CHARGERS DOWN RAIDERS, 20-9

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Las Vegas Raiders, 20-9, on Monday Night Football in Las Vegas

The Bolts start the season 2-0 for the second consecutive season under **Head Coach Jim Harbaugh**, earning their 14th win over the last 21 matchups with the Raiders. Defensively, the Bolts did not allow a touchdown, recorded three interceptions and held the Raiders to 218 total net yards. **Seven** different Bolts defenders recorded multiple passes defended.

QB Justin Herbert was 19-for-27 (70.4 pct.) for 242 yards and a pair of touchdowns for a 122.8 quarterback rating. He also led the Bolts with nine carries for 31 yards (3.4 avg.).

WR Quentin Johnston totaled 71 yards and a 60-yard touchdown on three receptions (23.7 avg.). **WR Keenan Allen** added five receptions for 61 yards (12.2 avg.) and a 10-yard touchdown.

LB Daiyan Henley, who was added to the injury report earlier in the day with an illness, led the defense with 10 tackles (seven solo), a sack, a QB hit, an interception and a pair of passes defended. Monday night marked the first time in the third-year linebacker's career that he has topped 10 tackles, recorded a sack and an interception in his career.

CB Donte Jackson added a solo tackle, his 20th career interception and a pair of passes defended. **S Tony Jefferson**, who was called up from the practice squad, recorded five tackles (three solo) an interception and a pair of passes defended.

CB Tarheeb Still logged nine tackles, a tackle for loss and a pair of passes defended while **S Derwin James Jr.** recorded seven tackles (three solo) and two passes defended.

OLB Khalil Mack and **DL Jamaree Caldwell** each added a sack.

DEFENSE SHINES ON MONDAY NIGHT

To open the game, the Bolts defense limited the Raiders to a pair of field goals, 128 total net yards and a 37.5 third down percentage. Monday night marked the second-straight game the Bolts have kept their opponent out of the end zone in the first half and seventh time since Defensive Coordinator Jesse Minter joined the team in 2024.

Los Angeles joins the Baltimore Ravens (eight), Washington Commanders (eight) Detroit Lions (seven) and Philadelphia Eagles (seven) as the only three teams in the NFL with at least seven of such games since 2024.

This season, the Bolts and the Green Bay Packers are the only clubs to not allow a score in the first half through two games this season.

The Bolts recorded three interceptions on Monday night, tied for the highest single game total in the 2025 season through two games.

It marked the third time the Bolts have recorded at least three interceptions in a single game since 2024, the most of such games in the NFL during that span.

JOHNSTON FINDS PAYDIRT

WR Quentin Johnston recorded three receptions for 71 yards (23.7 avg.) and a 60-yard touchdown.

Through two games of the 2025 season, the third-year receiver has totaled eight receptions for 150 yards (18.8 avg.) and three touchdowns. Since 2000, he is just the sixth Chargers player and first since Hall of Fame TE Antonio Gates to record three receiving touchdowns through the first two games of a season.
