CHARGERS FALL TO KANSAS CITY

The Los Angeles Chargers fell in overtime to the Kansas City Chiefs, 34-28. The Bolts record now stands at 8-6. The team travels to Houston in Week 16.

The Los Angeles offense put up a season-high 192 rushing yards. **RB Justin Jackson** led the team with 86 yards on 13 attempts (6.6 avg.), coming up four yards shy of setting a career high.

The Chargers allowed zero sacks for the second time this season (Week 9 at Philadelphia). It was the first time the Bolts allowed zero sacks in a home game since Oct. 6, 2019 vs. Denver.

WR Keenan Allen recorded six receptions for 78 yards, putting him over 1,000 yards on the season. 2021 marks his fifth 1,000yard season, the most by a Charger in the last 50 years.

NWOSU PICKS HIS FIRST

OLB Uchenna Nwosu batted a pass up in the air at the line of scrimmage and hauled it in for an interception in the fourth quarter, setting up a two-yard touchdown run on the next play.

It marked the first interception of his career and second takeaway of the season. He became the second Charger this season to have an interception and a fumble recovery, joining **CB Michael Davis**.

HERBERT SETS MORE RECORDS

With 236 passing yards on the day, QB Justin Herbert reached 8,394 for his career to record the most passing yards by any player in history through the first two seasons of a career. He finished the day with the 236 yards and two touchdowns with an interception to register an 82.8 passer rating.

Herbert added a rushing touchdown, bringing him to 71 total touchdowns in his career (63 passing, eight rushing). He passed Hall of Fame QB Dan Marino (70) for the most passing and rushing scores through the first two seasons of a career in history.

EKELER ADDS ANOTHER

RB Austin Ekeler ran in his 10th rushing touchdown of the season in the fourth quarter, giving him 17 scrimmage scores this year. The game marked his sixth in a row with a touchdown, the longest streak by a Charger since former RB Melvin Gordon III had a seven-game streak in 2018. Ekeler's has 1,347 yards from scrimmage this year, ranks No. 2 in the NFL among running backs.

BOSA GETS ANOTHER SACK

OLB Joey Bosa registered his second strip-sack in as many weeks, bringing him to an NFL-best six strip-sacks on the season. It's the most strip-sacks by a Charger in a single season since at least 2000. It's the first time a Bolt has had a strip-sack in consecutive games since Bosa did so in 2017.

The sixth-year pass rusher now has 9.5 sacks on the year and is within three sacks of reaching 60 for his career.
