The Dallas Cowboys are the only NFL team yet to allow a touchdown in the first quarter this season, and their 18 points allowed in the opening quarter are the fewest in the league.

Brett Maher has seven field goals of 50-plus yards in 2022, the most 50-yard field goals in a season in team history.

Micah Parsons has 10.0 sacks this season after recording 13.0 sacks as a rookie in 2021. He is the first Cowboys defender since 1982 with double-digit sacks in each of his first two seasons.

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★ DALLAS COWBOYS 2022 SCHEDULE ★

The Cowboys schedule currently features five games that will be broadcast nationally in primetime, including two from AT&T Stadium. In addition to the two primetime games at AT&T Stadium - both on NBC's *Sunday Night Football* - and the club's annual Thanksgiving Day national appearance (this year on FOX), the Cowboys will make three national appearances in primetime on the road, one on ESPN's *Monday Night Football*, one on NBC's *SNF* and one on Thursday night on Amazon Prime video.

The Cowboys play seven games against teams that qualified for the 2021 playoffs - Cincinnati, Green Bay, LA Rams, Philadelphia (twice), Tampa Bay and Tennessee.

This season marks the eighth time - third time in the last four seasons - that the Cowboys will face both Super Bowl participants from the previous season:

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★ WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN WEEK 12 ★

4

DAK PRESCOTT

- * With two passing touchdowns at Minnesota, Dak Prescott (151) would tie Roger Staubach (153) for fourth on the Cowboys all-time passing touchdown list.
- * Prescott (324) needs four rush attempts to pass Troy Aikman (327) for the second-most rushes by a quarterback in team history.
- * Prescott has 47 total games with multiple touchdown passes, and with at least two passing touchdowns against the N.Y. Giants will tie Roger Staubach (48) for the second-most multi-passing touchdown games in team history.

7

TREVON DIGGS

- * Trevon Diggs has 17 interceptions in his career, trailing only Everson Walls (22) for the most by a Cowboys defender in his first three seasons.
- * Diggs ranks second in the NFL with 13 pass breakups in 2022. Diggs' 48 career pass breakups are the second-most by a Cowboys defender in the first three seasons of a career, behind Terence Newman's 52 from 2003-05.
- * In the first five games of the season, opposing quarterbacks were targeting Diggs with five passes a game. In the last five contests, opponents have only challenged Diggs on 3.2 passes-per-game.

MICAH PARSONS

- * Micah Parsons has eight career multi-sack games and leads the NFL with five in 2022. With a multi-sack game against the Giants, Parsons would be the second NFL defender since 1982 with at least nine multi-sack performances in the first two years of a career.

EZEKIEL ELLIOTT

- * Ezekiel Elliott has 74 total touchdowns (62 rushing, 12 receiving) in his career. With one more score, Elliott would tie Dez Bryant (74) for the fourth-most overall touchdowns in Cowboys history.

TONY POLLARD

- * Tony Pollard has recorded 100 scrimmage yards in four straight games. With 100 scrimmage yards against the Giants, Pollard would be the first Cowboy with five consecutive 100 scrimmage yard games since Ezekiel Elliott posted eight straight in 2018 (vs. Ten, 11/5 - vs. TB, 12/23).
- * Pollard leads the Cowboys with 944 scrimmage yards this season on only 139 touches (118 rushes, 21 catches). If Pollard records 56 scrimmage yards on Thanksgiving, he will be the ninth Cowboys player to reach 1,000 yards on less than 200 touches and in the first 11 games of a season.

CEEDEE LAMB

- * With one more touchdown reception, Lamb will tie his single season career-high of six touchdown grabs that set in 2021. The last Cowboys receiver with six touchdown catches through the first 11 games of a season was Amari Cooper in 2019.
- * Lamb (16) needs one more receiving touchdown to move past Tony Hill and Terrance Williams for the third-most touchdown catches by a Cowboy in his first three seasons. Bob Hayes holds the record with 35 touchdown grabs in his first three years.



DALLAS COWBOYS

- * Dallas has 42.0 sacks so far in 2022, an average of 4.2 sacks-per-game. The single-season record for sacks by a Cowboys defense is 62.0 in 1985.
- * The Cowboys are 7-0 when leading at halftime in 2022 and 0-3 when trailing at the half.
- * Dallas has won 10 of the last 11 meetings against the N.Y. Giants, along with winning eight of the last nine contests against NFC East foes.
- * Despite squaring off with each other in 121 games, Dallas and New York will play each other on Thanksgiving for just the second time. Dallas defeated New York 30-3 on Thanksgiving Day in 1992.

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 6-10 record in 2020, a 12-5 record in 2021, and a 7-3 mark in 2022, he owns the fifth-most wins (23rd all-time) and ninth-highest winning percentage (.611) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 10 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

★ HEAD COACHES ★

MIKE McCARTHY (150-95-2, 16th Year, 25-18 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, handing the reigns of the team to an innovative offensive mind with a championship pedigree.

McCarthy has 15 years of head coaching experience - 13 with Green Bay and two with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 150-95-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (23rd all-time) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason nine times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In 2021 McCarthy led the Cowboys to the franchise's first NFC East title in three years, along with a 12-5 regular season record. Under McCarthy, Dallas led the league in total offense (407.0), scoring offense (31.2 points-per-game) and takeaways (34).

In his first season with the Cowboys, McCarthy's plan to install a new culture in Dallas was halted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Due to COVID protocols, McCarthy's first offseason with the Cowboys included no in-person meetings or practices and a season-ending injury to his starting quarterback in Week 5. Despite the hurdles, the 2020 Cowboys were in position to win the NFC East entering Week 17 but came up just short.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

BRIAN DABOLL (7-3, 1st Year)

The New York Giants hired Brian Daboll as the 20th head coach in franchise history on Jan. 28, 2022 after he spent the last four years (2018-21) in Buffalo calling the plays for one of the most productive offenses in the NFL.

Daboll entered 2022 with 20 years of NFL coaching experience. In four seasons with Buffalo, Daboll helped the Bills make three straight postseasons and win two AFC East titles. Daboll oversaw the development of Josh Allen, and in Allen's first four seasons (2018-21), he made NFL history as the first player with 100 passing touchdowns and 30 rushing scores.

During the 2021 season, Buffalo finished third in the NFL with 28.4 points-per-game and fifth with 381.9 yards-per-game. Allen was sixth in the league with a franchise-record 409 completions.

Daboll was voted the AP's NFL Assistant Coach of the Year in 2020 after the Bills finished 13-3 and won the AFC East for the first time since 1995 and made its first AFC Championship appearance since 1994. Daboll helped Allen finish second in the NFL MVP race after setting Buffalo single season franchise records in passing yards (4,544), touchdowns (37), completion percentage (69.2%) and passer rating (107.2).

Prior to Buffalo, Daboll served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Alabama in 2017. While at Alabama, the Crimson Tide won their 17th national championship where he was instrumental in the development of Jalen Hurts and Tua Tagovailoa. In Daboll's lone season with Alabama, the Crimson Tide averaged 38.8 points, 245.0 rushing yards and 455.3 yards of total offense.

Daboll joined Alabama after spending the previous four seasons with New England, his second stint with the team. Daboll spent a total of 11 seasons with the Patriots and helped the organization win five Super Bowl titles. He was an offensive assistant in 2013 before becoming the tight ends coach from 2014-16. Under his watch, Rob Gronkowski was selected first-team All-Pro in 2014 and 2015.

Daboll spent 2012 as Kansas City's offensive coordinator and 2011 as Miami's offensive play caller. Prior to joining the Dolphins, Daboll took his first offensive coordinator job with the Cleveland Browns, where he served as the play caller in 2009 and 2010 under Head Coach Eric Mangini.

Daboll also had a stop at the N.Y. Jets as the quarterbacks coach (2007-08) where he helped Hall of Fame quarterback Brett Favre earn a Pro Bowl selection after coming out of retirement. In one year under Daboll, Favre posted the second-highest completion percentage (65.7) of his career.

★ RED KETTLE KICKOFF ★

For 26 seasons the Jones family has dedicated the Cowboys annual Thanksgiving Day halftime performance as a national showcase to kick off The Salvation Army's iconic Red Kettle Campaign. Since the partnership began in 1997, the annual Red Kettle campaign has raised nearly \$3 billion dollars. Funds raised in 2021 supported services for more than 25 million people living in America.

Under the direction of Charlotte Jones, the Cowboys have produced the annual halftime event and welcomed nationally renowned entertainers from across the musical spectrum. This week's special performance features Grammy Award-nominated and American Music Award-winning Jonas Brothers. This will be the Jonas Brothers' second time performing for the Red Kettle Kickoff, having first done the honors in 2008.

FOX Sports will broadcast the Red Kettle Kickoff halftime show to its national television audience to help draw attention to thousands of red kettles across the country that will encourage the American public to give something extra to those in need while buying holiday gifts for friends and family. Last year's Thanksgiving Day game against the Las Vegas Raiders was broadcasted by CBS Sports and averaged 38.5 million viewers, the largest regular season NFL TV audience since 1990.

★ THANKSGIVING DAY TOTALS ★

Since 1966, the Cowboys have hosted the annual Thanksgiving Day game for 54 of the last 56 years. In 1975 and 1977, the St. Louis Cardinals played host to the game in place of Dallas. In 1978, the game returned to Dallas for good. The Cowboys have posted a 31-22-1 record in the holiday classic and a 34-20 mark the following week. Louis Cardinals to host games. In 1978 the game returned to Dallas on an annual basis.

The Cowboys have a 31-22-1 record on Thanksgiving Day, including a six-game win streak from 1980-85.

Thursday marks just the second time the Cowboys and Giants will square off on Thanksgiving. Dallas defeated New York 30-3 on Thanksgiving Day in 1992.

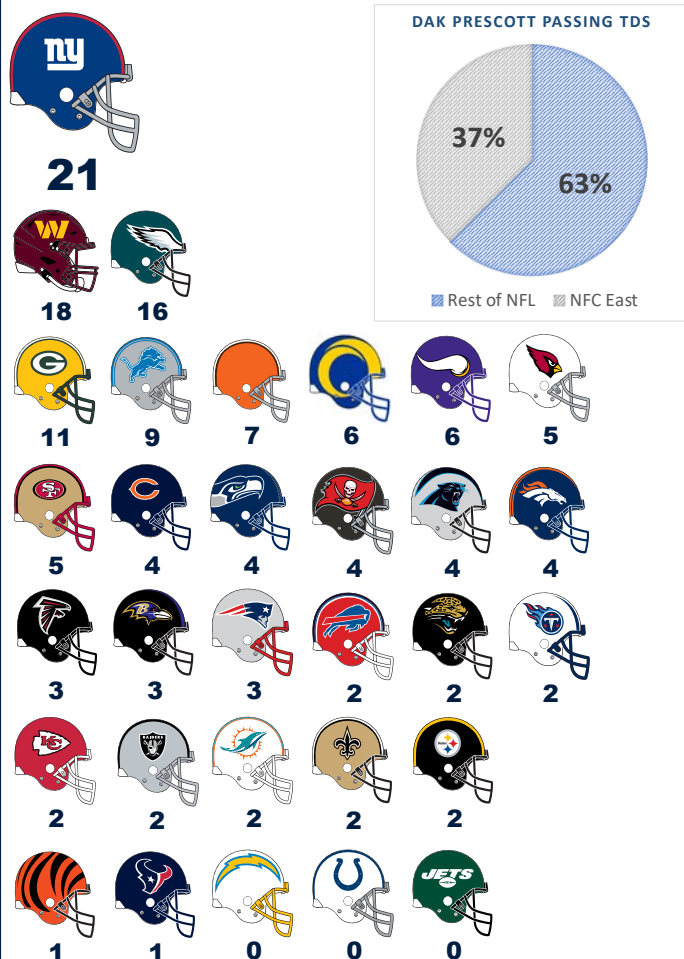

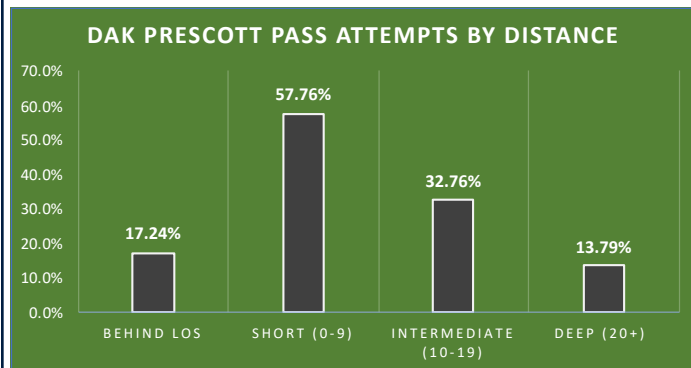

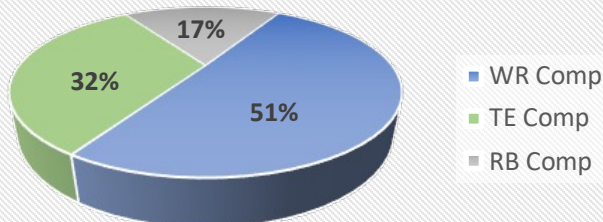

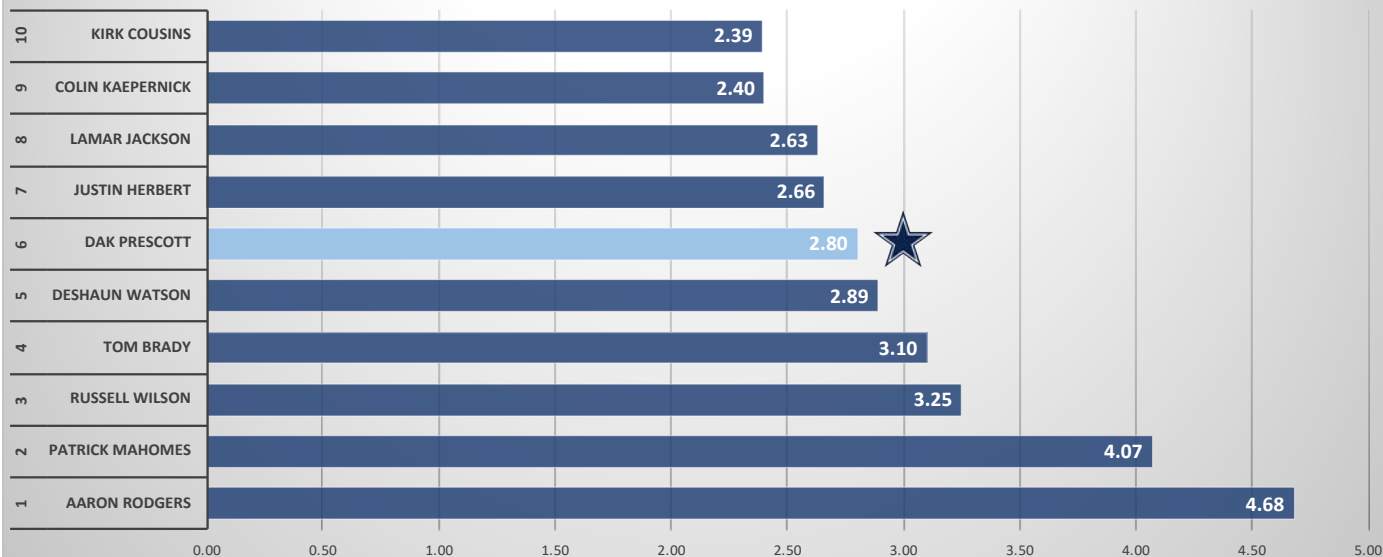

Elliott joined LaDainian Tomlinson as the only two players to begin a career with six consecutive seasons of 1,250 scrimmage yards and six touchdowns after posting 1,289 yards and 12 touchdowns in 2021.

★ THE BOOK OF EZEKIEL ★

For only the second time in franchise history, the Dallas Cowboys used a top-five pick on a running back when they chose Ezekiel Elliott out of Ohio State with the fourth overall selection in the 2016 NFL Draft. Dallas selected Tony Dorsett with the second pick in the 1977 NFL Draft.

In his first season, Elliott had seven 100-yard rushing games - most by a Cowboys rookie all-time and tied for the NFL lead in 2016. He owns 30 for his career to rank third all-time in team history.

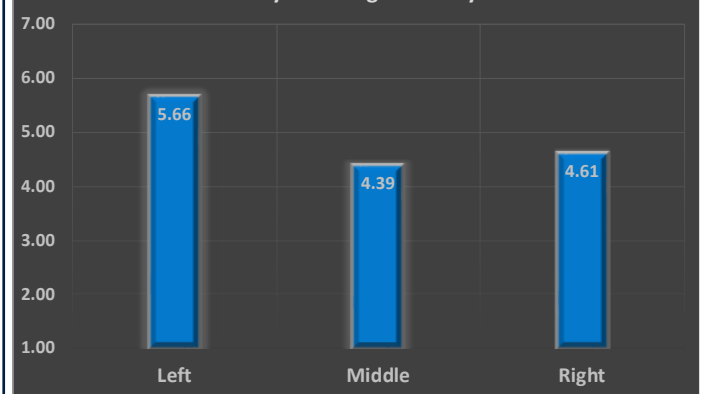

Head Coach Mike McCarthy has proved to be one of the more aggressive coaches in the NFL since arriving in Dallas in 2020. The Cowboys led the NFL with 31 fourth down attempts in 2020, a franchise record and the most McCarthy has attempted in his 16-year career. Since the start of 2020, Dallas has converted 37 (sixth in the NFL) of its 66 (ninth) fourth down attempts, a 56.1% conversion rate that ranks 12th in the NFL since 2020.

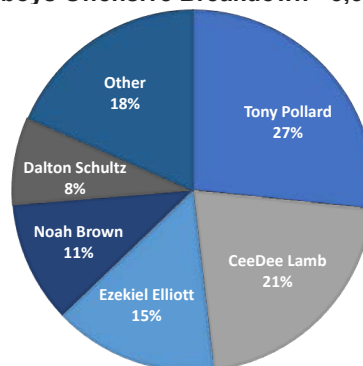

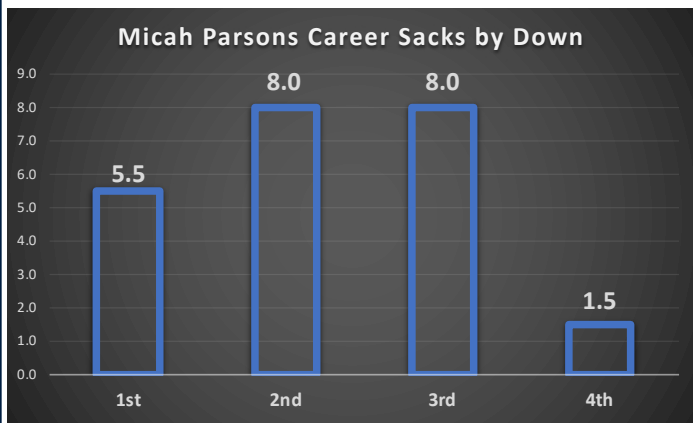

★ TO THE HOUSE ★

Dallas scored six touchdowns on defense in 2021 (five interception returns and one fumble return) - the most defensive touchdowns in a single season in Cowboys history.

It only took five games to record a defensive touchdown in 2022 for the Cowboys. In Week 5 at the LA Rams (10/9), Dorance Armstrong forced a fumble that was picked up by DeMarcus Lawrence and returned 19 yards for a touchdown. In Week 8 against Chicago (10/30), Leighton Vander Esch forced a fumble that was picked up by Micah Parsons and returned 36 yards for a touchdown.

Dallas is one-of-eight teams this season with multiple defensive touchdowns in 2022, and the Cowboys have the most defensive touchdowns since McCarthy's arrival in 2020:

★ EARLY AND OFTEN ★

The Dallas defense has showed up ready to play early in games this season. The Cowboys are the only team in the NFL to not allow a touchdown in the first quarter this season, and their 18 points allowed in the opening quarter are the fewest in the league:

★ STAY SCHEMIN' ★

Under Defensive Coordinator Dan Quinn, the Dallas secondary has become one of the most versatile units in the league. The Cowboys led the NFL with 34 takeaways in 2021, partly due to Quinn's change in the defensive scheme. In 2021 the Cowboys ranked in the top-five in man coverage snaps, and in 2022 Dallas has displayed its versatility in playing both coverage schemes. Below is a year-by-year breakdown of Dallas' coverage schemes dating back to 2018:

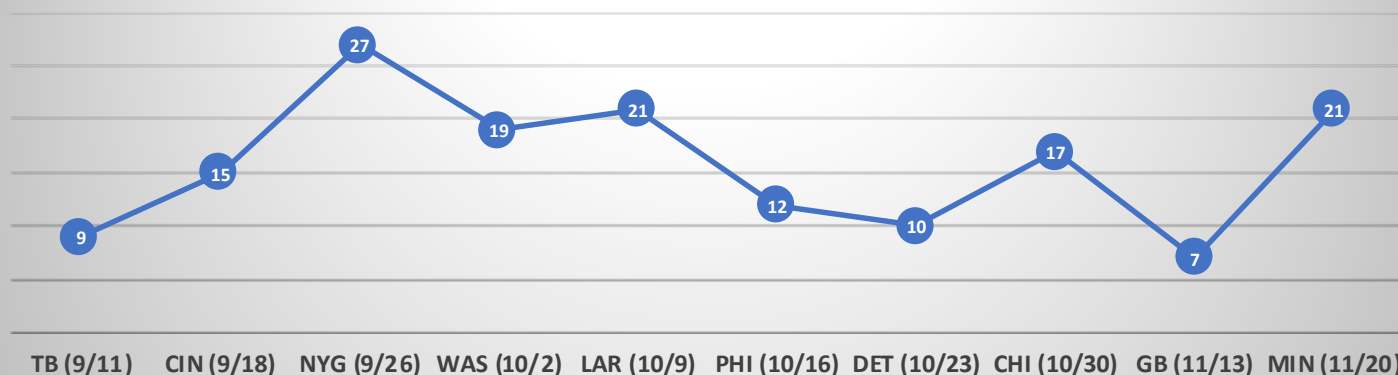
In Dan Quinn's first season as the defensive play caller, Dallas tied for the league lead with a +14 turnover differential in 2021. In Quinn's second season with the Cowboys, Dallas is tied for third in the league with a +7 turnover differential and seventh in the NFL with 16 takeaways. The Cowboys have posted an even or positive takeaway differential in eight of its 10 games in 2022:

Brett Maher has made seven field goals from 50-plus yards in 2022, the most 50-yard field goals in a season in team history.

★ LASER ROCKET LEG ★

Brett Maher made history by connecting on a 63-yard field goal in the waning moments of the first half against Philadelphia in 2019 (10/20), setting a franchise record for the longest field goal in Dallas Cowboys history and tying the third-longest field goal in NFL history. Maher then made a 60-yarder at Minnesota (11/20/22), upping his NFL record to four field goals of 60-plus yards:

Brett Maher went three-for-three on field goals from 50-plus yards at Minnesota (11/20), becoming the first player in Cowboys history with three field goals from 50 yards-or-more in a single game. It is also tied for the most 50-yard field goals made in a game in NFL history.

★ MONEY MAHER ★

Brett Maher has shown consistency in his return to Dallas, making 19-of-21 field goals with his only two misses coming from 59 yards at the N.Y. Giants (9/26) and at Philadelphia (10/16). Maher's 19 field goals made and his 90.5 conversion percentage are tied for sixth in the NFL in 2022 (min. 10 attempts):

★ TURPIN TIME ★

KaVontae Turpin broke onto the scene when he returned both a punt and kick return for a touchdown in the preseason win at the LA Chargers (8/20). Through 10 games in 2022, Turpin has established himself as one of the most dynamic returners in the NFL, as he is fourth in the NFL in punt return average (12.4):

At Philadelphia (10/16) Turpin returned a kick 63 yards to set up a Cowboys field goal prior to halftime. Turpin's 63-yard kickoff return was the fourth-longest kick return in the NFL this season.

Against Detroit (10/23) he caught a punt at his own seven-yard line before returning it 52 yards, the second-longest punt return of the season behind Avery Williams' 56-yard return.

Turpin is the only NFL player this season with multiple 50-yard returns, and the last Cowboys player with a 50-yard kick return and 50-yard punt return in the same season was Ryan Switzer in 2017.

★ TOUCHBACK CENTRAL ★

Brett Maher has not allowed opponents to return kickoffs at a high rate in 2022. After six of his eight kickoffs at Minnesota (11/20) went for touchbacks, Maher leads the NFL with 46 touchbacks, and he is second with a touchback percentage of 83.6.

★ BLOCK PARTY ★

Dallas blocked three punts in 2021, tying the second-most in a single season in franchise history. In 2022 the Cowboys blocked a punt at the LA Rams (10/9) and a field goal at the N.Y. Giants (9/26), joining the N.Y. Jets and Miami Dolphins as the only three teams with a blocked punt and field goal in 2022.

Dorance Armstrong blocked both of the kicks in 2022 and leads the NFL in blocked kicks (two). Armstrong also blocked a punt against Atlanta in 2021 (11/14), making him the sixth Cowboys player to block multiple punts in a career.

Special teams coordinator John Fassel arrived with Head Coach Mike McCarthy in 2020. Since the start of that 2020 season, the Cowboys lead the NFL in blocked kicks (seven):

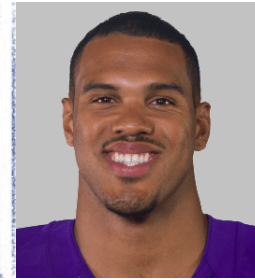

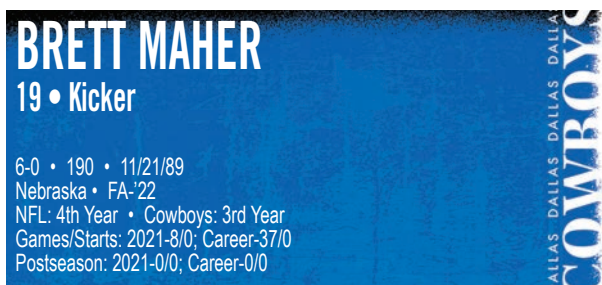

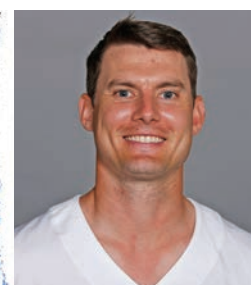
