JAGUARS KICK OFF 2020 SEASON

The Jacksonville Jaguars begin their 26th season in franchise history when they host the Indianapolis Colts in their 2020 regular season opener on Sunday, Sept. 13 at 1 p.m. at TIAA Bank Field. Sunday's game is a rematch of the Jaguars' 2019 season finale when Jacksonville defeated Indianapolis, 38-20, on Dec. 29, 2019 led by three TD passes from QB **Gardner Minshew II**.

Doug Marrone looks to improve to 3-1 on Kickoff Weekend as head coach of the Jaguars and 2-0 on Kickoff Weekend against AFC South opponents.

The Jaguars return two Pro Bowl performers in second-year DE **Josh Allen** and third-year WR **DJ Chark Jr.**, as well as Minshew, who set rookie records in passing yards (3,271) and passing TDs (21). In 2019, the Jaguars became the first team in NFL history to have rookies post at least 10.0 sacks (Allen) and 20 TD passes (Minshew) in the same season since sacks officially became a statistic in 1982.

"The biggest thing I like about our team right now is how together we are," said Minshew. "We do have a lot of young guys, but it's a young core that's kind of banding together. I don't think we have a lot of selfish ambitions. I don't think we have a lot of personal agendas."

JAGUARS WELCOME FANS IN WEEK 1

The Jaguars are one of only six teams expected to host fans for their regular season home opener in 2020 and the only team with fans in the stands on Sunday, Sept. 13. The Jaguars announced on July 10 that TIAA Bank Field would limit capacity to 25 percent in compliance with state and local authorities and following CDC social distancing guidelines.

Fans and stadium employees are required to wear face coverings at all times, except while actively eating or drinking, and limited capacity seating is grouped in pods, with 6 feet of distance between pods.

The Jaguars and its stadium partners have created a contactless fan experience in 2020, including new touchless security screening, selfscan ticket kiosks, mobile in-seat ordering and cashless payment options for parking, merchandise and food purchases. The Jaguars have installed more than 750 hand sanitizing stations around TIAA Bank Field and certified disinfection specialists will be at work on game day to keep high touchpoint areas clean.

WEEK 1 QUICK HITS

• The Jaguars are 2-1 on Kickoff Weekend under Head Coach **Doug Marrone** and 13-12 all-time. The Jaguars' 2020 season is book-ended by matchups against the Colts – at home in Week 1 and in Indianapolis in Week 17. This marks the second time in franchise history the Jaguars will open and close their season by playing the same team (Indianapolis, 2002).

• Of the initial Jaguars' initial 53-man roster, 25 played in Jacksonville's 2019 season opener. The roster features 16 rookies, including 12 2020 draft selections.

• The Jaguars players voted on eight captains for the 2020 season: QB Gardner Minshew II, DE Josh Allen, C Brandon Linder, DT Abry Jones, LB Myles Jack, WR Chris Conley, S Jarrod Wilson and K Josh Lambo.

• QB **Gardner Minshew II** broke franchise rookie records for single season passing yards (3,271), single game passing yards (374, Week 5 at Carolina), and single season passing TDs (21) in 2019. He had more wins and the best QB rating (91.2) of all rookies in the NFL last season.

• DE **Josh Allen** became the first rookie in franchise history to make the Pro Bowl after totaling a team-leading 10.5 sacks in 2019, which led all NFL rookies and were the most by a rookie in franchise history.

• WR **DJ Chark Jr.** earned Pro Bowl honors in 2019 after tallying 73 receptions for a team-leading 1,008 yards and eight TDs. Chark became the fifth wide receiver in franchise history to post a 1,000-yard season and the fourth wide receiver to earn Pro Bowl honors.

• The Jaguars 2020 depth chart features three starters that were signed as free agents following the 2019 season, including former Pro Bowlers TE **Tyler Eifert** (2015) and LB **Joe Schobert** (2017).

BY THE NUMBERS

4

Four rookie free agents made the Jaguars opening day roster this year: CB Luq Barcoo, DT Doug Costin, LS Ross Matiscik and RB James Robinson. Since Dave Caldwell was named the Jaguars general manager in 2013, 18 RFAs have made the Week 1 roster, including S Andrew Wingard (2019), CB Tre Herndon (2018), WR Keelan Cole Sr. (2017) and S Jarrod Wilson (2016).

QB Gardner Minshew II won seven Pepsi NFL Rookie of the Week awards in 2019, including after Week 1 vs. Kansas City when he completed 22 of 25 passes (88.0 pct) for 275 yards and two TDs. Minshew's 88.0 completion percentage was the highest by any player with at least 15 attempts making their debut in league history.

Free agent acquisition TE **Tyler Eifert** has caught 24 career TDs, including a career-high 13 in 2015 when he earned Pro Bowl honors. Eifert played in all 16 games in 2019 and caught 43 passes for 436 yards.

During the 2016 Presidential General Election, 25.2% of those registered in Duval County did not vote. On Sept. 1, the Jaguars launched an organization-wide commitment to voter engagement organized by players and coaches and designed to encourage fans to "Get in the Game" with a call for civic engagement.

K Josh Lambo set the franchise record for field goals in a single season with 33 en route to AP Second-Team All-Pro honors. Lambo connected on 33 of 34 field attempts, and his 97.1 field goal percentage is the highest in a single season in franchise history and led the NFL last season (min 15 FG attempts).

P Logan Cooke set a career-high and led the league with a net punting average of 44.5 (min. 10 punts). Cooke also finished the season with a career-high 46.8-yard gross punting average, finishing sixth in the league in that category (min. 10 punts).

146

WR **DJ Chark Jr.** caught four passes for 146 yards (36.5 rec avg.) and one TD in Week 1 at Kansas City in 2019, which set a Jaguars' Kickoff Weekend single game record. Chark totaled a team-high 1,008 receiving yards in 2019.

212

Since entering the NFL in 2013, RB **Chris Thompson** has posted 212 receptions, the 15th-most in the NFL among running backs. Thompson played with the Redskins from 2013-19 prior to signing with the Jaguars in May 2020.

378

Since 2017, LB **Joe Schobert** has posted 378 tackles, the fourthmost in the NFL. Schobert is expected to start his first game with the Jaguars at middle linebacker this Sunday.

DUUUVAL DOZEN

The Jaguars selected a franchise-record 12 players in the 2020 draft. Jacksonville selected four underclassmen, five offensive players and seven defensive players. All 12 selections made the Jaguars initial 53-man roster. See below for the Jaguars' 2020 draft class.

CB CJ Henderson - Florida, first round (ninth overall)

• Played in 30 games in three seasons with the Gators and posted 92 tackles, 20 passes defensed, six INTs and 4.0 sacks ... Became the 12th player the Jaguars have selected from the University of Florida in franchise history, more than any other school.

DE/LB K'Lavon Chaisson - LSU, first round (20th overall)

• Started 13 games as a redshirt sophomore in 2019 and led the team with 13.5 tackles for loss and 6.5 sacks en route to the 2020 College Football Playoff Championship.

WR Laviska Shenault Jr. - Coloardo, second round (42nd overall)

• Played three seasons at Colorado and totaled 149 receptions for 1,943 yards and 10 TDs, while also adding 42 rushes for 280 yards.

DT Davon Hamilton - Ohio State, third round (73rd overall)

• Played in 54 games with 17 starts during four seasons in Columbus, accumulating 21 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks ... Posted 33 reps on the bench press at the 2020 Combine, the most of any defensive lineman.

OL Ben Bartch - St. John's (Minn.), fourth round (116th overall)

• Started 14 games at left tackle as a senior and was named First-Team All-Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference honors and a Division III All-American ... Became the first player to be drafted from any Division III program in the last five years.

CB Josiah Scott - Michigan State, Fourth Round (137th overall)

• Three-year letterwinner for the Spartans started in all 30 career games.

LB Shaquille Quarterman - Miami (Fla.), fourth round (140th overall)

• Jacksonville native became the only player in Hurricanes' history to start 52 games without missing a single start and finished his career with 356 tackles, which ranks ninth in Miami (Fla.) history.

S Daniel Thomas - Auburn, fifth round (157th overall)

• Played 51 games at Auburn during his four-year career, amassing 199 tackles (124 solo), 13 passes defensed and five INTs.

WR Collin Johnson - Texas, fifth round (165th overall)

• Played in 45 games and made 29 starts, finishing his career with 188 receptions (sixth-most in school history) for 2,624 yards (fifth-most in school history) and 15 TDs ... Son of **Johnnie Johnson**, who played for 10 seasons in the NFL and is in the College Football Hall of Fame.

QB Jake Luton - Oregon State, sixth round (189th overall)

• Completed 222 passes for 2,714 yards and 28 TDs to only three INTs as a senior in 2019 ... Concluded his career at Oregon State ranked fifth in school history with 42 career TDs and seventh with 5,227 passing yards.

TE Tyler Davis - Georgia Tech, sixth round (206th overall)

• Played in 12 games at Georgia Tech as a graduate senior and caught 17 passes for 148 yards after spending his first three seasons at Conneticut ... Began his college career as a quarterback prior to switching to tight end.

CB/RS Chris Claybrooks - Memphis, seventh round (223rd overall)

• Transferred to Memphis after two seasons of junior college at Fort Scott Community College (2016) and Coahoma Community College (2017) ... Played in 21 games with Memphis and totaled 54 tackles, five passes defensed and returned 11 kickoffs for 338 yards and one TD.

CARING FOR THE COMMUNITY

Jacksonville Jaguars Owner **Shad Khan** and the Jaguars Foundation worked together with players, coaches and partners to respond to the worldwide COVID-19 crisis in a variety of ways:

- Owner **Shad Khan** committed \$1 million to local organizations including the Florida First Coast Relief Fund at the United Way of Northeast Florida, Feeding Northeast Florida, Clara White Mission and the American Red Cross.
- Head Coach **Doug Marrone** and General Manager **David Caldwell** contributed \$8,000 each to the 2020 NFL Draft-A-Thon, joining thousands of NFL fans across the nation. Jacksonville received more than \$100,000 from the worldwide fundraiser to support local efforts via the United Way of Northeast Florida.
- The Jaguars distributed 55,000 masks to citizens, nonprofit shelters, feeding programs and the Duval County Public Schools. Jaguars legend **Tony Boselli**, who himself recovered from COVID-19, participated in a team-produced public service announcement urging the public to wear masks.
- Alongside Daily's, the Jaguars distributed \$30,000 in gift cards to health care workers, first responders, educators, veterans and more.
- OL **Tyler Shatley** gifted \$10,000, matched by the Jaguars Foundation for a total of \$20,000 to help provide 1,500 prepared meals delivered daily to senior citizens in partnership with Florida Blue and Feeding Northeast Florida to support restaurants providing meals for first responders and healthcare workers.
- CB **Tre Herndon** and his girlfriend, **Treyleanna Robinson**, gifted more than 10,000 meals to via Feeding Northeast Florida.
- WR **Chris Conley**, alongside his goldendoodle, Waffles, put his video game skills to good use by taking part in a Twitch Stream-Aid online Fortnite tournament, raising \$9,300 for the World Health Organization.
- K Josh Lambo partnered with Pet Paradise and other organizations, to cover a portion of the adoption fees and six months of dog food for any dogs adopted from Jacksonville Beach shelter Furever Urs.
- LB Leon Jacobs, whose mother has worked as a nurse for more than 20 years, helped provide an all-day food truck to employees at LA+USC Medical Center.
- Jaguars players along with the Jaguars Foundation partnered with Academy Sports to donate more than 650 balls, frisbees, jump ropes and other pieces of athletic equipment to local nonprofits to distribute to area children and encourage exercise even while attending school virtually from home.

PROTECTING PLAYERS AND FANS IN 2020

Players returning to training camp in early August came back to a "new normal" at TIAA Bank Field. "Everybody has a role in making this work," said **Scott Trulock**, Jaguars director of player health and performance. "We all want the same thing. We all want to be in a safe, healthy environment and we all want the opportunity to put our product on the field this year."

- The Jaguars are maintaining a strict cleaning and disinfecting regiment throughout the day. All high touch surfaces and equipment are wiped down with hospital grade disinfectant between use and a minimum of three times per day. Every night, 115,000 square feet of Jaguars spaces are electrostatically sprayed to disinfect all surfaces.
- All Jaguars players, coaches and key staff members put on a Kinexon SafeTag every day when they arrive at TIAA Bank Field. The sensors measure the distance between nearby devices at the rate of one time per second. By recording who is in a defined proximity of one another, it allows the Jaguars staff to perform quick and accurate contact tracing.
- Players utilize the different weight rooms in groups of around 15 at any given time, split up by position group. To accommodate the most amount of players while still maintaining social distancing, the Jaguars added an 1,800 square foot auxiliary weight room steps away from the weight room on the plaza at TIAA Bank Field.
- Daily team food service still takes place in the TIAA Bank Field club space, but is now served upon request as opposed to self-serve buffet style. All items are individually wrapped, and a meal order app has been added to help decrease lines at busy mealtimes.



Although capacity is limited to 25 percent, the Jaguars, ASM Global, Delaware North and the City of Jacksonville have worked diligently over the summer to create a contactless game day experience for fans coming to TIAA Bank Field in 2020.

- After parking in physically distanced parking lots, fans will move through all new magnetometers with technology that allow fans to walk through carrying their clear bag, cell phone and keys. After security screening, they'll proceed to newly installed self-scan ticket kiosks to have their mobile ticket scanned.
- The Jaguars have added over 750 hand-sanitizing stations throughout the concourses, plaza and premium spaces. Certified Disinfection Specialists in blue vests will be at the stadium on game day disinfecting all high touchpoint areas with hospital grade disinfectant.
- The Jaguars and TIAA Bank Field are transitioning to a cashless payment stadium ensuring contactless options for parking, merchandise and food purchases. Cash will no longer be accepted at the stadium and ATMs have been removed from the premises. Fans can also scan a QR code or use the Jaguars app to order food online from the nearest concession stand and receive a text alert when it's ready for pickup.
- Limited capacity seating is grouped in pods. Every fan will have at least six feet of physical distance from every fan in other pods. Fans are encouraged to limit their pod to close friends or family. Unused seats are zip-tied to prevent accidental use.



SOCIAL JUSTICE



BLACK LIVES MATTER

Following widespread outrage over the death of George Floyd while in police custody in Minneapolis, and joining in a nationwide push for racial equality, Jaguars ownership, players, coaches and front office staff began taking steps to create positive change on the First Coast.

On June 3, Owner **Shad Khan** penned a personal op-ed, sharing his own experience with discrimination as a Muslim-American and announcing his commitment to work alongside the team to level the playing field for all to have equal access to the American dream.

"Racism, in all its forms, will kill," said Khan. "It kills people, it kills communities, it kills dreams, it kills hope. For many Americans, now is the moment. Never has that been clearer. I don't want to waste this moment."

Jaguars players took action June 5, as they led an organizationwide march to raise awareness for racial injustice against the Black community. More than 250 members of the Jaguars organization, including players, coaches, front office staff and their families, started at TIAA Bank Field at 9:04 a.m. and proceeded to the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office while wearing Black Lives Matter t-shirts.


WR **Chris Conley** addressed the crowd and called attention to markers of racism still present in Jacksonville. "We cannot allow comfortability with revisionist history to disarm our minds and weaken our convictions," said Conley. "A Confederate monument sits a couple of blocks from here, praising the south's dark past."

Three days later, a Confederate monument was removed from a downtown Jacksonville park. Conley challenged those in attendance and those watching from home to continue the fight. "This is only the beginning here in Jacksonville. Let's make sure that we maintain this momentum so this is not a moment and this is a movement."

As a team, Jaguars players are working on several plans this season to educate and engage the community on a variety of important topics including voting and legislative reform, youth education through arts and sports, financial stimulus and police and community relations.



GET IN THE GAME

On Tuesday, Sept. 1, the Jacksonville Jaguars launched an organizationwide commitment to voter education organized by players and coaches and designed to encourage fans to "Get in the Game" with a call for civic engagement. The season-long campaign kicked off with a public service announcement encouraging voter registration and will continue through election day with activations via social media, on game day, through grassroots activities and national partnerships.

"You can look at voting as a privilege, and as a naturalized U.S. citizen, you can be assured that I do," said Jaguars Owner **Shad Khan**. "But I also see it as a civic responsibility. If we're serious about being better in our communities and throughout our nation, and all voices being heard and respected, we have to participate in the electoral process. No exceptions. It's our duty to cast a ballot. If you haven't registered to vote, please do by October 5. If you're registered, please vote."

The campaign began with a non-partisan, "Get in the Game" public service announcement featuring Jaguars players and coaches, including Head Coach **Doug Marrone** and QB **Gardner Minshew II**, calling for fans in Florida to register to vote by the October 5 deadline. The Jaguars have also created www.jaguars.com/vote as a resource for the community looking for more information on voter registration and key deadlines.

Jaguars front office employees have the option to "Get in the Game" and further support the voters of Duval County by taking training from the Duval County Supervisor of Elections office to serve as poll workers on Election Day. Employees can participate in this day of service and have the opportunity to donate their time to the Jaguars Foundation.

Jaguars players, coaches and front office staff all recently participated in virtual voter education courtesy of RISE, a non-profit organization selected by the NFL to support their national NFL Votes campaign. RISE's nonpartisan initiative RISE to Vote led a virtual team meeting on August 17, walking players through the registration process and giving them insight on the history of voting rights in America.
