

THE CONTEXT

More than 20% of Philadelphians live in poverty, disproportionately impacting BIPOC residents.

This problem is **concentrated at** the <u>neighborhood</u> level.



THE CONTEXT

Community-led initiatives focusing on uplifting BIPOC grassroots leaders in low-income neighborhoods are an untapped solution with the potential for significant impact

People in the community are closest to the issues, and their perspectives have value

They have local knowledge, lived experience, are immersed in community context, and are trusted by their neighbors



Their dedication is often unrivaled, because their home is where they work; because they are not serving "clients" - they are serving their neighbors, friends and family.

Many are taking on multiple jobs, paying out of pocket to test models that are providing critical community services.

DEFINING GRASSROOTS LEADERS

They are **residents** of the neighborhoods.

They **live there**.

They breathe the air there.

They walk the streets there.

They go to school there.

They send their kids to school there.

They are **neighbors with people there**.


