LOS ANGELES CHARGERS vs. LAS VEGAS RAIDERS

ARGERS DEFEAT RAIDERS AT

The Los Angeles Chargers defeated the Las Vegas Raiders, 22-10, at home to open the 2024 season behind three defensive turnovers and a 135-yard rushing output from RB J.K. Dobbins.

In his first action since Week 1 of the 2023 season. **Dobbins** led the Chargers with 135 rushing yards and one touchdown on 10 carries (13.5 avg.). His 135 yards rushing is the second highest single game output of his career and is his best effort since collecting 125 yards on the ground in Week 15 of the 2022 season at Cleveland when he ran for 125 yards. **Dobbins'** night included carries of 61 and 46 yards. It is the first time in his career that he has had multiple 40yard rushes in a single game and is the first player to do so in the 2024 season before kickoff of the Sunday Night Football game. He scored on a 12-yard run in the fourth quarter.

QB Justin Herbert completed 17-of-26 passes (65 pct.) for 144 yards, one touchdown and no interceptions for a passer rating of 92.5. He connected with WR Ladd McConkey, who made his NFL debut and his first career start, on a 10-yard pass in the fourth quarter to close scoring at 22-10.

The defense forced three turnovers and limited the Raiders to just 10 points to open the season. Las Vegas was also held to 35.7 third down percentage and Raiders QB Gardner Minshew II was sacked four times.

OLB Joev Bosa and **S Derwin James Jr.** led the defense with seven tackles each. Bosa also collected 1.0 sack, 1.0 tackle for loss and forced a fumble. DB Ja'Sir Taylor recovered Bosa's forced fumble and turned in three solo tackles. OLB Khalil Mack added three tackles (one solo), 1.5 sacks, 1.0 tackle for loss a pass defense and one fumble recovery. **DL Poona Ford** collected three tackles (two solo), his first career interception and two passes defensed. Ford is the first defensive lineman this season ahead of the Sunday Night Football game to record an interception.

JAMES JR. FASTEST

With 10 total tackles against Las Vegas, S Derwin James Jr. has totaled 504 career tackles and became the fastest defensive back to eclipse 500 tackles since 2000, doing so in 67 games.

LB Junior Colson tallied three tackles (one solo) and one pass defensed in his NFL Debut while CB Cam Hart saw action on special teams.
