★ Cowboys Summer Training Camp ★



The Dallas Cowboys returned to Oxnard, California to open their 65th training camp in 2024 at the Residence Inn at River Ridge. The 2024 camp, presented by American Airlines, marks the 45th year that the team has prepped for the upcoming season in California and the 18th time that the Cowboys have spent all, or a portion of, its camp at the Oxnard location. Dallas came back to the west coast permanently in 2012 after training in the Alamodome in San Antonio prior to the 2011 season.

The Cowboys are one-of-eight teams who will spend camp away from their home facilities - Buffalo, Indianapolis, Kansas City, Las Vegas, LA Rams, New Orleans and Pittsburgh. Excluding 2020, the 24 clubs (75 percent) that are opting to “stay home” are the fourth-most such teams since 2000. Teams considered to be “staying home” hold camp at their respective practice facility, home stadium or at a site within 10 miles of their team headquarters. In 2000, only 10 of 31 (32 percent) teams stayed close to home.

Training camp in Oxnard will conclude on Thursday, Aug. 22, as the team will return to Texas and wrap up the final portion of Cowboys training camp at Ford Center at The Star in Frisco, Texas, with selected practices open to the public.

★ Training Camp History ★

June 3, 1960 – The newly formed Dallas Cowboys franchise announced that it will train at Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon. Rookies reported on July 9.

May 24, 1961 – Due to its proximity to their first exhibition game against Minnesota in Minneapolis, the Dallas Cowboys moved training camp to St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minn. Camp opened on July 9.

June 8, 1962 – The Dallas Cowboys moved their training camp site to the campus of Northern Michigan College on the shores of Lake Superior in Marquette, Mich. Rookies reported on July 13.

July 12, 1963 – Because the team played three of its first four preseason games on the west coast, the Dallas Cowboys moved training camp to California Lutheran College in Thousand Oaks, Calif. This camp, which was the first of 27 at CLC, opened on July 12.

Dec. 6, 1989 – For the first time in the 30-year history of the team, the Dallas Cowboys trained in Texas as the club announced its 1990 training camp would be held at St. Edward’s University in Austin, Texas. This camp, the first of eight at St. Ed’s, opened on July 22.

Feb. 17, 1998 – The Cowboys began a four-year stay at Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls, Texas, with their 1998 camp. The first camp at Midwestern State University opened on July 16. In 2001, the Cowboys split camp between Midwestern State and the Residence Inn in Oxnard, Calif., spending two weeks at each location.

May 17, 2002 – The Cowboys continued their commitment to fans in the state of Texas by announcing the 2002 training camp will take place at the Alamodome in San Antonio, Texas. The camp, which ran for four weeks, opened on July 26. The Cowboys returned to the Alamodome again in 2003.

Oct. 24, 2003 – The Cowboys announced a return to California for training camp. For the 2004-06 seasons, the Cowboys conducted their entire training camp in Oxnard, Calif., at the Residence Inn at River Ridge, using practice fields provided by The City of Oxnard. The Cowboys opened their first returned camp on July 30, 2004.

May 4, 2006 – The Dallas Cowboys announced a five-year commitment to once again call the City of San Antonio its summer home beginning in 2007. The Alamodome, which played host to Cowboys training camps in 2002 and 2003 was again the site for the team’s summer practice sessions.

Summer, 2010 – The Dallas Cowboys held a split camp, spending the first portion in the Alamodome in San Antonio and the second at the Residence Inn at River Ridge in Oxnard.

July, 2012 – The Dallas Cowboys returned to Oxnard, California for all of training camp at the Residence Inn at River Ridge after spending the 2011 training camp in San Antonio at the Alamodome.

August, 2017 – After spending the first four weeks of training camp in Oxnard, California, the Dallas Cowboys returned home to hold their first ever training camp practices at their new practice facility at The Star in Frisco. Six training camp practices were held inside Ford Center and open to the public.

August, 2020 – For the first time in franchise history, the Cowboys spent all of training camp at The Star in Frisco due to COVID-19 restrictions.

July, 2021 – The Cowboys return to Oxnard, California for training camp after spending 2020 training camp in Frisco.

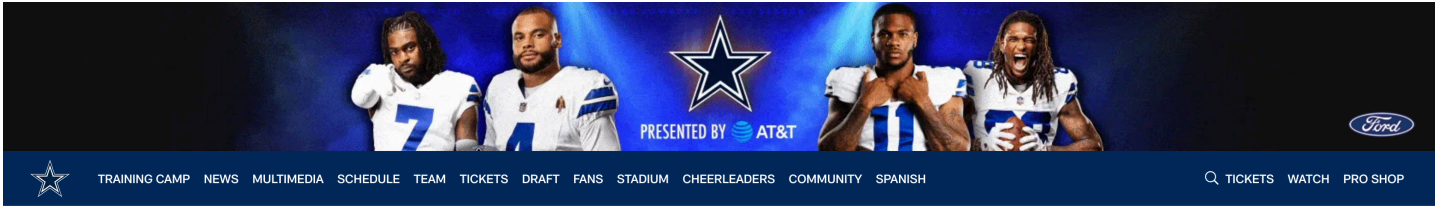

Daily Podcasts

Talkin' Cowboys – True to its name, the “Talkin' Cowboys” podcast delivers knowledgeable, entertaining coverage of America’s Team. This lineup has a blend of experience, youth and a former NFL player. Host Kyle Youmans is joined by Nick Harris, Josh Rodriguez and former Cowboys draft pick Isaiah Stanback for a daily dose of Cowboys coverage.

Cowboys Break – This daily show is serious about the Cowboys, without taking themselves too serious in the process. This one-hour podcast enters its 19th season, hosted by Derek Eagleton, along with Ambar Garcia, Patrik Walker and former NFL scout Bryan Broadus. The crew discusses the current state of the team, giving analysis on the day-to-day events with a mix of historical perspective.

Hangin' with the Boys – If you're looking for some guys that enjoy talking about Cowboys football but also enjoy giving each other a hard time and having fun, then this is the show for you. Join host Shannon Gross, along with six-time Pro Bowler Nate Newton, former Cowboys receiver Jesse Holley and Kurt Daniels as they aren't afraid to get off-topic from time to time. And you never know who might be calling into the show.

Cowboys StoryLine – The newest daily podcast has a unique format that focuses on the fan perspective. Longtime beat writer Nick Eatman runs the point solo with a new show that takes phone calls and text messages from the fans to get their viewpoint on the team, mixing in a few historical stories along the way.

Mick Shots – You can't find more experience on one show than this one, featuring Mickey Spagnola, who has covered the Cowboys since the 1980s. One of the players on the team back then - Everson Walls - has plenty of stories to tell and they're joined by longtime DFW media personality Bill Jones.

Players' Lounge – They joined the Cowboys together in 2010. Both undrafted and both playing safety. So why wouldn't Barry Church and Danny McCray have their own podcast? The two dissect the game like no other and have veteran media personality Newy Scruggs guiding the way and Hek'ma Harrison providing his insight as well.

Girls Talk, 'Boys Talk – One of the newest daily podcasts, GTBT covers the Cowboys like never seen before. A lineup of all females, this crew gives their opinions of the team, from anything to formations and alignments to stories from the locker room and the sidelines. A team of Nicole Hutchison, Kristi Scales, Isha Morrison, Jess Navarez and other special guests throughout the season will break down the Cowboys from every angle.

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 42-25 record in four seasons with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (18th all-time) and ninth-highest winning percentage (.620) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 12 times, won six NFC North Division titles and two NFC East titles, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

★ McCARTHY IN COWBOYS LORE ★

Mike McCarthy has led the Cowboys to double-digit wins in three consecutive seasons for the first time since 1991-96. McCarthy has stacked up wins since he arrived in Dallas in 2020, as his .627 winning percentage with Dallas is the highest among any head coach in franchise history:
