# HOUSTON TEXANS (0-2-1) VS LOS ANGELES CHARGERS (1-2)



## GAME PREVIEW

The Houston Texans will host the Los Angeles Chargers for a Week 4 matchup at NRG Stadium with kickoff slated for Noon CT. The Texans have won the last three-of-four matchups against the Chargers, highlighted by a 41-29 victory in Week 16 of last season.

The Texans defense registered two interceptions against the Bears in Week 3, marking the first time in franchise history the team has recorded a pick in each of the first three games of the season. The team has also allowed 23 or fewer points in the first three games of the season, the first time they've done so in franchise annals to start the season.

RB **Dameon Pierce** led the charge for the Texans offense in Week 3, rushing 20 times for 80 yards while adding his first career rushing touchdown. Pierce became the first Texans rookie running back to rush for 80-plus yards and one rushing touchdown in a single game since RB **Arian Foster** in 2009.

WR **Chris Moore** led the Texans in receiving yards against the Bears, catching three passes for 61 yards (21.0 avg.), the second-most single game output of his career. A bulk of Moore's receiving yards came on a 51-yard pass from QB **Davis Mills**, which ranked as the second-longest reception of his career.

After picking off QB Justin Fields twice in the Week 3 contest, DB **Jalen Pitre** became just the second Texans rookie to record two interceptions in a single game, joining DB Dunta Robinson, who did it in Week 4 vs. the Oakland Raiders (10/3/04). Additionally, Pitre became just the third rookie in NFL history to record two interceptions and 1.0 sack in the same game.

DL **Jerry Hughes** posted another 2.0-sack effort upping his season sack total to 4.0 and marking the second time in his 13-season career that he has recorded at least 3.0 sacks through the first three weeks of the NFL season.

Following Houston's matchup with the Los Angeles Chargers, the team will travel to Jacksonville for their first AFC South road matchup of the year with kickoff scheduled for Noon CT.

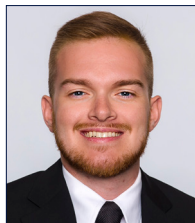

In accordance with NFL guidelines, the Houston Texans have implemented the below rules and regulations to accommodate media access. The Texans PR staff will communicate the schedule for practices and media availabilities via email. If you have any questions about the policy outlined below, please contact Omar Majzoub at [omar.majzoub@houstontexans.com](mailto:omar.majzoub@houstontexans.com).

## **MEDIA AVAILABILITY:**

- Head Coach Lovie Smith is available at the podium on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Postgame.
- Offensive Coordinator Pep Hamilton and a rotation of defensive coaches are available on Thursday.
- Primary Assistant Coaches are available every other Thursday and upon request.
- Texans players are available on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Postgame. Open Locker Room is on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Postgame while select players are at the podium.

## **INTERVIEW REQUESTS:**

- All interview requests for Houston Texans, executives, coaches and players should go through the Texans communications department. Members of the Texans organization, including players, should not be contacted directly for interview requests.
- Please give Evert Geerlings ([evert.geerlings@houstontexans.com](mailto:evert.geerlings@houstontexans.com)) at least a 24-hour notice for any 1-on-1 interview requests. Players who did not fully participate in practices or games will not be available for interviews.
- Interview requests for General Manager Nick Caserio and Head Coach Lovie Smith should be directed to Omar Majzoub at [omar.majzoub@houstontexans.com](mailto:omar.majzoub@houstontexans.com).

## **ACCESS TO NRG PARK:**

- The Texans communications staff will work with approved media to determine which players will be made available and send weekly availability schedules via email.
- Media will park in the Teal Lot on Murworth Dr. There is no parking pass required. Approved media will be on a security list.
- The media entrance and media will call at NRG Stadium is on the west side of the stadium at the corner of Kirby Drive and Murworth Drive.
- After practice, media has access to NRG Stadium as a working space with available bathrooms and WiFi.

## **REPORTING / SHOOTING / SOCIAL MEDIA:**

- Practices are expected to start at 8 a.m. during the regular season and media will view the first 30 minutes.
- Media are permitted to shoot video and still photography of practice during designated shooting portions, which will be announced by a member of the Texans communications staff.
- Tweeting is also permitted during the designated shooting portions of practice but all media must follow the reporting / social media rules set forth by the team.
- Broadcasting live, including social media (Facebook Live, Instagram Live, etc.), is not permitted during practice. Additionally, media members are not permitted to take phone calls.
- Media members may only report on what is being viewed on the designated practice fields.
- Tweeting/reporting of non-strategy events & exceptional plays is allowed during practice
- A member of the Texans communications staff will be in the designated media areas to help answer questions.

## **POOL SERVICES:**

- To get added to the Texans general email distribution list for media, which includes weekly schedules, transactions and more, please contact Tim Wiemann at [tim.wiemann@houstontexans.com](mailto:tim.wiemann@houstontexans.com).
- The Texans will provide pool video and press conference footage within a reasonable timeframe. Please email Tim Wiemann at [tim.wiemann@houstontexans.com](mailto:tim.wiemann@houstontexans.com) to be added to the distribution list.
- The Texans will transcribe all podium availabilities and send them via email. Please email Rachel Richards at [rachel.richards@houstontexans.com](mailto:rachel.richards@houstontexans.com) to be added to the distribution list.

## **OPEN LOCKER ROOM:**

- Open locker room sessions may not be broadcast live, including on social media (Facebook Live, Instagram Live, etc.), by an individual or media outlet. Additionally, still photos are not permitted in the locker room.
- Signs, notes and other personal items posted around the locker room and inside of or at player's lockers may not be photographed, videotaped or reported on
- Videographers must shoot tight shots of players conducting interviews at their lockers and shooting is only allowed when a player is engaged in an interview
- Please wait for players to be dressed before approaching for interviews and make sure they are standing with their back to their locker during an interview unless otherwise permitted
- Work with a member of the Texans PR staff to ensure the locker room is a comfortable environment for all.

## **CREDENTIALS:**

- The 2022 credential application is available online. The deadline for requesting single-game passes is Tuesday by 5 p.m. CT the week of each home game.

## **TOPICS TO AVOID:**

- Potential severity of an injury until it's addressed by Head Coach Lovie Smith.
- Game strategy – formations, plays, substitution packages, game plan, etc.
- Which players are practicing with individual units (first-team, second-team, goal line, nickel, etc.).
- Conversations that take place on field between players, coaches and/or staff.
- Players who line up in positions different from the one listed on the current roster.

## **VIOLATIONS:**

- All media who cover the Houston Texans must comply with the media policy in order to be credentialed for games or practices during the 2022 season.
- Texans PR will issue a formal, written notice to media members each time there is a violation of the policy.
- Any violation of the Texans media policy could result in disciplinary action, including but not limited to:
  - Limited or No Open Locker Room Access
  - Limited or No Gameday/Practice Access
  - Suspension of 2022 Credential

## WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN WEEK 4

### QB DAVIS MILLS' BIG DAY IN 2021

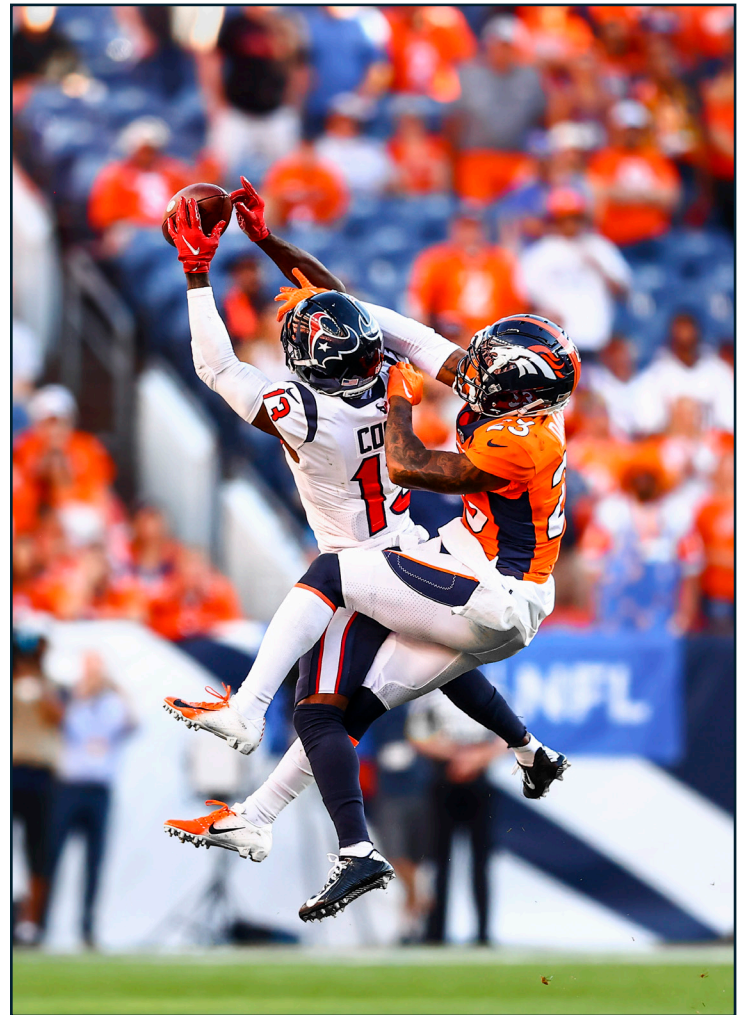
The last time QB **Davis Mills** played the Chargers, he posted career highs in passer rating (130.6) and passing percentage (77.8 pct.). Mills didn't throw a single interception and threw for 254 yards, the fourth highest single-game total of his career.

### DB JALEN PITRE INTERCEPTION WATCH

Last week, DB **Jalen Pitre** recorded his first career interception and sack at Chicago (9/25). If Pitre collects another interception in Week 4, he would be the first rookie in franchise history to have three or more interceptions through the first four weeks of the season.

### K KA'IMI FAIRBARN COULD SET NEW KICKING RECORD

If K **Ka'imi Fairbairn** connects on three field goal attempts, he will have the most games with three or more field goals in Texans history (20), surpassing K **Kris Brown** (19) when he accomplished this feat over his eight year career with the Texans (2002-2009).

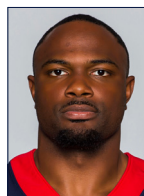

## DIVISIONAL DOMINANCE

Since joining the Texans before the 2020 season, WR **Brandin Cooks** has compiled 1,089 receiving yards against divisional opponents, trailing only **Justin Jefferson** (1,373), **Davante Adams** (1,245) and **Stefon Diggs** (1,153) for the highest receiving total in the NFL during that span. Cooks also has seven receiving touchdowns (tied for 13th) and 78 total receptions (seventh) against divisional opponents during that span.

Against AFC South teams, Cooks' per-game averages in receiving yards (89.2), receptions (6.2) and receiving touchdowns (0.6) all rank first in Texans history (min. five games played).

## NOW WE'RE COOKIN'

WR **Brandin Cooks** finished the 2021 season with a career-high 90 receptions for 1,037 yards (11.5 avg.) and six touchdowns. Cooks reached 1,000 yards receiving for the sixth time since joining the NFL in 2014, tied for the second-most such seasons in the league during that span. He joins **Brandon Marshall** as the only players in NFL history to record at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season with four separate teams, doing so with New Orleans, New England, the L.A. Rams and Houston.

Cooks joined **Andre Johnson** (2008-10, 2012-13) and **DeAndre Hopkins** (2014-15, 2017-19) as the only Texans to record consecutive seasons with 1,000 receiving yards.

Cooks has averaged 13.82 yards per reception since entering the league in 2014, fourth-highest in the NFL during that span (min. 500 receptions). He is one of six NFL players to average 10.0 yards per reception in every season since 2014 (min. 40 receptions per season) and ranks fifth in the NFL with 77 receptions of 25-plus yards during that span, including 12 in 2020 and seven in 2021.

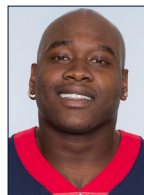

## DEFENSE DOES IT AGAIN

The Texans defense has only allowed one first half touchdown so far in the 2022 season. The unit limited Denver's offense to 3-of-12 on third downs (25 pct.) in Week 2, tied for the fifth-lowest rate allowed by the team since the start of the 2018 season.

The team also held Denver without a touchdown on two red zone trips, marking the first perfect red zone percentage posted by Houston's defense since the 2018 season (min. two opponent red zone trips). ## ROOKIES DEBUT IN THE RECORD BOOK

Three rookies made their first NFL start against the Indianapolis Colts in Week 1 of 2022, including RB **Dameon Pierce**, DB **Jalen Pitre** and DB **Derek Stingley Jr.** This marks the most rookies that have started for the Texans in Week 1 since the 2006 season when DL Mario Williams, TE Owen Daniels, RB Wali Lundy, LB DeMeco Ryans and OL Charles Spencer all started vs. the Philadelphia Eagles (9/10/06).

Pitre and Stingley Jr. started their NFL careers by notching 11 and seven total tackles, respectively, in the franchise's first ever tie game. Their performances rank as the second-most and tied for fourth-most tackles among rookies making their Texans debut.

## A HUGE START FOR HUGHES

DL **Jerry Hughes** currently has eight tackles (six solo), 4.0 sacks, four quarterback hits, one interception, one pass defended, three tackles for loss and one forced fumble through the first three games of the 2022 season.

In Week 3 at Chicago, Hughes posted his ninth career game where he recorded at least 2.0 sacks, bringing his season total to 4.0 sacks. Hughes currently is tied for second in the NFL for most sacks through three weeks and he's the only player among the top-45 who also has an interception on the season.

Hughes' 4.0 sacks is also tied for second most in franchise history for sacks through the first three weeks of a season.

In Week 1 vs. Indianapolis, Hughes became the third player in Texans history to record an interception, a sack and forced fumble all in the same game. He also became the first player in franchise history to reach this feat in just the first half of a game.

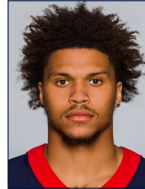

Texans rookie DB **Jalen Pitre** had a record-setting game in Week 3 at Chicago, finishing the game with two interceptions (first in his career), 1.0 sack (first in his career), eight total tackles (five solo) and two tackles for loss. Pitre became just the second rookie in Texans history to record two interceptions in the same game, joining CB Dunta Robinson, who did it in Week 4 (10/03/04) vs. Oakland.

Sunday's performance made Pitre the only player in the NFL this season with at least 1.0 sack and multiple interceptions so far. He is currently tied for second in interceptions on the 2022 season and ranks first in interceptions by a rookie this season. His interception also marked the first time in franchise history the team has recorded a pick in each of the first three games of the season.

He's also the fourth rookie in NFL history and first rookie in franchise history to record two interceptions and 1.0 sack in the same game.

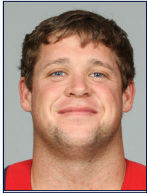

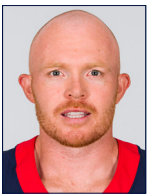

In Week 3 at Chicago, P **Cameron Johnston** landed 5-of-5 punts inside the 20-yard line, marking the first time in his career that 100 percent of his kicks landed inside the 20-yard line (min. three punts). Johnston punted inside of the 20-yard line on 43.2 percent of his kicks in 2021 (min. 34 punts), ranked seventh in the NFL (fourth in the AFC) in 2021 and the fifth-highest mark through 16 games in Texans history.

Johnston averaged 41.74 net yards per punt last season, which was 11th highest in the NFL and fifth-highest in the AFC.

K **Ka'imi Fairbairn** hasn't missed a field goal attempt from inside of 40 yards since 2017, connecting on 63 consecutive kicks from 0-39 yards during that span.

The UCLA product owns 19 career games with three-or-more made field goals, which is tied for most in team history with only **Kris Brown**.

Fairbairn ranked fourth in the NFL in total points scored from 2018-20 (368) and third in field goals made (84). He owns 18 games with 10-or-more points scored, which is the third-most in franchise history.

Fairbairn became the first player in Texans history with at least 90 points in four consecutive seasons (2017-20) and joined Brown (2007-09) as the only players in franchise history to record at least 100 points scored in three consecutive seasons (2018-20). He is second in Texans history in career field goals made with 119 and second in points (518).

## LONG RANGE LEADER

In Week 14 of 2021, K **Ka'imi Fairbairn** connected on a 61-yard field goal, a career-long and franchise-long. Fairbairn also reached 500 career points, joining **Kris Brown** (767 points) as the only players to score 500-plus points as a Texan and the 49th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to reach 500 points in 74 career games or less.

Fairbairn hit a 53-yard field goal in Week 7 of the 2021 season at Arizona to move past Brown for the most 50-plus yard field goals in Texans history. Fairbairn needed just over half as many games as Brown to set the record.

After the first two games of the 2022 NFL season, Fairbairn had four field goals of 40-plus yards, the most in franchise history through the first two weeks of the season.

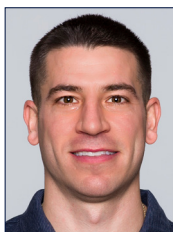

## Opening Statement

"I didn't think we would see a lot of y'all here today. Lot of good things going on with our (Houston) Rockets. Yesterday's game, we've lost three winnable games, three where we had fourth quarter leads. Glass half full, that's saying that we're close. The reality is we could still be far away because these things have happened three weeks in a row. Positives from the game, I thought our specials teams were outstanding yesterday, of course the fake punt, but so much more. Our punting game, coverage kickoff and punt. Thought we did some good things that gave us an opportunity to win the football game. Offensively, we need more. We put more points up on the board yesterday. There were opportunities for other plays. Favorable third downs would be a third-and-1 and we had four of those that we didn't convert. Not converting on four third-and-1s, two critical interceptions, both were tipped, hurt us a lot. If you can't stop the run, it's going to be a tough duty. Defensively, we weren't good on third down. The runs, I think they got about 130 of their yards with three runs. In order for that to happen, missed tackles but one was a definitely bust. Those kinds of things really lead to you losing games at the end of the game. These are things when we watch the video, you see it's obvious where we can clean some things up and that's what we'll do. Injury-wise, thought we ended up in pretty good shape. Not going in, so that shouldn't be a factor."

## What's the consistent problem on short third downs from all three games?

"I won't go all the way back to those games. This game, one was late. Third-and-1, two-minute situation, we're trying to complete a pass there. On the goal line, there was a third-and-1, that was a big one. We let one of the linebackers run through an A gap. That shouldn't happen. The other two were run pass options and we should have just taken the run. Those are the things that can be cleaned up though, from my point. You want to get in those situations. If you have to get to third down, you want it to be a third-and-1."

## How are you seeing QB Davis Mills handle the RPOs?

"We didn't handle those decisions the right way. I'll say that."

## Is there a way to improve tackling without hard hits in practice?

"Wasn't about fits, eventually you're going to get in position where you have to make a tackle. Simple as that. You have to wrap up. That's what we didn't do. Are there ways to improve it? Yeah, get in a little bit better positions and wrap up once you get to the point of attack. That's what it was. It's one thing to miss one tackle but we should be talking about missed tackles with a 10-yard gain, not those explosive plays like we've been giving up. Talking about all the negative that happened, first off, defensively I'm going to talk about the positives, Jalen Pitre's game. Rookie, outstanding job. Two interceptions, big sack, tackle for a loss, just overall good play throughout. That's encouraging when you see a player like that. Jerry Hughes. You have one of our youngest players really playing good ball and you have our oldest defensive player that's playing good ball also. Jerry (Hughes) did a good job rushing the pass. There's a lot of in between that we have to take care of. Back to the offensive side of the football, when I talk about those plays we didn't make, it can make the outcome look a lot worse. There were so many guys that improved from Week 2. If we can continue the path, we'll eventually get this figured out."

## When rushing the passer, were you trying to do something different by adding linebacker pressure to flood some holes?

"I think we did that a little bit. (Jalen) Pitre got his last sack was on a blitz. We were blitzing throughout. I wish it was as simple as just blitz. To me, as I look at it, do we have somebody in position to make a tackle. If the answer is yes, it's a good defense and we have to be able to execute that way."

## What are your thoughts on the last offensive play after watching the film?

"You know the outcome on the decision. First off the ball was tipped. If any quarterback is throwing the ball and the ball gets tipped, who's fault really is it? We didn't execute the way we need to. In that last play, whenever you get a chance to analyze it, there's normally a few guys that are open on most plays. It shouldn't come down to that. We can say that one play, you cannot have a takeaway in that situation. I'm not saying that, but look at all the other opportunities we had before that. I'm going to go back to the third-and-1 on the goal line, 2-yard line and taking a sack. That play was just as important too. We've got to be able to clean these one's up."

## How important is it for a team to get production from their backup running backs?

"I think it's very important. I think most teams play two guys. They feel pretty good about two guys. Yeah, he (Khalil Herbert) was listed as a second team running back, but he's played. He's a good football player. In the NFL, there's a lot of backups like that, just wait for the opportunity that haven't gotten it. Those plays yesterday, I'm going to that one big run that he had, that had a lot to do with us. We had someone out of a gap and we missed a big tackle. That leads to backup running backs coming in and having big games based on what the other side did. That was definitely the case on that play."

## Are you looking to bring in new running backs to the roster for different rotations?

"No. We like our running backs that we have. Dameon (Pierce) has got to protect the football better. The times that he's played all three games, we like what our one running back has done. It's pretty hard to get three running backs involved. Rex (Burkhead) in his role will continue. I've seen signs of improvement each week. It's not where it needs to be. A lot of time with the running game too, you've got to have some explosive in there. Some explosive runs and then it looks a whole lot better. That's what they were able to do yesterday. Eventually, we'll get that."

## Can you talk about the progress of QB Davis Mills throughout the first three weeks?

"You go ask Davis (Mills) and the rest of our team, we haven't made enough progress to win football games right now. You take away the interceptions, I know we can't do that, but I thought his pocket presence was a lot better yesterday. He threw some good passes. A couple to Nico (Collins) throughout. I thought he threw better passes yesterday than he did in the previous week. There's small progress being made throughout with all of the players and of course he's the biggest part of that. It's hard to talk about progress when you finish the way we did though."

## When you look at the film, how do you think the offense handled the obvious passing situations?

"It's pretty easy to look at that. We had four third-and-1's. I'm going to look more to that than obvious passing situations. As long as you take the third-and-1's and you convert on those, everything else will work itself out. You live for the day when you get to third down and it's a third-and-1 situation. We need to do a better job. My biggest complaint first, the turnovers, and there it's just converting third-and-1's. A lot of things we're talking about right now wouldn't be here."

## Is there a balance to trying to go for a tackle but also stripping the ball?

"Missing tackles has nothing to do with that. Nothing at all. Go watch the video and see how many times yesterday we missed a tackle where you somebody trying to go for the ball. We won't use that. You've got to get in better position with angles and being the right spot, and when we get there we need to wrap up. It has nothing to do with that. As far as our form of defense, we will never stop trying to take the ball away to win football games. Just like we'll never stop trying to intercept balls instead of knocking them down."

## Did they do anything more difficult for QB Davis Mills to try and get the ball to Brandin Cooks?

"Of course the answer is yes. That's what everybody is doing every play. They're trying to do that. Every pass coverage that you have, that's the goal to do that. I can't say you can do that the entire game. Brandin (Cooks) has to find ways to get open a little bit more. We've got to find him better ways to get him the ball. That's kind of the simple answer for a lot of what we did. I'm going to go back to yesterday, I don't think it was about that. You look at some of the critical moments that we weren't able to get that done."

## What is your assessment of the linebacker play?

"I don't think our play has been good. The linebackers just as a whole, it hasn't been good enough. I'm going to start up front first. Going into this game yesterday, it was about the offensive line blocking them. It was about our defensive line controlling theirs. We didn't do a good job of that. Whenever you get a running back to the second wave, it's going to start with the d-line, and from there, linebackers are going to be a big part of any plays that are able to break. Whether it be the run or pass, the linebackers are always involved. When we talk about not playing our best defense right now, of course the linebackers have a big say in that."

## How does working with 52-man on the roster compare to having 53?

"No, it's really not because how many dress on game day? 48. That's what it's about, it's that. We'll have a lot other players of course as we talk about that practice squad guys can move up. It doesn't affect it at all. What I look at each week, how many guys do you really need to win football games. I've been asked an awful lot about how many receivers we dress, how many played yesterday. Really we dress four, three really play. We dressed an extra defensive lineman, we went nine yesterday. Our ninth one played how many snaps yesterday, one snap. You have more than enough. The general rule as you look at it, you need a starting group and you need one backup at every position. Then the rest of the guys dressed are guys that have a big special teams role. I think we have the numbers about what they need to be. Whether there's 52 on the roster, it's more than enough."

## With having an extra spot this year compared to last year, does it give you an extra spot to field on game day?

"I don't think you need to look at anybody on game day. The guys that we have that's what I think we need. We need a starting group that's going to play and we need a backup at every position, I think we have that. If we could dress 60 guys, would I like to do that, yeah. Eighty would be, everyone on our roster would help a little bit too. You really don't need that many. We have more than enough to get what we need to get accomplished."

## Since you put an emphasis on finishing, will you change your speech or come up with something different?

"The first time something doesn't go right, you change what you believe that quick, well there's no belief in anything if you do that. The answer is no, no, no and no. We're going to keep doing the things that we believe in and we're going to do those better. That's where we are, three games into this 17-game regular season."

## How do you prepare for the depth that the Los Angeles Chargers have?

"We have an outstanding advanced scouting department, personnel department. There won't be any surprises like that. We're aware of the guys that are out right now. We've already gotten the scouting report on the Chargers. We played them last year. All of the things you kind of know about them, we'll know too. That won't be a reason for us to not have success against them based on not knowing their personnel."

## What did you think of DB Derek Stingley Jr.'s day against the Bears and assess his progress from Week 1?

"Yesterday was one of those days where it wasn't a passing day, starting with that. It was a show pass and take off running that kind of led to the rushing yardage too. To answer your question, he wasn't attacked as much, neither one of our corners. It was more about them supporting the run yesterday and we can do a better job of that. Stingley will get better each game he plays."

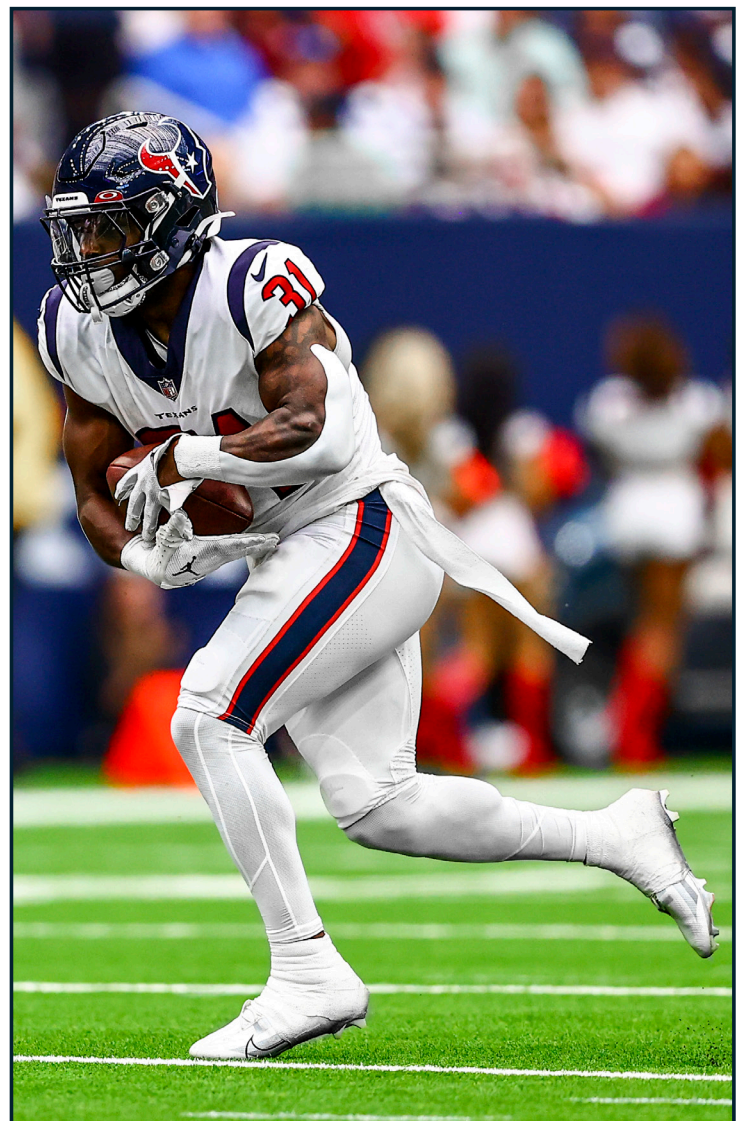
