# VOL. XXVII; NO. 1 GREEN BAY ENTERS DRAFT WITH EIGHT SELECTIONS

Later this week, the Green Bay Packers will welcome another rookie class to their roster through the NFL Draft, which will be held April 24-26 in Green Bay.

- Armed with eight selections, Green Bay will have opportunities to add more talent and depth to their roster. All picks are eligible to be traded.
- Green Bay enters the draft with a pick in all seven rounds, including two selections in Round 7.
- The event will begin in prime time on Thursday night, with Round 1 on April 24 starting at 7 p.m. CT.
- Rounds 2-3 also will be held in prime time, beginning on Friday, April 25, at 6 p.m. CT. Rounds 4-7 will complete the draft on Saturday, April 26, starting at 11 a.m. CT.

### **GUTEKUNST LEADS PACKERS IN EIGHTH DRAFT AS GM**

GM Brian Gutekunst enters his 27th draft with the Packers and his eighth as the general manager.

- The past two draft classes have played an important role in helping Green Bay become the two youngest teams by weighted age (25.72 in 2024 and 25.58 in 2023) to make the playoffs over the last 45 seasons (1980-2024).
- Since Gutekunst took over as GM in 2018, the Packers rank No. 2 in the league over that span in games started by rookies with 917 (L.A. Rams, 958).
- The 11-player class of 2024 saw nine players appear in a game, four play 13-plus games, seven play six-plus games and three record four-plus starts: LB Edgerrin Cooper (four), S Javon Bullard (11), S Evan Williams (six). Six players also played in the postseason with Cooper and Williams starting. Both Cooper and Williams were selected to the Pro Football Writers of America All-Rookie team. Cooper was the only player in the NFL in 2024 with 75-plus tackles, 13-plus tackles for a loss, three-plus sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble.
- Green Bay's rookie class combined to appear in 206 regular-season games in 2023, the most in a season in team history and the most by any NFL team in 2023. Of the 13 selections of the 2023 draft class, 11 players saw action, including eight who played in 15-plus games. Six members of the 2023 draft class started at least four games as rookies, with WR Jayden Reed (13) and CB Carrington Valentine (12) leading the way. Reed and Valentine were joined by TEs Luke Musgrave and Tucker Kraft and WR Dontayvion Wicks as rookies who started in the 2023 postseason. Reed joined WR Don Hutson as the only Packers with six-plus receiving TDs in both of their first two NFL seasons. Kraft (81 in 2023-24) passed Richard Rodgers (78 in 2014-15) for the most receptions by a Packer tight end in their first two seasons (since 1970).

### **2025 NFL DRAFT PREVIEW**

Of the 11 players drafted in 2022, eight players played in nine-plus games and six players combined to start 48 contests as rookies. The top three selections, LB Quay Walker (first Packer ILB to make PFWA's All-Rookie team since A.J. Hawk in 2006), DL Devonte Wyatt and WR Christian Watson combined to play in 47 games with 27 starts. According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Watson was the second rookie in NFL history at that point to post seven-plus receiving TDs and multiple rushing TDs (Chase Claypool, 2020). Green Bay's 2022 draft class also featured three offensive linemen (G Sean Rhyan, OL Zach Tom, T Rasheed Walker) who started every game for the Packers in 2024, the first trio of offensive linemen to all be selected in the same class and go on to start every game for that team in a season since Kansas City's draft class of 1974 had three linemen start every game for the Chiefs in 1981. The Packers' 2022 draft class combined for 226 starts from 2022-24, the second most by a class in their first three seasons in the seven-round draft era (since 1994) behind only the 2008 Kansas City Chiefs (227 from 2008-10).

- In 2021, all nine of the players drafted by Green Bay appeared in a game with six playing in at least 13 as rookies (G Royce Newman, 17 / DL T.J. Slaton, 17 / WR Amari Rodgers, 16 / CB Eric Stokes, 16 / CB Shemar Jean-Charles, 14 / LB Isaiah McDuffie, 13).
- In 2020, Gutekunst drafted nine players overall, including trading up in the first round to select QB Jordan Love, who led the Packers to the playoffs in each of his first two seasons as the starter and was one of two NFL players (Jared Goff) with 25-plus TD passes and a 95-plus rating in each of the past two seasons (2023-24).
- ▶ In the 2019 draft, Gutekunst selected eight players overall, including LB **Rashan Gary** (No. 12) and G/T **Elgton Jenkins** (No. 44). Gary ranks No. 8 on the Packers all-time sack list (since 1982) and earned his first Pro Bowl selection in 2024. Jenkins was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2020, becoming just the third offensive lineman in team history to be named to the Pro Bowl within his first two seasons in the NFL (Derel Teteak, 1952; Charley Brock, 1940). He was named to his second Pro Bowl in 2022, becoming just the 11th Packers offensive lineman to be named to multiple Pro Bowls, according to Stathead. com.
- In his first draft as general manager in 2018, Gutekunst made a couple of trades involving first-round picks that resulted in the Packers selecting CB Jaire Alexander at No. 18 and gaining the No. 30 pick in the 2019 draft. Alexander earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2020 and 2022, joining Charles Woodson (four) and Herb Adderley (seven) as the only Packers cornerbacks to

be named to multiple *AP* All-Pro teams. Alexander was also selected to the Pro Bowl in 2020, making him one of three CBs in franchise history to make the Pro Bowl in his first three seasons (Adderley, 1963, third season; Willie Buchanon, 1973, second season). He earned his second Pro Bowl honor (2022) in his fifth NFL season, becoming the 13th defensive back in franchise history to be named to multiple Pro Bowls.

- Green Bay selected 11 players in Gutekunst's first draft as GM. The Packers had rookies play in a league-high 171 games in 2018 and account for 50 starts, the most for Green Bay since 2006 (66 starts).
- Gutekunst spent his first 13 seasons with Green Bay as a college scout, serving as an East Coast regional scout for two years (1999-2000) before switching to the Southeast region (2001-11).
- During his first 13 drafts with the Packers, Gutekunst was part of a personnel department that drafted several Pro Bowlers, including WR Donald Driver (seventh round, 1999), who is the team's all-time leading receiver, QB Aaron Rodgers (first round, 2005), who is the all-time franchise leader in passer rating, LB A.J. Hawk (first round, 2006), who is the leading tackler in franchise history, WR Jordy Nelson (second round, 2008), who is No. 4 in franchise history in receptions, and LB Clay Matthews (first round, 2009), who is the franchise leader in sacks.
- Gutekunst was promoted to director of college scouting in 2012, a position he served in through 2015. Over that time period, Green Bay selected T David Bakhtiari (fourth round, 2013), who was honored five times as an All-Pro by AP, Pro Bowl RB Eddie Lacy (second round, 2012), and WR Davante Adams (second round, 2014), who was selected to five straight Pro Bowls (2017-21) and was named first-team All-Pro by AP in 2020-21.
- In 2016-17, Gutekunst served as director of player personnel and those two drafts were highlighted by the addition of DL Kenny Clark (first round, 2016), who joined Henry Jordan (1960-61, 1963, 1966) as the only Packers defensive tackles to make three-plus Pro Bowls (2019, 2021 and 2023), and RB Aaron Jones (fifth round, 2017), who made the Pro Bowl in 2020.

- ▶ The last time Green Bay chose a player with the No. 23 pick was in 2010 when it selected T Bryan Bulaga out of Iowa.

While first-round choices certainly can be key players for a franchise, as the Packers have shown with Pro Bowl selections QB Aaron Rodgers (2005), DL Kenny Clark (2016), LB A.J. Hawk (2006), LB Clay Matthews (2009), DT B.J. Raji (2009), S Ha Ha Clinton-Dix (2014), CB Jaire Alexander (2018) and LB Rashan Gary (2019), and key contributors LB Quay Walker (2022), DL Devonte Wyatt (2022) and LB Lukas Van Ness (2023), second-round selections can prove to be just as valuable. WRs Jordy Nelson (2008) and Randall Cobb (2011) were both picked in the second round and became the first duo in NFL history to both have 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season (2014). Another second-round pick was WR Davante Adams (2014), who earned first-team All-Pro honors from The Associated Press in 2020 and 2021, the first Packers WR to receive first-team recognition since Antonio Freeman in 1998, and was selected to five straight Pro Bowls, joining James Lofton (six straight, 1980-85) as the only WRs in team history to be selected in five-plus consecutive seasons. Other second-round picks include G/T Elgton Jenkins (2019), who was only the second Packers guard to be selected to the PFWA All-Rookie team since 1974 (Daryn Colledge, 2006) and in 2020 became the first Green Bay offensive lineman to start a game at guard, center and tackle in the same season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, CB Casey Hayward (2012), who became the first CB in franchise history (since 1974) to be named to the All-Rookie Team by Pro Football Weekly/PFWA. C Josh Myers (2021) started all 56 games he played in during his four seasons in Green Bay. In 2022, Green Bay traded up to draft WR Christian Watson, who in his first season joined Johnny (Blood) McNally (1931) and Don Hutson (1941) as the only Packers with seven-plus receiving TDs and multiple rushing TDs in a season. In 2023, Green Bay selected TE Luke Musgrave, who tied the top mark by a tight end in team history for receptions (Bubba Franks, 34 in 2000) and WR Jayden Reed, who ranked No. 1 in franchise history by a rookie in receptions (64) and 10 total TDs (No.

3 in franchise history among rookies). In 2024, the Packers selected LB **Edgerrin Cooper** and S **Javon Bullard** who combined to play in 29 games with 15 starts.

- The last time the Packers chose a player with the No. 54 pick in the draft was DE Lionel Aldridge out of Utah State in 1963.

- With 22 starters and a 53-man roster, selections in the third round often turn into significant contributors for a team. Examples are WR James Jones (2007), TE Jermichael Finley (2008), S Morgan Burnett (2010), LB Kyler Fackrell (2016) and TE Tucker Kraft (2023), who was one of only two tight ends in the league (George Kittle) to post 50-plus receptions, 700-plus receiving yards, seven-plus receiving TDs and an average of 14.0-plus yards per catch last season.
- The fourth and fifth rounds have also been a spot where the Packers have found starters. Last year, Green Bay selected S Evan Williams (fourth round), who played in 13 regular-season games with six starts and started the postseason contest. In 2023, the Packers selected WR Dontayvion Wicks (fifth round), who became just the sixth player in team history to register four-plus TD catches in both of first two seasons in the league (2023-24). In 2022, Green Bay selected WR Romeo **Doubs** (fourth round), who is one of only three players in franchise history to register 40-plus receptions, 400-plus receiving yards and three-plus receiving TDs in each of his first three NFL seasons, and OL Zach Tom (2022/fourth round), who after starting five of nine games played as a rookie, started every contest (including playoffs) in each of the last two seasons (2023-24). The fifth round was where Green Bay got Pro Bowl RB Aaron Jones (2017/fifth round), who registered the most games with 100-plus rushing yards and an average of 6.0plus yards per attempt in team history (15). LB Blake Martinez (2016/ fourth round) led the team in tackles for three straight seasons (2017-19). The Packers have found numerous Pro Bowl linemen in the fourth or fifth round over the years: G Josh Sitton (2008/fourth round), G T.J. Lang (2009/fourth round), five-time All-Pro T David Bakhtiari (2013/ fourth round) and C Corey Linsley (2014/fifth round). Pro Bowl DT Mike Daniels (2012) was also drafted in the fifth round. Green Bay has also found key contributors in all three phases in the fourth and fifth rounds: DB Micah Hyde (2013/fifth), LB Jake Ryan (2015/fourth), DL Dean Lowry (2016/fourth), P JK Scott (2018/fifth) and WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling (2018/fifth) and DL Colby Wooden (2023/fourth).
- Green Bay has received contributions from several late-round picks over the years, including DT Johnny Jolly (2006/sixth round), LB Desmond Bishop (2007/sixth round), K Mason Crosby (2007/sixth), QB Matt Flynn (2008/seventh), LB Brad Jones (2009/seventh), RB James Starks (2010/sixth), DE C.J. Wilson (2010/seventh), LB Sam Barrington (2013/seventh). In recent years the Packers have selected a player in the sixth or seventh round that saw significant playing time. LS Hunter Bradley (2018/seventh) played in every game in his first three seasons, LB Ty Summers (2019/seventh) appeared in 46 contests from 2019-21, G Jon Runyan (2020/sixth) played in 67 regular-season games with 50 starts and started three of five postseason contests he played in over four years, LB Isaiah McDuffie (2021/ sixth) has played in 63 games with 26 starts in his first four seasons, T Rasheed Walker (2022/seventh) played in every game over the past two seasons (2023-24) with 32 regular-season starts and three postseason starts, DL Karl Brooks (2023/sixth) and K Anders Carlson (2023/sixth) both played every game as rookies, and CB Carrington Valentine (2023/seventh) has played in 32 regular-season games with 19 starts and started all three postseason contests in his first two seasons.

### A LOOK INTO THE PERSONNEL DEPARTMENT

General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** heads up a talented and experienced player personnel staff.

- Members of the personnel staff have spent months, if not years with some prospects, studying for the 2025 NFL Draft. They visit schools throughout the season, attending practices, dozens of games and pro days in the spring. In each area, they have formed relationships with high school and college coaches, trying to get a better idea of who the person is, not just the football prospect.
- Working closely with Gutekunst year-round is Director Football Operations Milt Hendrickson (21st NFL season), Vice President of Player Personnel Jon-Eric Sullivan (22nd NFL season), Director of Player Personnel John Wojciechowski (30th NFL season), Director of College Scouting Matt Malaspina (28th NFL season), National Scout Sam Seale (30th NFL season), Director of Pro Personnel Richmond Williams (18th NFL season), Player Personnel Executive Lee Gissendaner (25th NFL season) and Assistant Director of College Scouting Patrick Moore (13th NFL season).
