Dear Community,

The impact of the Jacksonville Jaguars truly goes beyond football. Our players, coaches and staff are committed to this community and to making greater Jacksonville a place where all residents can find opportunity.

To ensure a community-first mindset, there are several initiatives we focus on through the Jaguars Foundation to strengthen our community and the neighborhoods in which we live, work and play. Our community impact is centered around three distinct pillars: neighborhood revitalization, youth development, and League-wide initiatives, including support for the military, cancer awareness and prevention, social justice, Hispanic heritage and non-profit engagement.

Last year, we were shaken by the senseless racially motivated shooting that tragically ended the lives of three of our fellow residents, just minutes from the stadium, in Jacksonville's New Town community. In the immediate aftermath of this tragedy, our players and staff quickly organized a food distribution event for the people of New Town. Additionally, the Jaguars Foundation, along with the NFL Foundation and other local organizations, honored the victims and heroes at the Jaguars' home opener, and presented a donation of \$1.1 million in support of the New Town residents for food security, victims, and long-term community support and advocacy.

In 2023, the Jaguars Foundation also answered our calling in the same tradition we have served our community over the years. We invested in scholarships that support high school female football athletes pursuing higher education, provided grants for 11 military and veteran-serving organizations through our partnership with the city's Veterans Resource and Reintegration Center; and committed hundreds of hours of community service with our players, staff, corporate partners and fans.

Since 2012, we have committed \$35 million in local grants earmarked to individuals and organizations making a difference in our community under the pillars we embrace. It is a privilege to give back to Jacksonville, both through financial donations and volunteerism.

Thank you for your continuous support of this organization and our mission. We are honored to be your hometown team and trusted community partner. We look forward to what the new year will bring and how we can continue building a better Jacksonville together.

In October, the Jaguars hosted its inaugural Community Day presented by Florida Blue, alongside many corporate partners, to positively impact thousands of children, families and military across Northeast Florida. More than 100 volunteers from several organizations joined together at EverBank Stadium to support nonprofits Feeding Northeast Florida, St. Michael's Soldiers and City Year by assembling 150 care packages for local military, packing meals to impact more than 2,000 individuals in the New Town community and bundling school supplies for more than 730 teachers and students at Matthew Gilbert Middle School in the OUTEAST community.

Flossie Brunson Eastside Park Playground Grand Re-Opening

In April, the Jaguars and LIFT JAX hosted the grand re-opening of the playground at Flossie Brunson Eastside Park, giving families a place to gather and enjoy the outdoors. The 7.4-acre park features new playground equipment, a baseball field, two basketball courts, and a multiuse field.

The Melanin Market

The Melanin Market was established in the OUTEAST community to support local minority-owned businesses, nonprofit organizations and local artists. The Jaguars are proud to support the Melanin Market and the business opportunities it provides for area businesses and residents.





Construction Ready

The Jaguars brought the
Construction Ready program to
Jacksonville in April 2022 with the
goal of creating new employment
opportunities for residents.
Construction Ready's workforce
readiness model provides free
training, credentialing, and career

placement services to residents
18 years and older. In completing
the Construction Ready program,
graduates receive eight national,
industry recognized credentials
and an opportunity to interview
and work with some of Northeast
Florida's leading construction
companies. This program is a

pathway to new and enhanced career opportunities for the city's residents, including our OUTEAST neighbors. Since the program's inception, the Jaguars have graduated six classes, resulting in 87 graduates being placed with full-time work at construction companies in our city.



Over the course of the year, Jaguars staff participated in various placemaking projects in the OUTEAST community, including renovations to Buster Ford Checkerboard Park, adding fresh paint to older buildings, conducting a neighborhood clean-up in partnership with Gallagher and supported the addition of five murals to enhance 10 blocks along the A. Philip Randolph business corridor.







Mobile Corner Market

The Jaguars support Feeding Northeast Florida's Mobile Corner Market. It offers OUTEAST residents and many other underserved communities in Northeast Florida with greater access to nutritious foods. The 40-foot self-contained Mobile Market targets neighborhoods with high rates of food insecurity and is stocked with fresh produce, lean proteins, dairy, plus home and personal care products that is accessible to residents. In 2023, it helped more than 7,500 families locally.



New Town Support

In the aftermath of the racially motivated shooting that took place in August, the Jaguars Foundation, the NFL Foundation and other local organizations came together to raise \$1.1 million for the First Coast Relief Fund in support of the New Town community and the victims. In addition, the Jaguars hosted a food distribution in New Town, alongside the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, JaxPAL, Kids Hope Alliance and Feeding Northeast Florida, to support the families and surrounding community.



Community Fields

The Jaguars, alongside the NFL Foundation, have invested in constructing and refurbishing 18 community fields across Jacksonville, giving kids and families safe and accessible spaces to enjoy sports and the outdoors. This past year, the Jaguars were able to help bring two new community fields to Jacksonville by partnering with the Cal Ripken, Sr. Foundation and the

City of Jacksonville to bring a new state-of-the-art multipurpose field to Clanzel T. Brown Boys & Girls Club on the Northside. In addition, the Jaguars partnered with Duval County Public Schools and the City of Jacksonville Parks and Recreation to bring a new AstroTurf football field to Englewood High School in September.





The Jaguars strongly believe in investing in our youth through education and sports. These two powerful tools offer productive environments for youth to learn, grow and thrive in. Through the Jaguars Literacy Locker Rooms, Honor Rows program, scholarship opportunities and nonprofit partnership programs, we are seeing thousands of youth benefiting from the resources offered.









Literacy Locker Rooms

Created in 2021 by the Jaguars Foundation, alongside Read USA and other partners, Literacy Locker Rooms were established to promote the importance of literacy to local youth. Jaguars players visit area elementary and middle schools, spending time reading to kids and discussing the impact that literacy has had on their lives through their own experiences.

Corporate partners Florida Blue, Florida Lottery, Gallagher and Whataburger made it possible to host Literacy Locker Rooms at John E. Ford K-8 School, San Jose Elementary, Hogan-Spring Glen Elementary School, Englewood Elementary School and John Love Elementary. More than 2,500 students received free books in 2023.



FAFSA Nights

The Jaguars Foundation teamed up with Florida Lottery and Key Buick GMC to bring Financial Aid Nights to Raines and Ribault High School. At each event, parents and students are connected with financial aid professionals to help guide them through the FAFSA application process.

End-of-Year School Celebration

The Jaguars teamed up with Stahl-Meyer to bring an unforgettable end of school year celebration to Long Branch Elementary School students in the OUTEAST neighborhood. It was a fun-packed day, filled with games, inflatable obstacle courses and appearances made by members of The ROAR and Jaxson de Ville.

Boys & Girls Clubs of Northeast Florida

The Jaguars have a history of support for the Boys & Girls Clubs of Northeast Florida, including contributing to \$3 million for the construction of the Boys & Girls Club's Youth Education Center in Brentwood, as part of hosting the Super Bowl XXXIX in Jacksonville in 2005. The Jaguars also support the Boys & Girls Club's programming and have provided multiple grants alongside the NFL Foundation, to bring a new state-of-the-art multipurpose field to the Clanzel T. Brown Boys & Girls Club and for the new Jaguars Foundation sponsored Boys & Girls Club facility at Russell B. Cook Jr. Park that is set to open in 2024.

Honor Rows

The Honor Rows Program is one of the Foundation's longest standing programs and was established with the idea that our youth are our future and should be recognized for their great efforts in the areas of academic improvement, character and community service. In partnership with Beaver Street Fisheries, Ticketmaster, and Vet Tickets, this nationally recognized program uses the opportunity to attend Jaguars home games as an incentive for youth to reach their goals, giving students something exciting to work towards each school year. During the 2023 season, more than 3,500 students earned a seat to a Jaguars home game!





Shad Khan and Harry Frisch Scholarship Fund

Jaguars owner Shad Khan and
Harry Frisch, the late Chair of
Beaver Street Fisheries, formed
the Shad Khan and Harry Frisch
Scholarship Fund to provide
opportunities for youth to pursue
higher education. Since its inception,
more than \$372,000 in scholarships
has been awarded, and the Frisch
family has graciously continued the
scholarship fund this year in Harry's honor.

We celebrate the life of Harry Frisch, Chair and CEO of Beaver Street Fisheries who passed away just short of his 100th birthday. A dear friend of Shad Khan and the Jaguars, Harry's legacy lives on in our community through his wonderful family, successful business and impactful philanthropy.


High School Media Day

Jaguars 5v5 Flag Football Tournament










Special Olympics Fantasy Camp






As part of an NFL league-wide effort to address social justice issues, the Jaguars focus on the following four areas of social justice: education, economic advancement, police-community relations and criminal justice reform.

The Bail Project

The Bail Project helps people in their darkest hour, bailing them out of jail and helping them navigate voluntary support services based on their needs as they await trial. Through the Jaguars Inspire Change grant, The Bail Project has been able to support Jacksonville clients return to 308 court dates with a 92 percent court appearance rate.





Throughout October, the Crucial Catch campaign is activated across all 32 NFL markets to raise awareness for multiple types of cancers, promoting early detection and risk reduction. The Jaguars host various events for families affected by cancer and support local nonprofits that offer financial support and services for families.





Crucial Catch Game

During the Jaguars' Crucial Catch game, players, coaches, fans, and referees wear Crucial Catch apparel to help create awareness around multiple types of cancer. The team provides unique and unforgettable on-field game day experiences for those battling cancer, survivors, and their families.

PINK OUT Month

In partnership with Clay County Athletics and the American Cancer Society, Jaguars PREP helped promote PINK OUT month in October. During eight of the local high school football games, athletes, coaches, parents and students wore pink to raise awareness and funds for breast cancer. In addition, the Jaguars Foundation provided each athlete a Crucial Catch helmet decal in support of the cause.

DONNA Marathon Weekend

The Jaguars are proud supporters of the DONNA Marathon Weekend. The 26.2 with DONNA, The National Marathon to Finish Breast Cancer, is the only marathon in the United States dedicated to breast cancer research and care.

Tom Coughlin Jay Fund

The Jaguars are proud supporters of the Jay Fund founded by former team head coach Tom Coughlin. The Tom Coughlin Jay Fund was founded in 1996 to honor one of his former players at Boston College, Jay McGillis, who lost his battle to leukemia. In honor of Jay, Coughlin made it his mission to help other families tackling childhood cancer by providing comprehensive financial, emotional and practical support.





The NFL and the Jaguars celebrate youth and high school football year-around, providing fun and engaging camps, tournaments and skills competitions for players of all ages and skill levels through the Jaguars PREP program. During the designated Play Football Month, the Jaguars host a series of events, camps and clinics that help highlight athletes for their on- and off-field achievements.





Play Football Game


The Jaguars hosted over 3,500 youth football athletes, coaches and families for the Jaguars vs. Dolphins game and offered exclusive game-day experiences. Jaguars PREP athletes were selected to receive pre-game on-field recognition, received exclusive VIP sideline passes and pre-game access

to the players' tunnel, held the flag during the national anthem, conducted the 'First DUUUVAL' chant and local girls flag teams competed at halftime as part of the Nike Kick Off Classic. The Jaguars also honored a Pop Warner coach as Veteran of the Game.

Naval Station Mayport Youth Football Camp


