BOLTS DOWN JETS ON PRIMETIME

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the New York Jets on Monday Night Football, 27-6, to secure the club's second-straight win in primetime. **WR Keenan Allen, S Derwin James Jr.**, and **DL Sebastian Joseph-Day** were the game captains for the Chargers. The Bolts lost the toss and received the opening kick.

The Chargers defense held the Jets to 3-of-17 on third down (17.6 pct.) and totaled a season-high eight sacks, holding New York to just six points, preventing a touchdown by the opponent for the first time since Week 16 of 2022. Los Angeles' trio of outside linebackers – **Joey Bosa** (2.5 sacks), **Khalil Mack** (2.0) and **Tuli Tuipulotu** (2.0) – led the way for the defense, as the unit reached 18 sacks on third down on the season, the most in the NFL. Bosa's first sack of the night led to a forced fumble, marking the takedown the veteran defender's 10th career strip sack on third down, the most by any player in the NFL since 2016, when Bosa entered the league.

To aid the winning effort, the Bolts forced a total of three fumbles, recovering all three, to record three takeaways in the game. Monday marked just the fourth performance by a team in at least the last 30 years to post eight-plus sacks and three-plus fumble recoveries, while allowing three or fewer third-down conversions. It was the only performance in the last 30 years to do so while also allowing zero touchdowns.

WR Keenan Allen led the offense with eight receptions for 77 yards (9.6 avg.), including a 23-yard third-down reception to move the chains. On the reception, Allen eclipsed 10,000 career receiving yards, becoming the fastest (134 career games) and youngest (31 years, 193 days) player to do so in franchise history.

On special teams, **WR Derius Davis** returned the first punt of the game 87 yards for a touchdown, marking the longest punt return in the NFL this season and the longest punt return touchdown by a rookie in Chargers history. **K Cameron Dicker** went two-for-two on field goals, tying a career-long with a 55-yard made field goal as time expired at the end of the first half.

MONDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

With three takeaways in the game, the unit is among the best in the NFL on *Monday Night Football* over the last two seasons. The Chargers have now registered eight takeaways in Monday night contests since the start of the 2022 season, the most on *Monday Night Football* over that span. Los Angeles has four firsthalf takeaways on Monday night over the last two years, tied for the most in the NFL. Los Angeles added eight sacks in the game, giving them an NFL-best 24 sacks on Monday Night Football over the last two years.

DICKER HES CAREEK-LUNG

At the end of the first half, **K Cameron Dicker** tied his career long with a 55-yard field goal. It tied for the third-longest field goal made in franchise history. Dicker added a 38-yard field goal in the fourth quarter, as well as three extra points, in the game. Dicker has made a field goal of 50-plus yards in three-straight games, the longest active streak currently in the NFL.

BOSA A THIRD-DOWN BEAST

OLB Joey Bosa forced a turnover in the first quarter with a stripsack on his fifth sack of the season. It marked the 10th time in his career he has recorded strip-sack on third down, the most in the NFL since he came into the league in 2016. Bosa also now has 36.5 sacks on third down in his career, the second-most in the NFL over that span.

It is the longest punt return in the NFL this season and the longest by any NFL rookie since 2017. Davis' return is the longest ever by a Chargers rookie and ranks as the fifth-longest in team history.
