



NOTABLE STORYLINES AND GAME INFORMATION

· Sunday's game will mark game number 28 in the all-time Browns-Chargers series. The Browns trail the all-time series, 17-9-1, and are looking for their first victory against the Chargers since winning 20-17 on Christmas Eve in 2016.

• The Browns won their first road game of the season beating the Minnesota Vikings 14-7 for their first victory at Minnesota since 2013. The win improved Cleveland's record to 3-1 for the first time in consecutive seasons since they did so from 1993-95.

 Three-time Pro Bowler LG Joel Bitonio can join Joe Thomas (167), Orpheus Roye (102) and Alex Mack (101)as the fourth player to start 100 games for the Browns since the team returned to Cleveland in 1999.

· The team's overall performance continues to rank among the best in the league in both total offense (eight) and total defense (second).

• Through the first four games of the season, the Browns have one of the league's most productive rushing attacks, topping the league in rushing yards (708), TDs (nine) and rushing first downs with 41.

· Cleveland has produced 150-or-more yards on the ground in all four games this season. The 708 yards on the ground through the first four games are the third-most by a Browns team in that span.

• The dynamic duo of RBs Nick Chubb and Kareem Hunt have produced 18 games with 100 rushing yards, ranking third in the NFL dating back to 2020. They are also the lone pair of teammates this season with at least a combined 590 rushing vards and six touchdowns.


• Over the past two weeks, the Browns defense have managed to hold their opponent to single-digit points in consecutive games for the first time since 1995. In addition to preventing double-digits, they have only allowed 20 total points in the last 10 quarters played (two TDs and two field goals). Moreover, the team has only allowed 266 rushing yards, the fewest ever allowed by a Browns team in the first four weeks of a season.



NOTABLE STORYLINES CONTINUED

• RB Nick Chubb led the rushing effort Sunday with 100 yards on 21 carries. The 18 career games with 100 rushing yards for Chubb is the second in the league since 2018 and the most by a player in their first four years since that time.

• DE Myles Garrett posted a half-sack, bringing his season total to six, matching the franchise record for most sacks in the first four games of a season he set back in 2019. Garrett is now three sacks behind Michael Dean Perry for the secondmost sacks in team history.

• CB Greedy Williams snagged his first NFL interception late in the fourth quarter in his first start since the 2019 season.

• K Chase McLaughlin made a 53 and 48-yard field goal, tying him for eighth most field goals by a Brown in their first four weeks of a season. McLaughlin is the first Browns kicker to make three field goals from 50-plus yards in a season since Phil Dawson (seven) did so in 2012.

MEDIA PRACTICE ACCESS AND REPORTING POLICY

In your coverage of daily practice sessions, we ask for your cooperation in observing the following practice policies:

- Practice sessions are open to approved local media through the individual period of practice (approximately 30 minutes).
- Do not report on offensive or defensive strategy without addressing questions to the head coach. This includes describing formations, personnel groups, deployment of personnel, starting lineups, players working in first-team, second-team or third-team, or non-conventional plays.
- Do not quote, paraphrase or report the comments made by coaches or players during a practice session.
- No reporting during the open portion of practice. This includes tweeting, blogging, radio updates or phone interviews (exception made for tweeting on injured players return to practice participation).
- Media are prohibited from interacting with players and coaches during practice.
- Media are asked to silence cell phones before entering the practice area.
- Only pre-approved media are permitted to attend practice and must be approved 24 hours in advance of any practice. All
 requests to attend practice must be submitted to Rob McBurnett via email (rmcburnett@clevelandbrowns.com) at least 48
 hours in advance.
- All requests to conduct live shots from facility, including the parking lot, must be submitted to Rob McBurnett via email.
- All media will be screened upon entering the Browns practice field, including a pre-screening form prior to heading to the facility. All media are subject to the same standards and policies as Browns staff, stadium employees and other individuals.
- The Browns reserve the right to change their access policy without prior notice.

HOW THEY COMPARE



KEVIN STEFANSKI KEVIN STEFANSKI: 14–6, SECOND SEASON AS A HEAD COACH. SECOND WITH THE BROWNS. On January 13, 2020, the Cleveland Browns announced the hiring of Kevin Stefanski as the 18th full-time head coach in franchise history. In his first season with the Browns, he led the club to their first playoff appearance since 2002 and first playoff victory in 26 years, earning him AP Coach of the Year. The 38-year old spent 14 seasons in various roles with the Minnesota Vikings prior to Cleveland. Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and elevated up the coaching ladder, serving as assistant quarterbacks coach (2009-13), tight ends (2014-15) and lone season (2016) coaching running backs. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games in 2018 before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019. Stefanski played defensive back at University of Pennsylvania.

BRANDON STALEY: 3-1, FIRST SEASON AS A HEAD COACH, FIRST WITH THE CHARGERS.

The Los Angeles Chargers hired Brandon Staley as the 17th head coach in franchise history in 2021, becoming the first Bolts head coach with a defensive background in over a decade. Staley served as the defensive coordinator in 2020 for the Los Angeles Rams after spending three seasons as the 0LBs coach for Denver (2019) and Chicago (2017-18). Prior to coaching in the NFL, Staley spent three seasons (2013 and 2015-16) at John Carroll as DC/secondary coach and the 2014 season as DC/LBs at James Madison. Before his stints at John Carroll and James Madison, Staley was a graduate assistant in 2012 at Tennessee. Staley held his first coordinator job as associate HC/DC at Hutchinson (Kan.) Community College from 2010-11. Staley began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Northern Illinois (2006-08) before coaching the DL and special teams in 2009 at the University of St. Thomas. He played quarterback at the University of Dayton, serving as a team captain and was a two-year starter. He ended his playing career at Mercyhurst College in 2005. He's a native of Perry, Ohio.



PROBABLE STARTERS

OFFENSIVE STARTERS

WR DONOVAN PEOPLES-JONES Made first start of the season Week 4 at Min...Second-year wide receiver caught two passes (both resulting in first downs) for 39 yards in Week 3 contest vs. Chi...Appeared in 16 games in two seasons with the Browns... Sixth-round (187th overall) selection by the Browns in the 2020 NFL Draft.

LT JEDRICK WILLS JR. Started all four games this season...Part of a Browns offensive line that has helped the running game lead the league in rushing yards (708) through the first four weeks... Second-year player out of Alabama started at LT in 15 games last season...Named to PFWA's 2020 NFL All-Rookie team.

LG JOEL BITONIO Earned third consecutive Pro Bowl nod last season and became the first Browns guard named to three consecutive Pro Bowls since Hall of Famer Gene Hickerson (1966-71)...Longest-tenured Brown has not missed an offensive snap since the start of the 2017 season...Started all 99 games appeared in since being drafted by the Browns in the second round (35th overall) of the 2014 NFL Draft.

C JC TRETTER Has played 100% of offensive snaps since joining the Browns in 2017...Part of an offensive line that contributed to Browns' NFL-best 215 rushing yards in Week 3, most in Week 3... Voted NFLPA President in 2020.

RG WYATT TELLER Earned second-team All-Pro honors in 2020... Part of offensive line that has helped the Browns rushing attack lead the league with nine rushing touchdowns this season...Fifthround pick by the Buffalo Bills in 2018 and was traded to Cleveland prior to the start of the 2019 season.

RT JACK CONKLIN Sixth-year pro started all four games this season at RT...Awarded first team Associated All-Pro honors and PFWA All-NFL team in 2020...Helped block for RBs Nick Chubb and Kareem Hunt rush for over 100 yards in 18 games dating back to the 2020 season.

TE AUSTIN HOOPER Recorded his first touchdown reception of the season Week 3 vs. Chi...Started every game at TE this season... Two-time Pro Bowl selection (2018-19)...Third-round pick by Atlanta in 2016...Joined the Browns as an unrestricted free agent in 2020.

WR ODELL BECKHAM JR. Played in his first game since Week 7 of the 2020 season vs. Chi and led all receiving efforts with 77 yards on five receptions...Inactive (knee) first two games of the season...Eighth-year vet has eclipsed 1,000 receiving yards in five of his seven seasons, only missing the mark in 2017 and 2020 when injuries limited him to four (2017) and seven games (2020)... Three-time Pro Bowler from 2014-16.

QB BAKER MAYFIELD Reached 1,000 career completions (1,006) and 12,000 career passing yards (12,050) Week 4 at Min...Became the first Brown to start three consecutive season openers since Brian Sipe (1978-80)...Has compiled a 16-8 record as a starter at FirstEnergy Stadium...Led the Browns to their first playoff

appearance since 2002 and first playoff victory (Wild Card Round vs. Pit) in 26 years...First-overall pick by the Browns in the 2018 NFL Draft.

RB NICK CHUBB Tied for third in NFL with three rushing touchdowns...Led Week 4 at Min with 100 rushing yards on 21 carries...Ranks second in the NFL in rushing yards (362)...Earned back-to-back Pro Bowl nods (2019-20)...PFWA All-AFC teams 2019-20...Second round pick in 2018 and signed three-year contract extension in 2021.

FB ANDY JANOVICH Punched in his first touchdown as a Brown on a one-yard touchdown after LB Sione Takitaki recovered a muffed punt in Week 2 vs. Hou...Appeared in 18 games with five starts in his first two seasons with Cleveland...Drafted by Denver in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft and traded to Cleveland in 2020.

TE HARRISON BRYANT Made first start of season at TE Week 3 vs. Chi...Propelled Browns to 708 rushing yards, most in NFL...Named to PFWA's 2020 NFL All-Rookie team...Five catches for 66 yards this season...Led all NFL rookie tight ends with three receiving touchdowns last season...Fourth-round selection (115th overall) by the Browns in the 2020 NFL Draft.

G MICHAEL DUNN Inactive (coach's decision) Weeks 3-4...Spent all of his playing time on special teams vs. Hou after being inactive (back) Week 1 at KC...Started first-ever NFL contest in AFC Wild Card against Pit...Spent nine weeks on the Jacksonville Jaguars' practice squad in 2018.

RB DEMETRIC FELTON Recorded 103 punt return yards Week 3 vs. Chi, the most by a Brown since Sept. 20, 2015...Scored first NFL touchdown on first NFL reception Week 2 vs. Hou...Has six receptions for 76 yards in addition to 208 yards on combined return yards...Appeared in all four games this season...Drafted by the Browns in the sixth round (211th overall) of the 2021 NFL Draft.

G BLAKE HANCE Filled in for LT Jedrick Wills Jr. on multiple occasions Weeks 2-3...Spent all of his playing time on special teams Week 1 at KC...First-year player spent Weeks 1-16 on the Jets' practice squad prior to joining the Browns during Week 17 last season...Made NFL debut in AFC Wild Card game against Pit...Spent the entire 2019 season on the Jacksonville Jaguars' practice squad.

C NICK HARRIS Spent all of his playing time on special teams Weeks 1-4...Protected Chase McLaughlin while he converted a career-long 57-yard field goal Week 3 vs. Chi...Originally drafted by the Browns in the fifth round (160th overall) in the 2020 NFL Draft.

WR RASHARD HIGGINS Sixth-year vet led team in receptions (four) and receiving yards (63) Week 4 at Min...Appeared in all four games this season...One of the Browns longest tenured players... Appeared in 71 games with 12 starts since entering the league as a fifth round (172nd overall) selection by the Browns in 2016.

T CHRIS HUBBARD Inactive (triceps) Week 2-4...Filled in for LT Jedrick Wills Jr. after he sustained an ankle injury Week 1 at KC... Played in 42 games with 34 starts for Cleveland since joining the team as an unrestricted free agent in 2018.

RB KAREEM HUNT Leads team in receiving yards with 121 and tied for third in the league with three rushing touchdowns... Recorded his 25th game with 50-plus scrimmage yards and a receiving touchdown Week 3 vs. Chi...One of three active players with 20-plus rushing and at least 15 receiving TDs since 2017... Recorded the third-most touchdowns by a Brown in postseason play with three in 2020.

T JAMES HUDSON III Filled in for LT Jedrick Wills Jr. Week 4 at Min...Wills Jr. exited the game with an ankle injury...Spent all of his playing time on special teams Weeks 2-3...Inactive (coach's decision) Week 1 at KC...Played in 11 games at Cincinnati from (2019-20) after transferring from Michigan (2017-18)...Received 2020 first team All-American Conference Honors...Fourth-round (110th overall) selection by the Browns in the 2021 NFL Draft.

RB D'ERNEST JOHNSON Saw time on offense Week 3 vs. Chi and rushed for nine yards on two carries...Spent all of his time on special teams Weeks 1, 2, and 4...Appeared in all 16 contests last season and averaged 25.1 yards as the team's primary kick returner.

QB CASE KEENUM Saw action Week 3 vs. Chi and did not attempt a pass...Did not play Weeks 1-2 and 4...Ninth-year pro has appeared in 70 regular season games (62 starts) and two postseason games (both starts)...Came to the Browns as an unrestricted free agent in 2020.

TE DAVID NJOKU Third on team in receiving yards with 111... Snagged three catches for a team-leading 76 receiving yards Week 1 at KC, his most yards since his four reception, 74-yard game on Dec. 3, 2017 against LAC...Originally a first round (29th overall) pick by the Browns in the 2017 NFL Draft...11 career receiving touchdowns tie for second most by a Browns tight end in their first four seasons.





The Browns offense has combined for 4.78 rushing average since 2018, **the third-highest average in the NFL**. The unit has also posted 6,876 rushing yards, fourth in that span.



The Browns have posted **203 rushes for 10-plus yards and 54 rushes for 20-plus yards** since 2018, fourth and second in the NFL, respectively. Additionally, the team's 25 carries for 20-plus yards and 96 for 10-plus yards since last season are second and first, respectively, in the NFL. The Browns also registered nine rushing attempts for 50-plus yards since 2018 and three since last year, both tied for second in the NFL.



The Browns have proven to be hard to take down since 2019, posting 3,553 rushing yards after contact since that time (third in the NFL). **Since last year, the team ranks third** in the category with 2,135. The Browns are first in 2021 (516).









DE Myles Garrett continued to reach the QB in Week 4, contributing a half-sack and upping his season total to six. His six sacks on the year tied his franchise record for most sacks in the first four games of a season set in 2019. He also tied for the third-most sacks in the same category in 2020 with five (Jamir Miller in 2001). His Week 4 outing followed what was a record-setting day in Week 3, posting a career-high 4.5 sacks, a new single-game Browns record. His 4.5 sacks surpassed Andra Davis' four, a record that stood since 2003. His 48.5 career sacks are the most by a player in his first 55 career games and he's posted the third-most sacks by a No. 1 overall pick in his first five years, behind Bruce Smith (57.5), Lee Roy Selmon (49). His total is also fourth among all first-round picks in the same span. Garrett's career sacks total is already third in Browns history, behind Michael Dean Perry (51.5) and Clay Matthews (62). The Browns are 10-3 since last year when Garrett posts at least a half-sack.

His six last year tied his total from September 2019 for the most by a Brown in any given month in history. His six sacks also tied for fourth among all active players in the month of October in history.

Since entering the league in 2017, Garrett is fourth in the NFL with 48.5 sacks (second in the AFC), despite playing in less games than any other player in the top five.



For the fourth week in a row, RB Nick Chubb led the game with 100 rushing yards on 21 carries. Chubb is currently second in the NFL with 362 rushing yards and tied for fifth, along with teammate RB Kareem Hunt, with three rushing scores. Additionally, his 5.25 rushing average (10th), 18 rushing first downs (tied for fourth), 10 rushes for 10-plus yards (third) and two rushes for 20-plus yards (tied for second) all rank in the top 10 in the NFL. Chubb is already second on the club's all-time rushing list among Browns in their first four years with 3,919 rushing yards, as well as second in the same category with 31 rushing touchdowns. He's also sixth on the Browns all-time rushing yards list and tied for sixth on rushing scores list. Chubb signed a three-year contract extension with the team in August.

Chubb has 18 100-yard rushing performances in his career, second in the NFL since 2018 and are the most by a player in his first four seasons since that time. His 18 games are also the third most by an active player in his first 48 career games and the Browns are 14-4 when Chubb rushes for at least 100 yards. The 18 games are also the third most by a Brown in his career. Chubb has the third-most games since 2018 with 100 rushing yards and a touchdown (11) and tied Mike Pruitt for third on the Browns' alltime list in the same category.

50 FEAT

Chubb has reached 50 rushing yards in 38 games since he was drafted in 2018, the second most by a Brown in his first four years, only behind Jim Brown (41). The 38 games are also the most among all Browns in their first 48 games.

BIG-PLAY BACK

Chubb ranks first by a Brown since 1991 in carries for 10-plus yards with 111 and has the most carries for 20-plus yards (36) and 50-plus yards (seven) in the same timeframe. Since entering the league in 2018, Chubb ranks second in the NFL with 111 rushes for 10-plus yards, first with 36 rushes for 20-plus yards and third with seven rushes for 50-plus yards.

ANYTHING BUT AVERAGE Chubb's career rushing average (5.23) through his first four years is second behind Bobby Mitchell in Browns history (min. 300 attempts). It's also the second highest since 2018 and the highest among all running backs (min. 300 attempts).

QB BAKER MAYFIELD



Inhis50thcareergame,QB**BakerMayfield** completed 15 of 33 passes for 155 yards at Minnesota last week. **Mayfield reached 1,000 career completions last** week (1,006), as well as 12,000 career passing yards (12,050). Following Week 4, Mayfield hasn't thrown an interception in his past five games versus an NFC opponent. Mayfield is currently eighth in the NFL with 8.27 yards per attempt.

The team is also 10-1 when Mayfield completes at least 70 percent of his passes.

HOME SWEET HOME

In 25 games at FirstEnergy Stadium, Mayfield has completed 490 of 781 passes for 5,765 yards with 34 touchdowns and a 17-8 record as a starter.

NO. 1 PASSER

Mayfield's career passer rating of 89.1 is the highest in team history, while his passing yards (12,050) place fifth, his completions (1,006) place fourth and his touchdowns (77) place fifth. His completions are already a team record by a quarterback in his fourth year or younger, as well as his passing yards. His passing touchdowns total place second behind Otto Graham (86).

SEASON STREAKS

Mayfield threw at least 20 touchdown passes in each of his first three seasons, the first Brown to do so. He was also the second Brown to reach the streak and the first since Brian Sipe's streak of three seasons from 1978-80. He tossed at least 3,500 passing yards for the third consecutive year in 2020, the first Brown to record the streak since Sipe from 1979-81 and just the second Brown ever. Mayfield was the first Brown to start his career with three straight seasons of 3,500 passing yards. Additionally, Mayfield threw 300 passing completions for the third consecutive year last year, the first Brown ever to record the streak. He was the first Brown to start his career with three straight seasons of 300 passing completions.

KEEP AWAY

Mayfield didn't throw an interception in five games from Games 8-12 last year, a new career high and tied for the second-longest streak by a Brown since 1970 (first time Vinny Testaverde in 1995). It was also tied for the second-longest streak in the league last year. The Browns were 4-1 in those games and the Browns were 7-2 last year when Mayfield didn't throw an interception. The team is also 15-4 all time in such games. His nine games without throwing an interception last year were a single-season career high. He also didn't throw an interception for 187 consecutive passing attempts last year, spanning seven games. The Browns were 5-2 during that stretch and it was the fourth-longest streak in franchise history.



Last week, RB Kareem Hunt posted 86 scrimmage vards (69 rushing and 17 receiving), along with his third rushing touchdown of the year. Hunt's rushing average of 5.44 is eighth in the NFL, while his three rushing scores tie for fifth, along with teammate RB Nick Chubb. Hunt also has 10 rushes for 10-plus yards in 2021, tied for the league's sixth-highest total. He's one of just six players since last season to accrue at least 1,000 rushing yards and 400 receiving yards. Since he entered the league in 2017, Hunt is 11th in the NFL in rushing yards (3,405), tied for eighth in rushes for 10-plus yards (97), tied for sixth in rushes for 20-plus yards (24), tied for third among all running backs in receiving touchdowns (16) and ninth in receiving yards (1,543). His 42 scrimmage touchdowns are the eighth most by a running back since 2017, while his scrimmage yards (4,948) are also eighth. Hunt is just one of nine players since 1932 to post at least 22 rushing touchdowns and 16 receiving touchdowns in his first five years of experience.



ON THE HUNT

Hunt has registered 26 career games with 50-plus scrimmage yards and a scrimmage touchdown since 2017 and his teams have gone 20-6 in those contests. Hunt has added 100 scrimmage yards and a touchdown 15 times, tied for ninth in the NFL since 2017, and his teams are 12-3 in those games. Hunt has totaled eight games with at least 50 scrimmage yards and two touchdowns in his career and his teams are 7-1 during those instances, as well as seven games with 100 scrimmage yards and a pair of touchdowns (6-1). He's tied for third in the NFL with six games consisting of at least one receiving touchdown and one rushing touchdown since 2017 (5-1).



Hunt's teams' record when he scores a touchdown since he joined the league in 2017, a winning percentage of .800, the seventh-highest mark among all running backs since that time.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE RUNNING BACK

Hunt has notched 14 games with at least one receiving touchdown since he entered the league in 2017, tied for the fourth-most games by a running back since that time and tied for 13th among running backs in thier first five years of experience since 1950. Hunt's teams have gone 10-4 (.714) in those games, the fourth-best winning percentage among running backs with a mark of at least 14 games since 2000.

CB DENZEL WARD



CB **Denzel Ward** posted four total tackles and a pass defensed against the Vikings last week and now has 16 on the year, along with three pass breakups. Ward is ranked tied for fifth in the NFL in passes defensed since last season (21). He was the only player in the NFL last year to have three or more passes defensed in three games and is tied for second in the NFL with five games of three-plus pass breakups since 2018. He became the first Brown in his third year or younger to post at least three passes defensed in three or more games since Joe Haden in 2011. His five career games with three passes defensed rank tied for third in team history and the Browns are 4-0-1 in those contests. His six career games with at least a pair of pass breakups and an interception are tied for third in team history and are tied for the second most in the NFL since 2018. Ward finished last year tied for second in the NFL with 18 passes defensed, despite only playing in 12 games. He became the first player since 2000 to tally at least 18 pass breakups in as few as 12 games in a single season.



- Ward **led the league** with three games consisting of at least three pass breakups last season. The three games tied a single-season high by a Brown.
- Ward is tied with Anthony Henry for **sixth** on the Browns' alltime list of games with multiple pass breakups (12).
- Ward became the first Brown since Joe Schobert in Week
 12 of 2019 to have at least four passes defensed and an interception in a game in Week 11 last year.
- Ward posted five games with multiple passes defensed last year, the first time that's been done by a Brown since Buster Skrine (five) and Joe Haden (seven) in 2014.

WARD SET A CAREER HIGH OF 18 PASSES DEFENSED LAST YEAR AND HAS POSTED AT LEAST 11 IN EACH OF HIS FIRST THREE SEASONS. ONLY 22 OTHER PLAYERS SINCE 1970 HAVE HAD SUCH A STREAK IN THEIR FIRST THREE YEARS. WARD IS ALSO THE THIRD BROWN IN THE SAME CATEGORY TO ACCOMPLISH THE FEAT, JOINING JOE HADEN AND ERIC WRIGHT. OVERALL, WARD IS THE FOURTH BROWN TO HOLD THE STREAK.





WR Jarvis Landry's coveted streak of games with at least a pair of receptions came to an end Week 2, reaching 111 consecutive games. Landry had one catch before he exited the game with a knee injury in the first guarter and did not return. The streak ended as the fourth-longest of its kind in **NFL history**. Landry is the first player in history to have at least 70 catches in each of his first seven seasons. Additionally, Landry has registered at least 70 receptions, 750 receiving yards and three touchdowns every year he's been in the league (seven), tied for the eighth-longest streak in history and tied with DeAndre Hopkins for the longest active streak. The streak has only been reached 12 other times in history and is the first time a player has done it in each of his first seven seasons.





Landry ranks eighth in NFL history for most receptions in a player's first 113 career games (642) and sixth in a player's first 100 games (581).



In Week 15 last year, Landry started his 100th career game and caught his 587th pass as a starter, the ninth-most receptions by a player in his first 100 starts since 1948. His 587 receptions tied for second with Brandon Marshall, trailing Marvin Harrison (598), in the same category in the first seven years of a player's career. His total is fourth since 2014 in the first 100 starts of a player's career, behind Julio Jones (668), DeAndre Hopkins (627) and Antonio Brown (589).

After throwing a touchdown pass in Week 4 and rushing for a touchdown in Week 17 last year, he became the first Brown with a rushing, receiving and passing touchdown in a season since Eric Metcalf in 1989 (10th time in franchise history).

Finished his seventh NFL season with 636 career receptions, the second most by a player in his first seven years in history. He also became just the fourth player in NFL history to reach 630 career receptions in his first seven seasons and the first player since he was drafted in 2014 to hit the mark.



Since Week 2 of his rookie season in 2014 until Week 2 this year, Landry caught at least two passes in 111 consecutive games. His streak was the best in the NFL since 2014 and was the second longest that's active.

With 642 career receptions, Landry is one of just three players to have 640-plus catches since 2014, including DeAndre Hopkins (712) and Julio Jones (686).

Since the 1970 merger, Landry is the only player to have at least 360 receiving first downs (369) and 15 rushing first downs (15).

Landry's 3,294 career yards after catch rank third since he entered the league.

In his 100th career game in Week 4 last year, Landry tossed his first career touchdown pass, a 37-yard pass to WR Odell Beckham Jr. He has 146 passing yards since 2014, first in the NFL by a WR since that time. It was the first touchdown pass by a Browns WR since Mohamed Massaquoi in Week 16 of 2010 and the longest passing touchdown by a Browns WR in history. He's completed all four of his passes last year, becoming the first NFL wide receiver to complete four passes in a season since Terrelle Pryor in 2016 and the first receiver to complete at least four passes and have a perfect completion percentage in NFL history.

Landry reached 7,000 career receiving yards (7,108) last year, just the 30th player to reach the mark in his first seven seasons in NFL history and became the seventh player since he was drafted in 2014 to reach the milestone.



In Week 2, WR Odell Beckham Jr. returned to the gridiron for the first time since his season-ending injury in Week 7 last year. Since then, Beckham Jr. has posted seven catches for 104 yards and a pair of rushing attempts for 14 yards. Prior to his injury last season, he had the third-longest active streak of consecutive games with two-plus receptions (81) in the league. In Week 5, he played in his 80th career game and caught five passes for 58 yards, passing Torry Holt for the **second-most receiving yards by a** player in his first 80 career games in NFL history (6,805). He also eclipsed Keenan Allen for the thirdmost receptions by a player in his first 80 career games in NFL history (485). Despite playing in just 84 career games, Beckham Jr. is still 10th in the NFL in receiving yards (6,934) and tied for fifth in receiving touchdowns (51) since being drafted in 2014. He's also fourth in the NFL since that time in seasons with at least 1,000 receiving yards (five).



A DAY TO REMEMBER

Week 4's contest last season was one of WR Odell Beckham Jr.'s most prolific performances as a Brown, recording five catches for 81 yards and two touchdowns, along with two rushing attempts for 73 yards and his first career rushing score. His 50-yard rushing score was the longest by a nonrunning back in Browns history. He tied his career high with three total touchdowns in the game and became the fourth NFL receiver with at least two receiving touchdowns and a rushing touchdown in a single game since 2000. He received his 50th career touchdown pass from Landry in the game, 37 yards for the longest recorded touchdown pass by a receiver in Browns history. He also became the first Browns player with a 30-yard receiving touchdown and 50-yard rushing touchdown in the same game since 1966 (Leroy Kelly).

TWO TUDDIES

With at least two receiving scores in 12 games since entering the league in 2014, Beckham Jr. ranks tied ofr third in the NFL in that category in an active player's first eight years. Since being drafted, he's fourth among all players in games with multiple touchdowns.

Kevin Stefanski was named the 18th full-time head coach in Cleveland Browns history on January 13, 2020. He spent the previous 14 seasons with the Minnesota Vikings, where he moved up the coaching ladder from assistant to the head coach to offensive coordinator.

In his first season with the Browns, Stefanski led the team to their first playoff appearance since 2002 and first playoff victory in 26 years. He notched the most wins (11) by a first-year Browns head coach since Hall of Famer Paul Brown had 12 in the team's inaugural season in 1946. Stefanski's winning percentage (.688) was the best since Blanton Collier (.714) in 1963 and the third-best overall in franchise history. Stefanski's 11 regular season wins were the most by a first-year head coach in 2020 and marked just the 11th time since 1970 a first-year coach has won 11 or more games. Stefanski was named the NFL Coach of the Year and joined Forrest Gregg (1976) as the second coach in franchise history to earn the honor.

Stefanski's first season was unlike any other in NFL history as he and the club had to navigate the new realities and protocols presented by the COVID-19 pandemic. During his first offseason program, he and the staff had to install a new offensive and defensive system entirely virtual. Stefanski and his coaching staff didn't meet most of the players in-person until training camp, which was completely revamped to adhere to the league's protocols. During the second half of the season, the Browns dealt with numerous stops and starts to their schedule, including complete closures of the team facility, because of positive COVID-19 tests.

Despite the new norms, Stefanski who serves as the team's playcaller, helped the Browns offense to some of its best numbers in generations. Cleveland's 408 points were its second-most in franchise history, while the club also finished with its secondbest total in scrimmage touchdowns (48) and tied for the second-most first downs (355). The Browns finished third in the league in rushing with an average of 148.4 yards per game (the team's best since 1978).

Stefanski helped several Browns earn individual honors as DE Myles Garrett and RT Jack Conklin were named first-team All-Pros by the Associated Press, while G Joel Bitonio and G Wyatt Teller each earned second team honors. Garrett, Bitonio and RB Nick Chubb were selected to the Pro Bowl.

He didn't just bring the team together on the field, he also brought them together in the community. As protests for social justice erupted all across the country during the summer of 2020, Stefanski carved out meeting time to allow the players time to discuss how they felt in the moment. They were also given time off during the funeral of George Floyd, whose controversial death spurred the movement. Stefanski then empowered them to "get in the arena" and use their platform to make a difference however they saw fit.

Stefanski joined the Vikings in 2006 as an assistant to the head coach and remained with the organization under three different head coaches. After serving as assistant quarterbacks coach from 2009-13, Stefanski spent two seasons (2014-15) coaching the tight ends and one season (2016) as running backs coach. From 2017-18, he coached the quarterbacks and added the role of interim offensive coordinator for the final three games before being named the team's offensive coordinator in 2019.

In 2019, the Vikings posted a 10-6 record and earned their first road playoff win since January 9, 2005, after defeating the Saints, 26-20, in New Orleans. Three offensive players were selected to the Pro Bowl as RB Dalvin Cook and FB C.J. Ham were each named to their first career Pro Bowl with Cook voted a starter. QB Kirk Cousins was also named to the Pro Bowl.

In his first full year under Stefanski, Cousins set a singleseason career high for passer rating with a 107.4 mark, fourth best in the NFL in 2019. Cousins also finished with a careerlow six interceptions, while adding 26 touchdowns and a 69.1 completion percentage, fourth in the NFL in 2019. He set a Vikings record for completions in a season with 425 and finished with the second-most passing yards (4,298) and passer rating (107.4) in Vikings history.

With 1,135 rushing yards, Cook became the eighth player in Vikings history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season and the first since Adrian Peterson in 2015. Despite missing the final two games of the season, Cook finished fourth in the NFL with 13 rushing touchdowns and seventh in scrimmage yards with 1,654.

WR Stefon Diggs set a career high with 1,130 receiving yards, giving him back-to-back 1,000-receiving yard seasons for the first time in his career. Diggs finished fourth in the NFL with an average of 17.9 yards per reception in 2019.

Stefanski was elevated from quarterbacks coach to interim offensive coordinator in Week 15 of the 2018 season and promptly guided the unit to two of its best showings of the season. In his first game calling plays, Minnesota scored a season-high 41 points and recorded 418 yards of offense en route to a 41-17 victory over the Dolphins.

As quarterbacks coach in 2017, the Vikings were forced to go to their backup, Case Keenum, early in the season after starter Sam Bradford went down with an injury. Keenum, who had completed 58 percent of his passes previously owned a 9-15 career record as a starter, went on to complete nearly 68 percent of his throws with 22 touchdowns and seven interceptions while leading the Vikings to a record of 11-3.

In his lone season coaching the running backs in 2016, the Vikings battled injuries along the offensive line and to RB Adrian Peterson that caused the runner to miss 13 games. The running game leaned on veterans Jerick McKinnon and Matt Asiata as the duo combined for 941 yards and eight rushing touchdowns.

As tight ends coach, Stefanski helped develop Pro Bowl TE Kyle Rudolph. In 2015, his unit helped clear the way for Adrian Peterson to lead the NFL in rushing with 1,485 yards.

Stefanski was elevated to assistant quarterbacks coach in 2009, where he had a hands-on role in one of the most successful offense seasons in Vikings history. Veteran QB Brett Favre signed with the team in mid-August and finished the season with 4,202 passing yards and 33 touchdowns. The Vikings finished the season 12-4 and won the NFC North.

Stefanski spent 2006-08 working directly with Head Coach Brad Childress on administrative duties and special projects. Stefanski first worked with Childress during Eagles training camp in 2005 as part of the team's operations department.

Stefanski spent the 2005 season at his alma mater, Pennsylvania, as assistant director of football operations, coordinating all aspects of the Quakers' day-to-day operations.


A team captain as a senior in 2003, Stefanski was part of one of the most successful stretches in the history of the Quaker football program. The team won three Ivy League titles (2000, 2002 and 2003), and went 10-0 in 2003 to become the first undefeated Penn team in a decade. During Stefanski's tenure, the squad posted a 42-7 overall record and a 32-3 mark in Ivy League play.

Stefanski earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Pennsylvania and attended St. Joseph's Prep in Philadelphia.

The Stefanski family has made a name in athletics as Kevin's father, Ed, was a basketball standout at Penn and works in the front office of the Detroit Pistons. He has previously held executive positions with the NBA's New Jersey Nets, Philadelphia 76ers, Toronto Raptors and Memphis Grizzlies.

Stefanski and wife, Michelle, have a daughter and two sons.


