Seattle plays its final preseason game of 2021 looking for its first win as it hosts the L.A. Chargers this Saturday night. Kickoff is set for 7 p.m. (PT).

This will be the 18th time the two teams meet in the preseason, a series that began in Seattle's inaugural season of 1976, with Seattle leading 12-5. The Seahawks last hosted the Chargers on August 15, 2014, a 41-14 Seahawks win at Lumen Field. Seattle has won seven of the last eight pre-season meetings.

Seattle is 25-17 in the preseason under Pete Carroll and had a franchise record nine-game winning streak from 2011-13.

# 2020 RECAP

## TEAM

- \* Since 2012, including playoffs, Seattle is 64-2 when leading by four or more points at halftime. Both losses were last season.
- \* Scored a franchise-record 459 points.
- \* Won 12 or more games for the fifth time in franchise history.
- \* Won its division for the 11th time in franchise history and fifth under Pete Carroll, tying Mike Holmgren. It was the 14th time in the last 18 seasons that Seattle has qualified for the postseason and ninth time in Carroll's 11 seasons as Seahawks head coach.

## JAMAL ADAMS

- \* Career-high 9.5 sacks set the NFL record for most sacks by a defensive back in a season and became the first defensive back to lead his team in sacks since 2011 (NO Roman Harper, 7.5).

## MICHAEL DICKSON

- \* Set club records in average (career-high 49.6) and net average (career-high 44.4).

## TYLER LOCKETT

- \* Set club record with a career-high 100 catches in a season.
- \* Had his second-straight 1,000-yard season, becoming the sixth player in club history to do so.
- \* Tied career-high with 10 touchdowns.

## DK METCALF

- \* Set club record for most receiving yards in a season with 1,303.

## TYLER LOCKETT & DK METCALF

- \* Gave Seattle two 1,000-yard receivers in a single-season for the second time in franchise history (Brian Blades & Joey Galloway in 1995).
- \* Became the first set of receivers to post 80-plus receptions each in a season in club history.
- \* Gave Seattle two receivers with 10-plus touchdowns in a season for the second time in franchise history (Steve Largent & Daryl Turner in 1984).

## JASON MYERS

- \* Has a current streak of 35 made field goals, a franchise-record.

## RUSSELL WILSON

- \* Ranked second for the most passing touchdowns in a player's first nine seasons in NFL history with 267 (Peyton Manning, 275).
- \* Is the only quarterback in NFL history with a winning record in each of his first nine seasons.
- \* Is the NFL's all-time winningest quarterback in a player's first nine seasons with 98.
- \* Is the NFL's all-time winningest quarterback in a player's first nine seasons, including postseason, with 107.
- \* Broke his own club records in a season for most touchdowns (career-high 40), completions (career-high 384) and completion percentage (career-high 68.82).
- \* Set the franchise-record for most 300-yard games in a season (5) and career (20).
- \* Joined Peyton Manning (2012-14) as the only quarterbacks in NFL history with 30-plus pass touchdowns & a 100-plus passer rating in three consecutive seasons (2018-20).
- \* Joined Kurt Warner, Tom Brady & Drew Brees as the only non-first-round quarterbacks to throw 40 passing touchdowns in a single season in NFL history.
- \* Joined Drew Brees (nine consecutive seasons) and Brett Favre (five) as the only players with 30 touchdown passes in at least four consecutive seasons in NFL history.
- \* Joined Peyton Manning as the only players in NFL history to record at least 3,000 passing yards and 20 touchdowns in each of their first nine seasons.
- \* Became the fourth-fastest quarterback to 100 combined wins (regular & postseason) after Week 5's win vs. Minnesota.
- \* Became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw four-plus touchdowns in each of his first three games to open a season.
- \* In Week 1 at Atlanta, became the second quarterback in NFL history (HOF Steve Young) to record 30,000 passing yards and 4,000 rushing yards in a career, becoming the fifth quarterback to reach 4,000 yards.
- \* Has started every game played with 160 straight (144 regular season, 16 postseason). His regular season starts are the longest active streak by a quarterback in the NFL.
- \* Is the NFL's all-time winningest quarterback at home in a player's first nine seasons with 55.
- \* His 34-9 record following an in-season loss is the best record by a quarterback since the 1970 merger.
- \* His 24-31-1 record (.438) when trailing at halftime is second-best in NFL history (Joe Montana, 23-28, .451).
