PACKERS TRAVEL WEST TO PLAY THE SEAHAWKS

The Green Bay Packers go back on the road to play in Seattle against the Seahawks on Thursday night.

- It marks the Packers' second Thursday night game at Seattle (Week 1 in 2014).
- Including the postseason, it will be the seventh time the two teams have played since 2012.
- It will be the fifth consecutive season the two teams have played during the regular season, the longest streak in the series.
- Green Bay has won three straight over Seattle, including a 17-9 victory in Week 1 last season.
- It is the third time the Packers have played at the Seahawks in the month of November (1987, 2006).
- Thursday will be the last of three games the Packers will have played in a 12-day span.
- The Packers have scored 23-plus points in seven of their last eight road games they have played in the month of November.
- ▶ Green Bay will play its next two games (at Seattle and at Minnesota) in primetime. The Packers have played three primetime games so far this season, defeating the Chicago Bears, 24-23, in Week 1 and the San Francisco 49ers, 33-30, in Week 6, and losing at the New England Patriots, 31-17, in Week 9.

AGAINST THE NFC WEST

- ► Under McCarthy, Green Bay is 18-8 versus NFC West teams during the regular season. The Packers' .692 winning percentage ranks No. 5 in the NFL against the NFC West and Green Bay's 18 wins are tied for No. 1 (Minnesota) among teams outside the NFC West (pro-football-reference.com).
- Dating back to 2002, the Packers are 23-10 against the NFC West in the regular season. Green Bay's .697 winning percentage against the NFC West is No. 1 in the NFC and No. 3 in the NFL.
- The Packers' 23 wins against the NFC West since 2002 are the most in the NFL for a team outside the division.
- Green Bay has a plus-260 point differential against the NFC West since 2002, No. 2 in the NFL behind the Seattle Seahawks (plus-614).
- ▶ QB **Aaron Rodgers** has started 21 regular-season games against teams from the NFC West with the Packers winning 15 of those. Rodgers has thrown 40 touchdowns and nine interceptions in the 21 games, and his 104.7 passer rating ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** among active players against the NFC West since 2008 (min. 100 pass att.).
- Rodgers has recorded a passer rating of 100-plus in 13 regular-season games against the NFC West, including three of the past four.
- TE **Jimmy Graham** has totaled five TD receptions in the last four road games he has played against NFC West teams.
- Graham has played against NFC West teams 31 times (including postseason) and registered 14 TD receptions. According to Sportradar, he ranks No. 2 in receiving TDs against NFC West teams since 2010, trailing only Arizona Cardinals WR Larry Fitzgerald, who has 19 receiving TDs in 51 games.

WITH THE CALL

REGULAR-SEASON WEEK 11

- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. Wayne Larrivee (play-by-play) and twotime Packers Pro Bowler Larry McCarren (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 24th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 20th season of broadcasts together. In Week 1, they surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- Westwood One Sports will air the game across the country. Tom McCarthy (play-by-play) and Mike Holmgren (analyst) will call the action and Scott Graham will host pregame and halftime shows.

VERSATILE RUNNING GAME

Green Bay has used numerous running backs this season as part of a rushing attack that has improved each week. The Packers have posted 95-plus rushing yards in each of the last eight games, the longest streak in the league and the longest streak by Green Bay since 2014-15 (12 games), according to pro-football-reference.com.

- Green Bay is tied for No. 1 in the NFL this season in games with 95-plus rushing yards.
- The Packers have four straight 100-yard rushing games as a team on 25 or fewer carries, the longest streak in franchise history and in the league this season (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Green Bay ranks No. 1 in the NFL in average yards per rush this season:

- The Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in percentage of rushing plays that gain 10-plus yards (16.9) this season (Sportradar).
- Green Bay posted a season-high 195 rushing yards on 25 carries (7.8 avg.) in Week 10, just the third time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers recorded 195-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer carries (at St. Louis Cardinals, Sept. 29, 1985; at Chicago, Dec. 18, 2016).
- The Packers rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 3 at Washington, marking the fewest rushing attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133).

JONES JUMPS TO THE FRONT

RB Aaron Jones ranks No. 1 in the NFL in rushing average (min. 50 att.) this season:

Among running backs with 150-plus career attempts, Jones ranks No. 1 in NFL history with an average of 6.12 yards per carry.

Jones leads the NFL in percentage of rushing attempts that gain 10-plus yards (min. 50 carries), according to Sportradar:

- In Weeks 8-10, Jones became the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote in 1951 to have 75-plus rushing yards on 15 or fewer attempts in three straight games.
- Jones rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 15 carries (9.7 avg.) with a career-best two rushing TDs in Week 10 to become just the sixth Packer since 1950 to rush for 145-plus yards in a game on 15 or fewer carries and the first to accomplish the feat since Ahman Green had 15 carries for 163 yards vs. Dallas on Oct. 24, 2004.
- Jones' 67-yard run late in the first quarter in Week 10 was the longest of his career and the longest by a Packer since WR Randall Cobb's 67-yarder vs. Detroit on Oct. 6, 2013.
- ► In Week 10, Jones rushed for 96 yards on four carries (24.0 avg.) in the first quarter, the most rushing yards by a Packer in a first quarter since Green had 122 rushing yards vs. Detroit in the opening quarter on Sept. 9, 2001. Jones had 101 rushing yards in the first half, the most by a Packer since RB Ty Montgomery posted 123 yards on the ground in the first half at Chicago on Dec. 18, 2016.
- Jones had a career-high six runs of 10-plus yards in Week 10, most by a Packer since Ahman Green had six at Minnesota on Nov. 2, 2003.

- Green Bay posted 521 yards of total offense in both Weeks 5 and 6. It marked just the second time in team history that the Packers registered back-to-back 500-yard games (Nov. 27-Dec. 4, 1983). Green Bay tied an NFL record with two straight 520-plus-yard games.
- ► The Packers' two 500-yard games are tied for the second most in a season in team history (three in 1983) and are the most in a season since recording two in 2011.
- Green Bay is tied for the second-most games with 500 total net yards in the NFL this season:

► Green Bay has totaled the third-most net yards in team history through its first nine games dating back to 1940 (pro-football-reference.com):

The Packers have recorded 340-plus yards in all nine games this season, tied with Kansas City and the Los Angeles Rams for the league lead. The only other time the Packers have recorded 340-plus yards in each of the first nine games of a season was in 2011, according to pro-football-reference.com.

- Green Bay's streak of nine consecutive games with 340-plusyards is the longest current streak in the NFL (pro-football-reference.com).
- Rodgers has thrown for 2,741 yards this season, the third most of by a Packer (since 1950) through the first nine games of a season behind the 2,619 he threw for in 2011 and the 2,757 thrown by Brett Favre in 2007.

BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 52-man roster that is composed of 24 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- Of the 52 players on Green Bay's roster, 28 of them (53.8 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has seven players that were drafted in the first round, including six that were selected by the Packers.
- Green Bay has 37 players on the roster that were draft picks (71.2 percent), including 20 players that were selected in the first three rounds (38.5 percent).
- Over a third of the players (18 of 52, 34.6 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ► Of the 52 players on the roster, 41 of them (78.8 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Nov. 15) and 28 players (53.8 percent) are 24 years old or younger.
- ► The Packers have nine players that have made at least one Pro Bowl, with six of those players being draft picks of Green Bay (Davante Adams, David Bakhtiari, Randall Cobb, Mike Daniels, Clay Matthews, Aaron Rodgers).
- ► Of the 52 players on the roster, 37 began their pro careers with the Packers (71.2 percent).
- Over half the roster consists of players with experience ranging from rookie to three years (33 of 52, 63.5 percent).

MIKE McCARTHY...Is in his 13th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Led Green Bay to its eighth consecutive playoff appearance in 2016, tied for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history. Has led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 11 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ► Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that span; Packers led the league in scoring in 2014.
- Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ► Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

PETE CARROLL...Is in his ninth year as the Seahawks' eighth head coach.

- Guided the Seahawks to a win in Super Bowl XLVIII with the youngest Super Bowl-winning roster in NFL history (26 years, 162 days).
- Built a defense that became just the fourth in league annals to lead the league in points and yards allowed in consecutive years (2013-14).
- Has guided the Seahawks to the divisional round in six of his eight seasons as coach, winning two NFC Championships and one Super Bowl, while claiming the No. 1 seed in the NFC twice.
- ► Coached Southern California to back-to-back national titles in 2003 and 2004, maintaining the No. 1 ranking throughout the 2004 season.

THE PACKERS-SEAHAWKS SERIES

- ► For a span of eight head-to-head meetings from 1996-2008, Mike Holmgren was the head coach for one of the teams.
- Of the three postseason matchups between the teams, only the Packers' 42-20 win in 2007 NFC Divisional Playoff was decided in regulation.
- ► Since Seattle's shift to the NFC due to realignment in 2002, the two teams have met 13 times (including playoffs). They met in six of seven seasons from 2003-09 and matched up six times between 2012-17.
- ► Seattle's only victory in Green Bay came on Nov. 1, 1999, when the Seahawks won 27-7.
- ► The Packers are 11-0 against Seattle when scoring 25-plus points.

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

Packers TE Jimmy Graham played for the Seahawks for three seasons and twice earned Pro Bowl recognition (2016-17)...Green Bay senior advisor to football operations Ted Thompson spent 2000-04 as Seattle's vice president of football operations...Packers associate head coach/linebackers Winston Moss played the final three seasons (1995-97) of his career in Seattle and started his coaching career with the Seahawks in 1998...Green Bay defensive coordinator Mike Pettine spent the 2017 season as a consultant for Seattle ... Seahawks QB Brett Hundley was drafted by the Packers in the fifth round of the 2015 NFL Draft, and spent three seasons with the club...Seattle executive vice president/general manager John Schneider was with the Packers for 13 years as a personnel intern (1992), scout (1993-96), personnel analyst to the general manager (2002-07) and director of football operations (2008-09)...Schneider worked under Thompson in Seattle in 2000 and attended Abbot Pennings High in De Pere, Wis. ...Schneider and Packers executive vice president/director of football operations Russ Ball worked together with the Washington Redskins in 2001...Green Bay head coach Mike McCarthy, special teams coordinator Ron Zook and general manager Brian Gutekunst worked with Schneider in Kansas City (1997-99)...McCarthy also coached alongside Seattle offensive coordinator Brian Schottenheimer and offensive line coach Mike Solari in Kansas City...Solari was the assistant offensive line coach for Green Bay in 2015...Seattle assistant defensive line coach Jethro Franklin coached the Packers' defensive line from 2000-04...Seahawks assistant strength and conditioning coach Mondray Gee coached in Green Bay from 2008-09...Seattle running backs coach Chad Morton was the Packers' coaching administrator in 2009 and special teams assistant from 2010-13...McCarthy coached in New Orleans in 2000 when Morton played for the Saints...Seahawks QB Russell Wilson played one season (2011) at the University of Wisconsin...Green Bay CB Kevin King (2013-16) played at the University of Washington...Seattle head coach Pete Carroll coached Packers LBs Clay Matthews (2005-08) and LB Nick Perry (2009) while serving as head coach at Southern California...A number of other Seahawks coaches also coached Matthews and Perry at USC, including defensive coordinator Ken Norton, Jr. and head strength and conditioning coach Chris Carlisle...Packers offense - run game coordinator/offensive line coach James Campen played for the Saints for two seasons while Seahawks associate head coach Carl Smith was the New Orleans offensive coordinator...Seahawks OLB Barkevious Mingo played in Cleveland while Pettine was head coach of the Browns... Mingo also played alongside Packers LB Antonio Morrison in Indianapolis in 2017...Green Bay T/G Byron Bell played with Seattle CB Kalan Reed in Tennessee...Bell also teamed with Seahawks TE Ed Dickson in Carolina... Seattle DE Dion Jordan played in Miami while Packers offensive coordinator Joe Philbin was the Dolphins' head coach...Schottenheimer also coached Zook at Florida (1994-95) and Pettine in New York with the Jets (2009-11)...Green Bay defensive assistant Scott McCurley played with Seahawks assistant offensive line coach Brennan Carroll at the University of Pittsburgh from 1999-2001...Seattle quality control/defense coach Tom Donatell was a defensive graduate assistant at UCLA while Packers DT Kenny Clark was a Bruin...Collegiately, Donatell was a linebacker at lowa, where he teamed with Packers DL Mike Daniels and T Bryan Bulaga...Green Bay wide receivers coach David Raih was also an offensive graduate assistant for the Hawkeyes at the time...Packers C Corey Linsley and Seahawks TE Nick Vannet played together at Ohio State.

LAST MEETING, REGULAR SEASON

Sept. 10, 2017; Packers won, 17-9, Lambeau Field

- ▶ Packers QB Aaron Rodgers completed 28 of 42 passes for 311 yards, a TD and an INT.
- ► Green Bay WR Jordy Nelson tallied seven receptions for 79 yards, including a 32-yard TD catch. Nelson surpassed 500 career catches in the contest, becoming just the fourth player in team history (WRs Donald Driver, Sterling Sharpe and James Lofton) to reach that mark.
- ► The Packers did not allow a TD and dominated the time of possession, 39:13 to 20:47.

AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 12 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

►McCarthy's 121 regular-season wins in his first 12 years as a head coach (2006-17) are No. 4 in NFL history (according to the Elias Sports Bureau):

- McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his first 12 seasons, he won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.
- ►With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

- ► The 135 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the second most in the NFL since 2006 (New England, 171).
- In Week 6 of the 2017 season, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason), Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the sixth-most wins by a head coach through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.
- McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).
- McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- ►McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the most by a coach in franchise history.
- McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a franchise record (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (17) and Andy Reid (12) have more 10-plus-win seasons.
- McCarthy is the only coach in franchise history to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).
- McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowlwinning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.
- Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 135-82-2 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .621 winning percentage that ranks No. 3 among current NFL head coaches (minimum 100 games):

- ► It was the sixth 400-yard passing game for Rodgers, **a franchise record**. No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).
- Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games, the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.
- ► Rodgers tied Manning for the fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards, trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Dan Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ►Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt.

RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued this season. It is the first time in his career that he has registered 10-plus touchdowns and one or fewer interceptions in the first nine games of the season (17/1). He joins Drew Brees (21/1) as the **only players in the NFL this season** with 10-plus TDs and one or fewer INTs, according to pro-football-reference.com.

- ► In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ► Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ► Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ► With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Drew Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ► Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ► In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).

ASCENDING ADAMS

Despite playing in just 14 games in 2017, WR **Davante Adams** led the Packers in all three major receiving categories with 74 receptions (one shy of career-best 75 from 2016) for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 touchdowns (**tied for No. 2 in the NFL**), resulting in his first appearance in the Pro Bowl.

- ► Adams' nine TD receptions this season are the third most through nine games by a Packer (since 1950) behind only WR Billy Howton (11 in 1956) and WR Randall Cobb (10 in 2014).

- ► The Packers did not allow a TD in Week 4 and Week 10. The last time Green Bay had two-plus games in a season with no TDs allowed was 2010 (three games). The Packers are one of only three teams in the NFL to not allow a TD in two games this season (Baltimore and Indianapolis, two each).
- Green Bay's defense ranks No. 7 in the league in third-down defense (36.6 percent). The Packers have not allowed a team to register a conversion percentage of higher than 50.0 in a game this season.
- The Packers rank No. 3 in the NFL in second-half points allowed (82) this season, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- Green Bay ranks No. 6 in the NFL in second-half points scored (126) this season.
- The Packers had three players record 100-yard receiving games in Week 6 (WR Davante Adams, 10-132; TE Jimmy Graham, 5-104; WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, 103), just the second time in franchise history (per Elias Sports Bureau) that Green Bay has had three 100-yard receivers in a single game (Oct. 12, 1980, at Tampa Bay with RB Eddie Lee Ivery, TE Paul Coffman and WR Aundra Thompson).
- ►QB Aaron Rodgers ranks near the top of the NFL this season in numerous fourth-quarter passing categories (min. 50 pass att.):

KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started all 24 games he has played in since the start of the 2017 season.

- Clark is **tied for No. 7** among players listed as defensive tackles and defensive lineman with five sacks this season (Sportradar).
- He ranks No. 2 on the team in QB hits (six) this season.
- Clark is tied for No. 2 in the NFL with two defensive fumble recoveries this season. He forced and recovered a fumble of Bills QB Josh Allen in Week 4. In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB Nick Perry on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ► In Week 8, Clark tied his career high with two sacks against the Rams. Dating back to 2016, he ranks No. 2 on the Packers in multi-sack games (Nick Perry, three), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ► In Week 3, he matched his career high in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).
- ► The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December in a single season (since 1982).

- ►The Packers are the only team in the league to register two games this season with 50-plus sack yards (64 vs. Buffalo in Week 4, 50 vs. Miami in Week 10). It is tied for the second most in a season in team history (three games in 1978) and it is the first time Green Bay has had two games since 1998.
- ▶ The Packers have recorded 19.0 sacks in the second half this season, the most in the NFL, according to Sportradar.
- ► Green Bay has 31 sacks on the season, tied for the fifth most by the Packers (1965 and 2006) in the team's first nine games dating back to 1963 (34 in 2001, 33 in 1966, 1976 and 1998).
- ►The Packers recorded six sacks against the Dolphins in Week 10, with six different players recording a sack. It marks Green Bay's second game this season with six-plus sacks (seven vs. Buffalo in Week 4), tied for No. 1 in the NFL.

CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DL **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- Leads the team in QB hits (six) and is tied for the team lead in QB pressures (11) this season.
- After being selected as an alternate three straight seasons (2015-17), he was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- ► He finished No. 4 on the team with five sacks in 2017, the third-most sacks of his career (6.5 in 2013, 5.5 in 2014), and recorded a career-best 72 tackles.
- Daniels has two sacks this season. He has recorded at least four sacks in five seasons since 2013, which is tied for No. 1 in the NFL among defensive tackles (according to pro-football-reference.com):

- Crosby has been named NFC Special teams Player of the Week a teamrecord seven times in his career, including this season after hitting a game-winning field goal in Week 6.
- Crosby ranks No. 9 in the NFL in scoring this season with 77 points.
- Crosby has recorded a game-winning field goal in each of the last three seasons (2016 at Chicago, 2017 vs. Cincinnati, 2018 vs. San Francisco).
- ► In Week 4, Crosby hit two 52-yard field goals, joining Ryan Longwell (at Atlanta, Nov. 13, 2005) as the only Packers to make two 50-plus-yard field goals in a regular-season game. It was the first time two field goals of 50-plus yards had been made by a kicker at Lambeau Field. Crosby had previously connected on two 50-plus field goals (56, 51) in the 2016 NFC Divisional Playoff win at Dallas.
- Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the singlegame franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- Crosby has played in 185 straight games for the Packers, the third most all-time behind only QB Brett Favre (255) and T Forrest Gregg (187).
- Crosby passed Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

- ► The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach Mike McCarthy's tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ►Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only seven of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records at or above .500.

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Miami Dolphins in Week 6 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 339 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ► The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ► Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver). Green Bay is 4-0-1 at home this season.
- Head Coach Mike McCarthy stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 73-26-2 (.733) at home in the regular season since 2006, No. 3 in the NFL.
- Since Ron Wolf and Mike Holmgren began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 98th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 19 by the National Football League.

PE SHEET

- ► For the second consecutive season, the Packers opened the season at home and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- In Week 1, Green Bay hosted Chicago on Sunday night, marking the 13th consecutive regular season that the Packers and Bears have squared off in primetime.
- It was the first time Green Bay opened the season at home against the Bears since playing them on Sunday night in Week 1 of the 2009 season, a 21-15 win for the Packers.
- Green Bay hosted Minnesota in Week 2, marking the first time since 2012 that the Packers played two home games to open the season. It also marked just the third time (2003, 2008) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ► The Packers' first road contest was at the Redskins, marking Green Bay's first September visit to Washington.
- ► The Packers returned home to take on the Buffalo Bills in Week 4. It was the second-coldest September game (49 degrees at kickoff) at Lambeau Field (since 1959) behind only the contest between the Packers and Washington Redskins on Sept. 24, 2001 (46 degrees).
- ► In Week 5 they traveled to Detroit to play the Lions.
- ▶ In Week 6, Green Bay hosted the San Francisco 49ers on *Monday Night Football*. It was the fifth time in the last six seasons the Packers have played at Lambeau Field on *MNF*. The temperature at kickoff was 37 degrees, the second-coldest October game at Lambeau Field (since 1959) behind only the contest between the Packers and Minnesota Vikings on Oct. 26, 1980 (36 degrees).
- After the second Week 7 bye for Green Bay in the last four seasons (2015), the Packers will play four of five games on the road.
- Green Bay made its first trip to the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 1990 to play the Rams.
- In Week 9, the Packers traveled to the other side of the country to play the Patriots on Sunday night.
- ► It was the second consecutive time the Packers and Patriots faced off on a Sunday night in New England (2010).
- ▶Green Bay returned home to take on the Miami Dolphins before a quick turnaround to play the Seahawks, marking the Packers' second Thursday night game at Seattle (Week 1 in 2014). Including the post-season, it will be the seventh time Green Bay and Seattle have played since 2012.
- November finishes with a trip to play the Vikings on Sunday night, marking the sixth straight season that the teams have met in a prime-time game.
- ▶Green Bay opens the final month of the regular season against Arizona, only the second time the Cardinals have played at Lambeau Field in December (Dec. 21, 1969).
- The Packers will play back-to-back home games for only the second time in 2018 when they host the Atlanta Falcons in Week 14. It will be the fourth matchup (including postseason) between Green Bay and Atlanta in the last three seasons.
- The Packers end the season with two road games in the final three weeks for the seventh straight year.
- In Week 15, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place it has won in the regular season each of the last seven years. The Packers have scored 30-plus points at Chicago in four of the last five matchups (33, 38, 31, 30, 23).
- ► The Packers' road slate will finish up with a game at the New York Jets, the third December game at the Jets in team history (1981, 2002). Three of the last four games at New York have been decided by single digits, including one game that went to overtime.
- Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the third straight year and the fourth time in the last five seasons. Green Bay has an 18-6 overall mark (.750) and a 10-2 home record (.833) against Detroit under Head Coach Mike McCarthy.

- Despite missing a game, was No. 2 on the team with 66 receptions in 2017. It was the fourth consecutive season he registered 60-plus receptions
- Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
 Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl. ► His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team his-
- torv Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2.342 combined
- net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

LT David Bakhtiari, 6th Year, Colorado, D4a-13

- Earned second-team All-Pro honors from The Associated Press in 2016 and 2017, joining Forrest Gregg (1959-60, 1962-67) as the only Green Bay tackles to be named to an *AP* All-Pro team in consecutive seasons.
- Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 during the 2017 season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

LG Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13

- ► Has played in 71 regular-season games for Green Bay, with all but three of his 42 starts (LT in Week 4-5 of 2017, RG in Week 13 of 2015) taking place at LG.
- Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.

- Originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of New Mexico by the Carolina Panthers in 2011. After four seasons (2011-14) with the Panthers, spent two years with the Tennessee Titans (2015-16) and a season with the Dallas Cowboys (2017)
- Played in 90 games with 74 starts from 2011-17, and started all three postseason contests he appeared in.
- Played in 37 games with 36 starts at New Mexico, starting 24 games at LT over his final two seasons after making 12 starts at RT as a sophomore.

RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10

- ► Has played in 94 career regular-season games with 90 starts at right tackle.
- Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in
- 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season. ►Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.

- From 2015-17, he played for the Seattle Seahawks but entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2010 as a third-round pick (No. 95 overall) and played five seasons (2010-14) for the Saints.

WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14

- Became the first player in franchise history to record five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season.
- Recorded 130-plus receiving yards in three consecutive games (Weeks 5-6, 8), joining WR James Lofton (1984) as the players in franchise history to do so, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- Registered the fourth-most receptions (237) and receiving touchdowns (26) by a Green Bay player in their first four seasons (2014-17) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74 receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).
- ►With 12 receiving touchdowns in 2016, joined Jordy Nelson (2014, 2016), Antonio Freeman (1997-98), Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catchés in consecutive seasons.

WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, Rookie, South Florida, D5c-18

- Leads the team with 17.5 yards per reception (min. 10 receptions)

QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05

That was certainly the case in a 31-17 loss at the Washington Redskins on Sunday, when Green Bay fell behind 14-0 and trailed 28-10 at halftime after giving up TD drives of 74, 75, 79 and 98 yards. Among McCarthy's laments were his team's 11 penalties for 115 yards - including three for pass interference on one drive - and the most-discussed among those flags was linebacker Clay Matthews' for roughing the passer after he sacked Alex Smith late in the third

quarter. A week after gaining 20 yards on 11 attempts, Adrian Peterson went for 120 yards on 19 runs with a pair of 2-yard TDs. Smith went 12 for 20 for 220 yards. He also had his streak of 156 consecutive passes without an interception, the longest active run in the lague, end in the second quarter. Safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix made the pick when Jordan Reed went one way and Smith threw another. Rodgers, who was 27 for 44 for 265 yards passing with two touchdowns - of 64 yards to Geronimo Allison and 2 yards to Davante Adams - said he expects to start against Buffalo after again dealing with an injured left knee, which he hurt in Week 1. He wore a bulky brace on his left knee against Washington, and he came up hobbling a bit after some plays where he moved around in the pocket or

scrambled for a gain. Green Bay's receivers had problems with drops, plus Randall Cobb was stripped of the ball by Fabian Moreau - Josh Norman recovered the fumble - after a completion with about 5½ minutes remaining in the fourth quarter. The Packers' ground game was limited to 15 carries for 87 yards by running backs.

12 Aaron Rodgers, QB, 14th Year, California

• Ranks No. 1 in NFL history (min. 1,500 attempts) in career passer rating (103.5), interception percentage (1.50) and TD/INT ratio (4.18, 330/79).

Has posted six seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16) with 500-plus passing attempts and eight or fewer INTs, the most in NFL history ahead of Patriots QB Tom Brady (four), Redskins QB Alex Smith (two) and nine QBs (one).
Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.

 Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), tied with Saints QB Drew Brees for the most in NFL history.

• Is one of only three QBs in NFL annals with 40,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway).

• Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).

• In 151 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 54 games with 300-plus passing yards (tied for No. 4 in the NFL over that span), 90 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 83 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).

• Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in six of the last nine seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16).

• In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and four of the top six for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016).

►Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15): Became the first QB in team history to post back-to-back 400-yard passing games as he connected on 25 of 46 attempts for 425 vards and two TDs with no INTs for a 100.4 rating... Became the first QB in NFL history to register back-to-back 400-yard passing games with no interceptions...It marked his sixth career 400-yard game, with no other QB in team annals posting more than one 400-yard effort...Part of an offense that featured three 100-vard receivers (Adams. 132; TE Jimmy Graham, 104; WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, 103) for just the second time in franchise history (Oct. 12, 1980, at Tampa Bay)... Completed two passes of 50-plus yards (60-yarder to Valdes-Scantling and 54-varder to Graham), matching his career high...With the Packers trailing, 30-23, with three minutes remaining, led the offense on a fourplay, 58-yard drive that took just 1:05 and was capped off with his 16-yard TD pass to Adams...After a CB Kevin King interception gave the offense the ball back with 1:07, led the offense on a 10-play, 81-yard drive that was capped off with Crosby's 27-yard game-winning FG as time expired... The final drive included a 21-yard scramble up the middle by Rodgers and back-to-back 19-vard completions to WR Equanimeous St. Brown and

Adams down to the San Francisco 9 to set up Crosby's FG...It marked his fifth straight game with 40-plus passing attempts, topping Don Majkowski (four-game streak in 1989) for the longest in team history.

► At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28): Threw for 286 yards and a TD on 18-of-30 passing (60.0 pct.) with no INTs (102.9 rating), his third straight game with zero INTs...Matched his career best (six previous times) with three completions of 40-plus yards, including a 40-yard TD pass to Valdes-Scantling midway through the fourth quarter that gave the Packers a 27-26 lead...The pass to Valdes-Scantling capped Green Bay's second straight five-play, 75-yard TD drive, with both drives taking less than three minutes each.

Voted first-team All-Southeastern Conference by the coaches three times (2014, 2016-17).
