BY THE NUMBERS



After ranking third in sacks in 2022, Dallas' pass rush was off and running in Week 1 with a leaguehigh seven sacks at the N.Y. Giants. The Cowboys generated pressure on 23-of-37 dropbacks (62.2%), the fourth-highest pressure rate in a NFL game since 2019, per Next Gen Stats.



Since Head Coach Mike McCarthy arrived in 2020, the Cowboys have scored 40 points in 12 games, the most 40-point outings among NFL teams. Tampa Bay, Kansas City and Buffalo are tied for second with seven 40-point games during that span.



Since Dak Prescott was drafted in 2016, the Dallas Cowboys have scored 196 touchdowns and averaged 29.2 points-per-game at AT&T Stadium, the most touchdowns and points-per-game in the NFL at home during that span.

Stephon Gilmore was a force to be reckoned with in
 Week 1, as he finished with an interception and
 three pass breakups, one-of-six players to have three
 pass breakups in the season opener. He also held
 Daniel Jones to a 12.5 passer rating when targeted.

The Cowboys seven sacks last week were the second-most in a season opener in team history, trailing only the 1994 season opener when Dallas tallied nine sacks against Pittsburgh (9/4). Dorance Armstrong and Osa Odighizuwa each had 2.0 sacks in last week's win.

Dallas' 40-point victory was its largest shutout in franchise history. It marked the fourth largest shoutsout in a season opener in team history, firs since 1995 at the New York Giants.

🛪 WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 31-20 record in his fourth season with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (20th all-time) and sixth-highest winning percentage (.616) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

MIKE McCARTHY (156-97-2, 17th Year, 31-20 with Dallas)

Year

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since 2006-07. He has also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 16th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and three with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 156-97-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (20th alltime) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season. In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the first time for Datas since 1994 05 to record consecutive 12 plus win

first time for Dallas since 1994-95 to record consecutive 12-plus win seasons. En route to the team's second straight playoff berth (first time since 2006-07), the Dallas offense finished third in the league in points (467, fourth in points-per-game) while the defense led the league in takeaways for the second consecutive season.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, Mc-Carthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

ROBERT SALEH (12-23, 3rd Year)

Robert Saleh was named the head coach of the New York Jets on January 19, 2021 after leading one of the league's top defenses in San Francisco for four years as the 49ers defensive coordinator.

In 2022 Saleh helped the Jets increase their total by three victories with a 7-10 record. Despite using three quarterbacks, the Jets saw improvements in almost every offensive category. After finishing last in the NFL in total defense in 2021, Saleh led a defensive unit that finished fourth overall in the league. His defenses, including his last two years as the defensive play caller in San Francisco, have finished as a top five scoring defense in three of the last four seasons.

Saleh also helped his players reach multiple individual accolades in 2022, including four Pro Bowl selections, two first-team All-Pro honors one second-team All-Pro honor and both the Offensive and Defensive Rookie of the Year selections in wide receiver Garrett Wilson and cornerback Sauce Gardner - becoming one of only three teams in NFL history to do so.

Since joining the Jets, Saleh's group has seen a league-high 9,808 snaps by rookies, including 117 starts, the third-most rookie starts in the NFL over that span. In his first season, he coached the NFL's youngest roster with an opening day age of 25.13.

Prior to the Jets, Saleh spent the 2017-20 seasons as the defensive coordinator with San Francisco. In his four years, Saleh's unit ranked third in the NFL in passing yards allowed (211.4) and held opposing guarterbacks to the eighth lowest completion percentage (62.9%). In his last two seasons with the 49ers, Saleh's defense led the NFL in passing defense (188.6).

Saleh spent 2014-2016 in Jacksonville as the linebackers coach. The team's linebackers were a key part of a Jaguars defense that ranked fifth in passing defense and sixth in opponent rushing average in 2016.

Prior to his time in Jacksonville, Saleh spent three seasons in Seattle as a defensive quality control coach. He was responsible for assisting the defensive staff with day-to-day duties with a focus on the lineback ers. In those three seasons, he helped develop linebackers Bobby Wag ner (2012 second-round pick) and K.J. Wright (2011 fourth round pick) as the two became future Pro Bowl selections.

Saleh began his NFL coaching career in Houston as a coaching intern (2005), became a defensive assistant (2006-08) and ultimately the linebackers coach (2009-10).









The Dallas defense came out firing in 40-0 season-opening win over the N.Y. Giants. Dallas' 40-point victory was its largest shutout in franchise history and the first time that Dallas shutout its opponent to start the season since 1995 at the N.Y. Giants. It also marked the largest shutout in a NFL season opener since 1999 when Pittsburgh defeated Cleveland 43-0.

Overall, there have been eight 40-point shutouts in season openers in NFL history and only four instances since 1989:






