WIN IN NASHVILLE, 27-20

The Los Angeles Chargers downed the Tennessee Titans, 27-20, in Nissan Stadium on Sunday

The Bolts defense did not allow a touchdown on the day and limited the Titans to just 10 first downs, 44 net rushing yards and 118 net passing yards. It is the second week in a row the Chargers have held their opponent to just 10 first downs.

Offensively, the Chargers averaged 5.3 yards per play and posted a 15-play, 99-yard touchdown drive taking 9:03 off the clock. That possession marked the team's seventh 99-yard touchdown drive since 2000 and first since Oct. 9, 2022.

QB Justin Herbert 19-of-29 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns with an interception for a passer rating of 101.2. The sixth-year quarterback let the Bolts on the ground with nine carries for 68 yards (13.6 avg.) and a one-yard touchdown, including a 36-yard scamper.

TE Oronde Gadsden totaled 68 yards on five receptions (13.6 avg.), while WR Ladd McConkey added four receptions for 56 yards (14.0 avg.). WR Quentin Johnston turned in four receptions for 53 yards (13.3 avg.), including a 19-yard touchdown grab.

S Derwin James Jr. paced the Bolts with eight tackles (five solo) and a QB Hit. LB Daiyan Henley posted seven tackles (five solo), a sack, a tackle for loss, a QB hit and a pass defensed.

OLB Odafe Oweh turned in his first multi-sack game as a Charger, totaling three tackles (two solo), 2.0 sacks, two tackles for loss and a pair of QB hits. Since joining the Bolts via trade in Week 6, Oweh's four sacks are tied for the fifth-most in the NFL.

OLB Tuli Tuipulotu added a solo tackle, a sack, a QB hit, and a forced fumble.

HERBERT KEEPS CLIMBI

QB Justin Herbert completed 19-of-29 passes for 250 yards and two touchdowns with an interception (101.2 rating). The sixth-year passer has accumulated 23,483 career passing yards, passing QB Matt Ryan and good for the fourth most passing yards by a player in the first six years of his career.

Sunday also marked Herbert's 50th career multi-touchdown game, tying him with Hall of Fame QB Peyton Manning for the most of such games in a player's first six seasons in NFL history. The performance also marked Herbert's 12th with a passing touchdown and a rushing touchdown, tying Hall of Fame QB John Hadl for the most in franchise history.
