ARGERS FALL TO CHIEFS

The Los Angeles Chargers fell to the Kansas City Chiefs, 31-17. WR Keenan Allen, S Derwin James Jr., and DL Sebastian Joseph-Day were the game captains for the Chargers. The Bolts lost the toss and received the opening kickoff.

The Chargers' offense accounted for 139 net rushing yards on Sunday, the third-highest output by the unit in a single game this season. RB Joshua Kelley had a career-long run of 49 yards for a touchdown in the second quarter, finishing the game with 75 yards. WR Joshua Palmer accounted for a career-high and teambest 133 yards receiving on five receptions, as all five catches accounted for first downs and three of the five first-down grabs occurred on either third or fourth down.

The Los Angeles defense registered two takeaways in the game (one interception, one fumble). It's the fourth game of the season with multiple takeaways, tying for the third-most by any defense in the NFL. S Dean Marlowe led the unit with a gamehigh 11 tackles (10 solo).

In the second quarter, CB Asante Samuel Jr., picked off his teamhigh second pass of the year. Including the postseason, Samuel now has seven interceptions over the last two seasons, tied for the most in the AFC and No. 2 in the NFL over that span.

LB Kenneth Murray Jr., recorded a nine-yard sack on third down in the third quarter, his second of the year and giving the Bolts a league-leading 12 sacks on third down this season. The takedown gave the Chargers 22 sacks on the season, which ranks tied for fourth-most by any defense in the NFL through the late afternoon window of Week 7 games.

P JK Scott placed four of his punts inside the 20-yard line, including three inside the 10. He averaged 52.2 yards per punt, the fourth-best single-game gross punting average of his career.

DICKER MAKES CAREER

In the first quarter, K Cameron Dicker made a career-long 55yard field goal. It tied for the third-longest field goal made in franchise history. Dicker finished the game with two successful PATs along with his career-long 55-yard make in the first quarter.

JAMES HITS 400 TACKLES

In his 55th career game, S Derwin James Jr., posted five tackles (three solo). He reached 400 tackles for his career, doing so faster than any defensive back in the last 30 years.

He is the first defensive back in the last 15 years to record at least 400 tackles, 20 tackles for loss and nine sacks within the first 60 games of a career.
