★ PRESEASON NOTABLES ★

A win would mark the first time Dallas opened up the preseason with a victory since 2017 against Arizona (8/3) at the Hall of Fame Game in Canton, Ohio.

For the first time since 2011, the Dallas Cowboys will open the preseason at home in the confines of AT&T Stadium. The last time Dallas played its preseason opener at home, they defeated Denver 24-23 in front of 74,045 fans at AT&T Stadium.

★ Cowboys Summer Training Camp ★



The Dallas Cowboys returned to Oxnard, California to open their 64th training camp in 2023 at the Residence Inn at River Ridge. The 2023 camp, presented by American Airlines, marks the 44th year that the team has prepped for the upcoming season in California and the 17th time that the Cowboys have spent all, or a portion of, its camp at the Oxnard location. Dallas came back to the west coast permanently in 2012 after training in the Alamodome in San Antonio prior to the 2011 season.

The Cowboys are one-of-seven teams who will spend camp away from their facilities - Buffalo, Carolina, Indianapolis, Kansas City, LA Rams and Pittsburgh. Excluding 2020, the 25 NFL clubs that are opting to “stay home” this summer trails only 2021 for the most such teams since 2000. Teams considered to be “staying home” hold camp at their respective practice facility, home stadium or at a site within 10 miles of their team headquarters. In 2000, only 10-of-31 (32 percent) teams stayed close to home.

Training camp in Oxnard will conclude on Tuesday, Aug. 18, as the team will depart to Seattle for a preseason contest against the Seahawks on Aug. 19. The team will return to Texas after the Seattle preseason game and wrap up the final portion of Cowboys training camp at Ford Center at The Star in Frisco, Texas, with selected practices open to the public.

★ Training Camp History ★

June 3, 1960 – The newly formed Dallas Cowboys franchise announced that it will train at Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon. Rookies reported on July 9.

May 24, 1961 – Due to its proximity to their first exhibition game against Minnesota in Minneapolis, the Dallas Cowboys moved training camp to St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minn. Camp opened on July 9.

June 8, 1962 – The Dallas Cowboys moved their training camp site to the campus of Northern Michigan College on the shores of Lake Superior in Marquette, Mich. Rookies reported on July 13.

July 12, 1963 – Because the team played three of its first four preseason games on the west coast, the Dallas Cowboys moved training camp to California Lutheran College in Thousand Oaks, Calif. This camp, which was the first of 27 at CLC, opened on July 12.

Dec. 6, 1989 – For the first time in the 30-year history of the team, the Dallas Cowboys trained in Texas as the club announced its 1990 training camp would be held at St. Edward’s University in Austin, Texas. This camp, the first of eight at St. Ed’s, opened on July 22.

Feb. 17, 1998 – The Cowboys began a four-year stay at Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas, with their 1998 camp. The first camp at Midwestern State University opened on July 16. In 2001, the Cowboys split camp between Midwestern State and the Residence Inn in Oxnard, Calif., spending two weeks at each location.

May 17, 2002 – The Cowboys continued their commitment to fans in the state of Texas by announcing the 2002 training camp will take place at the Alamodome in San Antonio, Texas. The camp, which ran for four weeks, opened on July 26. The Cowboys returned to the Alamodome again in 2003.

Oct. 24, 2003 – The Cowboys announced a return to California for training camp. For the 2004-06 seasons, the Cowboys conducted their entire training camp in Oxnard, Calif., at the Residence Inn at River Ridge, using practice fields provided by The City of Oxnard. The Cowboys opened their first returned camp on July 30, 2004.

May 4, 2006 – The Dallas Cowboys announced a five-year commitment to once again call the City of San Antonio its summer home beginning in 2007. The Alamodome, which played host to Cowboys training camps in 2002 and 2003 was again the site for the team’s summer practice sessions.

Summer, 2010 – The Dallas Cowboys held a split camp, spending the first portion in the Alamodome in San Antonio and the second at the Residence Inn at River Ridge in Oxnard.

July, 2012 – The Dallas Cowboys returned to Oxnard, California for all of training camp at the Residence Inn at River Ridge after spending the 2011 training camp in San Antonio at the Alamodome.

August, 2017 – After spending the first four weeks of training camp in Oxnard, California, the Dallas Cowboys returned home to hold their first ever training camp practices at their new practice facility at The Star in Frisco. Six training camp practices were held inside Ford Center and open to the public.

August, 2020 – For the first time in franchise history, the Cowboys spent all of training camp at The Star in Frisco due to COVID-19 restrictions.

July, 2021 – The Cowboys return to Oxnard, California for training camp after spending 2020 training camp in Frisco.

★ TURPIN TIME ★

The Dallas Cowboys signed KaVontae Turpin following his breakout season in the 2022 USFL spring football league, where he earned league MVP honors as an offensive weapon and return specialist. Turpin was one of the highlights of the 2022 preseason, returning both a kickoff and punt for a touchdown in the second preseason game at the LA Chargers.

Turpin was the only NFL player in the 2022 preseason with a kick return touchdown or punt return touchdown, solidifying a spot on the Cowboys 53-man roster.



★ GROUND GAME ★

In 2022 Malik Davis was fourth among all NFL preseason rushers with 132 yards on 31 carries (4.3 avg.). As a team, Dallas ranked seventh in the 2022 preseason in rushing yards-per-game (128.0).

Davis will receive carries once again this preseason, along with rookie running backs Deuce Vaughn and Hunter Luepke. Vaughn, one of the most decorated players in college football in 2022, was the first player in Kansas State's program with 1,000 rushing yards and 1,000 receiving yards in a career. Luepke comes from North Dakota State, where he was a three-time All-American and rushed for 1,665 yards and 24 touchdowns while catching 38 passes for 494 yards and nine touchdowns in his four-year career at North Dakota State.



★ MAKING AN IMPACT ★

Over the last decade (2012-22), the Dallas Cowboys have relied on the draft to develop young players and finish building the roster for the upcoming season. Dallas has consistently hit on its draft picks in recent years, including two-time All-Pro linebacker Micah Parsons and two-time Pro Bowlers in CeeDee Lamb and Trevon Diggs.

The Cowboys have also been successful in the later rounds of the draft and rely on rookies to play a key role in all three phases of the game. In 2022 Dallas' rookies combined for 145 games played, 41 games started and 4,902 snaps, the sixth-most snaps among rookies in the NFL.

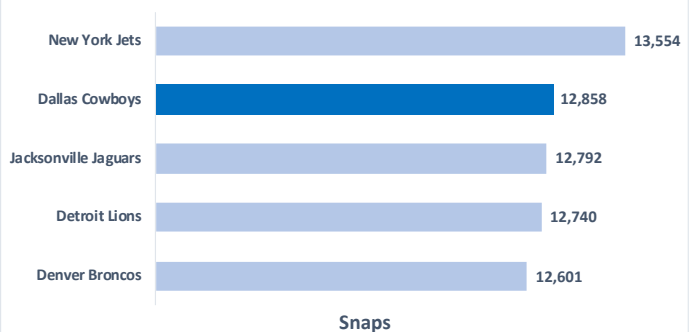

Led by 2022 first round pick Tyler Smith (1,095 snaps), Cowboys rookies played the fourth-most offensive snaps in the league (2,075). Cornerback DaRon Bland, who led the team with five interceptions in 2022, led all Dallas defensive rookies with 573 snaps.

Since Mike McCarthy arrived in 2020, Cowboys rookies have played the second-most snaps in the NFL, trailing only the N.Y. Jets.

★ PASS BREAKUP UNIT ★

Dallas' secondary in 2022 ranked eighth in the NFL in pass defense, allowing a mere 200.9 net passing yards-per-game. In the 2022 preseason, the Cowboys were the only NFL team to have three players with three-or-more pass breakups.

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 6-10 record in 2020, a 12-5 record in 2021, and a 12-5 mark in 2022, he owns the fifth-most wins (20th all-time) and sixth-highest winning percentage (.614) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

★ HEAD COACHES ★

MIKE McCARTHY (155-97-2, 17th Year, 30-20 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since 2006-07. He has also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 17th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and four with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 155-97-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (20th all-time) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the first time for Dallas since 1994-95 to record consecutive 12-plus win seasons. En route to the team's second straight playoff berth (first time since 2006-07), the Dallas offense finished third in the league in points (467, fourth in points-per-game) while the defense led the league in takeaways for the second consecutive season.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

DOUG PEDERSON (51-45-1, 7th Year, 9-8 with Jac)

The Jacksonville Jaguars hired a two-time Super Bowl champion, naming Doug Pederson the club's head coach on Feb. 3, 2022.

In his first year with Jacksonville, Pederson led the team to its first AFC South title and first playoff appearance since 2017. One-of-three finalists for AP NFL Coach of the Year, Pederson helped second year quarterback Trevor Lawrence earn his first Pro Bowl berth while the offense recorded the most scrimmage yards in franchise history.

Pederson joined the Jaguars after spending five seasons as the head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles (2016-20), compiling a 46-39-1 record through the regular and postseason. Under Pederson's guidance, the Eagles earned a playoff berth in three consecutive seasons (2017-19) and won two NFC East titles (2017 and 2019). In 2017 Pederson led the Eagles to their first-ever Super Bowl Championship with a 41-33 victory over the Patriots in Super Bowl LII.

As a former NFL quarterback, it is no surprise that Pederson was key in the development of Carson Wentz, who threw for 16,811 yards and 113 touchdowns from 2016-20. Wentz established several single-season franchise records during his time in Philadelphia, including completions (388 in 2019), completion percentage (69.6 pct. in 2018), passing yards (4,039 in 2019) and passing touchdowns (33 in 2017) under Pederson's tutelage.

In 2019 the Eagles claimed their second NFC East division title in Pederson's tenure. Philadelphia made their third straight playoff appearance, and Pederson joined Andy Reid as the only head coaches in Philadelphia history to earn three postseason berths in their first four seasons.

Prior to arriving in Philadelphia, Pederson served as the offensive coordinator of the Kansas City Chiefs from 2013-15, helping the team post a 31-17 regular season record over three seasons. Pederson helped Alex Smith through the most productive stretch of his career with three consecutive 3,000-yard seasons.

Before joining Kansas City, Pederson coached quarterbacks in Philadelphia (2011-12). Pederson began his pro coaching career as offensive quality control coach with the Eagles from 2009-10.

A 12-year NFL veteran, Pederson played quarterback for the Green Bay Packers, Miami Dolphins, Philadelphia Eagles and Cleveland Browns after originally being drafted by the Carolina Panthers in the 1995 expansion draft. He was part of Packers teams that won Super Bowl XXXI, two NFC Championships (1996 and 1997) and six division titles.



★ THIRD DOWN DARLING ★

Dak Prescott's ability to make the play that extends the drive on third down should not be overlooked, as he posted a first down on 59-of-124 third down chances in 2022 - the third-highest third down conversion rate among NFL quarterbacks:

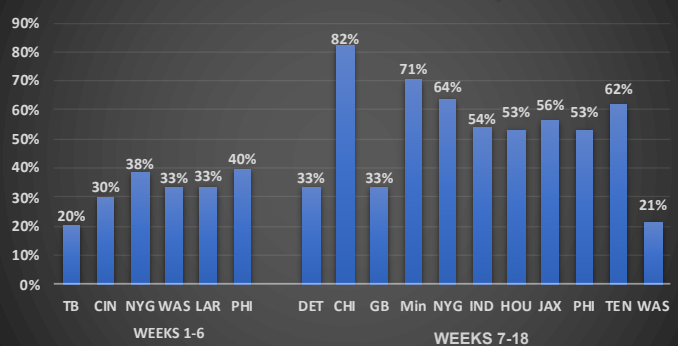

When Prescott returned from a thumb injury in Week 7, the Cowboys led the NFL in third down offense, converting 52.3% of their third down chances and ranked fifth (45.5%) in the NFL spanning the entire season. Before Week 6, Dallas was 29th in the NFL with a 32.1% third down conversion rate.

Dallas converted at least 50.0% of its third downs in seven consecutive games (at Min, 11/20 - at Ten, 12/29), the first time that the Cowboys went seven straight games with a 50.0% conversion rate-or-better since a seven-game streak in 2014 (at Cle, 9/7 - vs. Cin, 10/5).

After leading the Cowboys to a win at Minnesota (10/31) in 2021, Cooper Rush was once again called upon to step in for an injured Dak Prescott in 2022.

In his five starts in 2022, Rush led the Cowboys to four straight wins before falling at Philadelphia (10/16). Including last year's win at Minnesota, Rush is now 5-1 as a starting quarterback. He was the only quarterback in franchise history to win his first five career starts and the 14th quarterback in NFL history to accomplish this feat.

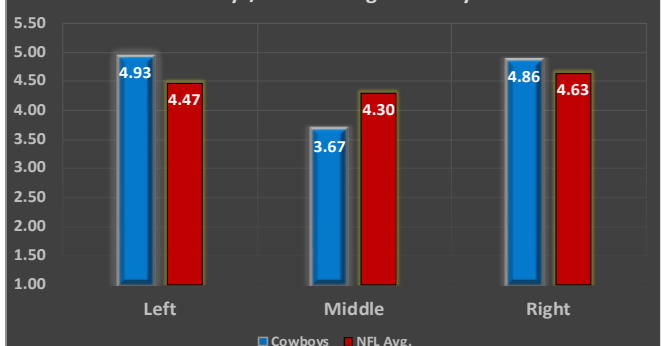
