Brandon Aubrey has eight field goals of 50-plus yards in 2023, the most by a Cowboys rookie kicker in a single season, and he has extended his NFL-record streak of consecutive field goals made to start an NFL career to 30.

Along with a high-flying offense that leads the league with 32.4 points-per-game, the Cowboys take care of the ball. Dallas' 11 giveaways in 2023 are tied for fewest in the NFL and tied with the 1998 Cowboys team for the fewest turnovers through 13 games in franchise history.

The Cowboys have started fast in 2023, as they are averaging 19.8 points in the first half, the highest first half scoring average in the NFL this season. It is also the second-highest first half scoring average in a season in NFL history behind the 2007 Patriots (20.8).

Dallas Cowboys (10-3) at Buffalo Bills (7-6)

Sunday, Dec. 17, 2023, 3:25 p.m. CDT

Team Spotlight:

BRANDON AUBREY

- Brandon Aubrey made all four of his field goal attempts during Sunday's win against the Eagles, including makes from 60, 59 and 50 yards. Aubrey is the first player in NFL history to make two field goals of 59 yards-or-longer in the same game.
- Aubrey's 60-yarder last weekend was the first 60-plus yard field goal made in the first quarter in league history. The longest first-quarter field goal made, entering Sunday, was 59 yards by Evan McPherson on Sep 11, 2022. Aubrey's 60-yard make was also the second-longest by a Cowboys rookie behind Brett Maher's 62-yard field goal in 2018.
- Aubrey had eight touchbacks last weekend and has 84 total touchbacks in 2023, a single-season franchise record. The NFL record is 88 touchbacks, set by Bradley Pinion in 2021 with Tampa Bay.
- Aubrey extended his NFL record of most field goals made without a miss to start a career to 30 consecutive field goals.

SCOUTING REPORT **©**

- Since Dan Quinn arrived as the defensive play caller in 2021, the Dallas Cowboys lead the NFL in both takeaways (88) and interceptions (55). During that same span, Buffalo quarterback Josh Allen leads the league with 43 interceptions.
- Dallas has forced opponents off the field at a high rate in 2023. The Cowboys have forced 30 three-and-outs on 130 defensive series, a 23.1% three-and-out percentage that is seventh in the NFL. Buffalo's offense enters Sunday's matchup with an 11.3% three-and-out percentage, lowest among all NFL offenses.



\star WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN WEEK 15 \star

DAK PRESCOTT

4

- * Dak Prescott has thrown for multiple touchdowns in eight games in 2023, tied with Patrick Mahomes and Josh Allen for the most multi-touchdown games in the NFL. Prescott has also thrown for two-or-more touchdowns in seven straight games and can set the franchise record for most consecutive multi-passing touchdown games (eight) on Sunday in Buffalo.
- * Prescott leads the league in passer rating (131.2) against man coverage in 2023, according to NextGenStats. The Bills are allowing a 109.3 passer rating when playing man coverage, 24th in the NFL.
- * Prescott's 107.5 passer rating in 2023 is currently a career-high and ranks second in single-season franchise history. Tony Romo's 113.2 passer rating in 2014 is the Cowboys single-season passer rating record.

MICAH PARSONS

11

- With 1.0 sack on Sunday, Micah Parsons will reach 40.0 career sacks. He would become the fifth NFL player since 1982 with at least 40.0 career sacks in his first three NFL seasons, joining Reggie White (52.0), Derrick Thomas (43.5), Aldon Smith (42.0) and Dwight Freeney (40.0).
- * Parsons, who has 12.5 sacks in 2023, needs 1.5 sacks against Philadelphia to tally a single-season career-high of 14.0 sacks. His previous career-best sack total was 13.5 in 2022.
- * Micah Parsons has 11 career games with 2.0 sacks. With 2.0 sacks on Sunday, Parsons would tie Richard Dent, Shawne Merriman and Aldon Smith for the second-most games with at least 2.0 sacks in a player's first three NFL seasons. Only Reggie White (16 games) would have more.

BRANDON AUBREY

- Brandon Aubrey has made eight field goals from 50-plus yards in 2023, and he needs one more make from 50-plus yards to tie Brett Maher (nine in 2022) for the single-season franchise record.
- Aubrey's 30 field goals made are tied for the fifth-most made field goals by a Cowboys kicker in a season. Richie Cunningham and Greg Zuerlein have the Cowboys single-season record with 34 field goals made.
- Aubrey's 129 kicking points lead the NFL. He is only nine points away from passing Brett Maher (137 in 2022) for the most kicking points in a season in franchise history.

DARON BLAND

DaRon Bland leads the NFL with eight interceptions in 2023, and his 13 career interceptions are the third-most by a Cowboys player in his first two seasons. Bland needs one interception to tie Trevon Diggs (14) for the second-most interceptions in a Cowboys player's first two seasons.

JAKE FERGUSON

Jake Ferguson is the fifth tight end in Cowboys history to reach 50 receptions and 500 receiving yards in a season, joining Jason Witten (15 times), Jay Novacek (three), Dalton Schultz (three) and Doug Cosbie (two).

CEEDEE LAMB

- * CeeDee Lamb has a receiving touchdown in five straight games, a career-long streak. With a touchdown catch against the Bills, Lamb would be the first Cowboy with a receiving touchdown in six straight games since Terrell Owens in 2007.
- * Lamb, who has 96 receptions in 2023, needs four catches to reach 100 receptions on the season. If he reaches 100 receptions on Sunday, he would join Michael Irvin (14 games) as the fastest Cowboys to reach 100 catches in a season. He would also join Irvin as the only two players in franchise history to record multiple seasons of 100 receptions.
- * With one more receiving touchdown, Lamb will tie his single-season career-best of nine touchdowns that he set in 2022

DALLAS COWBOYS



- With Dallas' next win, Head Coach Mike McCarthy will reach his 41st win as head coach of the Dallas Cowboys. His 41 regular season wins would be the most wins by any Cowboys head coach in the first four seasons with the club.
- * The Cowboys have scored at least 30 points in nine games in 2023, tied for the second-most 30-point games in a season in franchise history. Dallas needs one more game with 30-plus points to tie the 2014 Cowboys team for the most 30-point games in a season.
- * Over the last three seasons, Dallas is 9-4 (.692) against AFC opponents, the second-most wins over the AFC by an NFC club. Only Philadelphia (11-4; .733) has more wins against the AFC since 2021.

MIKE McCARTHY Head Coach Baker University Head Coach: 17th Year • NFL: 30th Year • Cowboys: 4th Year

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 40-23 record in his fourth season with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (18th all-time) and seventh-highest winning percentage (.622) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

MIKE McCARTHY (165-100-2, 17th Year, 40-23 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since 2006-07. He also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 17th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and four with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 165-100-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (18th alltime) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in

Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.
In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the first time for Dallas since 1994-95 to record consecutive 12-plus win seasons. En route to the team's second straight playoff berth (first time since 2006-07), the Dallas offense finished third in the league in points (467, fourth in points-per-game) while the defense led the league in takeaways for the second consecutive season.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, Mc-Carthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

The Buffalo Bills named Sean McDermott the 20th head coach of the franchise on Jan. 11, 2017. McDermott, who is in his seventh season with the Bills, has notched five playoff appearances, transforming a program that had not experienced a postseason berth since 1999

From 2020-22, McDermott's Bills won three consecutive AFC East division titles for the first time since 1988-91. Buffalo joined Kansas City as the only two teams in the NFL to win 10-plus games and earn a playoff berth each year from 2019-22.

In 2022, the Buffalo offense finished second in the NFL in total yards-per-game with 397.6. The team boasted a 50.3 third-down conversion rate, the highest in the league last season. McDermott who calls defensive plays, guided the Bills defense to sixth in the NFL in yards allowed-per-game (319.1)

Prior to taking the reins in Buffalo, McDermott spent six seasons as Carolina's defensive coordinator, where he developed a top-10 defense in four of his six years while in command of the Panthers defense. During his tenure, Carolina's defense ranked second in the NFL in sacks (261), third in turnovers forced (169), sixth in rushing yards allowed-per-game (103.3), ninth in yards-per-game (339.1) and 12th in points allowed-per-game (22.1). He helped Carolina to three division titles and a trip to Super Bowl 50.

Before his stint in Carolina, McDermott coached for 12 seasons with Philadelphia. He spent his last two seasons in Philadelphia as defensive coordinator and helped lead the Eagles to the playoffs in each of those seasons. He coached the secondary and linebackers before becoming defensive coordinator in 2009. In 2007 McDermott took over the linebackers after serving as the secondary/safeties coach from 2004-06. Pro Football Hall of Famer Brian Dawkins was a Pro Bowler all three seasons under McDermott's direction, as well as fellow safety Michael Lewis in 2004.

An All-Atlantic 10 Conference choice at safety for William & Mary as a senior in 1997, McDermott graduated with a degree in finance and began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater in 1998.



The Cowboys scored at least 40 points in four consecutive home games (LAR, 10/29 - Sea, 11/30), becoming the third team in the Super Bowl era with a four-game streak of 40-plus points, joining the 2014 Cincinnati Bengals and 2000 St. Louis Rams.

★ AT&T STADIUM RECORD... >

The Dallas Cowboys are currently in their 15th season calling AT&T Stadium home. The Cowboys went 8-1 at home in 2022, the most home wins since the venue opened in 2009. Dallas' first game at the venue was on Sept. 20, 2009 - a 31-33 loss to the N.Y. Giants. The club's first win came a week later with a 21-7 decision over Carolina.

Dallas is 7-0 at AT&T Stadium in 2023, and they are currently on an 15-game win streak at home, the longest home win streak in the NFL. The last time Dallas won at least 15 straight home games was when they won 18 consecutive from 1979-81. 

Dak Prescott has proven to be a threat with both his legs and his arm during his career. After throwing for 143 yards in the season-opening win at the New York Giants (9/10), Prescott eclipsed 25,000 career passing yards and joined Aaron Rodgers and Patrick Mahomes as the only three players in NFL history with 25,000 passing yards and 1,500 rushing yards in their first 100 career games.

Prescott is one-of-two quarterbacks in NFL history - Josh Allen - with 150 passing touchdowns and 25 rushing touchdowns in his first 100 career games.





As a rookie, Bland filled in as a starter at both nickel corner and outside corner due to injuries. Bland stepped up for the Dallas secondary, tying for second among NFL rookies with five interceptions, and his five picks were the most by a Cowboys rookie since 2002 (Roy Williams and Derek Ross).

DaRon Bland was named NFC Defensive Player of the Month for November, his first career player of the month award.

Combined with Dak Prescott's NFC Offensive Player of the Month honor for November, it marked the second time since at least 1994 that an NFL team had two monthly award winners at the same time (LA Rams in 2018).

In the Thanksgiving Day win against Washington (11/23), Bland recorded his fifth pick-six of the season, making him the only player in NFL history with five pick-sixes in

a season. Overall in Novémber, Bland finished with four interceptions, two of which he returned for a touchdown, along with five pass breakups and 26 tackles.

It also marked Dallas' second Defensive POTM award in 2023, as Micah Parsons won the award for September. It's the first time in team history that two defensive players were named POTM in the same season.



★ THE LIONBACKER ★

Micah Parsons proved to be explosive off the edge in his first two seasons with Dallas. Parsons led the NFL with 90 quarterback pressures and a league high 19.3% pressure percentage in 2022.



He was the fifth Cowboys player to start the season with a three-game sack streak and the first since DeMarcus Lawrence in 2017.


