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## LOS ANGELES CHARGERS vs. MINNESOTA VIKINGS

Thursday, Oct. 23, 2025 | 5:15 p.m. PT | Inglewood, Calif.



### CHARGERS CONQUER VIKINGS, 37-10

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Minnesota Vikings, 37-10, on Thursday night in SoFi Stadium.

**QB Justin Herbert** completed 18-of-25 passes (72 pct.) for 227 yards and three touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 122.8. The sixth-year quarterback added 62 rushing yards on seven carries (8.9 avg.).

**RB Kimani Vidal** rushed for 117 yards on 23 carries (5.1 avg.) and a touchdown. The second-year running back scored on a three-yard scamper in the second quarter. Thursday marked his second 100-yard rushing output in the last 11 days.

**WR Ladd McConkey** led the Bolts in receiving with six receptions for 88 yards and a 27-yard touchdown. Rookie **TE Oronde Gadsden** totaled five receptions for 77 yards (15.4 avg.) and a touchdown including a 40-yard reception in the second quarter. Gadsden has recorded a touchdown and a 40-yard reception in back-to-back games.

Defensively, the Bolts limited the Vikings to 164 total net yards a 27.3 third down percentage and turned in five sacks, eight QB hits and seven passes defended.

**CB Benjamin St-Juste** led the Chargers with seven solo tackles while **CB Cam Hart** turned in four solo tackles and a career-high three passes defended. **S RJ Mickens** added a pair of tackles (one solo) and his first career interception.

**DL Justin Eboigbe** recorded his first career multi-sack game, turning in three tackles (two solo), 2.0 sacks, two tackles for loss and three QB hits. **OLB Tuli Tuipulotu** added three tackles (two solo), a sack, a tackle for loss, QB hit and a forced fumble recovered by **OLB Khalil Mack** who added a pair of solo tackles, a sack, a tackle for loss and a QB hit. **OLB Odafe Oweh** turned in three tackles (two solo), a sack, a tackle for loss and a QB hit.

### GADSDEN GOES LONG

**TE Oronde Gadsden.**, hauled in five receptions for 77 yards, including a 40-yard catch in the second quarter, and a touchdown.

With a 40-yard reception on Thursday night and a 53-yard catch on Sunday, Gadsden is the only tight end in the NFL this season with multiple 40-yard receptions and is the only Bolts rookie to accomplish the feat since 2000.

In his last two games, the fifth-round pick has totaled 12 receptions for 241 yards (20.1 avg.) and a pair of touchdowns. He joins Robert Awalt (1987) and Walter White (1975) as the only tight ends since 1970 to record consecutive games with 75 receiving yards and a touchdown.

## VIDAL REACHES CENTURY MARK

**RB Kimani Vidal** recorded 23 carries for 117 yards (5.1 avg.) and a touchdown along with a 10-yard reception.

Since taking over as the Bolts' starting running back in Week 6, Vidal has recorded a pair of 100-yard games and totaled 50 carries for 261 yards (5.22 avg.) and a touchdown.

Heading into Sunday's slate of games, Vidal's 5.22 yards per carry ranks sixth in the NFL (min. 30 carries) since Week 6 and his 261 yards leads the AFC during that time span.

## COMPLETING RECORDS

After setting the rookie completions record in 2020, **QB Justin Herbert** has continued his pace, setting the record for the most through the first five seasons of a career. With his first completion on Thursday night, Herbert passed Hall of Famer Payton Manning for most completions by any player through the first six seasons of a career in NFL history. The Oregon product now has 2,146 career completions.

Herbert completed the game going 18-for 25 (72 pct.) for 227 yards and three touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 122.8.
