Second-year QB Justin Herbert totaled 337 yards and a touchdown on 31-of-47 passing (65.9 pct.). In the first half, he joined Chiefs QB Patrick Mahomes as the only players ever to total at least 4,500 passing yards in the first 16 starts to a career. The 300-vard performance was the ninth of Herbert's career. leaving him one 300-yard game shy of tying Mahomes for the most by any player in their first two pro seasons.

After completing his first four passes of the game, Herbert became the first player ever to top 400 completions through the first 16 starts of a career. Herbert also threw for 12 third-down conversions on the day, the most passing first downs in a single game on third down since Andrew Luck did so in 2012.
