

Each year, the Jaguars Foundation reiterates its commitment to improving the lives of our residents through its focus on neighborhood revitalization, youth development, and NFL-wide initiatives, including support for the military, cancer awareness and prevention, social justice, Hispanic heritage and non-profit engagement.

Since 2012, the Jaguars and Khan Family have donated more than \$37 million through the Jaguars Foundation in support of many worthy causes within those pillars. In 2024, our team continued this tradition in the community through numerous monetary grants and volunteer hours.

Among the initiatives spearheaded in the last year alone, I am especially proud of the efforts by the Jaguars Foundation to provide access to technology and training tools for Jacksonville residents to bridge the digital divide, including funding a new computer lab in the in the Historic Eastside and providing iPads and hands on learning for senior citizens at the inaugural Senior Technology Training Camp. Additionally, through our Jaguars PREP football development program, we positively impacted more than 10,000 youth and high school football athletes, continuing to grow the pipeline for the sport and make it accessible to more kids in Northeast Florida and beyond.

We are grateful for the work of Jaguars players and coaches who are also committed to improving lives in our community, including participating in food distribution drives, honoring military families and encouraging young athletes to continue their pursuit of football excellence. The awareness of our locker room's dedication went beyond our own community as the NFL recognized our own Arik Armstead as the 2024 Walter Payton Man of the Year for his tireless work related to reading and financial literacy through Jaguars Literacy Locker Rooms and EverBank Touchdowns for Tomorrow, among other initiatives.

At the time of the City Council vote for the Stadium of the Future in late spring 2024, I said "never doubt Jacksonville." I stand by this statement beyond measure. We are a mighty city with the most steadfast and resilient people – a people with a "can-do" mentality to ensure we build a better Jacksonville together.



COMMUNITY DAY

In September, the Jaguars hosted their second annual Community Day presented by Florida Blue which positively impacted thousands of local children, families, and military personnel. Volunteers from Florida Blue, CSX, FIS, Regency Centers, and Tito's Vodka assembled 1,000 meal kits for Feeding Northeast Florida, 200 care packages for St. Michael's Soldiers, a backpack filled with school supplies for every student at Andrew Robinson Elementary with the help of City Year and 600 hygiene kits benefitting Operation New Hope.







JAGUARS IN THE COMMUNITY

UNIFIED BOWL

The Special Olympics Florida team battled the Special Olympics Minnesota team in the Special Olympics Unified Bowl, a competitive flag football match held at EverBank Stadium leading up to the Jaguars vs. Vikings matchup. Athletes received customized jerseys, backpacks, and gear thanks to Ticketmaster. The Special Olympics Minnesota athletes traveled to Jacksonville for a memorable game day experience filled with flag football, NFL football and making new friendships.


EVERBANK FINANCIAL LITERACY CAMPS

The Jaguars and EverBank teamed up on the field and in the classroom for the EverBank Touchdowns for Tomorrow program. For every Jaguars touchdown scored in the 2024 NFL season, EverBank provided 100 Duval County students with access to financial education on the field through camps and in the classroom through financial literacy lessons. Held at EverBank Stadium, Jaguars players, Legends, and EverBank volunteers provide hands-on financial education lessons using football drills and activities.



SENIOR TECH TRAINING CAMP

The Jaguars and AT&T collaborated on a Senior Technology Training Camp that benefited 90 seniors from the First Coast YMCA Silver Sneakers Program. Each participant received a new iPad along with hands-on training in essential digital skills. Mayor Donna Deegan spoke to the audience, and following the unboxing and setup of the devices, attendees engaged in information sessions covering topics such as internet security, navigating healthcare platforms, and transportation apps. This initiative aimed to equip seniors with the tools they need to stay connected and informed in today's rapidly changing digital landscape. The program was made possible by the NFL Foundation's Digital Divide Grant, which seeks to address the technology gap in marginalized communities.

NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION

We believe when neighborhoods thrive, so do residents and ultimately their communities. The Khan Family and the Jaguars Foundation made a \$1.3 million donation to LIFT JAX and its work with the Historic Eastside Community Development Corporation (CDC), supporting the revitalization of Jacksonville's OUTEAST neighborhood.

GRAND REOPENING OF THE CORNER AT DEBS STORE

In September, the Jacksonville Jaguars celebrated the grand reopening of The Corner at Debs Store in Jacksonville's Historic Eastside. This Goodwill Industries of North Florida initiative offers fresh, affordable food plus career services through the GoodCareers Center. Originally serving the community since 1911, the Debs Store closed in 2011, leaving the neighborhood without a walkable grocer. This 2024 revival, supported by the Debs family, Goodwill, LIFT JAX, City of Jacksonville, Jaguars, VyStar and others, also includes a new computer lab with funding made possible from the Jaguars Foundation.







FSCJ AND GOODWILL A-STEP PROGRAM

This summer, the Jaguars supported the Florida State College at Jacksonville and Goodwill Industries of North Florida A-STEP (Academic Support Through the Employment Process) program's concentrated construction 'Building Futures Together' track. Jaguars Partner DeWalt Tools graciously provided the first graduating class with a bag of essential items to kickstart their construction careers.



BUSTER FORD CHECKERBOARD PARK CLEANUP

Volunteers from VyStar Credit Union and the Jaguars teamed up with Florida Avenue, Main Street and OUTEAST residents to tackle phase three of the transformation of Buster Ford Checkerboard Park, located on A. Philip Randolph Boulevard. Volunteers installed plants, flowers, mulch and gravel, and cleaned storefronts along the APR corridor.



COMMUNITY FIELDS

The Jaguars, alongside the NFL Foundation, brought a new state-of-the-art track and football field to KIPP Bold City High School making it the 19th community field opened through the partnership in Northeast Florida. The Jaguars are committed to investing in community fields to provide safe, accessible spaces.





THE JAGUARS FOUNDATION BOYS AND GIRLS CLUB AT RUSSELL B. COOK JR. PARK

We continued support of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Northeast Florida with a \$250,000 donation towards a club renovation of the Jaguars Foundation Boys and Girls Club at Russell B. Cook Jr. Park in Jacksonville's Historic Eastside neighborhood. The renovations include major improvements to the building interior and structure, along with new equipment for recreational and academic use.





YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Investing in our youth through education and sports offers productive environments for learning and growth. We strongly believe these two powerful tools positively impact the Northeast Florida community and thousands of youth benefit annually from the resources offered through Literacy Locker Rooms, Honor Rows, scholarship opportunities and nonprofit partnership programs.

LITERACY LOCKER ROOMS

Literacy Locker Rooms were created in 2021 by the Jaguars Foundation in collaboration with READ USA and other partners to promote the importance of literacy to area youth. Jaguars football players visit local schools and spend time reading to the kids and discuss the importance of reading and the impact literacy has had on their lives. Corporate partners Florida Blue, Whataburger, JEA, Gallagher Insurance and Nemours, made it possible to host Literacy Locker Rooms at John Love Early Learning Center, Beauclerc Elementary, The Guardian Catholic Schools, Andrew Robinson Elementary, Louis S. Sheffield Elementary and Julington Creek Elementary. More than 2,500 elementary and middle school students received free books in 2024.

HONOR ROWS

The Honor Rows program was established to recognize area students for their dedicated efforts in the areas of academic improvement, character and community service. In partnership with Beaver Street Fisheries, this nationally recognized program is one of the Foundation's longest-standing initiatives and uses the opportunity to attend Jaguars home games as an incentive for youth to reach their goals. During the 2024 season, more than 4,400 students earned a seat.







JAGUARS PREP PRESENTED BY DREAM FINDERS HOMES

The Jaguars PREP program is committed to growing the game of football throughout Northeast Florida by removing barriers to accessibility, encouraging health and safety, building strong character and enhancing opportunities and resources for youth and high school football athletes.

GIRLS FLAG PRESEASON CLASSIC

The Jaguars 2024 Girls Flag Preseason Classic presented by Experience Kissimmee took place prior to the start of Girls Flag Football season at EverBank Stadium. The two-day event was the largest preseason classic the Jaguars have hosted to date, featuring 45 girls flag high school teams with over 1,000 athletes from across Northeast Florida.

GIRLS FLAG COLLEGE SHOWCASE

Our second annual Girls Flag College Showcase featured 145 high school girls flag athletes and offered the opportunity to be seen by NAIA and NJCAA coaches. Legend Paul Spicer was on-site to show his support.

DREAM BIG GIRLS FLAG SCHOLARSHIP

The DREAM BIG Scholarship was established through the Jaguars Foundation to support high school girls football athletes pursuing higher education. In its second year, we awarded three scholarships to female high school seniors participating in girls flag and/or tackle football who plan to pursue a higher education. The 2024 recipients included Olivia Cadiz, senior at Dr. Phillips High School; Courtney Brown, senior at Stanton College Preparatory High School; and Lilyana Hirschi, senior at Forest High School.

BOLD GOLD GAMES

In continuing its dedication to developing pathways for youth and flag sports, the Jaguars hosted nearly 700 athletes and coaches at the "Bold Gold Games." The Olympic-themed 5v5 flag football tournament hosted nine divisions of travel flag teams ranging from 9U to 18U teams of girls and boys/coed teams. Fifty five teams had the chance to compete at EverBank Stadium and Daily's Place Flex Field with champions receiving gold medals.







QB SKILLS CHALLENGE

The Jaguars QB Skills Challenge continues to grow and attract the top talent across Florida and southeast Georgia with over 200 male and female high school quarterbacks competing in a head-to-head competitive challenge.



THE NIKE 11-ON

In 2024 the Jaguars hosted Nike 11-On series with 16 high school football teams participating and competing against other local high school teams to prepare for their seasons. Boys flag athletes representing Jacksonville to North Orlando and the panhandle traveled to Northeast Florida to compete at EverBank Stadium.

The Jaguars and Nike hosted 16 teams for the second annual Girls Flag Summer Tournament at EverBank Stadium. Choctaw High School's team was crowned the champions in the $7\sqrt{7}$ tournament and Niceville High School won the tug-of-war contest.

SPECIAL OLYMPICS FANTASY CAMP

Special Olympics Florida 'Fantasy Camp' presented by Ticketmaster was a day filled with once-in-a-lifetime moments. Athletes began with a stadium tour that led to the official team locker room, where THE ROAR cheerleaders showed them to lockers featuring personalized nameplates and game-day style jerseys. Jacksonville Jaguars GM Trent Baalke was onsite to welcome attendees and announced that each athlete would each sign an exclusive one-day contract to become Jaguars players for the day.





HELMET DONATIONS

The Jacksonville Jaguars and Gatorade teamed up to surprise the Riverside High School football team with new helmets and equipment for their season. Athletes are provided equal access and opportunity for all to play the game they love thanks to Gatorade's equity in sports program. To kickoff August's Play Football Month, the Jaguars also donated nearly 200 new helmets to local youth football programs.



GATEWAY CONFERENCE AWARDS

The Jaguars partnered with Florida Lottery to celebrate more than 350 local public high school athletes at the annual Duval County Public Schools Gateway Conference Awards. The ceremony honors the top male and female athletes on the field and in the classroom from across Duval County.



PREP PROSPECT CAMPS

The Jaguars hosted PREP Prospect Camps with over 500 of the best athletes in Jacksonville in attendance. Boys and girls flag athletes ages 8 through 17 showed off their skills through a series of drills and scrimmages.

INSPIRE CHANGE

As part of an NFL league-wide effort to address social justice issues, we focus on the following four areas of social justice: education, economic advancement, police-community relations, and criminal justice reform.

NATIONAL VOLUNTEER MONTH

During April's National Volunteer Month, nearly 80 Jaguars front office staff dedicated more than 700 volunteer hours to impact several non-profit organizations and companies across Jacksonville. The team packaged and distributed 3,522 meals, supported 500 area youth, assembled 300 care packages for the homeless, and served 1,500 meals.





INSPIRE CHANGE CHANGEMAKER AWARD

Mia Jones, CEO of AGAPE Community Health Center, is the Jaguars 2024 Inspire Change Changemaker awardee. AGAPE Community Health Center is a Jacksonville-based nonprofit that provides quality healthcare services for insured, uninsured, and underinsured Jacksonville residents. Jones has long been a community steward, serving in the Florida House of Representatives and on Jacksonville City Council. She was recognized during a home game and received a donation from the NFL Foundation plus a trip to Super Bowl LIX!



CRUCIAL CATCH

The Crucial Catch campaign raises awareness for multiple types of cancer and promotes early detection and risk reduction across all 32 NFL markets. The Jaguars host various events for families affected by cancer and support local nonprofits that offer financial support and services for families.


