he 2025 NFL Draft will be held April 24-26 in Green Bay, Wis., with Lambeau Field and Titletown highlighting the NFL Draft Theater. The league also announced that the NFL Draft Experience, the NFL's interactive football theme park, will once again be free and open to the public all three days of the event. This year's draft will be presented across ABC, ESPN, ESPN Deportes and NFL Network - or streamed through NFL+ - the seventh consecutive year that The Walt Disney Company has worked with the National Football League to offer a multi-network presentation for all seven rounds.

The 2025 NFL Draft can be heard nationwide on Westwood One Radio, SiriusXM NFL Radio and ESPN Radio. Audacy Radio's 105.3 The Fan, the flagship radio station of the Dallas Cowboys, and DallasCowboys.com will also provide live draft coverage for all seven rounds. Seventeen prospects will attend this year's draft in Green Bay, while additional prospects will participate in draft festivities remotely from their homes around the country.

On Thursday, April 24th, the 2025 Draft will begin at 7 p.m. (CT) and feature the first round in primetime across four major TV networks (ABC, ESPN, NFL Network, ESPN Deportes) - concluding at approximately 11 p.m. (CT). The draft resumes on Friday, April 25, at 6 p.m. (CT) for rounds two and three, finishing appoximately at 11 p.m. (CT) and will conclude on Saturday, April 26, with the final four rounds, starting at 11 a.m. (CT) and finishing at approximately 7 p.m. (CT).

There will be a total of 257 selections in this year's draft, including 35 compensatory choices. From 1994-2024, the Cowboys have been awarded the second-most compensatory selections (58). Dallas was awarded four compensatory picks in this year's draft, three in the fifth round (Pick 34, No. 170 overall; Pick 35, No. 171 overall; Pick 38, No. 174 overall) and one in the sixth (Pick 35, No. 211 overall).

The NFL also announced 27 legends and five active players will be on site to announce Round Two and Three selections at the 2025 NFL Draft, including former Cowboys offensive lineman and Wisconsin native Travis Frederick. This marks the second time that Frederick has been the Cowboys representative on site to introduce a draft pick for Dallas, following the 2018 NFL Draft held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, when he announced the selection of Michael Gallup in the third round. Charles Haley, Chad Hennings, Drew Pearson and Darren Woodson are a few recent Cowboys legends who have previously announced Dallas Cowboys draft selections.

PRO BOWL COWBOYS: Over the last 11 years, Dallas has selected 15 players in the NFL Draft that have gone on to make at least one Pro Bowl - the most in the NFL over that span. Baltimore has selected the second-most with 13 Pro Bowl draft picks since 2014. Since 1989 Dallas has sent 61 different players to the Pro Bowl, and of those, Dallas drafted 43.

<u>WHO AND WHERE IN ROUND ONE</u>: Over the past 65 drafts, Dallas has selected a player in the first round at every position except kicker and punter. Defense outpaces offense in the first round, with the Cowboys making 33 defensive and 27 offensive selections over the years. PICKING 12th: Dallas currently has the 12th pick in the first round. The last time the Cowboys picked 12th was in the 2021 NFL Draft where they selected Micah Parsons. Dallas has picked in the first round 20 times since 2000, having traded its 2000 and 2001 first round choices to Seattle for Joey Galloway; its 2004 first round choice to Buffalo for second and fifth round picks in 2004 and a first round choice in 2005; its 2009 first round choice to Detroit for Roy E. Williams; and its 2019 first round pick to Oakland for Amari Cooper. Here are the players Dallas has selected with its first pick:

OFFENSE vs. DEFENSE: In the 2024 NFL Draft, the Cowboys selected an even number of offensive and defensive players at four each. In the last 31 drafts, Dallas has selected an even number of offensive and defensive players six times. The Cowboys selected more defensive players than offensive players 17 times in the past 31 drafts, with the most recent stretch occurring from 2019-22. Since the current seven round format was introduced in 1994, the Cowboys took eight defensive players in 2021, the most from one side of the ball in any year. The offensive-high occurred twice - in 2011 and 2018 - when six offensive players were selected.

HOW HIGH DO THEY GO: From 1989-91, the Dallas Cowboys controlled the first overall pick in the draft. In 1989 they selected Troy Aikman with the first pick. In 1990 they exercised their first round pick, the first overall, by selecting Steve Walsh in the 1989 Supplemental Draft, and in 1991, the club selected Russell Maryland with the first pick. These three players joined Ed Jones, the first player taken in the 1974 draft, as the only Cowboys to be drafted with the first overall selection. With their first round choice, eighth overall, in 2002, the Cowboys took Roy Williams, making him the highest safety taken in club history. In 2003 Dallas selected Terence Newman with the fifth overall pick, the highest spot the Cowboys have ever selected a cornerback. Below is a list of the highest draft choices by position for Dallas:

COMPENSATION PACKAGE: This year, there will be 35 compensatory draft choices given to 16 different clubs that either experienced a net loss of certain quality unrestricted free agents in 2024 or received special selections under a 2020 amendment to the League's Collective Bargaining Agreement that promotes equal employment opportunities and an inclusive workforce within NFL clubs. Dallas gained four compensatory picks for the 2024 NFL Draft, and since 1994, the Cowboys have gained 58 compensatory picks, which ranks second in the NFL behind Baltimore (60). Dallas and Baltimore are tied for the most compensatory picks in this year's draft with four extra picks.

Last year Dallas had two extra picks and have had at least two compensatory selections in the last five drafts. There have been nine times Dallas had no compensatory picks (2000, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2013 and 2015). Dallas used its compensatory pick as part of a trade five times - 2025 to Buffalo for Kaiir Elam, 2025 to New England for Joe Milton, 2023 to Indianapolis for Stephon Gilmore, 2018 to Oakland for Jamize Olawale and 2019 to Cincinnati for fifth and sixth round selections. The Cowboys have received two compensatory picks via trade - 2017 from New England to select Marquez White and 2020 from Philadelphia to select Tyler Biadasz. Since 1994, Dallas had 41 compensatory selections make the final roster out of training camp. One of the most notable compensatory picks for Dallas is Pro Football Hall of Famer Larry Allen (selected in 1994). More recently, Dallas selected Dak Prescott with a compensatory pick in 2016. DRAFT DAY TRADES: The Cowboys have made 72 draft-day trades since 1989. In every year but 1989, 1998, 2003, 2005, 2006, 2011, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2020 and 2022 Dallas has taken part in a trade that included its first round pick. Trades have seen the Cowboys move up to get Emmitt Smith (1990), Russell Maryland (1991), Kevin Smith (1992), Shante Carver (1994), David LaFleur (1997), Ebenezer Ekuban (1999) and Morris Claiborne (2012) and move down to get out of the first round (1993, 1995 and 1996

In 2021 Dallas traded back from the 10th pick to the 12th pick to select Micah Parsons, who ended up garnering 2021 AP NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year honors. In 2013, Dallas traded back in the first round and selected four-time Pro Bowl center Travis Frederick with the 31st pick. In 2000 and 2001, first round draft choices were sent to Seattle for Joey Galloway. Of the 316 players selected by the Cowboys since 1989, 112 were chosen with picks obtained in trades. Since making a draft-day trade on April 23, 1989, the Cowboys have been involved in 170 total trades with all other 31 NFL teams. The Las Vegas Raiders, with 18, have been involved in the most Dallas deals over that period, while New England has

been involved with 13 Dallas trades.
