The girls from all teams that participated had the opportunity to compete and show off their skills on the same field where Jets players train.

Since the founding of the Gatorade Girls Flag Series three years ago, 18 games have been played and another four competitions will take place over the next few months. This spring, over 6,000 girls will participate and compete in flag football leagues and programs supported by the Jets.





GATORADE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chloe Ahorrio of Monroe-Woodbury High School in Central Valley, NY has been named this week's New York Jets High School Girls Flag Football Player of the Week presented by Gatorade. Entering its third year, this award is presented to standout girls flag players in the tri-state area. The Jets and Gatorade will recognize players throughout the season from a series of games hosted at the Atlantic Health Jets Training Center.

In the first game of the 2025 Gatorade Girls Flag Series, Ahorrio led her team to a victory over Washingtonville High School. Ahorrio was selected after having an impressive performance, recording 162 passing yards and an additional 130 rushing. She also tallied four touchdowns, throwing for three, while picking up one on the ground. Monroe-Woodbury went on to win in dominant fashion, with a final score of 36–0.

As the New York Jets Girls Flag Football Player of the Week presented by Gatorade, Ahorrio will receive a \$1,000 donation in her name to be used toward Monroe-Woodbury's Girls Flag Football program. In addition to the monetary award, Ahorrio has the opportunity to attend the Jets Play Football preseason game at MetLife Stadium, where she will be honored onfield for her achievement.

ADAM KUDLACIK - WATCHUNG HILLS

Adam Kudlacik of Watchung Hills High School in Warren, NJ has been named this week's New York Jets Girls Flag High School Coach of the Week presented by Visa. Coach Kudlacik will receive a \$2,000 donation to benefit the school's flag football program. Along with the monetary award, Coach Kudlacik will be invited to attend the Jets Play Football preseason game in August, where he will be honored on-field at MetLife Stadium.

In its third year, the Jets Girls Flag High School Coach of the Week presented by Visa award is given to a coach in the tri-state area who serves the best interests of the game through the teaching of sound football fundamentals, the motivation of young players to achieve, and the promotion of youth football by way of dedication to their community, their school, and their student-athletes.

The Watchung Hills Warriors are off to a 2–0–1 start, allowing zero points on the season with shutout wins over Scotch Plains–Fanwood (30–0) and Manville (26–0). Kudlacik is in his second year at Watchung Hills High School, where he teaches in the business department and is an assistant coach for the boys' football team, in addition to his role as the head coach of girls' flag. Prior to his time with the Warriors, Kudlacik served similar roles at Kittatinny Regional High School. Kudlacik grew up in Parsippany, NJ and began his football career at Parsippany Hills High School. He went on to play college football at Kings College, where he earned his bachelor's degree in business administration. The Warriors look to remain undefeated as they take on South Hunterdon in their upcoming game.

CHAMPIONSHIP OVERSEAS IN IRELAND

Earlier this month, the Jets, along with linebacker Quincy Williams and running back Isaiah Davis, launched the first-ever NFL girls flag league in Ireland. Eighty girls aged 12–15 from eight schools across Dublin joined the team for the league's all-day launch event at the Sport Ireland Campus. To culminate the inaugural season, a championship was held on April 8th at the Sport Ireland Campus where Larkin Community College was crowned the first-ever champions of the Jets NFL Girls Flag League in Ireland. Vanessa a safety from Ardscoil La Salle was awarded Defensive MVP while Holly a quarterback and wide receiver from from St. Louis High School was awarded Offensive MVP.
