BOLTS BEGIN 2024 SEASON AGAINST RAIDERS

The Los Angeles Chargers begin the 2024 season at home against the Las Vegas Raiders at SoFi Stadium. The teams kick off on Sun., Sept. 8 at 1:05 p.m. PT. Jim Nantz, Tony Romo and Tracy Wolfson have the call on CBS and Paramount+, while Matt "Money" Smith, Daniel Jeremiah and Shannon Farren will broadcast on the Chargers Radio Network airwaves on ALT FM-98.7 as well as on SiriusXM 85 or 225 and on the SiriusXM app. Adrian Garcia-Marquez and Francisco Pinto will present the game in Spanish on Que Buena Los Angeles.

Since the opening of SoFi Stadium in 2020, the Bolts have hosted Raiders in September or October three times, with a fourth coming in Week 1. The Chargers have won 15 of the past 21 home contests against the Raiders, scoring 20-plus points in all but five of those matchups.

Quarterback **Justin Herbert** continued to set records in his fourth pro season last year, as his 1,613 completions and 17,223 passing yards are the most ever by any player through the first four seasons of a career. Outside linebacker **Khalil Mack** represented the club as a Pro Bowler last season after setting a career-best and tying a franchise record with 17.0 sacks. The Bolts added to their roster this offseason by signing running backs **Gus Edwards** and **J.K. Dobbins**, while also drafting tackle **Joe Alt** in the first round of the 2024 NFL Draft.

Coached by Antonio Pierce, the Raiders are led on offense by quarterback Gardner Minshew II, wide receiver Davante Adams, running back Zamir White and tight ends Michael Mayer and Brock Bowers. Defensively, Las Vegas showcases defensive end Maxx Crosby and newly-signed defensive tackle Christian Wilkins.

The Chargers head on the road for Week 2, traveling to play the Carolina Panthers at Bank of America Stadium. Kickoff is slated for 10:00 a.m. PT on Sun., Sept. 15.

BY THE NUMBERS

- 23** The 2024 Los Angeles roster features 23 new players, including nine draft selections, 12 free agents, two trade acquisitions and a waiver claim.
- 300** QB Justin Herbert needs seven games with 300-plus passing yards for the most 300-yard games in a quarterback's first five seasons in NFL history.
- 16.0** The Chargers' punt return unit was among the best in the NFL last season, setting a single-season franchise record by averaging 16.0 yards per punt return.
- 110** OLB Khalil Mack needs 8.5 sacks to reach 110.0 for his career. He would become just the second player to reach that mark since he entered the NFL in 2014.

Harbaugh brings with him a winning culture, posting a 144-52 record as a collegiate head coach and a 49-22-1 record as an NFL head coach. In four years, he led the San Francisco 49ers to three-straight NFC Championship Games, including an appearance in Super Bowl XLVII.

With a keen eye for talent and an ability to develop players, Harbaugh coached nine eventual first-round selections over his nine-season tenure at Michigan (2015-23). Over the course of his four seasons (2011-14) with San Francisco, Harbaugh coached 17 players to a combined 30 Pro Bowl selections — the second-most Pro Bowlers in the NFL in that time. Eight of those players were also recognized as first-team All-Pro selections from *The Associated Press*, including linebackers Patrick Willis (twice) and NaVorro Bowman (three times).

Prior to being a head coach in the NFL, Harbaugh spent four years at the helm at Stanford University (2007-10) and three at the University of San Diego (2004-06). He turned around a Stanford program that went 1-11 in 2006 and led the Cardinal to 29 wins over his four seasons in Palo Alto, Calif., including a 12-win season that culminated in an Orange Bowl victory in 2010. Harbaugh broke into the head coaching ranks at San Diego, leading the Toreros to a 29-6 record in three years.

Harbaugh played quarterback at the University of Michigan, finishing his career as one of the most efficient passers in college football history. He posted a 21-3-1 record as a starter for the Wolverines, earning first-team All-American honors and finishing third in voting for the Heisman Trophy in 1986. Harbaugh paced the nation in 1985 in passing efficiency rating, while his career passing efficiency rating ranked as the best in NCAA history for more than 12 years following his time at Michigan.

Antonio Pierce was named Head Coach of the Las Vegas Raiders by Owner Mark Davis on Jan. 19, 2024. He was named to the post following a nine-game stint as the team's Interim Head Coach during the 2023 season. Pierce, a nine-year NFL veteran player and a former Super Bowl Champion, team captain and Pro Bowl selection, enters his third season with the Silver and Black after originally joining the Raiders as linebackers coach in 2022.

Pierce assumed Interim Head Coach duties prior to Week 9 of the 2023 season and posted a 5-4 record in nine games, highlighted by a 3-1 mark against AFC West opponents.

Under his guidance, the Raiders finished the season with the fewest penalties in the NFL (75) and twice completed games without a single penalty flag. After Pierce took the helm on Oct. 31, the Raiders were tied for 10th in the NFL in takeaways (14), tied for fifth in turnover margin (+6), and tied for third in sacks (30). The defense also allowed a league-low 16.0 points per game.

A native of Long Beach, Calif., Pierce grew up in Compton, Calif., and attended Paramount (Calif.) High School, where he was an All-CIF Southern Section selection as a linebacker and also played fullback...He played two years at Arizona, seeing action in 23 games and totaling 152 tackles, 20 tackles for loss and seven sacks.

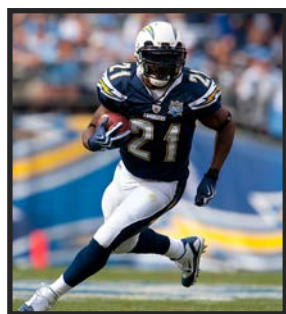

In Week 3 of the 2023 season, Justin Herbert completed 40 passes on 47 attempts (85.1 pct.) for 405 yards and three touchdowns with zero interceptions, registering a 123.8 passer rating.

He was the seventh player in NFL history to record a game with at least 40 completions, 400 passing yards and three passing touchdowns while also throwing zero interceptions. Herbert was just the fourth player to do so in a victory.

Justin Herbert set the record for combined touchdowns as a rookie (36) and through a player's first two seasons (77). His 102 combined touchdowns were also the most in history through the first three seasons of a career.

In Week 9 of 2022, he tied Hall of Fame QB Dan Marino as the second-fastest players to reach 90 combined touchdowns, each doing so in their 40th career game.

Herbert's 125 career combined touchdowns rank third in history through a player's first four professional seasons. He was also the fifth player in NFL history to pass for at least 100 touchdowns and run for at least 10 scores within the first four seasons of a career. Herbert is the only player ever to have 110 passing touchdowns and 10 rushing scores in his first four seasons.

In his 62 career starts, **Justin Herbert** has been the one of the best passers in the NFL at moving the chains on third down. He has completed 385 passes on 626 attempts (61.5 pct.) for 4,644 yards and 42 touchdowns with 18 interceptions (94.6 passer rating). Herbert's 385 completions lead the NFL, while his 4,644 passing yards rank second on third down since 2020.

Herbert tied for the league lead with 14 touchdown passes on third down in 2020, good for the most by a rookie in the last 40 seasons. He has added 28 since then, giving him 42 third-down passing scores since entering the professional ranks, which is good for No. 2 over that span.

- Became the first quarterback to throw a touchdown and run for a score in the first half of a debut since 1954.

OFFENSIVE ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Justin Herbert earned widespread recognition as the Offensive Rookie of the Year, including as the 10th quarterback in history to win the honor from *The Associated Press*. Herbert was also selected by *Professional Football Writers of America* as Rookie of the Year and Offensive Rookie of the Year — becoming the second and seventh quarterback to win those awards, respectively. He is the first player in history to be recognized with all three honors.

Khalil Mack had a historic performance in the team's Week 4 win over the Raiders. He set a career high with six sacks, including a pair of strip-sacks. It was the first six-sack performance by any NFL player since 2017 and just the sixth since the stat began being tracked in 1982.
