The New York Jets, in partnership with Moody's and Special Olympics New York, will host a City Championship for New York City based High School Unified Flag Football League at MetLife Stadium. The league began with a clinic in October, bringing together athletes with and without intellectual disabilities to compete and celebrate the spirit of inclusion and teamwork.

Special Olympics Unified Sports® joins individuals with and without disabilities (known as Unified partners) on the same team. Dedicated to promoting social inclusion through shared sports training and competition experiences, it was inspired by a simple principle: training together and playing together is a quick path to friendship and understanding.

Twelve teams representing New York City high schools competed in the second season of Unified Flag Football. The Jets and Moody's provided each team with uniforms, footballs, flag belts, and practice jerseys along with grants to help off-set any costs associated with participating. The Jets. Moody's, and Special Olympics New York hope this league serves as a pilot for New York City to offer Unified Flag Football as an official sport for all high schools in the future. The Jets will look to expand and add teams to the league in 2026.

Theo McMurray Named Jets High School Player of the Week Fueled by Gatorade



Each week during the 2025 high school football season, the New York Jets and Gatorade will recognize a player of the week from the tri-state area. All players will receive a \$1,000 donation from the Jets and Gatorade to support their high school football program. Along with the monetary award, each recipient will be invited to attend the Jets vs. Dolphins game on December 7th, where they will be honored on-field at MetLife Stadium.

This week's recipient is junior quarterback Theo McMurray of Bronxville High School in Bronxville, N.Y. In the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) Class C regional final, McMurray recorded five touchdowns to lead Bronxville to a 56-26 victory and extend the Broncos' undefeated season.



McMurray turned in a near-perfect performance in the air, completing 11 of 12 passes for 154 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 14.0 yards per throw. He also added a 15-yard rushing touchdown, bringing his total to five scores on the day. The Broncos will look to advance to the NYSPHSAA Football Championships when they face undefeated Schuylerville in a top-seeded showdown this Saturday. Kickoff is scheduled for noon at Middletown High School.
