In addition to being one-of-five teams without a give-away in the NFL this season, 2023 is the first time in 64 seasons of Cowboys football that Dallas committed no turnovers in the first two games of a season.

Dallas outscored its first opponents - the N.Y. Jets and N.Y. Giants - 70-10. The Cowboys +60 point differential is the second-highest point differential through the first two games in franchise history, trailing only the 1968 team (+67).

137

CeeDee Lamb has accumulated 137 of his 220 receiving yards when running after the catch. Lamb's 103 yards after catch are tied with Justin Jefferson for second in the NFL in 2023.

Three of the four teams in the NFC East advanced to the post-season in 2022, marking the third season since the NFL's realignment in 2002 that the NFC East sent three teams to the playoffs - 2006 and 2007.

Team Spotlight:

Dak Prescott & CeeDee Lamb



★ Dak Prescott and CeeDee Lamb's chemistry has grown since Lamb became the Cowboys No. 1 receiver in 2022. Since 2022, Lamb has averaged 85.6 receiving yards-per-game when Prescott starts at quarterback, the fifth-highest receiving yards-per-game among starting quarterback/top wide receiver duos.

★ Lamb reeled in 11 receptions for 143 yards in the win against the N.Y. Jets last week, giving him four career games with double-digit catches. Lamb's four games with 10-plus receptions are the most by any Cowboys player in their first four seasons.

★ Lamb has 11 career 100-yard receiving games, the second-most 100-yard games by a Cowboys player through his first 51 career games.

The Cowboys are the fifth team in the Super Bowl era to score at least 70 points and allow 10-or-fewer points through their first two games of a season, joining New England in 2019, Detroit (1970), Oakland (1967) and the Houston Oilers (1966).

★ WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN WEEK 3 ★

4

DAK PRESCOTT

- * Dak Prescott will play and start in his 100th career game on Sunday at Arizona. He is the only quarterback in NFL history with at least 150 touchdown passes and 25 rushing touchdowns in his first 100 career games.
- * Prescott has been efficient with the football in 2023, as he is one-of-five starting quarterbacks without a turnover (Jordan Love, Baker Mayfield, Geno Smith and Justin Herbert).

7

TREVON DIGGS

- * When targeted, Trevon Diggs has allowed a passer rating of 1.0, the lowest passer rating allowed in the NFL in 2023.
- * Diggs has 18 career interceptions, tied with J.C. Jackson for the most interceptions since Diggs was drafted in 2020. With two interceptions, Diggs would join Everson Walls as the only two players in franchise history with 20-plus interceptions in their first four seasons.

MICAH PARSONS

- * Micah Parsons needs half-a-sack to reach 30.0 career sacks. He would become the eighth player in NFL history to reach 30.0 sacks in the first 36 games of his career.
- * NFL Next Gen Stats credited Parsons with a team-high nine pressures in the 30-10 victory while clocking him with an average pass rush get-off of 0.57 seconds – the fastest of any player in a game over the last two years.

BRANDON AUBREY

- * Brandon Aubrey has racked up plenty of kicking points through two games. Aubrey's 26 kicking points lead the NFL in 2022 and are the fifth-most through two career games in NFL history, trailing Jeff Reed (30), Harrison Butker (29), Richie Cunningham (29) and Eddie Murray (28).
- * With three field goals against Arizona, Aubrey would become the fifth kicker in NFL history to make 10 field goals in his first three career games, joining former Cowboy Richie Cunningham (13; 1997), Harrison Butker (10; 2017), Jeff Reed (11; 2002), and Olindo Mare (10; 1997).

TONY POLLARD

- * Tony Pollard's 48 touches are the most by a Cowboys player through the first two games of a season since Ezekiel Elliott had 53 touches in the first two contests of the 2020 season.
- * With 30 touches at Arizona, Pollard would be the first Cowboys running back to record 30 touches in back-to-back games since Ezekiel Elliott in 2018.

CEEDEE LAMB

- * Coming off 11 receptions against the N.Y. Jets last week, CeeDee Lamb has four career games with 10-plus catches, the most by any Cowboys receiver in his first four seasons. With one more 10-catch performance, Lamb would tie Amari Cooper for the third-most games (five) with 10-or-more catches by a Cowboys receiver.
- * Lamb has 11 career 100-yard receiving games, the second-most 100-yard games by a Cowboy through his first four seasons. Lamb needs five 100-yard performances for the rest of the season to tie Bob Hayes (16) for the most 100-yard receiving games by a Cowboy in his first four seasons.

DALLAS COWBOYS



- * If Dallas allows 16 points-or-fewer on Sunday, they will have allowed the fewest points through the first three games in Cowboys history. The 1974 team currently holds the record with 27 points allowed through three games. The NFL record for fewest points allowed through the first three games of a season is 13 points by Green Bay in 2001.
- * With a win on Sunday, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will tie Bud Grant for 19th on the all-time wins list among NFL head coaches.
- * The Cowboys held the ball for 42:15 against the Jets, the second-highest mark for a non-overtime regular season game in franchise history. The only higher time of possession for a Cowboys non-overtime game was in 1983 against Philadelphia (10/16; 43:43).
- * When passing, Dallas is averaging the third-fewest air yards-per-attempt (5.5) in 2023. However, the Cowboys are 12th in yards after the catch (232).

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 32-20 record in his fourth season with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (20th all-time) and sixth-highest winning percentage (.617) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

★ HEAD COACHES ★

MIKE McCARTHY (157-97-2, 17th Year, 32-20 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since 2006-07. He has also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 17th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and four with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 157-97-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (20th all-time) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the first time for Dallas since 1994-95 to record consecutive 12-plus win seasons. En route to the team's second straight playoff berth (first time since 2006-07), the Dallas offense finished third in the league in points (467, fourth in points-per-game) while the defense led the league in takeaways for the second consecutive season.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

JONATHAN GANNON (0-2, 1st Year)

Jonathan Gannon landed his first NFL head coaching job when he was hired by the Arizona Cardinals on February 14, 2023. Gannon joined the Cardinals with over 15 years of experience in the NFL.

Gannon spent the past two seasons (2021-22) as the defensive coordinator with the Philadelphia Eagles. Under Gannon, the Eagles boasted a top-10 defense in each season, ranking second in total defense in 2022 (301.5 yards-per-game) and 10th in the NFL in 2021 (328.8). In 2022 the Eagles also featured the NFL's top-ranked pass defense (179.8 yards-per-game) and the league's eighth ranked scoring defense (20.2 points-per-game).

Philadelphia advanced to Super Bowl LVII after beating San Francisco in the NFC Championship, won the NFC East in 2022 and finished the regular season as the No. 1 seed in the NFC with a 14-3 record. The Eagles qualified for the postseason in each year Gannon was the defensive coordinator.

In his two seasons as defensive coordinator with Philadelphia, four different Eagles players combined for five Pro Bowl selections: Darius Slay (two), Haason Reddick (one), Javon Hargrave (one) and Josh Sweat (one). Reddick and CB James Bradberry were each named second-team All-Pro in 2022.

Prior to working with the Eagles, he was the defensive backs/cornerbacks coach with the Indianapolis Colts (2018-20) and the assistant defensive backs/quality control coach with the Minnesota Vikings (2014-17) after working as a defensive assistant with the Tennessee Titans (2012-13). He spent three seasons (2009-11) as a scout with the St. Louis Rams and began his NFL coaching career as a defensive assistant with the Atlanta Falcons under head coach Bobby Petrino, his former college head coach, in 2007.

Gannon played collegiately as a safety at Louisville and appeared in nine games as a redshirt freshman in 2002 before suffering a career-ending hip injury. Following the injury, he worked as a student assistant at Louisville for three seasons (2003-05) and one season as a graduate assistant (2006) under Petrino.

In his lone appearance against Arizona (1/2/22) in 2021, totaled five tackles, two tackles for loss and one quarterback pressure.

Dak Prescott - QB

Completed 66.1% of his passes for 409 yards, five touchdowns and zero interceptions in two career games against Arizona.

DeMarcus Lawrence - DE

In his four contests against the Cardinals, totaled 11 tackles, six quarterback pressures, 3.0 sacks, and three tackles for loss.



Prescott was awarded the Walter Payton Man of the Year Award for the 2022 season. Prescott is the only quarterback in Cowboys history to pass for 400 yards in consecutive games, and his three-game streak is tied with Ryan Fitzpatrick (2018) for the longest streak in NFL history.



Tony Pollard led the Cowboys with 1,007 rushing yards on 193 carries (5.2 avg.) while adding 39 receptions for 371 yards in 2022. Pollard's 5.9 yards-per-touch led all NFL running backs in 2022 - min. 150 touches.





The Cowboys are the 20th team in NFL history - first since Minnesota in 2007 - with 10-plus sacks and seven-or-more takeaways in the first two games of a season.

★ UNDER PRESSURE ★

The Cowboys front six have established themselves as one of the premier pass rushing units in the league. After leading the NFL with 271 pressures in 2022, Dallas once again sits atop the NFL in 2023 with 58 pressures, per *Pro Football Focus*:

★ NEGATIVE PLAYS ★

After ranking 24th in opponent negative plays in 2020, Dallas took down opponents behind the line of scrimmage at a high rate since Dan Quinn's arrival in 2021.

In 2023 Dallas has forced 17 negative plays on 111 defensive snaps, a 15.3% negative play percentage that is second in the NFL:

In 2022 Dallas made an effort to jar the ball loose from opposing ball carriers, as the Cowboys led the league with 20 forced fumbles, which was also the most by a Cowboys team since the stat became official in 1994:

Brandon Aubrey signed with the Cowboys prior to training camp after kicking two seasons for the Birmingham Stallions in the USFL. Aubrey has been rock solid as a rookie, converting all seven of his field goal attempts and five-of-six PATs.

PRO: Prior to their final 2023 preseason game, the Dallas Cowboys added a young, talented signal caller to the quarterback room when sending a 2024 fourth round pick to the San Francisco 49ers for Trey Lance, the former third overall pick from the 2021 NFL Draft. While learning under veteran quarterbacks Dak Prescott and Cooper Rush in Dallas, Lance will continue to develop his dual-threat abilities that made him such a sought after prospect in the Draft. Along with 797 career passing yards, Lance has rushed for 235 yards on 54 carries (4.4 avg.) in eight career games. Lance began the 2022 season as San Francisco's starting quarterback before suffering a season-ending ankle injury in Week 2.

- Made his first career start at Arizona (10/10), completing 15-of-29 attempts for 192 yards and rushing for 89 yards on 16 carries (5.6 avg.).
- Started his second game of the season in Week 17 against Houston (1/2/22), setting career-highs in passing yards (249), completion percentage (69.6%) and tied a career-high with two touchdown passes.

COLLEGE:

- Appeared in 19 games, with 17 starts, in three seasons at North Dakota State (2018-20) as a dual-threat quarterback, completing 208-of-318 attempts (65.4%) for 2,947 passing yards, 30 touchdowns and one interception to go along with 1,325 rushing yards and 18 touchdowns on 192 carries (6.9 avg.).
