THE MATCHUP

The New Orleans Saints [2-5] will play an AFC West opponent for the third consecutive week in 2024 on Sunday, Oct, 27, when they face the Los Angeles Chargers [3-3] at SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, Calif. The Saints, who dropped a 33-10 contest to the Denver Broncos at the Caesars Superdome on Thursday night, will look to break a five-game losing streak and get back on the winning track against a team they have had a recent history of success against. Dating back to 2008, the Saints have won their last four meetings with the Chargers, including contests played in London, England, New Orleans and San Diego. The Chargers will be trying to endure a short week of preparation following a 17-15 loss to the Arizona Cardinals on Monday Night Football.

Forced to withstand injuries at the quarterback position, the wide receiver corps and on the offensive line, RB **Alvin Kamara** has been the stalwart for the New Orleans offense. Leading the team in both rushing and receiving, Kamara has carried 111 times for 438 yards with six touchdowns and caught 34 passes for 252 yards with one touchdown. Kamara leads NFL running backs in receiving, is tied for third in the league in rushing touchdowns and total touchdowns [seven] and ranks fourth in total yards from scrimmage [690]. With 6,267 career rushing yards, Kamara is 234 yards from becoming the franchise's all-time leader. Many of Kamara's big plays have come behind the blocking of rookie T **Taliese Fuaga**, the club's first round pick, who has opened every contest at the left tackle position after playing on the right side at Oregon State.

Defensively, the club's newcomers and younger defenders have taken active roles alongside established leaders. CB **Alontae Taylor** has played in every game and has posted 41 tackles, seven stops for loss, 3.5 sacks, two forced fumble and six pass breakups, while his quarterback takedown and tackles for loss totals lead NFL defensive backs. Second-year DT **Bryan Bresee**, the team's first round pick in 2023, leads the team with four sacks. LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, an unrestricted free agent acquisition from Kansas City, leads the team and is tied for first in the NFL with two fumble recoveries, while S **Tyrann Mathieu** is tied for the team lead with three takeaways.

THE HEAD COACHES



Dennis Allen was hired as the 17th head coach in New Orleans Saints history on February 8, 2022. Now in his 29th year coaching and 23rd in the NFL, Allen has spent 14 seasons

in New Orleans in two separate stints, including six-and-a-half campaigns (2015-21) as the team's defensive coordinator prior to being promoted to head coach.

During his 23 years of coaching in the NFL, Allen has worked with 13 players who have combined for 26 Pro Bowl selections and he has also coached two *Associated Press* NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year winners and three members of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

Allen's defenses have consistently been among the most productive in the NFL in a number of categories, including scoring defense, total yards allowed and sacks. The team's defensive play-caller since the middle of the 2015 season, the Saints are the only team in the National Football League to rank in the top ten in opponent points per game each of the past four seasons.

In 2023, Allen guided the Saints to win four of their last five games as the team turned in a 9-8 performance, narrowly missing the playoffs. New Orleans finished 5-3 at home, winning their last three at the Caesars Superdome and captured their last three division contests, including convincing victories over Tampa Bay and Atlanta to close the season.

Prior to rejoining the Saints in 2015, Allen served as head coach of the Oakland Raiders from 2012-14 and as defensive coordinator of the Denver Broncos in 2011.

Allen played safety at Texas A&M from 1992-95, where he started the final 21 games of his career before being signed as an undrafted free agent by the Buffalo Bills in 1996. Prior to entering the National Football League coaching ranks in 2002, Allen served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater from 1996-99 and as a secondary coach at the University of Tulsa from 2000-01. He earned a bachelor of business administration degree and a master's in kinesiology from Texas A&M.

Raised in Hurst, Texas, Allen and his wife Alisson have a daughter, Layla and a son, Garrison.



Jim Harbaugh returns to the Chargers as the 19th head coach in franchise history, bringing with him a winning culture, posting a 144-52 record as a collegiate head coach and a 52-25-1 record as an NFL head coach. Har-

baugh rejoined the Chargers after spending the past nine years at his alma mater as head football coach for the University of Michigan

Over the last nine seasons at Michigan, he led the Wolverines to an 86-25 record along with three consecutive Big Ten Championships, three straight appearances in the College Football Playoff and a perfect 15-0 record and the 2023 National Championship during his final season in Ann Arbor. During his nine years at Michigan, he coached the top defense in the nation, allowing just 291.0 yards per game in that span. Michigan had a top-five defense in the country five times over those nine seasons, including the top-ranked defense in the nation twice. Harbaugh returned to his alma mater after spending four seasons (2011-14) as the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers, leading the team to a 49-22-1 record and three consecutive NFC Championship Games, including a victory in 2012 to represent the NFC in Super Bowl XLVII. He was named 2011 NFL Coach of the Year by the *Associated Press* after his first season with San Francisco, when he led the 49ers to an NFC West division crown with a 13-3 record.

Prior to joining San Francisco, he spent four years as head coach at Stanford (2007-10). Harbaugh got his first head coaching position at the University of San Diego (2004-06) after spending two seasons as an offensive assistant with the Oakland Raiders (2002-03). He worked as an assistant for his father, Jack Harbaugh, at Western Kentucky during his NFL playing career.

Harbaugh played quarterback at Michigan (1982-86) before playing 15 seasons in the NFL with the Chicago Bears (1987-93), Indianapolis Colts (1994-97), Baltimore Ravens (1998), Chargers (1999-2000) and Carolina Panthers (2001).

Personal: Born Dec. 23, 1963, in Toledo, Ohio. Harbaugh and his wife, Sarah, have two daughters - Addison and Katherine - and two sons - Jack and John. He also has three adult children - Jay, James Jr. and Katherine.

SERIES HISTORY

The Saints and Chargers have played 13 times in the regular season, with Los Angeles leading the series 7-6, but New Orleans winning the last four matchups. Most recently, the Saints defeated the Chargers 30-27 on October 12, 2020 in a Sunday Night Football contest at the Superdome, when QB Drew Brees successfully executed a nine-play, 48-yard drive that ended with a 36-yard field goal by K Wil Lutz and on a fourth and six play, CB Marshon Lattimore tackled Chargers WR Mike Williams at the Los Angeles 49-yard line, one yard short of the first down marker to end the contest.

LAST MEETING

Saints 30, Los Angeles Chargers 27; October 4, 2020 @ Mercedes-Benz Superdome - Wil Lutz kicked a 36-yard field goal with 5:08 left in overtime and New Orleans' defense stopped Chargers receiver Mike Williams just short on fourth down to preserve a 30-27 victory over seemingly star-crossed Los Angeles on Monday Night Football.

Chargers kicker Michael Badgley, who missed his first career point-after kick wide right in the first quarter, had a chance to redeem himself after Williams' leaping catch between two defenders put the Chargers on the Saints' 32-yard line in the final seconds. But Badgley's 50-yard kick as time expired bounced off the right upright.

"The young man's been kicking outstanding. He's got to do better but we could have done some other things better," Chargers coach Anthony Lynn said.

Drew Brees rushed for a one-yard touchdown and hit TE Jared Cook for a 41-yard score as the Saints rallied from a 17-point deficit in the second quarter.

"This is how you grow as a team," Brees said. "This is how you become battle-tested – and I think it pays dividends."

Rookie Justin Herbert's fourth touchdown pass of the game, a 64-yarder to Michael Williams, briefly put Los Angeles back in front before the Saints [3-2] tied it on Taysom Hill's nine-yard run with 52 seconds left in regulation.

The Chargers [1-4] fell to their fourth straight loss by a touchdown or less, and the second in overtime. They also blew a 17-point lead for a second straight game.

"Never thought this team would lose four straight. We've put ourselves in position, but we didn't get it done," Lynn said. "We have to finish these damn games."

Herbert, who was named the starter for the remainder of the season, finished 20 of 34 for 264 yards without an turnover. Five of his completions went to Williams for 109 yards and two TDs.

Brees finished 33 of 47 for 325 yards, including 12 completions to Emmanuel Sanders for 122 yards, as his 13 career overtime wins a starting quarterback broke a tie with Tom Brady since it was instituted in 1974. Kamara had 119 yards from scrimmage, highlighted by his leaping, juggling catch along the right sideline over the head of safety Rayshawn Jenkins to set up Hill's tying TD.

DATING GAME

This week's game at the Los Angeles Chargers is being played on October 27. The Saints are 3-4 on October 27, having won their last two meetings on the day. The Black and Gold have played six teams on the date, the Cardinals twice. The Saints will be looking to win their third consecutive contest on the date of October 27 and their first on the road. Here is a brief look at New Orleans' October 27 games:

1968 - The Saints lose to the St. Louis Cardinals, 31-17 at Busch Stadium.

1974 - The Saints defeat the Philadelphia Eagles 14-10 at Tulane Stadium on the strength of an eight-yard rushing touchdown by RB Jess Phillips with 1:10 left.

1985 - New Orleans falls to the New York Giants 21-13

1991 - The Saints fall to the Chicago Bears 20-17 at the Superdome to drop to 7-1, breaking what was their best start to a season. QB Jim Harbaugh, head coach of the Chargers, completed a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR Tom Waddle with 54 seconds left.

2002 - New Orleans falls to Atlanta, 37-35 at the Superdome to fall to 6-2.

2013 - New Orleans defeats the Buffalo Bills 49-17 to improve to 6-1 as QB Drew Brees threw five touchdowns passes.

2019 - New Orleans improves to 7-1 as Brees returns after missing five games with a thumb injury to throw three touchdowns in a 31-9 win over Arizona at the Superdome.

NEXT WEEK

Following the Chargers contest, the Saints will go out on the road for the second consecutive week, when they travel to the east coast to play the Carolina Panthers at Bank of America Stadium on November 3. The contest will have a 12:00 p.m. CT kickoff and will be regionally televised on CBS [WWL 4 locally]. The Saints lead the Panthers 31-28 in the all-time regular season series, as well as a 2017 NFC Wild Card Playoff victory. Following a 47-10 season-opening win over the Panthers on September 8 at the Caesars Superdome, New Orleans will be looking for their second consecutive series sweep.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

WEEK 1: Saints 47, Panthers 10; Sept. 8, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - The Saints, behind three **Derek Carr** touchdown passes, two rushing touchdowns and four **Blake Grupe** field goals, defeated the visiting Carolina Panthers, 47-10, at the Caesars Superdome.

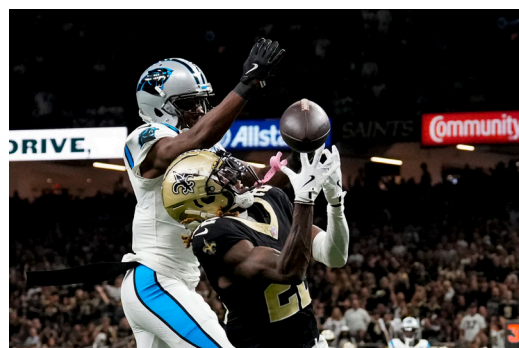
The Saints jumped out to a 30-0 lead, scored on their first nine possessions (tying a club record for scores on consecutive possessions) and held the ball for 36:39 in time of possession en route to the highest scoring total and most lopsided opening day result in team history. New Orleans won their sixth consecutive season opener, a club record and the current longest opener winning streak in the NFL.

The New Orleans defense also displayed their mettle, allowing only 193 total net yards of offense by the Panthers and held the Panthers to just one of ten third downs.

The Saints defense recorded three takeaways and CB **Alontae Taylor** became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest, but fans were excited by the debut of a new-look offense that helped the Saints control the clock with a rushing game that gained 180 yards and two touchdowns largely behind **Alvin Kamara's** 83 yards. Carr completed 19-of-23 passes (82.6 pct.) for 200 yards with three touchdown passes, zero interceptions and a 142.5 passer rating. The New Orleans defense harassed Carolina QB **Bryce Young** all day, as he completed only 13-of-30 passes for 161 yards with two interceptions and a 32.8 passer rating.

- With the victory, the Saints improved to 23-35 in season openers and extend their club-record winning streak of season openers to six straight, currently the longest streak in the National Football league.
- WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** led New Orleans with 73 receiving yards on three receptions (24.3 avg.) with one touchdown reception from 59 yards out, the longest play of the game. Including 60 punt return yards, sparked by a 47-yard runback and a 33-yard kickoff return, Shaheed finished with 163 all-purpose yards to start the season.

- Carr connected with two of his tight ends, **Juwan Johnson** and **Foster Moreau** for touchdowns.
- 17 players made their Saints debuts: T **Taliese Fuaga**, G **Lucas Patrick**, LB **Willie Gay Jr.**, DB **Will Harris**, QB **Jake Haener**, WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, CB **Kool-Aid McKinstry**, WR **Bub Means**, CB **Rico Payton**, P **Matthew Hayball**, LB **Khaleke Hudson**, LB **Anfernee Orji**, OL **Oli Udoh**, WR **Mason Tipton**, DTs **Kendal Vickers** and **Khristian Boyd** and DE **Chase Young**.
- With 83 yards rushing and five receptions for 27 yards, Kamara's 110 total yards from scrimmage gave him his 50th career game of at least 100 yards from scrimmage.



WEEK 2: Saints 44, Cowboys 19; Sept. 15, 2024 @ AT&T Stadium - The Saints posted an impressive road victory at Dallas behind the powerful offensive firepower of RB **Alvin Kamara**, the arm of QB **Derek Carr**, the hands of WRs **Chris Olave** and **Rashid Shaheed** and two interceptions by the defense.

The Saints struck first on the opening drive as Carr led the offense down the field on a sequence ending with Kamara rushing for a five-yard touchdown. At the conclusion of Dallas' first drive, K **Brandon Aubrey** booted a 52-yard field goal. New Orleans struck right back for their second score of the first quarter on a 70-yard pass play from Carr to Shaheed to put New Orleans up 14-3.

Leading 35-16 at halftime, the Cowboys got the ball out of the second half and New Orleans moved Dallas out of the red zone in the first drive, when DT **Bryan Bresee** sacked QB **Dak Prescott** and forced him to fumble before it was recovered by Dallas at the New Orleans 22-yard line, forcing a 40-yard field goal. On New Orleans' next 13-play, 70-yard drive, Kamara capped things off with a seven-yard touchdown, his fourth score of the day.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

SAINTS AT DALLAS (CONT.)

In the fourth quarter, Carr was intercepted on a tipped pass, but on the next play, New Orleans got the ball back on an interception by S **Tyrann Mathieu**, his second takeaway of the season. On the ensuing drive, New Orleans closed out the scoring in the contest with a 26-yard field goal by K **Blake Grupe**. Carr completed 11-of-16 passes for 243 yards with two touchdown throws and one interception, while scoring one rushing touchdown for a 125.0 passer rating. Kamara led the club in rushing with a game-high 115 yards on 20 carries with three touchdowns to go with two receptions for 65 yards, including a career-long 57-yard scoring grab on a screen pass. Shaheed led the Saints in receiving with four grabs for 96 yards with the deep touchdown, reaching the end zone in his third consecutive contest dating back to 2023.

The Saints defense harassed Prescott, sacking him three times and forcing two interceptions. CB **Alontae Taylor** led the team with a career-high nine tackles, while CB **Paulson Adebo** had his first interception of the season and DE **Carl Granderson** picked up 1.5 sacks.

- The win marked the first time the Saints have won in Dallas since a 34-31 overtime victory on December 23, 2012.
- Carr's two touchdown passes moved him into a tie for 26th all-time with Boomer Esiason. With his next scoring pass, he will move into a tie for 25th with Tony Romo.
- Shaheed's career-long 70-yard touchdown reception gives him eight career touchdowns on offense and special teams.
- Mathieu's interception was the 34th of his career since coming into the league in 2013, the most in the NFL over that time.
- A stingy Saints run defense held the Cowboys to 68 yards rushing on 21 carries [3.2 avg.].
- The 91 points by New Orleans in their first two games are tied for the second-most in NFL history through the first two games of a season, behind the Saints' 93 point total in 2009.



WEEK 3: Eagles 15, Saints 12; Sept. 22, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - Philadelphia S **Reed Blankenship** intercepted Saints QB **Derek Carr** with 48 seconds left to preserve a 15-12 win over New Orleans in the Caesars Superdome.

The Saints had overcome an unsuccessful fourth-and-one conversion attempts and a 65-yard touchdown run by Eagles RB **Saquon Barkley** to take the lead in the fourth quarter with just over two minutes left, 12-7, with a field goal and a 13-yard touchdown connection from Carr and WR **Chris Olave**.

However, upon the Eagles getting the ball back, Philadelphia QB **Jalen Hurts** completed a pass to TE **Dallas Goedert** for a 61-yard gain and Barkley punched in a touchdown from four yards in. The Eagles improved to 2-1, while the Saints fell to 2-1.

Carr completed 14-of-25 passes for 142 yards with one touchdown and one interception. Olave had six receptions for 86 yards, including a 13-yard touchdown catch. RB **Alvin Kamara** rushed for 87 yards and caught three passes for 40 yards from 127 total yards from scrimmage.

DE **Carl Granderson** had 1.5 sacks and a forced fumble and DT **Bryan Bresee** tied a career-high with two takedowns. S **Tyrann Mathieu** had an interception, giving him takeaways in four straight games for the first time in his career dating back to the 2023 season finale. CB **Paulson Adebo** led the team with a career-high ten solo tackles and one pass breakup.

- The loss snapped a four-game winning streak, and a four-game home win streak.
- For the third consecutive game, the Saints scored on their first offensive possession with the Grupe field goal. It marked the first time since Weeks 17 and 18 of the 2022 season and the 2023 season opener, that the Saints scored on their opening possession in three consecutive games.

- Mathieu's interception was the 35th of his career since coming into the league in 2013. He and Minnesota's Harrison Smith are tied as the NFL's interception leaders among active players.
- Dating back to Week 17 of the 2023 season, New Orleans has won the takeaway battle in five consecutive contests.

WEEK 4: Atlanta Falcons 26, Saints 24; September 29, 2024 @ Mercedes-Benz Stadium - Despite several significant injuries going into the contest and in-game, the Saints took the Falcons to the limit before dropping a 26-24 heartbreaker at Mercedes-Benz Stadium.

Atlanta kicker **Younghoe Koo's** 58-yard field goal with two seconds left was the difference. New Orleans rebounded from a fumbled punt return for a touchdown early in the first quarter to reach the end zone on rushing touchdowns by TE **Taysom Hill** on their first two offensive possessions, his first two scores of the season, before departing with an abdomen injury.

Atlanta took the lead back in the second quarter at 17-14 on a 53-yard Koo field goal and a 44-yard **Troy Andersen** interception return for a touchdown. Koo added to the scoring with a 44-yard field goal midway through the third quarter and then **Blake Grupe** and Koo traded field goals with the Falcons taking the end for the majority of the third and fourth quarters until QB **Derek Carr** engineered a nine-play, 42-yard drive ending with a one-yard touchdown run by RB **Alvin Kamara** with one minute left to pull ahead, 24-23. But Atlanta rallied, as the Falcons gained 30 yards on a pass interference penalty to set up Koo's 58-yard kick.

WEEK 5: Kansas City Chiefs 26, Saints 13; October 7, 2024 @ GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium - Despite missing five starters due to various injuries, the New Orleans Saints put forth a valiant effort in a 26-13 loss to the defending Super Bowl champion Kansas City Chiefs on Monday Night Football, closing to within three points early in the fourth quarter before the Chiefs had a late ten-point scoring outburst.

After falling behind 10-0 in the contest, New Orleans moved to within three points midway through the second quarter when QB **Derek Carr** found WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** for a 43-yard touchdown pass to cap a seven-play, 74-yard drive.

But after Kansas City milked the clock for a 15-play, 44-yard drive that ended with a 34-yard field goal by K **Harrison Butker**, the Chiefs forced a quick three-and-out and drove down the field for a 28-yard field goal. The two successful kicks late in the second quarter gave the Chiefs a 13-7 halftime lead.

New Orleans would rally with a 37-yard interception return by DT **Khalen Saunders** that set up a six-yard touchdown connection between Carr and TE **Foster Moreau**, but the Chiefs then ran down the field in five-plays and 68 yards, extending their lead to ten on a three-yard rushing touchdown by rookie WR **Xavier Worthy**.

WEEK 6: Tampa Bay Buccaneers 51, Saints 27; October 13, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - With the Buccaneers evacuated to New Orleans for their practice week due to Hurricane Milton, the Saints got caught in a storm of emotion and offensive production by Tampa Bay in a loss that dropped them to 2-4. Tampa Bay, who scored 24 unanswered points in the second half after trailing 27-24 at halftime, had 595 total yards of offense.

In the contest, QB **Spencer Rattler** made his first career NFL start in place of an injured **Derek Carr** [oblique]. Rattler completed 22-of-40 passes for 243 yards with a ten-yard touchdown pass to fellow rookie wide receiver **Bub Means** and two interceptions. Rattler also utilized his feet with four carries for 27 yards.

Buccaneers QB **Baker Mayfield** overcame three second quarter interceptions to complete 24-of-36 passes for 325 yards with four touchdown passes. He was aided by a ground game that added 277 yards and two touchdowns.

Mayfield and the Buccaneers jumped out to a 17-0 first quarter lead, but New Orleans would rally. Special teams provided a spark to put the team back into it. WR/RS **Rashid Shaheed** returned a punt 54 yards for a touchdown early in the second quarter to put the Saints within seven. On Tampa Bay's next possession, CB **Paulson Adebo** intercepted Mayfield and K **Blake Grupe** drilled a 29-yard field goal.

2024 GAME SUMMARIES

TAMPA BAY VS. SAINTS (CONT.)

Two plays after the field goal, S **Johnathan Abram** intercepted a tipped pass and returned it 30 yards to the Tampa Bay ten-yard line. Rattler then connected with fellow rookie WR **Bub Means** for a ten-yard touchdown to put New Orleans ahead 20-17. After Tampa Bay took the lead quickly on a Mayfield touchdown pass, the Saints responded with a seven-play, 70-yard drive that ended with a four-yard rushing touchdown by RB **Alvin Kamara** to give the Saints what would be a 27-24 halftime lead.

The two clubs traded punts on the first two possessions of the third quarter, but on New Orleans' second possession of the quarter, Tampa Bay turned up the heat on Rattler with two straight sacks on first and second down, forcing a punt. On Tampa Bay's next drive, Mayfield connected with WR **Chris Godwin** on a 55-yard touchdown to give the Buccaneers the lead for good on the afternoon.

WEEK 7: Denver Broncos 33, Saints 10; October 17, 2024 @ Caesars Superdome - Difficulties on third down and a standout performance on the ground by the Broncos offense combined to give the Saints their fifth consecutive loss.

The Broncos and Saints traded punts on their first possessions. Denver scored when they got the ball back for their second possession on a 46-yard **Wil Lutz** field goal. Broncos LB **Cody Barton** then sacked Saints QB **Spencer Rattler** and forced him to fumble with the recovery by LB **Kwon Alexander**. at the Denver 45-yard line, setting up for a 32-yard Lutz field goal.

The Saints were forced to punt on their first possession of the second quarter and Broncos QB **Bo Nix** engineered an eight-play, 86-yard drive that ended with an eight-yard touchdown run by RB **Javonte Williams** to give Denver a 13-0 lead. Nix matched a Saints field goal on his and Denver's next possession, successfully running a two-minute drill that gave the Broncos a 16-3 halftime lead following a 52-yard Lutz field goal.

Denver broke open the contest in the third quarter, where they forced three New Orleans punts and added on a 38-yard field goal by Lutz and a five-yard rushing touchdown by Williams to take a 26-3 edge going into the final period.

The Broncos scored their final points of the evening with just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter when CB **Ja'Quan McMillian** sacked Rattler and forced him to fumble, with the ball recovered by Barton and returned 52 yards for a touchdown. With QB **Jake Haener** entering the contest to allow Rattler to rest a hip pointer injury, New Orleans would achieve some offensive rhythm to end the contest when Haener engineered a 11-play, 79-yard drive that ended with a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR **Cedrick Wilson Jr.**, the second-year signal-caller's first career touchdown pass and the sixth-year wideout's first scoring grab as a Saint.

TEAM NOTES

EVANS SELECTED TO SAINTS RING OF HONOR

Former Saints G Jahri Evans will be inducted into the club's Ring of Honor during a halftime ceremony of the team's contest against the Cleveland Browns on November 17.

Evans, 6-4, 318, was originally a fourth round draft pick (108th overall) of the Saints in 2006 out of Bloomsburg and developed into an anchor for one of the most dominant offenses in NFL history during his tenure with the Saints. The Philadelphia, Pa. native started all 169 regular season games he played in at right guard and all of the team's ten postseason contests during that period, including all three during the 2009 campaign when the Saints captured Super Bowl XLIV.

A five-time Associated Press All-Pro (2009-13), Evans was selected first-team four times, twice as much as any other Saint. Evans was selected to six straight Pro Bowls (2009-14) and was named to the Pro Football Hall of Fame's 2010's All-Decade Team. During his 11-year tenure, the Saints were ranked first in the NFL in total offense (net yards per game) six times (2006, 2008-09, 2011, 2014 and 2016) and in scoring (points per game) twice (2008-09). The 274 sacks surrendered by the Saints offensive line from 2006-16 were the lowest total in the NFL over the period and the unit was recognized twice (2009 and 2011) as the winner of the Madden Pro-tector Offensive Line Award.

Evans closed out his playing career starting 14 games at right guard for the Green Bay Packers in 2017, finishing with 183 total games played/started. A Pro Football Hall of Fame semifinalist in 2023 and finalist in 2024, Evans began his coaching career as an offensive assistant for the Saints in 2023.

Brother Klein works in the Dallas Cowboys player personnel department.

Vice President/Asst. General Manager-College Personnel Jeff Ireland - Stepson of Chiefs Hall of Fame linebacker/center E.J. Holub. Grandson of Philadelphia Eagles running back and Chicago Bears personnel executive Jim Parmer.

National Scout Terry Wooden - Brother, Jojo is Senior Director of Player Personnel for the Las Vegas Raiders.

QB Derek Carr - Older brother, David was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2002 NFL Draft by the Houston Texans and played quarterback in the league for 11 seasons with Houston, Carolina, the New York Giants and San Francisco. Uncle, Lon Boyett, played tight end for Tampa Bay, the Raiders and San Francisco.

LB Demario Davis - Cousin of the late Steve McNair, the standout quarterback for the Tennessee Titans [1995-2005] and Baltimore Ravens [2006-07].

QB Taysom Hill - Brother-in-law, David Nixon, played linebacker and on special teams for the Oakland Raiders [2009], Houston Texans [2010] and St. Louis Rams [2010-11].

DB Jordan Howden - Cousin, Saladin Martin, played cornerback with the New York Jets [1980] and San Francisco 49ers [1981].

TE Juwan Johnson - Brother, George, played defensive end for eight years in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers, Minnesota Vikings, Detroit Lions and Saints.

DE Cameron Jordan - Father, Steve, had a prolific 13-year career at tight end for the Minnesota Vikings, with six Pro Bowl selections, being inducted into their Ring of Honor.

C/G Erik McCoy - Cousin of former Dolphins and Buccaneers running back Jorvorski Lane.

LB Pete Werner - Father, Greg, played nine games at right end and on special teams for the New York Jets in 1989 and went to training camp with the Philadelphia Eagles in 1990.

WR Cedrick Wilson Jr. - Father, Cedrick Sr., is a former NFL wideout, who played for seven years in the league, including a Super Bowl championship with the Pittsburgh Steelers.

Area Scout Joey Vitt - Father, Joe Vitt, is a longtime NFL assistant coach, who served as assistant head coach/linebackers of the Saints from 2006-16 and also had coaching stints with the Seattle Seahawks, Baltimore Colts, Los Angeles/St. Louis Rams, Kansas City Chiefs, New York Jets and Denver Broncos.

Area Scout Matt Phillips - Father, Ted, worked in the Chicago Bears front office from 1983-2022, including serving his last 24 years as team president.

ROSTER ROLL CALL

On the Saints active roster as of October 17, 34 were on the active roster, a reserve list of the practice squad at the end of the 2023 season. Among newcomers, the roster includes seven unrestricted free agents, one trade acquisition, six draft picks and five rookie free agents.

Of the players, 24 have less than four years of previous NFL experience, including ten rookies. HIGHER EDUCATION

40 colleges and universities are represented on the Saints' 53-man roster. Of that total, eight are represented by multiple Saints, four from Ohio State, three from Fresno State and two from BYU, Mississippi State, LSU, Notre Dame, Tennessee, Northern Iowa, South Carolina and Vanderbilt.

BUCKING THE ODDS

The Saints have a long tradition of finding players as free agents signed after the draft that make an impact immediately or after developing their careers initially on the practice squad. Several undrafted Saints on the roster play key roles on offense, defense and special teams, including six undrafted rookies who are on the 53-man roster.

Over the past 21 years, the Saints (2018-22: defensive back **J.T. Gray**, wide receiver/return specialist **Deonte Harty** and wide receiver/return specialist **Rashid Shaheed**) and San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers (2003: guard **Kris Dielman**, tight end **Antonio Gates** and wide receiver **Kasim Osgood**) are the only two teams to have three players signed as undrafted free agents be selected to a Pro Bowl for the team that originally signed them.

In 2023, Shaheed was no longer a secret around the National Football League, as he appeared in 15 games with six starts and caught 46 passes for 719 yards (club-best 15.6 avg.) with five touchdown grabs to tie for the team lead, including seven receptions of 40-or-more yards, while also carrying seven times for 37 yards and ranking second in the NFC and third in the NFL in punt return average (13.6) and tenth in the league in all-purpose yards (1,479), despite missing two contests with a quad injury. Tying for the team lead with six total touchdowns including a punt return touchdown, Shaheed was selected as both Pro Bowl starter as a return specialist and as a first-team *Associated Press* All-Pro as a punt returner.

An integral part of both the team’s offense and return game, Shaheed and the Saints agreed to a contract extension prior to the start of training camp. Through six games before suffering a season-ending knee injury vs. Tampa Bay, Oct. 13, Shaheed had 20 receptions for 349 yards (17.5 avg.) with touchdowns of 43-, 59- and 70 yards, carried six times for 29 yards, returned nine punts for a league-best 143 yards (NFL-high 15.9 avg.) and six kickoff returns for 171 yards (28.5 avg.). Rasheed’s 15.9 punt return average ranks first in the NFL and his 692 all-purpose yards rank fourth. Overall, since coming into the league in 2022, his 14 catches of 40 yards or more rank second in the NFL. With his second career punt return on a 54-yard runback on Oct. 13 vs. Tampa Bay, Shaheed joins Reggie Bush (4) and Tyrone Hughes (2) as only the third Saint with multiple punt returns for touchdowns.

Originally signed as an undrafted free agent in 2018, spending part of his rookie season on the practice squad, Gray's 79 special teams tackles since 2019 rank first in the NFL, as he has been selected as both an *Associated Press* first-team All-Pro and Pro Bowler. In 2023, the special teams captain finished the season with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the league, despite missing three contests with injuries. In 2024, he is ranked first on the team with 14 stops and had a blocked punt on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia.

Defensive end **Carl Granderson** joined the club in 2019 as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming and has appeared in 78 regular season games with 31 starts, posting 206 tackles (119 solo), 26 sacks for a loss of 166.5 yards, two passes defended, four forced fumbles and two recoveries. In 2023, Granderson earned the starting right end position and posted a career-high 78 tackles (44 solo), led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a loss of 55 yards, defended one pass and forced a fumble and recovered one. Granderson's 78 stops ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints lineman since 2004. He has opened all seven games in 2024 and has 27 tackles (16 solo), three sacks and one forced fumble.



after a graduate transfer season at Notre Dame and playing most of his college career at Arkansas State, kicker **Blake Grupe** won a preseason competition to handle placekicking duties and in two seasons, has drilled 41-of-48 field goal attempts (85.4 pct.), including drilling all 11 kicks in 2024 with a career-long of 57 yards in the season-opening win over Carolina. Dating back to the Dec. 17, 2023 win over the New York Giants, Grupe has made 17 consecutive field goals, the longest streak of his career. He is one of five kickers (min. nine att.) to make all of his attempts.

New Orleans signed punter **Matthew Hayball** out of Vanderbilt following the NFL Draft. The West Adelaide, Australia native finished as Vandy's all-time leader in punting average (46.5) and was a consensus second-team All-American in 2023, when he ranked seventh nationally in net (43.1). Hayball won a training camp competition to secure the job. In seven games, he has punted 26 times with a 41.1 net punting average.

Joining New Orleans following the 2023 NFL Draft, Signing with New Orleans following the 2024 NFL Draft, guard **Kyle Hergel** appeared in 57 games with 56 starts along the offensive lines to North Dakota (2018-21), Texas State (2021-22) and Boston College (2023). An honorable mention All-ACC selection after starting all 13 games for the Eagles at left guard in 2023, Hergel engaged in competition along the offensive line in training camp and after spending the start of the season on the practice squad, has contributed on special teams in four contests in 2024 and seeing his first action on the offensive line on Thursday night vs. Denver.

Tight end **Dallin Holker** was signed by New Orleans after a standout graduate transfer campaign at Colorado State, where he posted 64 receptions for 767 yards with six touchdowns, the highest total of yardage and scoring grabs in the college regular season by an Football Bowl Subdivision tight end. Holker's performance in the offseason and training camp secured a roster spot behind Johnson, Taysom Hill and Foster Moreau.

Wide receiver **Jermaine Jackson** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Idaho after starting his college career at the College of San Mateo (Calif.). In 2023, the Oakland, Calif. native was one of the most dynamic returners in college, bringing back 18 punts for 332 yards (18.4 avg.) with two touchdowns to go with 18 kickoff returns for 478 yards (26.6 avg.) and 48 receptions for 593 yards (12.4 avg.) with two touchdowns. Following Shaheed’s season-ending knee injury, Jackson was signed to the active roster from the practice squad for Thursday’s contest vs. Denver and returned two punts for 13 yards and four kickoffs for 100 yards.

Tight end **Juwan Johnson** first led Saints tight ends with four touchdown receptions in 2021, converting to the position that offseason after playing wideout in college and as a rookie in 2020, signed as an undrafted free agent from Oregon. In 2022, he led the Black and Gold tight ends in receiving with 42 grabs for 508 yards with a club-best and career-high seven touchdowns, tied for third at the position in the NFL. Johnson led the team’s tight ends with 37 grabs for 368 yards with four touchdown grabs in 2023. Johnson has led the Saints with 12 receiving touchdowns over the past three seasons, tied for fourth over that period among league National Football League tight ends.

In 2024, Johnson quickly recovered from foot surgery in June and has played in all seven games, recording 15 receptions for 136 yards with one touchdown. Johnson has combined with Foster Moreau to form an effective tight end duo for quarterback Spencer Rattler in the absence of starter Derek Carr due to an oblique injury.

After originally signing as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, linebacker **Anfernee Orji** received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Demario Davis and Pete Werner. He ranks second on the team with ten coverage stops and has also added 15 defensive tackles. [nine solo].

Cornerback **Rico Payton** signed a college free agent contract in the spring, playing his final four years at Pittsburg State. As a senior in 2023, the St. Louis native recorded 35 tackles with four interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Payton secured a roster spot with his performance in training camp practices and preseason games, leading the team with five passes defensed and adding seven defensive tackles and one coverage stop in three contests. Payton has contributed on both defense and special teams in the first seven games with one pass breakup and four coverage stops.

After originally signing with New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Utah in 2022, linebacker **Nephi Sewell** has become a valued member of the special teams units, while also providing depth on defense. In his first full season in 2023 on the active roster, Sewell totaled five coverage stops and one forced fumble on special teams and ten defensive tackles. Sewell is currently on Reserve/Physically Unable to Perform, recovering from a knee injury suffered in Week 17 of the 2023 campaign, but expected to return to practice soon.

Wide receiver **Mason Tipton** stuck on the 53-man roster after showing bright spots in training camp practices, following a college career at Yale, where he posted 132 receptions for 1,067 yards with 19 TDs. In 2024, he has 12 receptions for 85 yards.

The Saints have won a franchise-record six consecutive season openers dating back to 2019. The six-game opener winning streak is the longest current streak in the National Football League.

Signed by the Saints following the 2018 NFL Draft out of Mississippi State, Gray has been voted by teammates as a special teams captain for the past three seasons and has been selected both as a Pro Bowl starter and AP All-Pro. Playing in 87 career games, Gray has career totals of 80 special teams stops, two blocked punts, three fumble recoveries and 12 defensive tackles, 2.5 sacks, one forced fumble and a pass defense. In 2023, he finished with 11 coverage stops to lead the team and tie for 12th in the NFL in 14 contests. Gray’s special teams impact was at its best on Sept. 22, when he blocked a punt in the third quarter vs. Philadelphia, the second of his career.



Gray’s 81 tackles since 2018 are ranked second in the NFL, despite missing six total contests in 2022 and 2023 with injuries. QUARTERBACKS

DEREK CARR



On March 6, 2023, the Saints agreed to terms with Derek Carr on a four-year contract to solidify the quarterback position. He spent the first nine seasons of his NFL career with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders. Originally selected in the second round [36th overall] of the 2014 NFL Draft by the Raiders out of Fresno State, the Bakersfield, Calif. native has started all 164 career regular season games he has played in, the most starts at the position over that time, completing 3,666-of-5,634 passes [65.1 pct.] for 40,089 yards with 250 touchdown passes, 111 interceptions and a 92.5 passer rating, while adding 907 rushing yards and seven touchdowns. Since entering the league in 2014, Carr ranks first in the NFL in completions, second in passing yardage and sixth in passing touchdowns. He became the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for 3,000-plus yards in each of his first ten seasons, joining Pro Football Hall of Fame signal-caller Peyton Manning and Russell Wilson. He is just the seventh player in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards in his first nine seasons and has completed 314 passes of 25+ yards since he entered the league in 2014, third-most in the NFL over that span.

Carr started all 17 games in 2023 and completed 375-of-548 passes [68.4 pct.] for 3,878 yards with 25 touchdowns, eight interceptions and a 97.7 passer rating. He finished his first season in Black and Gold ranked second in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating [106.9], sixth in completion percentage, seventh in completions and tenth in TD passes and passer rating.

In 2024, Carr has completed 90-of-128 passes [70.3 pct.] for 989 yards, eight touchdowns, only four interceptions and a 100.7 passer rating. Carr ranks fifth in touchdown percentage [6.3] and completion percentage, eighth in passer rating and ninth in yards per attempt [7.73]. He has missed his first games as a Saint in Weeks Six-Seven [oblique].

ALVIN KAMARA

A talented runner and receiver who was selected by the Saints in the third round of the 2017 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Kamara enjoyed an outstanding rookie campaign. He ranked first on the club and sixth in the NFL in yards from scrimmage (1,554), second on the team in rushing and receiving, carrying 120 times for 728 yards (6.1 avg) with eight TDs and a two-point conversion, catching 81 passes for 826 yards (10.2 avg) with five touchdowns and one kickoff return for a touchdown. Kamara set a club rookie record with 14 total scores, tied for second in the NFL and finished first in the league in yards per carry. Kamara was the first Saints offensive rookie selected to the Pro Bowl since Rueben Mayes (1986), as an AP second team All-Pro (flex), the club’s first rookie All-Pro since 1993. He was also named *The Sporting News* NFL Rookie of the Year and AP NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In 108 career regular season games with 77 starts, Kamara has carried 1,426 times for 6,267 yards (4.4 avg.) with 60 touchdowns and has caught 539 passes for 4,471 yards (8.3 avg.) with 24 touchdowns. Kamara is the franchise’s all-time leader in rushing touchdowns, total touchdowns (85), total yards from scrimmage (10,738) and all-purpose yardage (11,396) and is ranked second in rushing yards.

Kamara is off to a spectacular start in 2024, carrying 111 times for 438 yards with six touchdowns and catching a club-best 34 passes for 252 yards (7.4 avg.) with a career-long 57-yard touchdown. With a nose for the end zone and the chains, he is ranked third in the league in first downs (37), fourth in total yards from scrimmage (690), tied for third in total touchdowns and rushing touchdowns and leads running backs in receiving.

JAMAAL WILLIAMS

This seven-year NFL veteran was signed by the New Orleans Saints as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason. In eight NFL seasons with Green Bay [2017-20], Detroit [2021-22] and New Orleans [2023-], Williams has played in 110 games with 44 starts, carrying 1,051 times for 4,078 yards with 32 touchdowns, also catching 182 passes for 1,282 yards with eight touchdowns for 5,353 total yards from scrimmage. Williams is part of a formidable rushing trio with Kamara and his former college teammate, Taysom Hill.

JORDAN MIMS

A former standout at Fresno State, where he rushed for 3,285 yards and 37 TDs, Mims joined the Saints practice squad after going to training camp with Buffalo and contributed on special teams in two games for the Black and Gold in 2023. 6-0, 205, Mims will contribute in the run game and on special teams after earning a roster spot and had his first coverage tackle, Sept. 22, vs. Philadelphia.

KENDRE MILLER

A third round draft pick of the Saints in 2023, Miller was a three-year standout at TCU, posting 2,410 rushing yards and 26 touchdowns in only 33 games with 17 starts. In 2022, the first-team All-Big 12 selection carried 242 times for 1,399 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Limited to eight games as a rookie due to injuries, when he carried 41 times for 156 yards, one touchdown and ten receptions for 117 yards, Miller made his 2024 debut on Thursday night vs. Denver, when he carried six times for a club-best 36 yards and added one reception.

OLAVE WIDE RECEIVERS

The 11th overall pick in the 2022 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented wideout made an immediate impact as a rookie, catching 72 passes for 1,042 yards [14.5 avg.] and four TDs, leading the team in receptions, receiving average and receiving yards, while earning September NFL Offensive Rookie of the Month honors as the 24th player since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger to record 1,000 receiving yards as a rookie. Olave became the third Saints rookie to reach 1,000 receiving yards and the first Saints rookie since WR Danny Abramowicz [1967] to lead the team in receiving, receiving yardage and yards per catch in his first campaign.

In 2023, Olave took the next step in his career, leading the team in receiving and receiving yardage for the second consecutive season with 87 receptions for 1,123 yards and five touchdowns, tying for the team lead. The Southern California native became the seventh Saint with 85 receptions in a season and the sixth with 1,100 receiving yards in a season. In 2024, he leads the wideout corps in receiving with 23 grabs for 280 yards with one touchdown through the first six games.

BY THE NUMBERS

CEDRICK WILSON JR.

This seventh-year wideout was signed by New Orleans to a two-year contract at the start of free agency to compete for snaps on offense and to provide veteran leadership to the wideout room. In 75 regular season games with seven starts, he has recorded 110 receptions for 1,357 yards with 12 touchdowns. In 2023, the Memphis native posted 22 catches for 296 yards with three touchdowns, adding three grabs for 37 yards in the postseason. Wilson has nine grabs for 88 yards with one touchdown in 2024, after recording six grabs for a game-high 57 yards with one score on Thursday night, vs. Denver.

BUB MEANS

A fifth round pick of the Saints in 2024, Means played wideout for two seasons at Louisiana Tech and his final two at Pittsburgh, recording career totals of 90 receptions for 1,522 yards (17.2 avg.) with ten touchdowns. Earning Honorable Mention All-ACC in 2023, when he compiled 41 receptions for 721 yards (17.6 avg.) and six touchdowns. Means has seen an expanded role in the Saints wide receiver corps following injuries to the group, playing in six games with one start and recording eight receptions for 82 yards with one touchdown.

TIGHT ENDS

TAYSOM HILL

Hill has brought unheralded versatility to the Saints offense and special teams. A participant on special teams since midseason in 2017, as well as a signal-caller and as a runner and receiver, Hill has played in 100 regular season games with 44 starts at several positions. He has carried 412 times for 2,236 yards, the most by a Saint not to play running back, with 29 touchdowns, ranked fifth in club records. In the passing game, he has caught 78 passes for 758 yards with 11 touchdowns, completed 191-of-298 passes (64.1 pct.) for 2,348 yards with 11 touchdowns, returned 19 kickoffs for 447 yards, made 15 special teams tackles and blocked one punt.

In 2023, Hill ranked second on the team in rushing with 81 carries for 401 yards (5.0 avg.) with four touchdowns, caught a career-high 33 passes for 291 yards with two TDs, completed six-of-11 passes for 83 yards with one TD and a 109.3 passer rating, returned a kickoff 18 yards and had two special teams tackles.

RENAISSANCE MAN

Hill turned in an all-around standout performance in the November 5, 2023 win over the Chicago Bears, where he led the team in rushing, carrying 11 times for 52 yards (4.7 avg.), completed a three-yard touchdown pass to tight end Juwan Johnson and caught four passes for 13 yards with one touchdown.

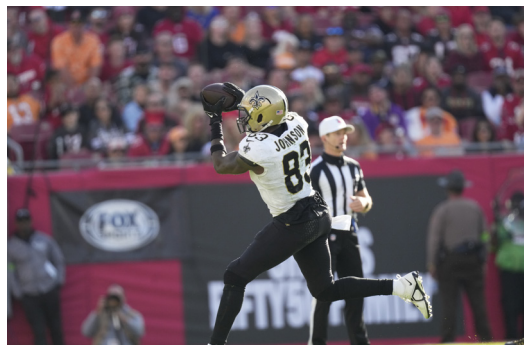
JUWAN JOHNSON

The former Penn State and Oregon wideout joined the New Orleans Saints in 2020 following the NFL Draft and transitioned to tight end his second season in 2021. In 2022, the New Jersey native had a breakout campaign as he appeared in 16 games with 12 starts and finished with 42 receptions for 508 yards and a team-best seven touchdown grabs. Johnson was tied for third among National Football League tight ends in receiving touchdowns. Overall, Johnson’s 15 touchdown grabs since 2021 lead the team.

In 13 games with 11 starts in 2023, Johnson finished with 37 receptions for 368 yards and four touchdowns to lead the position group in all major receiving categories. In his final four contests of the season, three of which were Saints victories, Johnson had 17 grabs for 206 yards and three touchdowns. In 2024, he has 15 grabs for 136 yards.

BIG TARGET

Johnson’s 12 touchdown grabs since 2022 rank fifth among NFL tight ends following his 16-yard scoring grab in the season opener.

FOSTER MOREAU

This veteran tight end and New Orleans native who was a standout at Jesuit High School and Louisiana State University signed with the Saints in the 2023 offseason. He finished his fifth National Football League season and first with the Black and Gold after spending his first four campaigns with the Oakland/Las Vegas Raiders, who originally selected him in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft. In his career, Moreau has contributed both as a pass catcher and blocker, appearing in 83 regular season games with 51 starts and has recorded 123 receptions for 1,450 yards [11.8 avg.] with 15 touchdowns, also adding seven special teams tackles.

In his first season with the Saints, Moreau was selected as the club’s winner of the Ed Block Courage Award, recognizing his recovery and return to the field following an offseason diagnosis of Nodular Lymphocyte-Pedominant Hodgkins Lymphoma [NLPHL] at a free agency physical with the team. Moreau returned to the field following the NFL Draft and also battled a nagging ankle injury to play in 15 games with ten starts and recorded 21 receptions for 193 yards with one touchdown.

In 2024, Moreau leads the Saints tight ends in receiving touchdowns with two scoring grabs on 11 catches for 150 yards [13.6 avg.], starting all seven games. In the past three games, he has caught six passes for 105 yards, including QB Derek Carr’s 150th touchdown pass as well as 41- and 32-yard gains from Spencer Rattler.



DEFENSIVE LINE

CAMERON JORDAN

New Orleans' first choice in the 2011 NFL Draft [24th overall] out of the University of California, Jordan has played in 216 career regular season games with 215 starts, recording 785 tackles [482 solo], a franchise record 117.5 sacks for a loss of 779.5 yards, three interceptions, 65 pass breakups, 15 forced fumbles and 11 fumble recoveries. In 2023, despite a lingering ankle injury, Jordan started every contest and recorded 43 tackles [20 solo], two sacks, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.

Jordan has posted 117.5 career sacks since 2011 and is the only player to have 100 takedowns and 60 passes defended. During this time, the Saints own a 57-23 regular season record when he corrals a signal caller and boast a 24-3 mark in a multi-sack performance. Jordan's 27 multi-sack games are tied for first in franchise record books with Rickey Jackson's 27, with both of them leading the franchise with six performances of at least three sacks.

MR. 200

On Dec. 24, 2022, at Cleveland, Jordan played in his 200th career game [regular season/postseason combined] in a Black and Gold uniform, moving him into third place on the club's all-time games played list. The following week at Philadelphia, Jan. 1, 2023, Jordan also started his 200th career game, joining Drew Brees as only the second player to open 200 contests in franchise history. On Sept. 24, 2023, at Green Bay, Jordan played in his 206th career game, passing Thomas Morstead for second all-time in club record books. On Oct. 29, 2023, Jordan became only the second Saints player, first defensive Saint and 57th NFL defensive lineman to play in 200 regular season contests. On Nov. 5, 2023 vs. Chicago, he became only the second Saint to start 200 career regular season contests. Jordan has played in 216 career regular season games and playing in his 217th game on Sunday, he will take sole possession of 25th all-time for games played among defensive lineman.

Until missing the Dec. 12, 2021 contest at the New York Jets on the Reserve/COVID-19 list, Jordan had enjoyed the longest active games played streak [172] among position players and the longest games started streak. Missing one contest in 2022 [eye], his first due to injury, Jordan played in at least 16 contests in his first 12 seasons. In 2023, he played in every game for the 12th time in his 14-year career, opening all 17 contests.

Jordan is now one of only 15 National Football League players to have at least 15 sacks against two opponents, 17 against the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and 23 against the Atlanta Falcons, both NFC South divisional rivals. Jordan's 23 takedowns of former Atlanta QB Matt Ryan are the most sacks a player has had against an individual quarterback in NFL history.

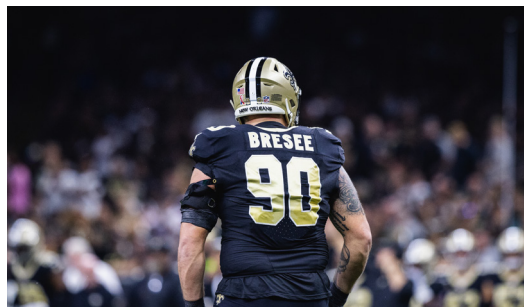

BRYAN BRESEE

The team’s first round selection in the 2023 NFL Draft out of Clemson after being a three-time All-ACC selection, the Maryland native played in 26 games with 21 starts for the Tigers, producing 54 tackles [35 solo], 15 stops for loss, nine sacks, a forced fumble, an interception and five passes defensed.

Bresee immediately found a role in New Orleans’ interior rotation and appeared in all 17 games, recording 24 tackles, 4.5 sacks and six pass breakups. His takedown total was the highest by a Saints rookie defensive tackle since becoming an official statistic in 1982 and his pass defense total was the most in club records for a rookie at the position since the statistic was officially recorded in 1980, Bresee also tied for second in the league among defensive tackles in 2023.

Bresee is enjoying a breakout sophomore campaign, starting all four games and tying for second in the NFL among defensive tackles with four sacks.

CARL GRANDERSON

Signed by New Orleans as an undrafted free agent out of Wyoming in 2019, Granderson posted 17.5 sacks in college and possesses the prototypical frame for an NFL pass rusher. Granderson has become a significant cog in the team’s defensive line rotation with 206 tackles, 26 sacks, two pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two recoveries.

Earning the starting right defensive end position in 2023, Granderson posted a career-high 78 tackles [44 solo], led the team with a career-best 8.5 sacks for a 55-yard loss, one pass defense, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Through five games in 2024, Granderson has 27 tackles, three sacks and one forced fumble.

TACKLES UP FRONT

Granderson’s 78 tackles in 2023 ranked fifth in the National Football League among defensive linemen and were the most by a Saints defensive lineman since 2004.

PAYTON TURNER

With the 28th overall pick in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Houston, the Saints added to the defensive line with this gifted pass rusher. In 18 career games, Turner has recorded 29 tackles, three sacks, one pass breakup one fumble recovery, one special teams stop and one blocked field goal. In 2023, the Texan suffered a toe injury in the season-opening win over Tennessee that would sideline him for 15 contests. However, Turner returned for the season finale vs. Atlanta and recorded the first fumble recovery of his career, showing his promise both with his pass rush and playmaking abilities. Turner is a part of the team’s defensive line rotation in 2024 with one sack, two passes defensed and two special teams stops.

CHASE YOUNG

Originally selected by Washington with the second overall pick in the 2020 NFL Draft out of Ohio State, this talented edge rusher is in his fifth season in the NFL and first with New Orleans. In five campaigns for Washington [2020-23], San Francisco [2023] and New Orleans [2024], Young has appeared in 50 regular season games with 32 starts and recorded 116 tackles [77 solo], 18.0 sacks, 23 stops for loss, nine pass breakups, six forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. The consensus NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Young recorded 44 tackles, 7.5 sacks, ten stops for loss and made multiple splash plays with four forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries in 2020. Young played in only 12 games from 2021-22 after suffering a knee injury midway through his second campaign. In 2023, he played in seven games for Washington and nine for San Francisco following a midseason trade and tied his career-best with 7.5 takedowns in helping the 49ers advance to Super Bowl LVIII. Young has fit in with the New Orleans defensive line and his addition will be a boost to the front.

NATHAN SHEPHERD

Originally selected by the New York Jets in the third round of the 2018 NFL Draft out of Fort Hays State, this versatile defensive tackle enters his seventh NFL season, his second campaign with the Saints. The Ajax, Ontario, Canada native has appeared in 97 career games with 36 starts, totaling 177 tackles [93 solo] and nine sacks for a loss of 75 yards. In 2023, this valued free agent acquisition started all 17 games for New Orleans in the middle, posting career-highs in tackles [50], solo stops [26] and sacks [three].

KHALEN SAUNDERS

Originally selected by the Kansas City Chiefs in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft out of Western Illinois, Saunders enters his sixth NFL season and second campaign with New Orleans. Signed as an unrestricted free agent in the 2023 offseason, Saunders combined with two other newcomers in Shepherd and Bresee to form a new interior front, recording career-highs in tackles [57] and solo stops [24]. In 58 career regular season games with 23 starts, Saunders has recorded 148 tackles [68 solo], 4.5 sacks, one interception, four pass breakups and four stops for loss.

LINEBACKERS



DEMARIO DAVIS

This dependable and sure-tackling defender joined the New Orleans Saints in 2018 after spending his first six NFL seasons with the New York Jets and Cleveland Browns. In his career, the Brandon, Miss. native has appeared in 200 regular season games with 186 starts for the Jets [2012-15, 2017], Browns [2016] and the Saints [2018-], recording 1,377 stops [892 solo], 43.5 sacks, three interceptions, 55 pass breakups, four forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and 24 special teams tackles.

In 2023, Davis started every contest and again led the Black and Gold in tackles with 121 stops [74 solo], ranked second with 6.5 sacks and added one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and four pass breakups. He joined LB Joe Federspiel as only the second Saint to have 100 stops in six straight seasons, having done so in his last seven campaigns and his tenth season overall of his 12-year National Football League career.

Through six games in 2024, Davis has 42 stops [22 solo], one pass defense and one sack, despite missing the first game of his career due to injury in Week Four. Davis played in his 200th career game on Thursday night against Denver.

PETE WERNER

New Orleans selected this three-year starter from Ohio State in the second round of the 2021 NFL Draft. The Indianapolis native finished his college career playing in 47 career games with 35 starts, recording 185 tackles (111 solo), 16 stops for loss, four sacks, 11 pass breakups, four forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Werner helped power the Buckeyes to the College Football Playoff championship game as a senior in 2020, when he was voted by the Big Ten coaches as a first-team All-Conference selection and a Butkus Award semi-finalist, posting 54 tackles, 2.5 stops for loss, one sack and two forced fumbles.

In four seasons, Werner has played in 47 games with 39 starts and has recorded 252 tackles (163 solo), a split sack, one interception, four pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and three special teams stops.

Werner finished the 2023 season ranked second on the team with 93 stops, a split sack, one interception, one pass breakup and two fumble recoveries, tied for the team lead. In the second week of 2024 training camp, he agreed to terms with the Saints on a three-year contract extension.

WILLIE GAY JR.

A contributor on defense for the back-to-back Super Bowl Champion Kansas City Chiefs, this sideline to sideline linebacker joined the Saints at the start of the 2024 free agency period. In five seasons, Gay has played in 63 regular season games with 53 starts, posting 243 tackles (157 solo), six sacks, four interceptions, including one returned for a touchdown, 21 pass breakups, three forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries and seven special teams stops. In nine postseason games played/starts, Gay has accumulated 29 stops, a split sack and three passes defended.

In his final season in Kansas City, Gay played in 16 regular season games with 15 starts for the Chiefs and finished the season with 58 tackles (44 solo), one sack, one interception, four pass breakups, one forced fumble and a career-high three fumble recoveries. In three postseason starts en route to the Super Bowl Championship, Gay collected nine more stops and one pass defense. Despite missing one contest with a hand injury, Gay leads the Saints in 2024 with two fumble recoveries.

ANFERNEE ORJI

After originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of Vanderbilt in 2023, where he led the Commodores in tackles in each of his final three seasons, Orji spent his entire rookie season on the club's practice squad. He received the opportunity to see extensive snaps in practice in training camp due to injuries to teammates Davis and Werner. In three preseason contests, Orji led the team with 20 tackles (team-high 13 solo), one stop for loss, two passes defended and three special teams stops, securing a 53-man roster spot. He ranks second on the team with ten special teams tackles and has added 15 defensive stops.

SECONDARY

S TYRANN MATHIEU

This versatile, hard-hitting, playmaking safety and New Orleans native enters his third season with his hometown team, signing after the 2022 NFL Draft. Mathieu has brought experience and leadership to the Saints secondary. He was originally selected by the Arizona Cardinals in the third round (69th overall) in the 2013 NFL Draft out of LSU and has played for the Cardinals (2013-17), Houston Texans (2018), Kansas City Chiefs (2019-21) and Saints (2022-). In 11 NFL seasons, he has played in 170 regular season games with 161 starts and has posted career totals of 800 tackles (655 solo), 43 stops for loss, 11 sacks for a loss of 78 yards, 35 interceptions for 524 return yards, four brought back for touchdowns, 101 passes defended, six forced fumbles, eight fumble recoveries and five special teams stops. Mathieu has been selected to three Pro Bowls, three Associated Press All-Pro teams and the Pro Football Hall of Fame’s 2010’s All-Decade Team.

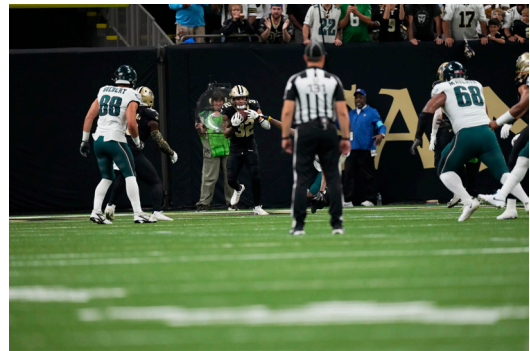
In his second season in New Orleans in 2023, Mathieu opened all 17 contests for the second consecutive campaign and finished with 75 tackles (50 solo), four interceptions, tied for seventh in the NFL and the team lead, returned for 122 yards with a TD and nine passes defended.

THE ONLY ONE

In 2024, Mathieu is his usual playmaking self. Through seven games, he has opened every contest at free safety and posted 28 tackles (21 solo), two interceptions, three pass breakups, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery. Mathieu is tied for ninth in the National Football League with two interceptions and is tied for first on the club with three total takeaways.

FOUR IN A ROW

Dating back to an interception in the 2023 season finale vs. Atlanta, recovering a fumble in the 2024 season opener vs. Carolina and picking off Dallas Cowboys quarterback Dak Prescott and Philadelphia Eagles signal-caller Jalen Hurts in Weeks Three and Four, Mathieu recorded a least one takeaway in four consecutive games for the first time in his career. Mathieu is the first Saints defender to record takeaways in four consecutive contests since safety Sammy Knight had at least one in five consecutive contests from Oct. 7-Nov. 4, 2001.



NOSE FOR THE BALL

Mathieu’s 35 interceptions since coming into the NFL in 2013 are first in the league over the period after tying for the club lead with four picks in 2023 and leading the team with two in 2024. Mathieu’s 35 career picks are tied for first among active players, with Vikings S Harrison Smith.

SAINTS AT CHARGERS

CB MARSHON LATTIMORE

Selected by the Saints in the first round [11th overall] of the 2017 NFL Draft Lattimore started all 13 games he appeared in. He totaled 53 tackles [44 solo], a forced fumble, one fumble recovery, five interceptions for 85 yards and 18 passes defended. As a rookie, Lattimore became the youngest Saint [21 years old] ever selected to the Pro Bowl and was voted as the AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year.

In his eighth season, Lattimore has started all 96 regular season games he has played in, recording 403 tackles [324 solo], 15 interceptions, 87 passes defended, five forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries, earning Pro Bowl honors in four seasons.

To open 2023, Lattimore came up with a standout performance in the opening win over Tennessee. In addition to his 15th career pick, to move him into a tie for eighth place in club record books in interceptions, he also finished with four passes defended, the third time in his career he has deflected at least four throws in a contest. In a season cut short by an ankle injury, he started the first ten games and posted 48 stops, one pick and eight passes defended. In 2024, he has opened five games and recorded 24 tackles and one pass defense, assigned to covering the top receiver of opponents.

GET A HAND ON

Lattimore's 87 passes defended since entering the NFL in 2017 are ranked fifth in the league.

CB PAULSON ADEBO

New Orleans' third round selection [76th overall] in the 2021 NFL Draft out of Stanford, Adebo overcame not playing college football in 2020 to make significant contributions to the Saints secondary in his first season with the club. The Texas native finished his college career playing in 22 games with 21 starts for Stanford and recording 97 tackles, 34 pass breakups and eight interceptions, earning All-Pac 12 honors in both 2018 and 2019.

Joining the starting lineup immediately as a rookie in 2021, Adebo has played in 50 games with 49 starts, posting 235 tackles, nine interceptions, 41 pass breakups, two forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and two special teams stops.

Sharpened by an extensive training camp competition, Adebo enjoyed a breakout 2023 campaign. His season was highlighted by a two interception, three total takeaway performance in the Nov. 5, 24-17 win over Chicago that earned him NFC Defensive Player of the Week. Adebo finished with 76 tackles to lead the secondary, four interceptions, tied for first on the team with Mathieu, 18 pass breakups to rank third in the league, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries, also adding a pick on a two-point attempt in the Dec. 31, 23-13 win at Tampa Bay.

ALONTAE TAYLOR

Selected by the Saints in the second round (49th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft out of Tennessee, Taylor shook off early injuries to play in 13 games with nine starts and posted 45 tackles (38 solo) and a club-best 11 pass breakups, ranked fourth among NFL rookies.

Moving to the nickel position in 2023, possessing extensive experience on the inside and the outside, Taylor appeared in all 17 games with 13 starts and recorded 75 tackles, his first two career interceptions and a career-high 14 pass breakups, tied for second on the team and ninth in the NFL.

In 2024, Taylor ranks third on the team with 41 tackles (31 solo), ranks second with 3.5 sacks and has added six passes defended and a team-best two forced fumbles..

DB DROP

In the Sept. 8 season-opening win over Carolina, Taylor became the first Saints defensive back to record three sacks in a contest since the statistic was officially recognized by the NFL in 1982. The only other defensive back to record three sacks on kickoff weekend is former Chargers S Rodney Harrison (vs. Buffalo, 9/6/98). After splitting a sack on Sept. 22 vs. Philadelphia, Taylor's 3.5 sacks are the second-highest total by a cornerback in Saints record books behind Alex Molden's four in 1997.

BREAKING UP

In 2022, Taylor was the first rookie since Lattimore to lead the Saints in pass breakups (11), and only the fourth in team history to do so (Saints did not track passes defended before 1980). He followed that up by finishing tied for second on the team with 14 in 2023.

- Rookie QB **Spencer Rattler** got his second start of his NFL career tonight. He finished 22-of-35 for 172 yards, while adding 28 rushing yards on three carries (9.8 avg.), including a 28-yard carry.
- In the fourth quarter, **Jake Haener** entered the game after Rattler suffered a hip pointer injury and went three-for-four for 38 yards and threw for a 12-yard touchdown pass to WR Cedrick Wilson Jr.
- RB **Kendre Miller**, in his season debut and led the Saints in rushing with six carries for 36 yards and added two receptions.
- Wilson seeing his most extensive action at wide receiver as a Saint, finished with six grabs for 57 yards, including the touchdown catch from Haener late in the fourth quarter.
- WR **Mason Tipton** finished with six catches for 45 yards, while fellow rookie WR **Bub Means** rounded out the wideout trio with three receptions for 37 yards.
- TE **Foster Moreau** was effective again for the Saints offense at tight end. Moreau hauled in two receptions for 38 yards, including a 32-yard grab.
- LB **Demario Davis** played in his 200th career game and finished with seven tackles (five solo).

- Fellow Mississippi native, LB **Willie Gay Jr.** finished with two tackles (one solo) and one forced fumble/fumble recovery. Gay now leads the team with two fumble recoveries on the season.
- DB **Jordan Howden** led the team with eight stops (four solo), receiving a start.
- P **Matthew Hayball** punted six times for 267 yards (44.5 gross avg), including three downed inside the 20-yard line.

(Opening Statement) “We have one (major) injury update to make you guys aware of. Paulson Adebo looks like he has got a broken femur. Then (Marshon) Lattimore’s got a hamstring and Nick Saldiveri a shoulder. Those are the three where (those) guys weren’t able to come back into the game. You look at this game and there was nothing complementary about the game. In particular early on in the game, we weren’t able to get anything going offensively. Defensively, we allowed them to have too many long drives. Therefore, the first half, I think the time of possession was out of whack. It kind of got a little more balanced up as the game went along. I think that’s been a challenge for us. I think we’re not winning the line of scrimmage on either side of the ball. That’s a challenge for us right now. We have, obviously, a few days here before we have to play again. We’ll go out to L.A. next week. We’ve got to find a way to put our guys in the best position to have some success, and we’ve got to find a way to play better football. That’s been disappointing. Obviously, look, injuries play a part in it, but we’ve got to find a way to play better.”

(On what contributes to a lack of success in the game) “Look, I think as coaches and as players, we have to do a better job. We have to do a better job throughout the week of preparation. We’re making mistakes that we shouldn’t be making and allowing guys to get free. Again, part of the run game is that we have to do a better job at winning the line of scrimmage. That’s where it all starts. We have to do a better job of getting off the blocks, and we have to do a better job of tackling. I guess as coaches and players all alike, we’ve got to figure it out.”

(On if he’s concerned on the team’s buy in) “No, look it’s hard when you lose five in a row, and then when you look at all the injuries on top of it, it makes it a lot more challenging. I think our guys are fighting, yet the results aren’t showing.”

(On the process leading up to the game and his evaluation of it) “I think it’s still got to improve. Again, I get it, we have to play better. I think guys are trying. I think guys are working. We’re dealing with a lot of injuries right now. That’s not an excuse. I don’t want anybody to misconstrue that as an excuse, but it is an issue for us. I think all of us are trying to fight through that.”

(On if he’s ever experienced so many injuries) “No. I don’t know what that number is in terms of amount of missed time for guys and critical pieces to our team, but it’s the nature of the game that we play.”

(On if there is any trend leading to injuries) “I don’t think we’ve been able to put our thumb on one individual thing that’s caused these things. I think it’s kind of one of those years.”

(On if he could see issues at the line of scrimmage coming from performance in training camp and early in the year) “I don’t think that’s something that as we went through the course of training camp and everything that I felt was going to be a major issue for us, but it’s become that. It’s become that really over the last two or three weeks. Each and every week, it’s kind of gotten a little bit not as good.”

(On if the line of scrimmage issues are fixable with current personnel) “I think it is. I definitely think it is. We’ve got to get back to the fundamentals and technique.”

(On if injuries can be demoralizing) “It can be. It certainly can be, and that’s something we have to be able to fight through. That’s the tough part of our league, seeing things like that. It can be difficult, sure.”

(On why Spencer Rattler left the game at the two-minute warning) “He got, I think maybe, a hip pointer. At that time, I didn’t want to leave him in there. I wanted to put Jake (Haener) in. I didn’t want to risk him getting hurt any further.”

(On the biggest problems Rattler faced in the game) “I think just the pressure. They sent a lot of pressure at him, gave him some different looks, things that we kind of – not maybe the exact certain looks – but they did a lot of the things that we expected they would do. I think we had some opportunities in the passing game, and we dropped a few balls. Certainly, the sacks were an issue, and part of that’s protection, part of that is him being able to get the ball out. I think there’s a combination of things.”

(On his quarterback plan going forward) “I certainly wouldn’t put all of this on Spencer Rattler, for sure. I think there’s a supporting cast around him that has to play better. I think we will evaluate the tape. We’ll look at it and see what we need to do. Then, we will have a plan moving forward.”

(On if Derek Carr and/or Taysom Hill could be back next week) “I think it’s possible. I think it’s probably more likely that Taysom (Hill) would be ready before Derek (Carr), but we have ten days. Let’s let that play out a little bit and see where we are out there.”

(On the sequence before the end of the first half) “We shouldn’t have taken the timeout is what we shouldn’t have done. We had two plays to try to see if we could create something. Then, after having a couple of checkdowns and some pressure on the quarterback, it was like let’s take a knee. Let’s get out of the half. Let’s regroup and come back. We’ll get the ball to start the second half. Initially, the thought was can we get a chunk play and have the opportunity to create something? If not, then let’s get out of the half.”

(On who called the timeout before the half) “I’m not sure exactly who called the timeout, to be honest with you. I’m not sure if it was called on the field or not.”

(On Bo Nix’s performance) “I think the big play was the short yardage toss play where they had the numbers over there. It was a good play by them, a good design. That was probably their biggest play. I felt like we had a few times where we had free runners on the quarterback, and he’s athletic. He made a play. He made us miss. That was certainly something we were aware of and probably need to do a better job of managing that.”

(On managing player frustration) “You have to stand up and lead. That’s what you have to do. You have to stand up and lead. That’s what I have to do. That’s what our coaches have to do. That’s what the leaders on our team have to do because we’re the only ones that can get us out of this. Nobody – it’s not like we’re going to have a draft in the middle of the season. Nobody’s going to be coming in here to be the savior. We’re going to have to do it ourselves. Hopefully, we’ll begin to get some guys back because, look, early on in the season, we played good football. I know this team has it in them. I have two tapes that show me that this team has good football in them and has got good coaching in them. Right now, we’re not playing that way, and obviously, there’s a multitude of reasons why. We’ve got to figure out how to get back to playing that type of football because I’ve seen it done. I’ve seen what it looks like.”

(On if Paulson Adebo’s injury requires surgery) “I think he’s going to have surgery tonight.”

(On Rashid Shaheed going on Injured Reserve) “Look, it’s another playmaker. We’ve got our rookie quarterback out there with some backup players on the offensive line playing in front of him and two primary receivers are out of the game. That’s another challenge that you have to overcome as a young player (Rattler). He’s (Shaheed) an explosive element to our offense. He’s an explosive element to our team and special teams. That’s a big loss.”

(On the approach in the next few days) “Here’s the approach - the approach is we’re going to come back in on Monday, which would be a Thursday night kind of schedule. Monday’s going to be like a normal day after the game schedule. I want guys to get some rest. I want guys to get some recovery. I want them to get their bodies back. The guys that are injured are going to be spending the weekend in here getting themselves healthy. Then, we will start planning for the Chargers. I think over the next few days, I know for me and for the coaches, I think we just have to look at everything that we’re doing and where we’re at and how we can help our guys be better. That’s what we have to do as coaches.”

(On if he’s going to be in the office more than what he would be for a schedule after a Thursday night game) “No, but we’re going to be working. It’s easy to work remote now. I’m going to see my son in Savannah.”

(On Kendre Miller) "I thought he played well. I thought the plays when we handed him the ball, I thought he did some good things. I wished he would have caught the ball over the middle, but I was impressed with what I saw out of Kendre. I think that's a guy that can help us."

(Opening Statement) “I thought it was a good team win. We did a lot of things well tonight that we statistically talk about. You are always adjusting and getting used to the short week schedule when you are at home and on the road. We talked all week about a fast start. I thought they handled the mental part of it. It’s really easy to complain on a short week and pretty soon no one cares. I thought our preparation for those two days were good. I didn’t want to go through all the stats with them. First half leads fair better for those teams. For me I know I wasn’t going to tell them that we were 5-0 with the lead and 0-5 when we didn’t have one. That’s the last thing I wanted to mention to them. I thought we ran the ball well of course. Defensively, we had pressure. They are nicked up. I told Dennis Allen to get healthy. They have a good football team. A lot of their players right now weren’t able to play. Overall, I’m pleased how we played.”

(On not feeling sorry for teams in the NFL) “No. It’s just the business we are in. You just play. You have injuries. It’s really the truth. No one outside the building cares. At the end of the day, they want to see the end result.”

(On receiving the game ball) “It’s just two days of prep and we are here. So, not a lot of sleep. It keeps your mind off it because there are so many things that you have to get done. My big concern was just not having enough rest, so I slept today for a while. I came over here early just to get started going through the game plan again. It meant a lot. There were a lot of moments here. You get to see a lot of old players that were here and to be with this team and this ownership group. It’s the reason that you miss it. The one year out. You miss relationships and making memories. It’s like I told them a couple of weeks ago. (Patrick) Surtain’s interception right in front of our bench. There will be a time that I won’t remember his name and I’ll be having apple sauce out of a straw, but I’ll remember that play. That part about being around young people and having a chance to be a part of their journey and coach them is a pretty good job. I’m thankful for it. It was kind of emotional.”

(On driving up to the building) “This building has changed over the years. One time I think I was an assistant with the Cowboys we played here and the locker room used to be where you had to walk across the field. I had never really been in the visitor’s locker room here. It’s all been renovated. Anytime they have a Super Bowl here there has been modifications. I’m glad that I was here early, like six hours before the game early. I had plenty of time to grab some coffee. I think (about) what happened here and I’m going back to 2005 before any of us have arrived. A lot changed with this city and more than any player and any coach from 2006 and on that it was bigger than football. There were schools and hospitals not opened. There were a lot of things up in the air. So you appreciate those people that came when they didn’t necessarily had to. That was a unique time. None of us were prepared for that. We were all anxious and excited about our new job opportunities, but none of us understood what it would mean and how big it would become. That part of it is different and kind of special.”

(On honoring Drew Brees) “When the schedule came out, it was the night that he wanted to come in. They have the Saints Hall of Fame and then they have the Ring of Honor. He was being put in the Hall of Fame. It was good to see him. A few of us went over really quick to the Hilton and just thanked him. We were all kind of underdressed in our travel sweats. This is a city that dresses up a lot. It is always good to see him. I feel like I see him quite a bit. He has been to our practices. Anytime you see that whole group even pre-game yapping at us was fun.”

(On if he thinks this will be the last time he coaches in this place) “I don’t think this is the last time that I am ever going to coach in this place. This was the last team I hadn’t beaten.”

(On Javonte Williams play) “He had to have been good. I didn’t see all of the numbers. We actually were going to come out early, mix in the run and the read option. Bo (Nix) did a great job. We got a penalty called on one that was an impossible penalty. He threw the ball in .5 seconds and we got called for someone downfield (illegal downfield pass). It can’t happen meaning it’s an impossibility. I thought all of that clicked. We blocked them. You get a sense right away how you are matching up. Really from the late second quarter on it was pressure. We got a lot more zone tonight from this team maybe to keep more eyes on Bo. He did a good job with his feet. Javonte had some really good runs. When you

have a night like that rushing and the time of possession, the script was flipped a little bit from last week. Fortunately from our defense, they got some rest.”

(On if tonight was the ideal offense) “We are building. We are figuring it out. I will say this respectfully to the question, we are working on how to win that game. You don’t say this is how we are going to play regardless. Based on who we were playing tonight, that what we feel we had to do to win that game. It might change a week from now. Certainly the reps our young quarterback is receiving and our receivers are receiving, we are young as a team and so that is invaluable.”

(On beating 32 teams) “It means you’ve had two jobs. Someone brought that statistic up and we were trying to guess who was on that list. Someone had brought it up yesterday or the day before. We don’t think about things like that, but I know you had to have worked at two different organizations to do it. I’m glad I am here.”

(On seeing his family before the game) “No, I would normally see my wife. My kids will come to three or four games. There were some other close friends that I knew for a long time. That was a little bit more than normal.”

(On his welcome) “I thought it was great. You don’t forget the faces, the smiles or the dialect. They were great.”

(On his kids coming to this game) “They were I think six and nine (when I was first head coach in New Orleans) and have been to over 150 games here. They’ll probably see five games a year, but this was definitely a game that they were going to come to. We used to play touch football after the games were over win, lose or draw with the kids. The problem was that the visiting locker room players would come out and you’d have to stop and wait. There were certain things that we did for families that we thought were important. They kind of grew up here.”

(On Bo Nix playing well tonight) “I had made this comment earlier when we drafted him. When you watch him play, you don’t feel like you are in harm’s way. He is tough to sack. He has good ball location. He makes a lot of plays with his feet. He has some big play opportunities. There is confidence that you get as a playcaller that allows you to be more aggressive. We wanted to come out tonight in that mindset.”

(On Saints fans that are growing frustrated with the team) “I’d start with the leadership and ownership. You guys all saw how they played earlier in the season before they got hit with the injury bug. They had two good wins in a row. There are so many games ahead of us. They will bounce back.”

QB SPENCER RATTLER

(On his performance in his second start) “Got to be better. Plain and simple, got to be better. I felt like we had some good things going at certain times, but just couldn’t catch a rhythm. It starts with myself, (I) got to be better, and then the group will follow. So I’ve got to set that standard and be better.”

(On tonight’s challenges versus last week) “I can’t put my hand on it right now. We’ll watch the tape, see what we could’ve done better, but just coming on the sideline and looking at the iPad, we had some stuff there. We just all got to be on the same page and at the same focus, and that starts with me. As a leader, I’ve got to be better in that area.”

(On the blind side sack situation) “They had a better play call than we did, plain and simple. They executed and split second that ball is out to Juwan [Johnson] and it’s a big play, so, I’ve got to get it off faster.”

(On the defensive pressure) “They have a really good front, a really good defense, good scheme. We moved the ball at times, but it’s a good front. They’re talented.”

(On team’s disappointing stretch) “I think you’re going to go through tough times, and we’ve got great leaders on our team. Demario [Davis] just talked to us and said ‘This storm will pass. We’ve got to all stick together.’ Just keep finding ways to improve. It doesn’t feel great right now, but if we just keep stacking days and get some guys back healthy, we’ll be alright.”

(On what he’s learned through two starts) “Just to not quit. Keep going, keep battling. I know that’s said a lot, but it’s real. You don’t want to just give it up at half or third quarter or fourth quarter, no matter what’s going on. You’ve got to just keep swinging, keep punching, keep believing in your guys. Just got to be better.”

(On grace considering injuries) “No excuses for anybody, starting with myself. I’m so hard on myself and want myself to play at a high level at all times no matter what the circumstances are. We do have a lot of injuries, but it’s next man up mentality, we know that. We’ll get guys back healthy and keep getting better.”

(On specifics in his game to work on during the mini-break) “Again, I’m going to watch the tape and see what happened today. I felt like I was seeing things well today. I felt pretty comfortable back there. We just all have got to be on the same page, and that starts with me. It starts with me. If I’ve got to use my legs more, or get it out quicker, get a sense of different checks, I have to, so I can get better at that.”

(On sequence before halftime) “We just did what was called. We took two throws. I think I checked them both down to [Alvin Kamara] and we took a knee, and there was only 16 seconds left. We had two timeouts, had to go 50 yards or so, 40 yards or so. They were going to drop coverage and try to force us to check it down, so that’s what we did. Got on to the half.”

(On hip pointer) “Fourth quarter, I landed on it weird. Maybe somebody hit it, just landed on it funny. I just got up and it was a little tight. It’s one of the only spots I don’t have pads on, but should be okay.”

(On talking to Drew Brees) “Obviously, one of the best of all time. It was pretty cool to spend a little moment with him pregame. Obviously such a big deal, he got inducted into the Saints Hall of Fame today, so congrats to him. He’s one of the GOATs, and it was cool to be on the sideline with him for a minute. He had some good advice for me.”

(On message to fans) “Obviously, we want to put out a better product. We’ve got to be better, so it starts with us, but having great support always helps. With what I’ve seen, Saints fans are great every game, so we’ve got to play better and keep them there.”

S TYRANN MATHIEU

(On how the defense approaches this going forward) “Obviously, it’s not going our way. We can’t pout, we’re grown men, we get a paycheck, so we have just got to continue to push forward. Life doesn’t always go your way, and I can’t stress that enough. We’ve got to find a way to stay together and look in the mirror. Are we doing the right things throughout the week? Are we preparing the right way? Do we believe in our coaches? Do we believe in the guys next to us? So, we’ve got a lot of tough questions to answer and ask ourselves, but obviously this is not the type of outcome any of us imagined. Some things aren’t in our control, but the things that are in our control, we’ve got to do a better job of showing up and trying to make a play.”

(On the state of the team and the break before the next game) “We’re not the healthiest team right now, and sometimes you just need a couple of days off to regroup. I’m hoping that this long weekend could work to our advantage, and we come back and everybody has to recommit to the group. The season isn’t over, but we’ve got a lot to figure out.”

(On team’s biggest concerns) “Defensively, if we don’t stop the run, it’s hard to play good defense. I think for most of that game, they had the momentum. I dropped a pick, and those are the plays that we have to make if we want to turn the momentum. If I catch that ball before halftime, they don’t get three points and we probably score that drive. So then, it’s a one score game, and we’re still in the game. So we’ve just got to find a way to make those plays, because I think that’s what’s really holding us back. We aren’t making those plays in those critical moments like the team needed.”

LB DEMARIO DAVIS

(On the run defense falling short) “That’s the point of a run defense, and a good defense in general. You have to stop the run. But you have to look at it and figure out why that happened and make the corrections. I think what you don’t do is try to attribute it to all these other factors. I’ve been on this defense for seasons when we haven’t given up a hundred yards rushing. I’ve been here when it’s up, and I’ve been here when it’s down. Sometimes you do everything right and you get a bad result. What are you going to do, and how are you going to respond? For me, I look at them as opportunities, because I was always focused on the process, not on the results. I’ve learned it’s the process, and of course it’s tough when you don’t get the results you want. But like I said, and I say it all the time, loss is the greatest teacher in life. When I was up ten, I went right back to the drawing board, so now that I’m down ten, I’m going right back to the drawing board. And that has only served me well, and this team has always been resilient through all different types of adversity. Whether it’s been injuries, whether it’s been games not going our way, this team has always been resilient.”

(On if a short week benefitted the team and simplified the approach) “Yeah, maybe so. (On the win) “It was just one of those nights where it just comes to you and you just kind of feel it. It was a great team win. It was just one of those games. It was a great team win on the road on a short week. I am happy for everyone.”

(On if he thought that he would get a second chance at scoring a touchdown) “Tonight I did. I was saying it all game. ‘It’s going to happen. I am going to get it back. (On what this win meant for Sean Payton) "It meant a lot. It probably couldn't have gone any better, to be honest. He talked about next game, but, obviously everyone knew that it meant a little something to him and we wanted to win it because it is the next game; but, we knew how special it was to him. There are 22 guys here from New Orleans. So, just doing it for everyone (was special). Getting to 4-3 was the goal."

RB JAVONTE WILLIAMS

(On if this was his best game this year) "Rushing-wise, (yes). There are still some things that I can clean up and some things that I can improve on. I am just going to watch the film and get better."

(On the key to running the ball well from the start tonight) "Coach preached the whole week (to have a) fast start. That is something that we wanted to do to get on them early (and to have a) fast start."
