HERBERT HITS 50

QB Justin Herbert became one of the fastest players in NFL history to reach 50 career touchdown passes. His two-yard scoring throw to **RB** Austin Ekeler marked No. 50, doing so in 24 games to become the fourth player in NFL history to do so within the first 24 games of a career. At 23 years, 249 days old, he was also the fourth-youngest player in NFL history to reach 50 career touchdown passes.

On a two-yard touchdown catch in the third quarter, **RB Austin Ekeler** reached 20 career receiving scores. At 26 years, 181 days, he became the youngest running back to reach that mark in the common draft era (since 1967). Only Chuck Foreman (21) has more receiving touchdowns by a running back over their first five pro seasons in the common draft era.

DEFENSIVE PRESSURE

OLB Joey Bosa dropped Minnesota QB Kirk Cousins for a sevenyard strip-sack in the first quarter, marking the first time sacking Cousins in his career. The performance brought Bosa to 53.0 career sacks. Bosa now has three strip-sacks on the year, tying for the most in the NFL this season.

Later in the first quarter, rookie **LB Amen Ogbongbemiga** dropped Cousins for a nine-yard loss to register his first career sack. Ogbongbemiga is the second rookie undrafted free agent to post a sack this season, joining Tennessee DT Naquan Jones. He is the first undrafted rookie from Oklahoma State to have a sack since Warren Thompson in 1987.
