CHARGERS TOPPLE BROWNS, 27-10

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Cleveland Browns, 27-10, at Huntington Bank Field on Sunday.

Sunday's win was highlighted by **QB Justin Herbert**, who completed 18-of-27 passes for 282 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 125.8. The fifth-year quarterback set a season high in quarterback rating and recorded is third multi-touchdown game of the season and had three receivers with 60-or-more yards. In the first half, Herbert was 14-for-16 (87.5 pct.) for 250 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 158.3. It marks the eighth time in his career he has thrown for over 200 yards in the first half of a game and the first time he has recorded a perfect 158.3 passer rating in the first half of a game.

RB J.K. Dobbins led the team on the ground, recording 85 yards and two touchdowns on 14 carries. Sunday marked the third multi-rushing touchdown game of his career.

WR Quentin Johnston totaled 118 yards and one touchdown on four receptions, finding the endzone on a 66-yard pass from Herbert. It marks the first 100-yard receiving game for Johnston and his 66-yard touchdown reception was the longest catch of his career.

WR Joshua Palmer added 63 yards and one touchdown on two receptions. Rookie **WR Ladd McConkey** recorded five receptions for 64 yards.

Defensively, the Chargers recorded three interceptions and 6.0 sacks. **DB Elijah Molden, S Alohi Gilman** and **CB Tarheeb Still** each had an interception.

LB Daiyan Henley led the team with 13 tackles (eight solo), 1.0 tackles for loss and one pass defensed.

OLB Tuli Tuipulotu totaled a career-high 2.5 sacks while **DL Morgan Fox** matched his career-high with 2.0 sacks. **OLB Khalil Mack** added 1.0 sack while **CB Cam Hart** combined with Tuipulotu for half a sack.

HERBERT'S FIRST HAL

In the first half, **QB Justin Herbert** was 14-for-16 (87.5 pct.) for 250 yards and two touchdowns for a passer rating of 158.3. It marks the eighth time in his career he has thrown for over 200 yards in the first half of a game and the first time he has recorded a perfect 158.3 passer rating in the first half of a game.

His 250 yards is the second most he has recorded in the first half of his career and the most since he threw for 212 in Week 8 of the 2023 season against Chicago. It is the seventh-highest first half total in franchise history and seventh time a Chargers quarterback has thrown for 250 yards in the first half of a game.

Herbert is the first Chargers quarterback to throw for 250 yards and record a 158.3 passer rating in the first half of a game and joins Phillip Rivers (3) as the only Chargers quarterbacks to throw for 250 yards in the opening half of a game.

Since Herbert was drafted in 2020, he joins Tom Brady, Joe Burrow and Lamar Jackson as the only quarterbacks to throw for 250 yards in the first half of a game and record a 158.3 passer rating.
