

PFWA Pool Reporter Joe Reedy Interview with NFL Senior Vice President of Officiating Walt Anderson
Los Angeles Chargers at Kansas City Chiefs
Thursday, September 15, 2022

Question: On Asante Samuel Jr.'s overturned interception in the third quarter, what did you see? Because on the Amazon angles that they showed, it looked like he had possession and the ball didn't move.

Anderson: "What we saw was that the ball did hit the ground and that he had not secured and maintained control of the ball after it hit the ground. We saw movement of the ball after it hit the ground, and then the ground ended up helping him re-secure it."

Question: So, he lost possession of the ball after he went to the ground, or it hit the ground as he was going down?

Anderson: "The ball hit the ground as he was going down, and then he did not maintain control of the ball."

Question: Was there a different angle that you saw, compared to the angles that were shown on Amazon, that showed it as indisputable evidence?

Anderson: "We have the angles from all of the cameras that the network has, and we're using multiple angles. I'm not 100 percent sure of the angles that the broadcast used. But we're using all of the angles from all of their cameras and working to select the ones that best show us what had happened to the ball."
