GREEN BAY ENTERS DRAFT WITH EIGHT SELECTIONS

Later this week, the Green Bay Packers will welcome another rookie class to their roster through the NFL Draft, which will be held April 23-25 in Pittsburgh.



- ▶ Armed with eight selections for the second straight year, Green Bay will have opportunities to add more talent and depth to their roster. All picks are eligible to be traded.
- ▶ Green Bay enters the draft with a pick in six of the seven rounds, including two selections in both Rounds 5 and 7.
- ▶ The event will begin in prime time on Thursday night, with Round 1 on April 23 starting at 7 p.m. CT.
- ▶ Rounds 2-3 also will be held in prime time, beginning on Friday, April 24, at 6 p.m. CT. Rounds 4-7 will complete the draft on Saturday, April 25, starting at 11 a.m. CT.

GUTEKUNST LEADS PACKERS IN NINTH DRAFT AS GM

GM **Brian Gutekunst** enters his 28th draft with the Packers and his ninth as the general manager.

- ▶ Since Gutekunst took over as GM in 2018, the Packers have gone 82-49-2, a .624 winning percentage that ranks No. 1 in the NFC and No. 4 in the NFL from 2018-25. Green Bay is one of six teams to make the playoffs in each of the last three seasons and is tied for No. 2 in the NFL with six postseason appearances in the past seven years (2019-25).
- ▶ Prior to the 2025 season, the Packers acquired DL **Micah Parsons** from the Dallas Cowboys in exchange for DL **Kenny Clark** and two first-round picks (2026-27). In his first season with Green Bay, Parsons earned first-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press*, was one of five finalists for the AP Defensive Player of the Year and was selected to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ Green Bay had six picks from the 2025 draft class play in a game as a rookie with five seeing action in 11-plus contests and two starting five-plus contests: WR **Matthew Golden** (five) and G/T **Anthony Belton** (seven). Four players also saw action in the playoffs with Belton starting.
- ▶ The 11-player class of 2024 saw nine players appear in a game, four play 13-plus games, seven play six-plus games and three record four-plus starts: LB **Edgerrin Cooper** (four), S **Javon Bullard** (11), S **Evan Williams** (six). Six players also played in the postseason with Cooper and Williams starting. Both Cooper and Williams were selected to the Pro Football Writers of America All-Rookie team. Cooper was the only player in the NFL in 2024 with 75-plus tackles, 13-plus tackles for a loss, three-plus sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and a forced fumble.
- ▶ Green Bay's rookie class combined to appear in 206 regular-season games in 2023, the most in a season in team history and the most

by any NFL team in 2023. Of the 13 selections in the 2023 draft class, 11 players saw action, including eight who played in 15-plus games. Six members of the 2023 draft class started at least four games as rookies, with WR **Jayden Reed** (13) and CB **Carrington Valentine** (12) leading the way. Reed and Valentine were joined by TEs **Luke Musgrave** and **Tucker Kraft** and WR **Dontayvion Wicks** as rookies who started in the 2023 postseason. Kraft posted the most receiving yards (1,551) and the second-most receptions (113) by a Packers tight end in his first three seasons (since 1970).

- ▶ Of the 11 players drafted in 2022, eight played in nine-plus games and six players combined to start 48 contests as rookies. The top three selections, LB **Quay Walker** (first Packer ILB to make PFWA's All-Rookie team since A.J. Hawk in 2006), DL **Devonte Wyatt** and WR **Christian Watson** combined to play in 47 games with 27 starts. Watson is one of only three players in team history to average 17.0-plus yards per catch and post 125-plus receptions in his first four NFL seasons (WRs Billy Howton and James Lofton). Green Bay's 2022 draft class also featured three offensive linemen (G **Sean Rhyan**, OL **Zach Tom**, T **Rasheed Walker**) who started every game for the Packers in 2024, the first trio of offensive linemen to all be selected in the same class and go on to start every game for that team in a season since Kansas City's draft class of 1974 had three linemen start every game for the Chiefs in 1981.
- ▶ In 2021, all nine of the players drafted by Green Bay appeared in a game with six playing in at least 13 as rookies (G **Royce Newman**, 17 / DL **T.J. Slaton**, 17 / WR **Amari Rodgers**, 16 / CB **Eric Stokes**, 16 / CB **Shemar Jean-Charles**, 14 / LB **Isaiah McDuffie**, 13).
- ▶ In 2020, Gutekunst drafted nine players overall, including trading up in the first round to select QB **Jordan Love**, who led the Packers to the playoffs in each of his first three seasons as the starter and was one of only three QBs in the NFL (Lamar Jackson, Matthew Stafford) to throw 20-plus TD passes and fewer than 12 INTs in each of the last three seasons (2023-25).
- ▶ In the 2019 draft, Gutekunst selected eight players overall, including LB **Rashan Gary** (No. 12) and G/T **Elgton Jenkins** (No. 44). Gary ranks No. 6 on the Packers all-time sack list (since 1982) and earned his first Pro Bowl selection in 2024. Jenkins was named to two Pro Bowls, becoming just the 11th Packers offensive lineman to be named to multiple Pro Bowls, according to Stathead.com.
- ▶ In his first draft as general manager in 2018, Gutekunst made a couple of trades involving first-round picks that resulted in the Packers selecting CB **Jaire Alexander** at No. 18 and gaining the No. 30 pick

in the 2019 draft. Alexander earned second-team AP All-Pro honors from in 2020 and 2022, joining Charles Woodson (four) and Herb Adderley (seven) as the only Packers cornerbacks to be named to multiple AP All-Pro teams. Alexander was also selected to the Pro Bowl in 2020, making him one of three CBs in franchise history to make the Pro Bowl in his first three seasons (Adderley, 1963, third season; Willie Buchanon, 1973, second season). Alexander earned his second Pro Bowl honor (2022) in his fifth NFL season, becoming the 13th defensive back in franchise history to be named to multiple Pro Bowls.

- ▶ Green Bay selected 11 players in Gutekunst's first draft as GM. The Packers had rookies play in a league-high 171 games in 2018 and account for 50 starts, the most for Green Bay since 2006 (66 starts).
- ▶ Gutekunst spent his first 13 seasons with Green Bay as a college scout, serving as an East Coast regional scout for two years (1999-2000) before switching to the Southeast region (2001-11).
- ▶ During his first 13 drafts with the Packers, Gutekunst was part of a personnel department that drafted several Pro Bowlers, including WR **Donald Driver** (seventh round, 1999), who is the team's all-time leading receiver, QB **Aaron Rodgers** (first round, 2005), who is the all-time franchise leader in passer rating, LB **A.J. Hawk** (first round, 2006), who is the leading tackler in franchise history, WR **Jordy Nelson** (second round, 2008), who is No. 4 in franchise history in receptions, and LB **Clay Matthews** (first round, 2009), who is the franchise leader in sacks.
- ▶ Gutekunst was promoted to director of college scouting in 2012, a position he served in through 2015. Over that time period, Green Bay selected T **David Bakhtiari** (fourth round, 2013), who was honored five times as an All-Pro by AP, Pro Bowl RB **Eddie Lacy** (second round, 2012), and WR **Davante Adams** (second round, 2014), who was selected to five straight Pro Bowls (2017-21) and was named first-team All-Pro by AP in 2020-21.
- ▶ In 2016-17, Gutekunst served as director of player personnel and those two drafts were highlighted by the addition of DL **Kenny Clark** (first round, 2016), who joined Henry Jordan (1960-61, 1963, 1966) as the only Packers defensive tackles to make three-plus Pro Bowls (2019, 2021 and 2023), and RB **Aaron Jones** (fifth round, 2017), who made the Pro Bowl in 2020.

- ▶ The last time Green Bay chose a player with the No. 52 pick was in 2006 when it selected WR **Greg Jennings** out of Western Michigan.

- ▶ While first-round choices certainly can be key players for a franchise, as the Packers have shown with Pro Bowl selections QB **Aaron Rodgers** (2005), DL **Kenny Clark** (2016), LB **A.J. Hawk** (2006), LB **Clay Matthews** (2009), DT **B.J. Raji** (2009), S **Ha Ha Clinton-Dix** (2014), CB **Jaire Alexander** (2018) and LB **Rashan Gary** (2019), and key contributors LB **Quay Walker** (2022), DL **Devonte Wyatt** (2022) and LB **Lukas Van Ness** (2023), second-round selections can prove to be just as valuable. WRs **Jordy Nelson** (2008) and **Randall Cobb** (2011) were both picked in the second round and became the first duo in NFL history to both have 90-plus receptions, 1,200-plus yards and 12-plus touchdown receptions in the same regular season (2014). Another second-round pick was WR **Davante Adams** (2014), who earned first-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2020 and 2021, the first Packers WR to receive first-team recognition since Antonio Freeman in 1998, and was selected to five straight Pro Bowls, joining James Lofton (six straight, 1980-85) as the only WRs in team history to be selected in five-plus consecutive seasons. Other second-round picks include G/T **Elgton Jenkins** (2019), who was only the second Packers guard to be selected to the PFWA All-Rookie team since 1974 (Daryn Colledge, 2006) and in 2020 became the first Green Bay offensive lineman to start a game at guard, center and tackle in the same season since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger, CB **Casey Hayward** (2012), who became the first CB in franchise history (since 1974) to be named to the All-Rookie Team by *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA. C **Josh Myers** (2021) started all 56 games he played in during his four seasons in Green Bay. In 2022, Green Bay traded up to draft WR **Christian Watson**, who is one of four players in team history with five-plus receiving TDs in three (or more) of his first four NFL seasons, joining WRs Don Hutson (four), Antonio Freeman (three) and Max McGee (three). In 2023, Green Bay selected TE **Luke Musgrave**, who tied the top mark by a tight end in team history for receptions (Bubba Franks, 34 in 2000) and WR **Jayden Reed**, who ranks No. 1 in the NFL since 2023 in passer rating when

targeted (126.8) among wide receivers with 100-plus targets. The Packers selected LB **Edgerrin Cooper** and S **Javon Bullard** in 2024 and T **Anthony Belton** in 2025, who combined to play in 43 games with 22 starts in their rookie seasons.

- ▶ The last time the Packers chose a player with the No. 84 pick in the draft was RB LeShon Johnson out of Northern Illinois in 1999.

- ▶ With 22 starters and a 53-man roster, selections in the third round often turn into significant contributors for a team. Examples are WR **James Jones** (2007), TE **Jermichael Finley** (2008), S **Morgan Burnett** (2010), LB **Kyler Fackrell** (2016) and TE **Tucker Kraft** (2023), who has posted the most receiving yards (1,551) and the second-most receptions (113) by a Packers tight end in his first three seasons (since 1970).

- ▶ The fourth and fifth rounds have also been a spot where the Packers have found starters. In 2024, Green Bay selected S **Evan Williams** (fourth round), who has played in 29 games with 21 starts and started both postseason contests in his first two years. In 2022, the Packers selected WR **Romeo Doubs** (fourth round), who was one of only three players in team history to post 40-plus catches, 400-plus receiving yards and three-plus receiving TDs in each of his first four NFL seasons, and OL **Zach Tom** (2022/fourth round), who has started 51 of the 55 games he has played in and three postseason contests. The fifth round was where Green Bay got Pro Bowl RB **Aaron Jones** (2017/fifth round), who registered the most games with 100-plus rushing yards and an average of 6.0-plus yards per attempt in team history (15). LB **Blake Martinez** (2016/fourth round) led the team in tackles for three straight seasons (2017-19). The Packers have found numerous Pro Bowl linemen in the fourth or fifth round over the years: G **Josh Sitton** (2008/fourth round), G **T.J. Lang** (2009/fourth round), five-time All-Pro T **David Bakhtiari** (2013/fourth round) and C **Corey Linsley** (2014/fifth round). Pro Bowl DT **Mike Daniels** (2012) was also drafted in the fifth round. Green Bay has also found key contributors in all three phases in the fourth and fifth rounds: DB **Micah Hyde** (2013/fifth), LB **Jake Ryan** (2015/fourth), DL **Dean Lowry** (2016/fourth), WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling** (2018/fifth) and DL **Colby Wooden** (2023/fourth).

- ▶ Green Bay has received contributions from several late-round picks over the years, including DT **Johnny Jolly** (2006/sixth round), LB **Desmond Bishop** (2007/sixth round), K **Mason Crosby** (2007/sixth), QB **Matt Flynn** (2008/seventh), LB **Brad Jones** (2009/seventh), RB **James Starks** (2010/sixth), DE **C.J. Wilson** (2010/seventh), LB **Sam Barrington** (2013/seventh). In recent years the Packers have selected a player in the sixth or seventh round that saw significant playing time. LS **Hunter Bradley** (2018/seventh) played in every game in his first three seasons, LB **Ty Summers** (2019/seventh) appeared in 46 contests from 2019-21, G **Jon Runyan** (2020/sixth) played in 67 regular-season games with 50 starts and started three of five postseason contests he played in over four years, LB **Isaiah McDuffie** (2021/sixth) has played in 80 games with 38 starts and appeared in five postseason games with two starts in his first five seasons, T **Rasheed Walker** (2022/seventh) played in every game over the past three seasons (2023-25) with 48 regular-season starts and four postseason starts, DL **Karl Brooks** (2023/sixth) and K **Anders Carlson** (2023/sixth) both played every game as rookies, and CB **Carrington Valentine** (2023/seventh) has played in 49 regular-season games with 30 starts and started all four postseason contests in his first three seasons.

A LOOK INTO THE PERSONNEL DEPARTMENT

General Manager **Brian Gutekunst** heads up a talented and experienced player personnel staff.

► Members of the personnel staff have spent months, if not years with some prospects, studying for the 2026 NFL Draft. They visit schools throughout the season, attending practices, dozens of games and pro days in the spring. In each area, they have formed relationships with high school and college coaches, trying to get a better idea of who the person is, not just the football prospect.
