### JAGUARS HEAD TO NASHVILLE IN WEEK 2

On Kickoff Weekend, the Jacksonville Jaguars (1-0) defeated the Indianapolis Colts (0-1), 27-20, at TIAA Bank Field, marking their sixth consecutive home victory over the Colts. Head Coach Doug Marrone improved to 3-1 on Kickoff Weekend, and the win marked Jacksonville's first home victory in Week 1 since 2011.

"I think this team has been through some things," said Coach Marrone following the team's Week 1 victory. "This team has stuck together. This team relies on each other, for someone to come up with a play. And they continue to keep getting better ... And this team has really instilled that faith for me. I feel, with no disrespect to any other team I've been on, outside of just being a line coach and having your own room, this is the closest I've felt to a team since I've been a head coach.'

In Week 2, the Jaguars face a second straight division rival when they travel to Nashville to take on the Tennessee Titans (1-0), who are coming off a 16-14 win in Denver on Monday Night Football.

## MINSHEW MANIA ENSUES

In Week 1, second-year QB Gardner Minshew II completed 19 of 20 passes (95.0 comp. pct.) for 173 yards and three TDs for a passer rating of 142.3. He became the first quarterback in NFL history to throw for at least three TDs and complete at least 95.0 percent of his passes on Kickoff Weekend. Through 15 career games, Minshew has completed 304 of 490 passes (62.0 comp. pct.) for 3,444 yards, 24 TDs and six INTs. Through five games played in the month of September, Minshew has a 115.5 passer rating with 10 TDs and just one INT. Minshew also broke the Jaguars' single-game record (min. five pass attempts) for completion percentage (95.0), a record that he originally set on Kickoff Weekend last season after completing 88.0 percent of his passes.

### **ROOKIES ON THE RISE**

In the team's Week 1 victory over the Colts, 13 rookies made their NFL debut, including starts from RB **James Robinson** (undrafted), WR Laviska Shenault Jr. (second round) and CB CJ Henderson (first round). Robinson rushed 16 times for 62 yards (3.9 rush avg.) and added 28 yards on a reception and became the first undrafted rookie running back in NFL history to start on Kickoff Weekend since 1990. Shenault caught a 15-yard TD pass from QB Gardner Minshew II in the second quarter. Henderson, who was selected with the ninth overall pick in the 2020 draft, posted five tackles, three passes defensed and one INT and became the third player in NFL history to achieve all three in their NFL debut, joining CBs Marcus Peters (Sept. 13, 2015) and Denzel Ward (Sept. 9, 2018).

## **WEEK 2 QUICK HITS**

- · QB Gardner Minshew II completed 113 of 202 passes for 1,437 yards, nine TDs and zero INTs on the road in 2019. Minshew joined QB Tom Brady (2016) as the only quarterbacks in NFL history to post at least nine TDs and zero INTs on the road in a single season.
- The Jaguars are seeking their first win in Nashville since Nov. 10, 2013. A victory would mark the eighth time in franchise history Jacksonville started 2-0 and the second time Jacksonville won their first two games against divisional opponents.
- · Since 2019, WR DJ Chark Jr. has scored five receiving TDs against AFC South opponents, more than any other player in the NFL against the division. In Jacksonville's Week 3 victory against Tennessee in 2019, Chark caught four passes for 76 yards and one TD.
- · RB James Robinson's 90 scrimmage yards in Week 1 were the secondmost among all rookies in the NFL, trailing only Chiefs first-round RB Clyde Edwards-Helaire's 138 yards from scrimmage.
- · K Josh Lambo connected on a 50-yard field goal in Week 1, marking the second straight game he has made kicks from at least 50 yards. Since signing with the Jaguars in 2017, Lambo has made 11 of 12 attempts of at least 50 yards, the highest percentage (91.7) among kickers with at least 10 tries during that span.
- In Week 1, the Jaguars became the first team since the Buccaneers in 2010 to have a player with a receiving TD (WR Laviska Shenault Jr.) and a player with an INT (CB CJ Henderson) in their NFL debuts.
- · Since Head Coach Doug Marrone took over in 2017, the Jaguars are 8-4 in September, tied with the Tians for the best record in the AFC South during that span. Jacksonville is 3-1 on the road in September under Marrone.

Jacksonville announced the hiring of **Jay Gruden** as their offensive coordinator on Jan. 22, 2020. In Gruden's first game with the Jaguars, Jacksonville's offense scored three TDs and committed no turnovers in a 27-20 victory.

### BY THE NUMBERS

2

The Jaguars finished with a +2 turnover margin and scored 10 points off takeaways in Week 1, the fourth-most points off turnovers in the NFL. Jacksonville intercepted Colts QB **Philip Rivers** twice and did not commit a turnover.

## 4

CB **CJ Henderson** forced four incompletions according to Pro Football Focus, the most forced incompletions in the NFL in Week 1. No other player in the NFL was credited with more than two. Henderson also added one INT and the game-clinching pass defensed on the Colts' final drive.

## 10

QB **Gardner Minshew II** was one of two QBs (Broncos QB **Drew Lock**) to complete passes to 10 different players in Week 1. The Jaguars were one of four teams to have at least three players with TD receptions.

## 11

LB **Myles Jack** posted 11 tackles and 1.0 sack in Week 1, marking the second time in his career he has posted double-digit tackles and 1.0 sack with the previous instance coming at Tennessee in 2018.

## 12

S **Josh Jones** tied his career high with a team-leading 12 tackles in his Jaguars debut, tied for the fifth-most in the NFL in Week 1. Jones, who was claimed off waivers by the Jaguars in January, started at strong safety in Week 1.

# 15

WR Laviska Shenault Jr. caught a 15-yard TD pass, marking the first score of his career. He was the only rookie wide receiver in the NFL to catch a TD in Week 1 and the fourth wide receiver in Jaguars history to record at least 10 rushing yards and a receiving TD in a single game.

# 21

Jacksonville has totaled 21 victories in the all-time series against Tennessee, which are the most wins against any opponent faced in franchise history. The Jaguars first game in team history was against the Houston Oilers on Sept. 3, 1995.

# 42.8

Since being selected in the 2018 draft, P **Logan Cooke** has posted a 42.8 net punting average with the Jaguars, the third-best in the NFL over that span (min. 10 punts). Cooke booted three punts for a net average of 45.3 in the Jaguars' Week 1 victory.

# 62

Rookie RB **James Robinson** rushed for 62 yards in his debut, marking the second-most rushing yards by a Jaguars rookie in their first game. Robinson totaled 90 scrimmage yards, the sixthmost ever by an undrafted rookie on kickoff weekend.

# 99.1

In five games against AFC South opponents, QB **Gardner Minshew II** has completed 116 of 169 passes for 1,194 yards and nine TDs. In his only game against the Titans last season, he completed 20 of 30 passes for 204 yards and two TDs for a 110.6 passer rating in a 20-7 victory.

# COVID-19



## CARING FOR THE COMMUNITY

Jacksonville Jaguars Owner **Shad Khan** and the Jaguars Foundation worked together with players, coaches and partners to respond to the worldwide COVID-19 crisis in a variety of ways:

- Owner Shad Khan committed \$1 million to local organizations including the Florida First Coast Relief Fund at the United Way of Northeast Florida, Feeding Northeast Florida, Clara White Mission and the American Red Cross.
- Head Coach Doug Marrone and General Manager David Caldwell
  contributed \$8,000 each to the 2020 NFL Draft-A-Thon, joining
  thousands of NFL fans across the nation. Jacksonville received
  more than \$100,000 from the worldwide fundraiser to support
  local efforts via the United Way of Northeast Florida.
- The Jaguars distributed 55,000 masks to citizens, nonprofit shelters, feeding programs and the Duval County Public Schools. Jaguars legend Tony Boselli, who himself recovered from COVID-19, participated in a team-produced public service announcement urging the public to wear masks.
- Daily's and the Jaguars distributed \$30,000 in gift cards to health care workers, first responders, educators, veterans and more.
- OL Tyler Shatley gifted \$10,000, matched by the Jaguars
  Foundation for a total of \$20,000 to help provide 1,500 prepared
  meals delivered daily to senior citizens in partnership with Florida
  Blue and Feeding Northeast Florida to support restaurants providir

CB Tre Herndon and his girlfriend, Treyleanna Robinson, gifted more than 10,000 meals to via Feeding Northeast Florida.

- WR Chris Conley, alongside his goldendoodle, Waffles, put his video game skills to good use by taking part in a Twitch Stream-Aid online Fortnite tournament, raising \$9,300 for the World Health Organization.
- K **Josh Lambo** partnered with Pet Paradise and other organizations, to cover a portion of the adoption fees and six months of dog food for any dogs adopted from Jacksonville Beach shelter Furever Urs.
- LB Leon Jacobs, whose mother has worked as a nurse for more than 20 years, helped provide an all-day food truck to employees at LA+USC Medical Center.
- Jaguars players and the Jaguars Foundation partnered with Academy Sports to donate 650 balls, frisbees, jump ropes and other pieces of athletic equipment to local nonprofits to distribute to area children and encourage exercise even while attending school virtually from home.

#### PROTECTING FANS IN 2020

The Jaguars opened the 2020 regular season with a limited capacity crowd of 14,100 at TIAA Bank Field on Sunday, Sept. 13. Fans were introduced to several new game day experience upgrades and protocols all designed with health and safety in mind. The Jaguars, ASM Global, Delaware North and the City of Jacksonville all worked diligently over the summer to create a contactless game day experience for fans coming to TIAA Bank Field in 2020, including the following new features:

- After parking in physically-distanced lots, new magnetometers allow fans to enter the stadium while carrying their clear bag, cell phone and keys. After the security screening, they proceed to newly installed self-scan mobile ticket kiosks.
- The Jaguars have added more than 750 hand-sanitizing stations throughout the concourses, plaza and premium spaces. Certified disinfection specialists in blue vests are at the stadium on game day disinfecting all high touchpoint areas with hospital grade disinfectant.
- The Jaguars and TIAA Bank Field have transitioned to a cashless payment stadium ensuring contactless options for parking, merchandise and food purchases. Cash is no longer accepted at the stadium, and ATMs have been removed from the premises. Fans can scan a QR code or use the Jaguars app to order food online from the nearest concession stand and receive a text alert when it's ready for pickup.
- Limited capacity seating is grouped in pods. Every fan has at least 6 feet of physical distance from every fan in other pods. Fans are encouraged to limit their pod to close friends or family. Unused seats are zip-tied to prevent accidental use.







# **SOCIAL JUSTICE**



## **BLACK LIVES MATTER**

Following widespread outrage over the death of George Floyd while in police custody in Minneapolis, and joining in a nationwide push for racial equality, Jaguars ownership, players, coaches and front office staff began taking steps to create positive change on the First Coast.

On June 3, Owner **Shad Khan** penned a personal op-ed, sharing his own experience with discrimination as a Muslim-American and announcing his commitment to work alongside the team to level the playing field for all to have equal access to the American dream.

"Racism, in all its forms, will kill," said Khan. "It kills people, it kills communities, it kills dreams, it kills hope. For many Americans, now is the moment. Never has that been clearer. I don't want to waste this moment."

Jaguars players took action June 5, as they led an organization-wide march to raise awareness for racial injustice against the Black community. More than 250 members of the Jaguars organization, including players, coaches, front office staff and their families, started at TIAA Bank Field at 9:04 a.m. and proceeded to the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office while wearing Black Lives Matter t-shirts.

WR Chris Conley addressed the crowd and called attention to markers of racism still present in Jacksonville. "We cannot allow comfortability with revisionist history to disarm our minds and weaken our convictions," said Conley. "A Confederate monument sits a couple of blocks from here, praising the south's dark past."



Three days later, a Confederate monument was removed from a downtown Jacksonville park. Conley challenged those in attendance and those watching from home to continue the fight. "This is only the beginning here in Jacksonville. Let's make sure that we maintain this momentum so this is not a moment and this is a movement."

As a team, Jaguars players are working on several plans this season to educate and engage the community on a variety of important topics, including voting and legislative reform, youth education through arts and sports, financial stimulus and police and community relations.

#### **GET IN THE GAME**



On Tuesday, Sept. 1, the Jacksonville Jaguars launched an organization-wide commitment to voter education organized by players and coaches and designed to encourage fans to "Get in the Game" with a call for civic engagement. The season-long campaign kicked off with a public service announcement encouraging voter registration and will continue through Election Day with activations via social media, on game day, through grassroots activities and national partnerships.

"You can look at voting as a privilege, and as a naturalized U.S. citizen, you can be assured that I do," said Jaguars Owner **Shad Khan**. "But I also see it as a civic responsibility. If we're serious about being better in our communities and throughout our nation, and all voices being heard and respected, we have to participate in the electoral process. No exceptions. It's our duty to cast a ballot. If you haven't registered to vote, please do by October 5. If you're registered, please vote."

The campaign began with a non-partisan, "Get in the Game" public service announcement featuring Jaguars players and coaches, including Head Coach **Doug Marrone** and QB **Gardner Minshew II**, calling for fans in Florida to register to vote by the October 5 deadline. The Jaguars have also created www.jaguars.com/vote as a resource for the community looking for more information on voter registration and key deadlines.

Jaguars front office employees have the option to "Get in the Game" and further support the voters of Duval County by taking training from the Duval County Supervisor of Elections office to serve as poll workers on Election Day. Employees can participate in this day of service and have the opportunity to donate their time to the Jaguars Foundation.

Jaguars players, coaches and front office staff all recently participated in virtual voter education courtesy of RISE, a non-profit organization selected by the NFL to support their national NFL Votes campaign. RISE's nonpartisan initiative RISE to Vote led a virtual team meeting on August 17, walking players through the registration process and giving them insight on the history of voting rights in America.

And that's what's great about CJ. He's constantly wanting to learn, he constantly wants to be a better football player, and we think he's a heck of a player now. So I think a young player like that, all of a sudden you get out there, thrown out there, not a lot of people saying things and you get your first pick in the first game, plus-two in the turnover bracket. That's a lot, I mean, he did a nice job."



The Jaguars began the season with a big opening-day win over the division-rival Indianapolis Colts, coming from behind with two scores in the final 6 minutes to claim a 27-20 victory at TIAA Bank Field. QB Gardner Minshew II completed 19 of his 20 passes on the day for 173 yards, with scoring throws to WRs DJ Chark Jr., Laviska Shenault Jr. and Keelan Cole, while undrafted rookie RB James Robinson ran for 62 yards in his NFL debut. Indianapolis started fast with a seven-play, 63-yard drive resulting in a 7-0 lead on RB Nyheim Hines' 12-yard scoring run. The Jacksonville offense started slowly with punts on its first two possessions, while the defense rose up with a fourth-down stop at the Jacksonville 3-yard line on the Colts' second drive. The defense then changed the momentum on the next series when rookie CB CJ Henderson picked off QB Philip Rivers and returned to 22 yards to the Colts 27. That set up Minshew's 6-yard TD pass to Chark to tie the score at 7-7. Indianapolis responded with an 11-play, 75-yard drive capped by Rivers' 8-yards touchdown pass to Hines, but the Jaguars answered with a 75-yard drive of their own to tie the game at 14-14 on Shenault's 15-yard scoring catch with 1:38 remaining in the first half. The Colts regained a 17-14 lead on the final play of the half: a 38-yard field goal by rookie K Rodrigo Blankenship. In the third quarter Blankenship hit the left upright with a 30-yard attempt, and Jacksonville capitalized with K Josh Lambo nailing a 50-yard field goal for a 17-17 tie with 3:30 left in the quarter. Blankenship bounced back to make a 25-yard field goal on the ensuing possession to regain the lead at 20-17, but the Jaguars were not done. Their 75-yard march included three runs and three passes as well as a 15-yard horse collar penalty to get to the Indy 22, from where Minshew hit Cole 15-yard horse collar penalty to get to the Indy 22, from where Minshew hit Cole for a 22-yard TD to give the Jaguars their first lead of the day at 24-20 with 5:56 remaining. Rivers then threw his second INT of the day, this time to S **Andrew Wingard**, to set up Lambo's second field goal of the day from 46 yards for a 27-20 lead with 2:50 left. The Jacksonville defense stopped the Colts eight plays later on 4th-and-5 from the Jacksonville 26 to seal the win.
