BY THE NUMBERS



Dak Prescott leads the NFL with 32 touchdown passes to just eight interceptions in 2023, a 4.0 touchdown-to-interception ratio that ranks second in the NFL behind C.J. Stroud (4.2).



Head Coach Mike McCarthy has stacked up wins since he arrived in Dallas in 2020, as his 41 victories with Dallas are the most among any Cowboys head coach in his first four seasons.



The Cowboys have feasted on the NFC East in five games, logging a point differential of +122, which ranks second against division opponents in a season since 2000.



CeeDee Lamb has eight games with 100-plus receiving yards in 2023, tied for the most in the NFL this season and the second-most by a Cowboys player in a single season, trailing only Michael Irvin (11 in 1995).

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 41-25 record in his fourth season with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (18th all-time) and ninth-highest winning percentage (.619) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 12 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

\star HEAD COACHES \star

MIKE McCARTHY (166-102-2, 17th Year, 41-25 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to three consecutive playoff appearances for the first time since 1991-96. He also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 17th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and four with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 166-102-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (18th all-time) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 12 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season. In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the

In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the first time for Dallas since 1994-95 to record consecutive 12-plus win seasons. En route to the team's second straight playoff berth (first time since 2006-07), the Dallas offense finished third in the league in points (467, fourth in points-per-game) while the defense led the league in takeaways for the second consecutive season.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, Mc-Carthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10). RON RIVERA (102-102-2, 4th Year, 26-39-1 with WAS)

The Washington Commanders named Ron Rivera the 30th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 1, 2020, handing the team to a seasoned leader with a solid defensive background. Rivera is in his fourth season with Washington, 13th season as an NFL head coach and has 26-plus years of NFL experience.

Through his first four seasons with the Commanders, Rivera has accumulated 26 regular season wins and one playoff appearance.

In his first season with Washington, Rivera led his squad on a remarkable NFC East title run, the franchise's first since 2015. At the beginning of the 2020 season, Rivera was diagnosed with Squamous Cell Carcinoma (SCC). Despite undergoing treatments, Rivera continued to coach through the season and was declared cancer free on Jan. 28, 2021. Rivera was selected as the NFC Coach of the Year by the Committee of 101 following the 2020 season.

Rivera hailed to Washington after spending nine seasons as the head coach of the Carolina Panthers where he led the franchise to three consecutive division championships (2013-15) and an appearance in Super Bowl L.

Hired by the Panthers for his defensive expertise, Rivera strung together five top-10 finishes in total defense from 2012-18. He also helped to lead a Panthers team that finished among the league's top-10 rushing offenses including top-five finishes in 2011, 2015, 2017 and 2018.

Prior to his time in Carolina, Rivera served as linebackers coach then defensive coordinator for the San Diego Chargers from 2007-10. From 2004-06, he oversaw the Chicago Bears defense. Rivera spent five seasons (1999-2003) as linebackers coach for the Philadelphia Eagles, and prior to that, he landed his first coaching gig with Chicago as a defensive quality control coach from 1997-98.

Selected in the second round of the 1984 NFL Draft by Chicago, Rivera played nine seasons with the Bears. Primarily an outside linebacker, he appeared in 149 games with 62 stats and accumulated 392 tackles, 8.5 sacks, five forced fumbles, six fumble recoveries, nine interceptions and 15 passes defensed. Rivera was a member of six NFC Central division title teams and the Super Bowl XX championship team in 1985.

\star McCARTHY IN COWBOYS LORE \star

Mike McCarthy has led the Cowboys to double-digit wins in three consecutive seasons for the first time since 1991-96. McCarthy has stacked up wins since he arrived in Dallas in 2020, as his 41 victories with Dallas are the most among any Cowboys head coach during his first four seasons:

The Dallas Cowboys concluded their 15th regular season calling AT&T Stadium home. Dallas' first game at the venue was on Sept. 20, 2009 - a 31-33 loss to the N.Y. Giants. The club's first win came a week later with a 21-7 decision over Carolina.

Dallas was 8-0 at AT&T Stadium in 2023, and they are currently on a 16-game win streak at home, the longest home win streak in the NFL and the second-longest home win streak in franchise history (18 from 1979-81). Dallas joins the New England Patriots as the only teams since 2000 to win at least 16 straight regular season home games. New England accomplished the feat on four different occasions since 2000. Prescott went on a torrid stretch in his five games in November, completing 68.9% of his passes for 1,597 yards, 16 touchdowns and one interception. Prescott's 1,597 passing yards were the fifth-most in NFL history in the month of November. The most passing yards ever in November was also Prescott's 1,665 yards in 2019.

KEEPING IT

Dak Prescott has proven to be a threat with both his legs and his arm during his career. After throwing for 143 yards in the season-opening win at the New York Giants (9/10), Prescott eclipsed 25,000 career passing yards and joined Aaron Rodgers and Patrick Mahomes as the only three players in NFL history with 25,000 passing yards and 1,500 rushing yards in their first 100 career games.

Prescott is one-of-two quarterbacks in NFL history - Josh Allen - with 150 passing touchdowns and 25 rushing touchdowns in his first 100 career games.

The Dallas Cowboys selected cornerback DaRon Bland in the fifth round (167th overall) of the 2022 NFL Draft. As a rookie, Bland filled in as a starter at both nickel corner and outside corner due to injuries. Bland stepped up for the Dallas secondary, tying for second among NFL rookies with five interceptions, and his five picks were the most by a Cowboys rookie since 2002 (Roy Williams and Derek Ross).

Bland is up to the task once again in 2023, as he leads the NFL with eight interceptions in 2023. He also has more interceptions (13) than any other player since entering the league in 2022:

Combined with Dak Prescott's NFC Offensive Player of the Month honor for November, it marked the second time since at least 1994 that an NFL team had two monthly award winners at the same time (LA Rams in 2018).

In the Thanksgiving Day win against Washington (11/23), Bland recorded his fifth pick-six of the season, making him the only

player in NFL history with five pick-sixes in a season. Overall in November, Bland finished with four interceptions. two of which he returned for a touchdown, along with five pass breakups and 26 tackles.

The Dallas Cowboys added a lockdown corner when they traded a 2023 fifth round pick to the Colts for the former 2019 NFL Defensive Player of the Year, Stephon Gilmore, who has added a veteran presence to the Dallas secondary. Gilmore has two interceptions in 2023 and has 31 picks in his

career, fifth-most among active players.

He was the fifth Cowboys player to start the season with a three-game sack streak and the first since DeMarcus Lawrence in 2017.

Brandon Aubrey, who spent his collegiate athletic career as a soccer player at Notre Dame, leads the NFL in field goals made (35) and ranks first in field goal percentage (100%). After Aubrey made a game-winning field goal at the LA Chargers (10/16), Dak Prescott called Aubrey "Butter Aubrey" in reference to his historic start.

Aubrey has made all 35 of his field goal attempts in 2023, extending his NFL record for the most field goals made without a miss to start a career:

Aubrey nailed a 60-yard field goal and a 59-yard field goal against Philadelphia (12/10), becoming the first player in NFL history to make two field goals from 59-plus yards in a single game. Brandon Aubrey signed with the Cowboys prior to training camp after kicking two seasons for the Birmingham Stallions in the USFL. Aubrey has been rock solid as a rookie, converting all 35 of his field goal attempts and 44-of-47 PATs.

Along with precision, Aubrey has racked up points thanks to touchdowns from all three phases. Aubrey's 149 kicking points lead the league in 2023 and are the third-most points scored through 16 career games in NFL history:
