CHARGERS CLOSE SEASON WITH 11-6 RECORD

The Los Angeles Chargers fell to the Denver Broncos, 19-3, on Sunday at Empower Field at Mile High.

The Bolts defense did not allow an offensive touchdown in Denver, marking the third time this season the Chargers did not allow an offensive touchdown in a game. The Bolts limited Denver to 124 net passing yards and held the Broncos to five-of-15 (33.3 pct.) on third down.

QB Trey Lance led the Bolts on the ground with 69 yards on nine carries (7.7 avg.). He was 22-of-44 passing for 136 yards with a pick.

WR Keenan Allen totaled seven receptions for 36 yards (5.1 avg.), while **WR Tre' Harris** added a pair of receptions for 28 yards (14.0 avg.).

S Tony Jefferson totaled eight tackles (two solo) while **LB Del'Shawn Phillips** posted seven tackles (four solo), a sack, a tackle for loss and two QB hits.

LB Marlowe Wax saw his first action on defense, totaling six tackles (five solo) and a tackle for loss.

DL Justin Eboigbe saw extended action on Sunday in Denver, recording a pair of tackles, 2.0 sacks, two QB hits and two tackles for loss. It marked his second career multi-sack game and brings his season-total to six, which ranks third on the Bolts' defense.

DL Otito Ogbornia and **OLB Odafe Oweh** split a sack to bring the team total to four on the day. Ogbornia totaled five tackles (three solo), a tackle for loss and a QB hit while Oweh had four tackles (one solo), and a QB hit.

BEND, DON'T BREAK

The Chargers defense stood tall on Sunday in Denver, not allowing an offensive touchdown in four quarters of football.

Sunday was the seventh time in 2025 that Jesse Minter's defense did not allow a first-half touchdown — a mark that is tied for the lead in the AFC and tied for the third best in the NFL this season.

It was also the Bolts third time in 2025 that the defense did not allow an offensive touchdown, a mark that ranks tied for second in the NFL.

EBOIGBE IN THE BACKFIELD

DL Justin Eboigbe saw extended action on Sunday in Denver, recording a pair of tackles, 2.0 sacks, two QB hits and two tackles for loss.

It marked his second career multi-sack game and brings his season-total to six, which ranks third on the Bolts' defense. He was one of seven players in the NFL, four in the AFC, to record at least 2.0 sacks in Week 18.
