Dak Prescott has a 30-8 career record against the NFC East. Since 2016, Prescott's 30 wins against the NFC East are the second-most wins against his division, trailing only Tom Brady (31).

The Dallas Cowboys have scored at least 40 points in five games in 2023, tied for the most 40-point games in a season in team history. Since Head Coach Mike McCarthy arrived in 2020, Dallas has the most 40-point outings (16 games) in the NFL. Buffalo and Kansas City are tied for second with eight games.

CeeDee Lamb has eight career games with double-digit catches, the first player in Cowboys history - fifth in NFL history - with eight games of 10-plus catches in his first four seasons.

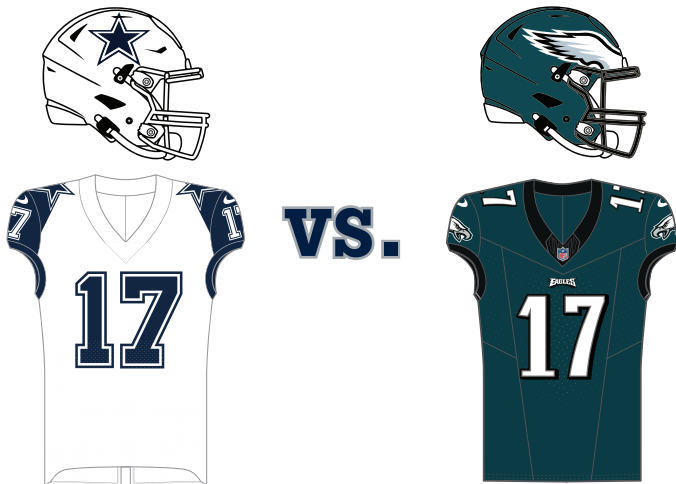

DEMARCUS LAWRENCE

2024 Dallas Cowboys
NFL Walter Payton Man of the Year
Award Nominee

★ The Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year Award presented by Nationwide is the league's most prestigious honor and acknowledges NFL players who excel on the field and demonstrate a passion for creating a lasting positive impact beyond the game. The Dallas Cowboys have nominated DeMarcus Lawrence for the honor.



★ DeMarcus Lawrence embodies positive character and a lifestyle of giving back since he first broke into the league in 2014. He consistently demonstrates empathy, compassion, and a commitment to the well-being of others. In the past year, Lawrence has exhibited a strong commitment to community efforts in many ways – from donating his time and funds to support location non-profits, to being present for youth and serving as a positive role model.



BIRD WATCH

★ The Dallas Cowboys are tied for second in the league in pressures with 205, per PFF. this season, the Philadelphia Eagles have allowed the fifth most pressures in the NFL with 196.

★ The Cowboys have been exceptional on third down in 2023, as they rank second in the NFL with a 48.5% third down conversion rate. Dak Prescott also leads all NFL quarterbacks in completion percentage (72.8%) and passer rating (117.2) on third down plays this season. Conversely, Philadelphia ranks last in the NFL in third down defense (47.3%).

★ Dallas currently ranks 3rd in the NFL for passing yards-per-game (263.4), meanwhile Philadelphia ranks 29th in passing yards allowed-per-game (260.3).

★ WHAT TO WATCH FOR IN WEEK 14 ★

DAK PRESCOTT

- * In five home games this season, Dak Prescott has recorded a 126.8 passer rating, the second-highest home passer rating in the NFL in 2023. Prescott has thrown for 18 touchdowns at home in 2023 and needs five more in the final two home games to tie his own single-season record of 23 home passing touchdowns in 2021.
- * Dating back to Dallas' last home game in 2022 (Phi, 12/24), Prescott has recorded at least 250 passing yards and a passer rating of 100.0-or-higher in seven consecutive home games, joining Brett Favre as the only two players in NFL history to reach those marks in seven consecutive games. With 250 passing yards and a 100.0 passer rating on Sunday night, Prescott would become the first player in NFL history to record those stats in eight straight games.
- * Prescott has thrown for multiple touchdown passes in six straight games, the longest active streak in the NFL. With two-or-more passing touchdowns on Sunday he will tie Tony Romo for the longest multi-passing touchdown streak in franchise history (seven games).

MICAH PARSONS

- * Micah Parsons has 11 career games with 2.0 sacks. With 2.0 sacks on Sunday night, Parsons would tie Richard Dent, Shawne Merriman and Aldon Smith for the second-most games with at least 2.0 sacks in a player's first three NFL seasons. Only Reggie White (16 games) would have more.
- * Parsons, who has 11.5 sacks in 2023, needs 1.5 sacks against Philadelphia to become the second NFL player since 1982 with at least 13.0 sacks in each of his first three NFL seasons, joining Reggie White.
- * With 2.0 sacks, Parsons will become the fifth player since 1982 with at least 40.0 career sacks in his first three NFL seasons, joining Reggie White (52.0), Derrick Thomas (43.5), Aldon Smith (42.0) and Dwight Freeney (40.0).

BRANDON AUBREY

- * Brandon Aubrey has made five field goals from 50-plus yards in 2023, and he needs one more make from 50-plus yards to tie Brett Maher for the most 50-yard field goals by a Cowboys rookie.
- * Aubrey's 26 field goals are tied with Nick Folk for the fourth-most field goals made by a Cowboys kicker in his rookie season. Richie Cunningham has the rookie single-season record with 34 field goals made in 1997.

DARON BLAND

- * DaRon Bland leads the NFL with eight interceptions in 2023, and his 13 career interceptions are the third-most by a Cowboys player in his first two seasons. Bland needs one interception to tie Trevon Diggs (14) for the second-most interceptions in a Cowboys player's first two seasons.
- * Bland needs two more interceptions this season to tie Mel Renfro (10) for the third-most interceptions in a season in Cowboys history.

88

CEEDEE LAMB

- * Lamb, who has 350 career receptions, needs 10 catches to tie Justin Jefferson for the third-most receptions by an NFL player in his first four seasons.
- * Lamb has a receiving touchdown in four straight games, a career-long streak. With a touchdown catch against the Eagles, Lamb would be the first Cowboy with a receiving touchdown in five straight games since Dez Bryant in 2013.



DALLAS COWBOYS

- * With a win on Sunday, Dallas will reach 10 wins for the third consecutive season. Head Coach Mike McCarthy would become the fourth coach in franchise history to record double-digit wins in three straight seasons, joining Tom Landry, Jimmy Johnson and Barry Switzer.
- * The Cowboys have scored at least 30 points in each of their six home games in 2023. With 30-or-more points on Sunday, Dallas would be the first team in NFL history to score at least 30 points in each of its first seven home games.
- * Dallas has scored 40-plus points in four consecutive games at AT&T Stadium, one-of-five teams in NFL history to reach those marks. With 40 points on Sunday, Dallas would be the first team in NFL history with at least 40 points in five straight home games.

★ WINNING HEAD COACH ★

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 5, 2020. Along with 13 years of head coaching experience and 13 additional years as an assistant coach in the NFL, McCarthy came to Dallas with a 125-77-2 regular season coaching record - all with the Green Bay Packers (2006-18).

After a 39-23 record in his fourth season with Dallas, he owns the fifth-most wins (18th all-time) and seventh-highest winning percentage (.620) among qualifying active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles and one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship.

★ HEAD COACHES ★

MIKE MCCARTHY (164-100-2, 17th Year, 39-23 with Dallas)

The Dallas Cowboys named Mike McCarthy the ninth head coach in franchise history on Jan. 8, 2020, and he has led the franchise to back-to-back playoff appearances for the first time since 2006-07. He also won 12 games in each of the last two seasons, the first time Dallas posted consecutive seasons with 12-plus wins since 1994-95.

McCarthy is in his 17th year as a head coach - 13 with Green Bay and four with Dallas - along with 13 years as an assistant coach in the NFL, including six as an offensive coordinator.

As a head coach, McCarthy has racked up a 164-100-2 regular season coaching record, and he owns the fifth-most wins (18th all-time) among active NFL coaches. His teams have qualified for the postseason 11 times, won six NFC North Division titles, one NFC East title, made four NFC Championship Game appearances and took home a Super Bowl XLV championship held at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas, following the 2010 NFL season.

In 2022 McCarthy led the charges of a team that finished 12-5 for the second straight season to mark the first time in his career and the first time for Dallas since 1994-95 to record consecutive 12-plus win seasons. En route to the team's second straight playoff berth (first time since 2006-07), the Dallas offense finished third in the league in points (467, fourth in points-per-game) while the defense led the league in takeaways for the second consecutive season.

During his time in Green Bay, McCarthy was known as a prolific offensive mind and the primary play-caller for the Packers. McCarthy's offense finished fourth in the NFL in total offense and third in points-per-game through his 14-year stint with the club.

McCarthy is only the fourth head coach in NFL history to lead a single franchise to eight-or-more consecutive playoff appearances, joining Tom Landry, Chuck Noll and Bill Belichick. Those eight appearances from 2009-16 were more than the rest of the NFC North Division combined over that span (Minnesota, three; Detroit, three; Chicago, one).

McCarthy's nine playoff appearances overall are the most by a Packers coach since the NFL postseason began in 1933, and he guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. With the victory over Dallas in the 2016 playoffs, McCarthy surpassed Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren for the most playoff victories in team history (10).

NICK SIRIANNI (33-13, 3rd Year)

Nick Sirianni was named the 24th head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles on Jan. 24, 2021. Sirianni totaled 23 regular season wins in his first two years with the Eagles, the most wins by any head coach in their first two years with the franchise.

Sirianni is in the midst of his third season with Philadelphia after navigating the Eagles to its fourth all-time trip to the Super Bowl in 2022, establishing himself as the youngest head coach in Eagles history to reach the Super Bowl. During the 2022 season, he led Philadelphia to the most regular-season victories (14) in franchise history, becoming the fourth NFL head coach to produce a 14-win campaign within their first two years at the helm.

Under Sirianni, the Eagles cemented a number of single-season team records, including points (477), total touchdowns (59), scrimmage touchdowns (57), rushing touchdowns (32, tied for fourth in NFL history), total first downs (385), third-down conversion rate (45.9%), red zone touchdown efficiency (67.8%) and sacks (70.0, tied for third in NFL history). The Eagles also finished among the top three teams in total offense (third, 389.1 ypg) and defense (second, 301.5 ypg) for the first time since the 1970 merger.

Before becoming a head coach, Sirianni spent three seasons as the Indianapolis Colts offensive coordinator. Under Sirianni, the Colts ranked sixth in third-down conversion rate (43.4%), seventh in red zone touchdown efficiency (63.9%) and eighth in points-per-game (25.9). Indianapolis also surrendered the second-fewest sacks (71) in the league.

Prior to his three-year stint with the Colts, Sirianni spent five seasons with the San Diego Chargers (2013-17), starting as an offensive quality control coach before going on to coach quarterbacks and then receivers. He began his NFL coaching career with the Kansas City Chiefs (2009-12) as a quality control coach where he eventually took over the wide receivers position in 2012.

Before entering the NFL coaching ranks, Sirianni spent five years at the collegiate level as the wide receivers coach at Indiana University of Pennsylvania (2006-08) and defensive backs coach at Mount Union (2004-05), his alma mater.

A native of Jamestown, NY, Sirianni was a three-year starter at wide receiver at Mount Union, winning three NCAA Division III National Championships (2000-02).

★ PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS VS. PHI ★

Jake Ferguson - TE

Recorded 12 receptions for 155 yards (12.9 avg) and two touchdowns in three games against the Eagles. Posted seven receptions for 91 yards and a touchdown in Week 9.

CeeDee Lamb - WR

Notched 38 receptions for 582 yards (15.3 avg) and three touchdowns in seven games against the Eagles. In Week 9, Lamb secured 11 receptions for 191 yards.

DeMarcus Lawrence - DE

Posted 59 tackles, 3.0 sacks, 10 quarterback pressures, 10 tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and four passes defended in 17 games against Philadelphia.

Dak Prescott - QB

Completed 67.3% of his passes for 3,131 yards, 22 touchdowns and eight interceptions in 12 career games against Philadelphia. In his last three games against the Eagles, has thrown for 1,016 yards, 11 touchdowns and just one interception.

★ PRIMETIME COWBOYS ★

The Dallas Cowboys appear in six primetime games in 2023. Sunday night against Philadelphia will mark the Cowboys fifth primetime appearance of the season. Dallas is 3-1 in primetime bouts in 2023, with wins against the N.Y. Giants (9/10), LA Chargers (10/16) and Seattle (11/30) and a loss to San Francisco (10/8).

Sunday night will mark the Cowboys NFL-high 79th appearance on SNF, well ahead of the second place Pittsburgh Steelers who have appeared in 58 NBC SNF games.

Forty-one of the Cowboys prior 57 NBC SNF appearances have averaged at least 20 million viewers - also an NFL-high - and the Cowboys own a 30-27 record in those 56 games.

★ AT&T STADIUM RECORD... ★

The Dallas Cowboys are currently in their 15th season calling AT&T Stadium home. The Cowboys went 8-1 at home in 2022, the most home wins since the venue opened in 2009. 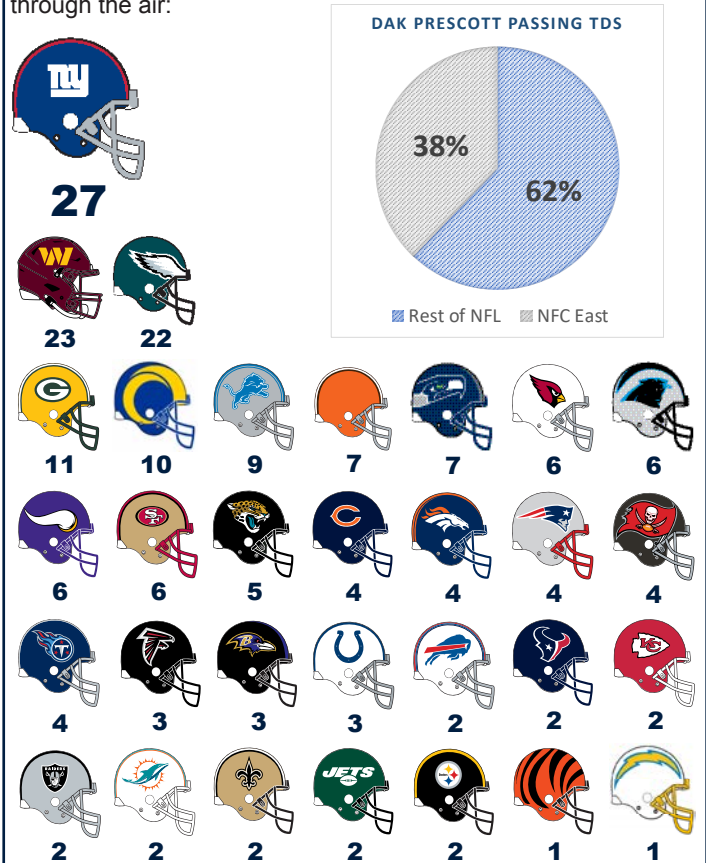

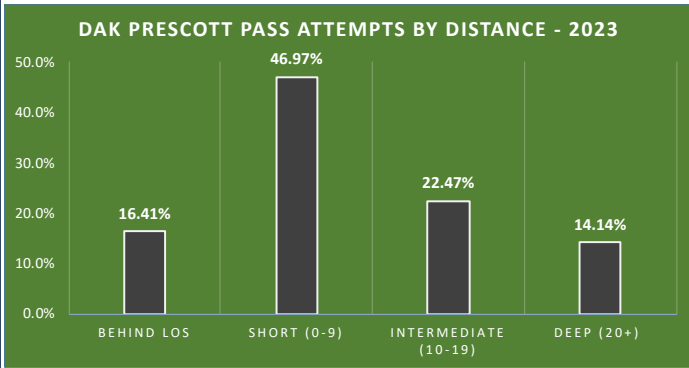
Dak Prescott was named NFC Offensive Player of the Month for November, his first career Player of the Month award.

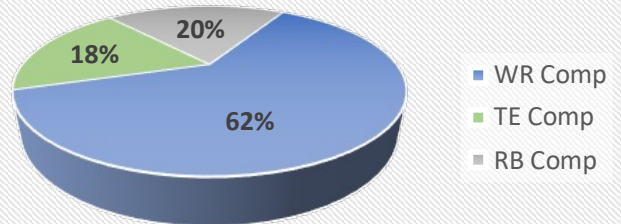

As a rookie, Bland filled in as a starter at both nickel corner and outside corner due to injuries. Bland stepped up for the Dallas secondary, tying for second among NFL rookies with five interceptions, and his five picks were the most by a Cowboys rookie since 2002 (Roy Williams and Derek Ross).

Bland is up to the task once again in 2023, as he leads the NFL with eight interceptions in 2023. He also has more interceptions (13) than any other player since entering the league in 2022:

DaRon Bland was named NFC Defensive Player of the Month for November, his first career player of the month award.

Combined with Dak Prescott's NFC Offensive Player of the Month honor for November, it marked the second time since at least 1994 that an NFL team had two monthly award winners at the same time (LA Rams in 2018).

In the Thanksgiving Day win against Washington (11/23), Bland recorded his fifth pick-six of the season, making him the only player in NFL history with five pick-sixes in a season. Overall in November, Bland finished with four interceptions, two of which he returned for a touchdown, along with five pass breakups and 26 tackles.

It also marked Dallas' second Defensive POTM award in 2023, as Micah Parsons won the award for September. It's the first time in team history that two defensive players were named POTM in the same season.

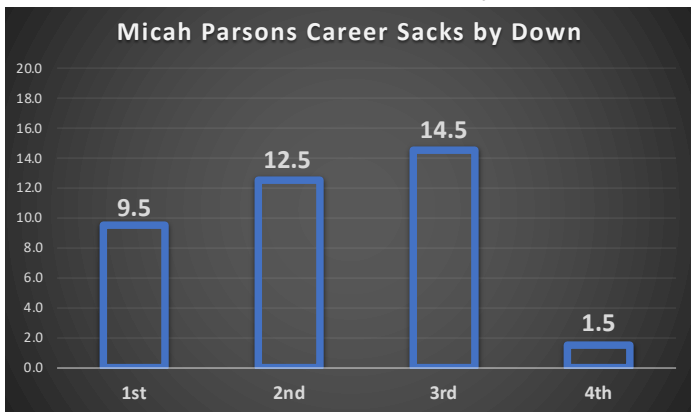

Under Defensive Coordinator Dan Quinn, the Dallas secondary has become one of the most versatile units in the league. The Cowboys led the NFL in takeaways in both 2021 and 2022.

Since Quinn arrived in Dallas, the Cowboys have played man coverage 34.0% of the time, the third-highest man coverage rate during that span. In 2023 Dallas has played man coverage 37.5% of the time, third in the league behind Cleveland (44.8%) and the N.Y. Giants (38.3%).

★ THIRD-AND-I GOT THIS ★

The Cowboys have held opponents to 49-of-143 on third downs in 2023, a 34.3% opponent third down conversion rate that is tied for 10th in the NFL. When limiting opposing offenses on first and second down, the Cowboys defense has given opponents fits on third and long (more than six yards). Dallas has allowed just 13 first downs on 72 third and long attempts, an 18.1% third and long opponent conversion rate that is fifth in the NFL in 2023.

Brandon Aubrey, who spent his collegiate athletic career as a soccer player at Notre Dame, is second in the NFL in field goals made (26) and tied for the league lead in field goal percentage (100%). After Aubrey made a game-winning field goal at the LA Chargers (10/16), Dak Prescott called Aubrey "Butter Aubrey" in reference to his historic start.

Aubrey has made all 26 of his field goal attempts in 2023, setting an NFL record for the most field goals made without a miss to start a career:

Brandon Aubrey signed with the Cowboys prior to training camp after kicking two seasons for the Birmingham Stallions in the USFL. Aubrey has been rock solid as a rookie, converting all 26 of his field goal attempts and 36-of-39 PATs.

Along with precision, Aubrey has racked up points thanks to touchdowns from all three phases. Aubrey's 114 kicking points lead the league in 2023 and are the fourth-most kicking points through 12 career games in NFL history:
