BOLTS WIN REGULAR-SEASON HOME FINALE

The Los Angeles Chargers closed out their regular-season home slate with a 34-13 victory over the Denver Broncos. The team improved to 9-8 on the year and controls its own postseason destiny in the season finale at Las Vegas.

The defense allowed Denver to convert just three third downs on 11 attempts in the game (27.2 pct.), the best by a Bolts defense in a game since Week 3 against Carolina last season.

ROBERTS RUNS ONE BACK

WR Andre Roberts ran back a 101-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. It was the first by a Charger since 2012 and the fourth-longest kickoff return in team history.

He opened the game with a 47-yard kickoff return, giving him a league-leading four kickoff returns of 45-plus yards this year—all of which came with the Chargers.

HERBERT SETS MORE RECORDS

With 22 completions on 31 attempts (71.0 pct.) for 237 yards and two touchdowns (114.6 rating) on the day, **QB Justin Herbert** reached 800 for his career in the 31st game of his career, doing so faster than any player in NFL history. At 23 years, 298 days old, he became the third-youngest player to reach 800 completions.

Herbert now has 35 touchdowns on the year, setting the team's single-season passing touchdowns record. He became the sixth player ever to throw for 35 touchdowns before turning 24 years old and the second-youngest player to reach 65 career passing touchdowns (Dan Marino did so at 23 years, 93 days old).
