LOS ANGELES CHARGERS vs. PITTSBURGH STEELERS

Sunday, Nov. 9, 2025 | 5:20 p.m. PT | Los Angeles, Calif.



BOLTS BEAT STEELERS, 25-10

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Pittsburgh Steelers, 25-10, in prime time on Sunday night in SoFi Stadium.

The Chargers defense limited the Steelers to only 11 first downs and 4.33 yards per drive. The Bolts allowed just two-of-11 (18.2 pct.) third downs — the third best mark in the NFL and second best in the AFC in Week 10. The Bolts also recorded a plus-three turnover differential, tied for the league lead heading into the Monday night game.

WR Ladd McConkey led the receiving corps with 107 yards over receptions, a touchdown of his own and a season high 58-yard reception to set up **RB Kimani Vidal** for a rushing touchdown to seal the deal in the 4th quarter. Sunday marked McConkey's fifth career 100-yard receiving game. Vidal wrapped up the game with 95 rushing yards on 25 carries (3.8 avg) and a score along with a 13-yard reception.

WR Keenan Allen added a pair of receptions on the night to set a Chargers franchise record, passing Hall of Fame TE Antonio Gates (955) for the *most receptions in franchise history with 956*.

CB Donte Jackson spearheaded the attack on defense, recording two passes defended, reaching 61 in his career, and retuning an interception for 21 yards. **S RJ Mickens** hauled in an interception of his own while recording four tackles.

OLB Khalil Mack, **OLB Tuli Tuipulotu**, and **OLB Bud Dupree** each put up a sack with Mack putting the Chargers first two points on the board with a safety. Mack and Dupree are the fifth duo of players that have been in the league over a decade to each record a sack in the last five years.

K Cameron Dicker made three field goals and kicked for two extra points to add eleven points to the chargers final score of 25. Dicker's 59-yard make in the third quarter matches his career-long franchise-leading mark.

KEENAN PASSES GATES

WR Keenan Allen finished the game with two receptions for 19 yards (9.5 avg.), marking his 956th career reception as a Chargers wide receiver and pushing him past Hall of Fame TE Antonio Gates for the most receptions in franchise history.

The 13-year veteran out of Cal hauled in his record-breaking reception from QB Justin Herbert in the fourth quarter.

It took 148 for Allen to top the Chargers record books, reaching 950 career receptions faster than any player in franchise history.

Allen heads into Week 11 of the 2025 season as the Bolts' reception record holder and also ranks second in career receiving yards with 11,069.

DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACK

QB Justin Herbert completed 20-of-33 passes (60.6 pct.) for 220 yards and touchdown for a passer rating of 90.5. His 15-yard pass to WR Ladd McConkey marked his 170th career touchdown, makin him the seventh player to reach the mark through his first six seasons in NFL history.

BOLTS STAND TALL

The Bolts shined in primetime, recording a plus-three turnover differential on Sunday night. **CB Donte Jackson** and **S RJ Mickens** each earned interceptions while **LB Del'Shawn Phillips** recovered a fumble on a muffed punt. The Chargers offense did not turn the ball over.

At the conclusion of the Sunday games, the Bolts plus-three turnover differential is tied with Baltimore for the highest in the NFL in Week 10.

Since Defensive Coordinator Jesse Minter took over in 2024, the Bolts have recorded four games with a plus-three turnover differential - ranking tied for third in the NFL over that timeframe.

MACK MAKES HISTORY ... AGAIN

OLB Khalil Mack totaled three tackles (one solo) a sack, a QB hit, a tackle for loss and a forced fumble on Sunday night.

His sack in the first quarter, which resulted in his second career safety, marked his 35th sack with the Chargers. The Buffalo product joins Hall of Fame LB Kevin Greene as the only players in NFL history with 35 sacks with three different teams.
