GREEN BAY ENTERS DRAFT WITH 10 SELECTIONS

Later this week, the Green Bay Packers will welcome another rookie class to their roster through the NFL Draft, which will be held April 29 - May 1 in Cleveland.



- ▶ Armed with 10 selections for the third straight year, the Packers will have plenty of opportunities to add more talent and depth to their roster. All picks are eligible to be traded.
- ▶ Green Bay enters the draft with a pick in every round, including two selections in Rounds 4-6.
- ▶ If the Packers draft 10 players, it will mark the third draft in the last five years that Green Bay selected 10-plus players (11 in 2018 and 10 in 2017). From 2000-20, the Packers selected 10-plus players in a single draft eight times (2013, 11; 2011, 10; 2007, 11; 2006, 12; 2005, 11; 2000, 13) according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ The event will begin in prime time on Thursday night, with Round 1 on April 29 beginning at 7 p.m. CT.
- ▶ Rounds 2-3 also will be held in prime time, beginning on Friday, April 30, at 6 p.m. CT. Rounds 4-7 will complete the draft on Saturday, May 1, starting at 11 a.m. CT.
- ▶ Teams will have 10 minutes in between selections in the first round and seven minutes between each choice for Round 2. Rounds 3-6, including compensatory picks, will allow up to five minutes in between picks and Round 7, including compensatory picks, will allow four minutes. GUTEKUNST LEADS PACKERS IN FOURTH DRAFT AS GM

GM **Brian Gutekunst** enters his 23rd draft with the Packers and his fourth as the general manager.

- ▶ Last year, Gutekunst drafted nine players overall with four players seeing action in 10-plus regular-season games as rookies (G **Jon Runyan**, 16 / S **Vernon Scott**, 15 / RB **AJ Dillon**, 11 / LB **Kamal Martin**, 10).
- ▶ In the 2019 draft, Gutekunst selected eight players overall, including LB **Rashan Gary** (No. 12), S **Darnell Savage** (No. 21), G **Elgton Jenkins** (No. 44), DL **Kingsley Keke** (No. 150) and LB **Ty Summers** (No. 226). All five players have played in 29-plus games for a team that has gone 26-6 in their first two seasons. Jenkins was selected to his first career Pro Bowl in 2020, becoming just the third offensive lineman in team history to be named to the Pro Bowl within his first two seasons in the NFL (Derel Teteak, 1952; Charley Brock, 1940).

- ▶ In his first draft as general manager in 2018, Gutekunst made a couple of trades involving first-round picks that resulted in the Packers selecting CB **Jaire Alexander** at No. 18 and gaining the No. 30 pick in the 2019 draft. Alexander earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2020. He was also selected to the Pro Bowl last season, making him one of three CBs in franchise history to make the Pro Bowl in his first three seasons (Herb Adderley, 1963, third season; Willie Buchanon, 1973, second season).
- ▶ Green Bay selected 11 players in Gutekunst's first draft as GM. For the first time since 2006 (five), the Packers had four or more rookies start six-plus games in 2018 (Alexander, 11; fifth-round pick WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling**, 10; second-round pick CB **Josh Jackson**, 10; sixth-round selection WR **Equanimeous St. Brown**, seven). The Packers had rookies play in a league-high 171 games in 2018 and account for 50 starts, the most for Green Bay since 2006 (66 starts).
- ▶ Gutekunst spent his first 13 seasons with Green Bay as a college scout, serving as an East Coast regional scout for two years (1999-2000) before switching to the Southeast region (2001-11).
- ▶ During his first 13 drafts with the Packers, Gutekunst was part of a personnel department that drafted several Pro Bowlers, including WR **Donald Driver** (seventh round, 1999), who is the team's all-time leading receiver, QB **Aaron Rodgers** (first round, 2005), LB **A.J. Hawk** (first round, 2006), who is the leading tackler in franchise history, WR **Jordy Nelson** (second round, 2008), and LB **Clay Matthews** (first round, 2009), who is the franchise leader in sacks.
- ▶ Gutekunst was promoted to director of college scouting in 2012, a position he served in through 2015. Over that time period, Green Bay selected T **David Bakhtiari** (fourth round, 2013), who became the first Green Bay rookie to start every game at LT since 1978 and has been honored as an All-Pro by *AP* each of the last five years, Pro Bowl RB **Eddie Lacy** (second round, 2012), and WR **Davante Adams** (second round, 2014), who has been selected to four straight Pro Bowls (2017-20) and was named first-team All-Pro by *AP* in 2020.
- ▶ In 2016-17, Gutekunst served as director of player personnel and those two drafts were highlighted by the addition of DL **Kenny Clark** (first round, 2016), who earned his first trip to the Pro Bowl in 2019, and RB **Aaron Jones** (fifth round, 2017), who in 2019 recorded a franchise-best 23 total TDs (including postseason). He joined RB Jim Brown (1957-60) as one of only two players in league history to post 3,000-plus rushing yards and 35-plus rushing TDs with an average of 5.00-plus yards per carry in their first four seasons in the NFL.

WHO HAS BEEN THERE AT NO. 29?

Green Bay will have the No. 29 selection in the first round of the 2021 NFL Draft.

- The last time the Packers entered the draft with the No. 29 selection was in 2017 when they used it in a trade with the Cleveland Browns for picks in the second round (No. 33 overall, CB Kevin King) and fourth round (No. 108, LB Vince Biegel).
- The last time Green Bay chose a player with the No. 29 pick was in 2003 when it selected LB Nick Barnett out of Oregon State.

- While first-round choices certainly can be key players for a franchise, as the Packers have shown with Pro Bowl selections QB **Aaron Rodgers** (2005), DL **Kenny Clark** (2016), LB **A.J. Hawk** (2006), LB **Clay Matthews** (2009), DT **B.J. Raji** (2009) and S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** (2014), CB **Jaire Alexander** (2018), and key contributors S **Darnell Savage** (2019) and LB **Rashan Gary** (2019), second-round selections can prove to be just as valuable. WRs **Jordy Nelson** (2008) and **Randall Cobb** (2011) were both picked in the second round and became the first duo in NFL history to both have 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season (2014). Another second-round pick was WR **Davante Adams** (2014) who earned first-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2020, the first Packers WR to receive first-team recognition since Antonio Freeman in 1998, and was selected to his fourth straight Pro Bowl, joining James Lofton (six straight, 1980-85) as the only WRs in team history to be selected in four-plus consecutive seasons. Other second-round picks included G **Elgton Jenkins** (2019), who was only the second Packers guard to be selected to the PFWA All-Rookie team since 1974 (Daryn Colledge, 2006) and in 2020 became the first

Green Bay offensive lineman to start a game at guard, center and tackle in the same season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, CB **Kevin King** (2017), who tied for No. 4 in the NFL in 2019 with a career-best five interceptions, CB **Casey Hayward** (2012), who became the first CB in franchise history (since 1974) to be named to the All-Rookie Team by *Pro Football Weekly/PFWA*, and RB **Eddie Lacy** (2013), who was named the NFL Offensive Rookie of the Year by *The Associated Press* and earned a Pro Bowl selection in 2014.

- Green Bay has one pick in the second round this year and for the second consecutive year, it is No. 62 overall. Here is a look at the players selected at No. 62 over the past 10 drafts (2011-20), including three times the Packers selected a player at No. 62:

- With 22 starters and a 53-man roster, selections in the third round often turn into significant contributors for a team. Examples are WR **James Jones** (2007), TE **Jermichael Finley** (2008), S **Morgan Burnett** (2010) and LB **Kyler Fackrell** (2016).
- The fourth and fifth rounds have also been a spot the Packers have found starters. The top two rushers for Green Bay over the last two seasons season were **Aaron Jones** (2017/fifth round) and **Jamaal Williams** (2017/fourth round). In 2020, Jones was selected to the Pro Bowl, and he is one of only two players in league history to post 3,000-plus rushing yards (3,364) and 35-plus rushing TDs (37) with an average of 5.00-plus yards per carry (5.17) in their first four seasons in the NFL, joining Jim Brown (1957-60). LB **Blake Martinez** (2016/fourth round) led the team in tackles for three straight seasons (2017-19). Of the Packers' main starters on the recent offensive lines, five were drafted in the fourth or fifth round: G **Josh Sitton** (2008/fourth round), G **T.J. Lang** (2009/fourth round), three-time All-Pro T **David Bakhtiari** (2013/fourth round) and C **Corey Linsley** (2014/fifth round). A mainstay on the Packers' defensive line from 2012-18, Pro Bowl DT **Mike Daniels** (2012) was also drafted in the fifth round. DL **Kingsley Keke** (2019) was also a fifth-rounder and played in 15 games with nine starts last year and tied for No. 3 on the team in sacks. Green Bay has also found key contributors in all three phases in the fourth and fifth rounds: DB **Micah Hyde** (2013/fifth), LB **Jake Ryan** (2015/fourth), DL **Dean Lowry** (2016/fourth), P **JK Scott** (2018/fifth) and WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** (2018/fifth).
- Green Bay has received contributions from several late-round picks over the years, including DT **Johnny Jolly** (2006/sixth round), LB **Desmond Bishop** (2007/sixth round), K **Mason Crosby** (2007/sixth), QB **Matt Flynn** (2008/seventh), LB **Brad Jones** (2009/seventh), RB **James Starks** (2010/sixth), DE **C.J. Wilson** (2010/seventh) and LB **Sam Barrington** (2013/seventh). In each of the last three drafts, the Packers have selected a player in the seventh round that saw significant playing time. LS **Hunter Bradley** (2018/seventh) has played in every game in his first three seasons, LB **Ty Summers** (2019/seventh) has appeared in all 32 contests since being drafted and S **Vernon Scott** (2020/seventh) played in 15 regular-season games and a postseason contest as a rookie.

A LOOK INTO THE PERSONNEL DEPARTMENT

General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** heads up a talented and experienced player personnel staff.

- Members of the personnel staff have spent months, if not years with some prospects, studying for the 2021 NFL Draft. They visit schools throughout the season, attending practices, dozens of games and pro days in the spring. In each area, they have formed relationships with high school and college coaches, trying to get a better idea of who the person is, not just the football prospect.
- Working closely with Gutekunst year-round is Director - Football Operations **Milt Hendrickson** (17th NFL season), Co-Director of Player Personnel **Jon-Eric Sullivan** (18th NFL season), Co-Director of Player Personnel **John Wojciechowski** (26th NFL season), Director of College Scouting **Matt Malaspina** (24th NFL season), National Scout **Sam Seale** (26th NFL season), Director of Pro Personnel **Richmond Williams** (14th NFL season), Assistant Director of Pro Scouting/Salary Cap Analyst **Chad Brinker** (12th NFL season) and Personnel Executive **Lee Gissendaner** (21st NFL season).
