The Los Angeles Chargers lost to the Denver Broncos in Week 14, 24-7. WR Keenan Allen, S Derwin James Jr., and DL Sebastian **Joseph-Day** were the game captains for the Chargers. The Bolts lost the toss and received the opening kickoff.

WR Keenan Allen led the offensive unit with six catches, setting a pair of records in the process. With Sunday marking his 139th career game, he eclipsed 900 career receptions faster than any player in NFL history. Allen now has 108 catches on the season. setting a new single-season franchise record.

WR Quentin Johnston led the team with a career-high 91 receiving yards, setting a career long in the fourth quarter by hauling in a 57-yarder. He finished the day with three receptions, averaging 30.3 yards per catch.

The Los Angeles defense was led by LB Kenneth Murray Jr., and his 12 tackles (nine solo), including a sack. LB Eric Kendricks had his second sack in as many games, while S Derwin James Jr., added 11 tackles (eight solo) and a pass breakup. On the first defensive play of the game, CB Michael Davis ripped the ball away from the receiver and picked off a pass, marking his first of the season and eighth of his career.

Coming off his AFC Special Teams Player of the Week-winning performance in Week 13, P JK Scott boomed an 83-yard punt in the second quarter, the longest punt in franchise history. Scott placed two punts inside the 20-yard line and posted a gross average of 57.4 yards, the second-best single game gross punting average in franchise history (min. four punts).

THE FASTEST EV

Keenan Allen caught a team-high six passes for 68 yards (11.3 avg.). After his first two receptions, Allen eclipsed 900 catches for his career. With Sunday marking his 139th career game, Allen reached that mark faster than any player in NFL history.

With the six catches, Allen now has set the single-season franchise record with 108 on the year. Entering Sunday Night Football, his 108 receptions lead the NFL this year.
