## WITH THE CALL

NBC will broadcast the game to a national audience. Play-by-play man **Al Michaels** joins analyst **Cris Collinsworth** in the booth with **Michele Tafoya** reporting from the sidelines.



- Milwaukee's WTMJ (620 AM), airing Green Bay games since November 1929, heads up the Packers Radio Network that is made up of 50 stations in four states. **Wayne Larrivee** (play-by-play) and two-time Packers Pro Bowler **Larry McCarren** (analyst) call the action. McCarren first joined the team's broadcasts in 1995 and enters his 24th season calling Packers games. After originally being paired together in 1999, McCarren and Larrivee enter their 20th season of broadcasts together. In Week 1, they surpassed Jim Irwin and Max McGee for the most regular-season and postseason games broadcast for the Packers.
- The broadcast is also available on Sirius Satellite Radio (WTMJ feed).
- Westwood One Sports will air the game on radio across the country. **Kevin Kugler** (play-by-play) and **Jason Taylor** (analyst) will call the action, with **Scott Graham** hosting the pregame and halftime shows.

## PACKERS FACE DIVISION FOE VIKINGS ON THE ROAD

The Green Bay Packers play the last of four road games in a five-game stretch when they face the Minnesota Vikings on Sunday night.



- It is the sixth straight season that the teams have met in a prime-time game.
- Green Bay has won five of the last eight games at Minnesota.
- Of the past 32 regular-season meetings between the teams, 21 of those games have been decided by seven points or less, including a tie in the first meeting this season in Week 2.
- They have split the season series two of the past three years.
- The Packers have a 28-28 record in away games against the Vikings.
- It is the fourth time since 2010 that Green Bay will play at Minnesota in November, with the Packers winning the previous three (2010, 2014, 2015).
- Through 116 meetings, which includes two postseason contests (1-1), the Packers hold a 60-53-3 edge over the Vikings in the all-time series.
- Green Bay has had five games decided by three points or less this season, with a record of 2-2-1 in those contests.
- The Packers have scored 22-plus points in eight of 10 games played this season, tied for the fifth most in the NFL.
- Green Bay has scored 23-plus points in eight of their last nine road games they have played in the month of November.
- The Packers have played four prime-time games so far this season, defeating the Chicago Bears, 24-23, in Week 1 and the San Francisco 49ers, 33-30, in Week 6, and losing at the New England Patriots, 31-17, in Week 9 and at the Seattle Seahawks, 27-29, last week.

## RODGERS AND THE VIKINGS

- Including the postseason, Green Bay is 12-7-1 against Minnesota with **Aaron Rodgers** as the starting quarterback, and has won or tied 12 of the last 16 contests.
- In 20 games as the starter against the Vikings (including playoffs), Rodgers has completed 432 of 632 passes (68.4 percent) for 5,109 yards, 41 TDs and six INTs with a passer rating of 110.4. His passer rating is the second highest of any opposing starting quarterback (min. 100 att.) vs. Minnesota (Kurt Warner, 112.4), according to Sportradar.
- Rodgers has recorded a 100-plus passer rating in 12 of his 20 starts against the Vikings, including the postseason.
- Rodgers has recorded seven games with a passer rating of 130-plus against Minnesota, the most in NFL history against the Vikings.
- In the last 11 games versus Minnesota (including playoffs), Rodgers has thrown 21 touchdowns and two interceptions.
- Rodgers is the only player to have four games with four-plus touchdown passes with zero interceptions against the Vikings. No other quarterback has more than two.

► Under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**, Green Bay is 62-35-1 in regular-season games 9-16, a .638 winning percentage that ranks in the top five in the NFL since 2006, according to pro-football-reference.com:

### EFFECTIVE RUNNING GAME

Green Bay has used numerous running backs this season as part of a rushing attack that has improved each week. The Packers have posted 95-plus rushing yards in eight of the last nine games.

- Green Bay is **tied for No. 1 in the NFL** this season in games with 95-plus rushing yards (eight).
- The Packers recorded four straight 100-yard rushing games as a team on 25 or fewer carries (Week 6, Weeks 8-10), the **longest streak in franchise history** and in the league this season (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- Green Bay ranks **No. 2 in the NFL** in average yards per rush this season:

- The Packers rank **No. 3 in the NFL** in percentage of rushing plays that gain 10-plus yards (15.9) this season (Sportradar).
- Green Bay posted a season-high 195 rushing yards on 25 carries (7.8 avg.) in Week 10, just the third time since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger that the Packers recorded 195-plus rushing yards on 25 or fewer carries (at St. Louis Cardinals, Sept. 29, 1985; at Chicago, Dec. 18, 2016).
- The Packers rushed for 100 yards on 17 carries (5.9 avg.) in Week 3 at Washington, marking the fewest rushing attempts by Green Bay in a 100-yard rushing game since Oct. 18, 2015, vs. San Diego (17-133).

### JONES JUMPS TO THE FRONT

► RB **Aaron Jones** ranks **No. 1 in the NFL** in rushing average (min. 55 att.) this season:

- Among running backs with 150-plus career attempts, Jones ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** with an average of 5.95 yards per carry.

- In Weeks 8-10, Jones became the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote in 1951 to have 75-plus rushing yards on 15 or fewer attempts in three straight games.
- Jones rushed for a career-high 145 yards on 15 carries (9.7 avg.) with a career-best two rushing TDs in Week 10 to become just the sixth Packer since 1950 to rush for 145-plus yards in a game on 15 or fewer carries and the first to accomplish the feat since RB Ahman Green had 15 carries for 163 yards vs. Dallas on Oct. 24, 2004.
- Jones' 67-yard run late in the first quarter in Week 10 was the longest of his career and the longest by a Packer since WR Randall Cobb's 67-yarder vs. Detroit on Oct. 6, 2013.
- In Week 10, Jones rushed for 96 yards on four carries (24.0 avg.) in the first quarter, the most rushing yards by a Packer in a first quarter since Green had 122 rushing yards vs. Detroit in the opening quarter on Sept. 9, 2001. Jones had 101 rushing yards in the first half, the most by a Packer since RB Ty Montgomery posted 123 yards on the ground in the first half at Chicago on Dec. 18, 2016.
- Jones had a career-high six runs of 10-plus yards in Week 10, the most by a Packer since Green had six at Minnesota on Nov. 2, 2003.

- ▶ Green Bay posted 521 yards of total offense in both Weeks 5 and 6. It marked just the second time in team history that the Packers registered back-to-back 500-yard games (Nov. 27-Dec. 4, 1983). Green Bay tied an NFL record with two straight 520-plus-yard games.
- ▶ The Packers' two 500-yard games are tied for the second most in a season in team history (three in 1983) and are the most in a season since recording two in 2011.
- ▶ Green Bay is tied for the third-most games with 500 total net yards in the NFL this season:

- ▶ The Packers have recorded 340-plus yards in all 10 games this season, **tied for No. 1 in the NFL**. The only other time the Packers have recorded 340-plus yards in each of the first 10 games of a season was in 2011, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ Green Bay's streak of 10 consecutive games with 340-plus yards is the longest current streak in the NFL (pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown for 3,073 yards this season, the **second most by a Packer (since 1950) through the first 10 games of a season** behind the 3,168 he threw for in 2011.

### BREAKING DOWN THE ROSTER

The Packers have a 53-man roster that is composed of 25 offensive players, 25 defensive players and three specialists.

- ▶ Of the 53 players on Green Bay's roster, 29 of them (54.7 percent) were draft picks of the Packers. Green Bay has seven players that were drafted in the first round, including six that were selected by the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay has 38 players on the roster that were draft picks (71.7 percent), including 20 players that were selected in the first three rounds (37.7 percent).
- ▶ Over a third of the players (18 of 53, 34.0 percent) on Green Bay's roster entered the league as a sixth-round or seventh-round pick or as an undrafted player.
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 40 of them (75.5 percent) are 28 years old or younger (as of Nov. 25) and 28 players (52.8 percent) are 24 years old or younger.
- ▶ The Packers have nine players that have made at least one Pro Bowl, with six of those players being draft picks of Green Bay (Davante Adams, David Bakhtiari, Randall Cobb, Mike Daniels, Clay Matthews, Aaron Rodgers).
- ▶ Of the 53 players on the roster, 38 began their pro careers with the Packers (71.7 percent).
- ▶ Over half the roster consists of players with experience ranging from rookie to three years (34 of 53, 64.2 percent).

**MIKE MCCARTHY**...Is in his 13th year as the Packers' 14th head coach.

- ▶ Led Green Bay to its eighth consecutive playoff appearance in 2016, tied for the fourth-longest streak in NFL history. Has led the team to nine playoff appearances in the last 11 years (2007, 2009-16).
- ▶ Ranks second in franchise history in total victories, trailing only Curly Lambeau.
- ▶ Guided the Packers to top-10 finishes in scoring in eight straight seasons (2007-14), joining the Patriots as the only other team to accomplish the feat over that span; Packers led the league in scoring in 2014.
- ▶ Reached the 100-win plateau faster than any active NFL head coach, needing just 155 games.
- ▶ Joined Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl title with a win over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

**MIKE ZIMMER**...Is in his fifth year as the Vikings' 9th head coach.

- ▶ Led Minnesota to a record-setting 2017 campaign that saw the Vikings go 13-3, win the NFC North title and advance to the NFC Championship Game.
- ▶ After inheriting the No. 31 defense in the league in 2014, guided the Minnesota defense to the top ranking in both yards allowed and points allowed in 2017.
- ▶ The 2017 division title marked Zimmer's second in four years after piloting the Vikings to an 11-5 record and an NFC North crown in 2015.
- ▶ A longtime defensive coordinator prior to taking the Minnesota job, coached four top-10 defensive units in Cincinnati (2009, 2011-13) and three in Dallas (2001, 2003, 2005).

### THE PACKERS-VIKINGS SERIES

- ▶ The Packers began the series with six straight wins before Minnesota rattled off 22 victories in 32 contests from 1964-79.
- ▶ Green Bay started a run of its own in 1979 that generated 16 wins over 21 games and lasted until 1990.
- ▶ Since 2000, the Packers are 23-14-2 (.615) versus the Vikings.
- ▶ In the two Wild Card playoff contests between the franchises, Green Bay and Minnesota have each scored 41 total points and won a game by 14 points.
- ▶ The 29-29 tie in the most recent game between these clubs was the eighth OT contest in the series. The Vikings hold a 4-1-3 advantage in OT games.

Sept. 16, 2018, Lambeau Field, Packers and Vikings tied, 29-29

- ▶ Packers K Mason Crosby tied his career high and matched the single-game franchise record with five made field goals.
- ▶ Vikings QB Kirk Cousins completed 35 of 48 passes for 425 yards, four TDs and one INT.
- ▶ Minnesota WRs Adam Thielen (131) and Stefon Diggs (128) both surpassed 100 yards receiving in the game.
- ▶ The result was just the third tie between the teams in the 58-year history of the series, and it was Green Bay's first tie since 2013, also against the Vikings at Lambeau Field.

### AT THE HELM

Having led Green Bay to the playoffs in nine of his first 12 seasons as head coach, **Mike McCarthy** is joined by Vince Lombardi and Mike Holmgren as the only coaches to guide the Packers to a Super Bowl win with a victory over Pittsburgh in Super Bowl XLV.

► McCarthy's 121 regular-season wins in his first 12 years as a head coach (2006-17) are **No. 4 in NFL history** (according to the Elias Sports Bureau):

► McCarthy guided the Packers to a franchise-record fourth consecutive division title in 2014. In his first 12 seasons, he won six division titles, tying Lombardi for the second most in franchise history.

► With a win at Tampa Bay in Week 16 of the 2014 season, McCarthy passed Lombardi for the No. 2 spot in team history as far as overall victories:

► The 135 overall wins are the most in the NFC and the **third most in the NFL** since 2006 (New England, 175 / Pittsburgh, 139).

► In Week 6 of the 2017 season, McCarthy recorded his 200th career game as a head coach (including the postseason). Having compiled 128 victories, he tied Bud Grant and Chuck Noll for the **sixth-most wins by a head coach** through 200 games: Don Shula, 149 / Joe Gibbs, 138 / George Halas, 134 / Tony Dungy, 130 / Curly Lambeau, 130.

► McCarthy reached 100 career wins (including playoffs) in just his 155th game. He was the fastest to reach 100 wins in the NFL since George Seifert in 1996 (132 games).

► McCarthy recorded his third regular season with 12-plus wins in 2014 (2007, 2011), passing Lambeau (1929, 1931), Lombardi (1962, 1966), Holmgren (1996-97) and Mike Sherman (2001-02) for the most by a coach in franchise history.

► McCarthy has guided the Packers to five seasons with 11-plus wins (2007, 2009, 2011-12, 2014), passing Lombardi (1961-63, 1966) and Holmgren (1995-98) for the **most by a coach in franchise history**.

► McCarthy's eight regular seasons with 10-plus wins are a **franchise record** (since 1921). Among current NFL head coaches, only Bill Belichick (17) and Andy Reid (12) have more 10-plus-win seasons.

► McCarthy is the **only coach in franchise history** to post three or more consecutive 10-win seasons twice in his career (2009-12, 2014-16).

► McCarthy joined Pittsburgh's Bill Cowher (2005) as the only Super Bowl-winning coaches to lead their respective teams to three road wins as the No. 6 seed in the postseason en route to a world title.

► Including playoffs, McCarthy has a 135-83-2 record since taking over as head coach in 2006, a .618 winning percentage that ranks **No. 3 among current NFL head coaches** (minimum 100 games):

### TAKING HIS PLACE AMONG THE GAME'S BEST

QB **Aaron Rodgers** surpassed the 1,500-attempt plateau for his career in 2010, the benchmark to qualify for passer rating in the NFL record book.

▶ Rodgers ranks **No. 1 in NFL history** in career passer rating:

▶ Rodgers threw for 442 yards, three touchdowns and zero interceptions at Detroit in Week 5 and then recorded 425 yards, two touchdowns and zero interceptions in Week 6, becoming the **first player in NFL history to have back-to-back 400-yard games with no INTs.**

▶ It was the sixth 400-yard passing game for Rodgers, a **franchise record.** No other quarterback in franchise annals has more than one 400-yard passing game (four QBs with one).

▶ Rodgers reached 40,000 passing yards in his 154th career game (Week 5 at Detroit). At the time, he had 323 passing TDs, becoming the **first quarterback in NFL history to reach 40,000 passing yards and 300 TD passes in fewer than 157 games,** the number in which both Peyton Manning and Dan Marino reached the two marks.

▶ Rodgers tied Manning for the **fourth-fewest games to reach 40,000 passing yards,** trailing Matt Ryan (151), Drew Brees (152) and Dan Marino (153), according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

▶ Rodgers reached 5,000 career attempts in Week 3. At the time of his 5,000th career attempt, he had 319 TD passes and 78 INTs, setting the record for the most (Johnny Unitas, 284) and fewest (Donovan McNabb, 107) in each category in NFL history at the time of the 5,000th attempt.

## RODGERS AND TOUCHDOWNS

QB **Aaron Rodgers** has found the end zone a lot in his career, and that has continued this season. It is the first time in his career that he has registered 15-plus touchdowns and one or fewer interceptions in the first 10 games of the season (19/1). He joins Drew Brees (25/1) as the **only players in the NFL this season** with 15-plus TDs and one or fewer INTs, according to pro-football-reference.com.

- ▶ In Week 2 of 2017, Rodgers became the 11th NFL player to throw 300 passing touchdowns, reaching the mark in his 144th career game to pass Peyton Manning and Dan Marino (157) for the fewest games needed to reach 300 passing TDs in NFL history.
- ▶ Rodgers reached 300 passing TDs on his 4,742nd pass attempt, surpassing Manning (5,306) for the fewest in league history.
- ▶ Rodgers also became the first quarterback to reach 300 passing TDs before throwing 100 interceptions. His 73 interceptions passed Tom Brady (115) for the fewest at the time of reaching 300 passing TDs.
- ▶ With a league-best 40 passing TDs during the 2016 regular season, Rodgers became just the fourth QB in NFL history to record two seasons (also 2011) with 40-plus TD passes (Marino, Manning, Brees). It was his franchise-record fourth season (2011-12, 2014, 2016) with 35-plus TD passes (Brett Favre, three, 1995-97).
- ▶ Rodgers now has five seasons with 4,000-plus passing yards and 30-plus passing TDs (2009, 2011-12, 2014, 2016), further extending his team mark.
- ▶ In 2016, Rodgers registered his third straight season with 30-plus touchdown passes, the second-longest streak in franchise history (Favre, five straight, 1994-98).
- ▶ Rodgers has thrown 38-plus TD passes four times in his career, the most in NFL history:

Despite playing in just 14 games in 2017, WR **Davante Adams** led the Packers in all three major receiving categories with 74 receptions (one shy of career-best 75 from 2016) for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 touchdowns (**tied for No. 2 in the NFL**), resulting in his first appearance in the Pro Bowl.

► Adams' nine TD receptions this season are the fourth most through 10 games by a Packer (since 1950) behind only WR Billy Howton (11 in 1952 and 1956) and WR **Randall Cobb** (10 in 2014).

► Adams became the **first player in franchise history** to record five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season (2018).

► Adams recorded 130-plus receiving yards in three consecutive games (Weeks 5-6, 8), joining WR James Lofton (1984) as the players in franchise history to do so, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► Adams was the first Packer since WR Greg Jennings (2010) with three straight games with 100-plus receiving yards. Adams finished one short of the franchise record held by Lofton (four in 1982-83) and Don Hutson (four in 1945).

► Adams' average of 26.6 yards per catch in Week 8 was a career high (min. four receptions).

► WR **Davante Adams** leads the NFL with four games with 130-plus receiving yards this season, tied for the **second most in franchise history** (Don Hutson, five in 1942) according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

► In Week 5, Adams extended his franchise record by posting a TD catch in his 10th straight road game, and **tied the longest streak in NFL history** (Eagles WR Tommy McDonald, 10, 1959-61).

► Adams opened the 2018 season with a TD reception in each of the first three contests, which extended his streak of consecutive regular-season games with a TD catch to five, dating back to last season. He had six TD catches during the streak. It was the longest streak of his career, besting the run of three games he had in 2017 (Games 4-6) when he totaled five receiving touchdowns. It was also the longest streak by a Packer player since WR **Randall Cobb's** streak of six games in 2014.



### ODDS AND ENDS

- The Packers did not allow a TD in Week 4 and Week 10. The last time Green Bay had two-plus games in a season with no TDs allowed was 2010 (three games). The Packers are one of only three teams in the NFL to not allow a TD in two games this season (Baltimore and Indianapolis, two each).
- Green Bay's defense ranks **No. 10 in the league** in third-down defense (36.96 percent). The Packers have not allowed a team to register a conversion percentage of higher than 50.0 in a game this season.
- The Packers rank **No. 4 in the NFL** in second-half points allowed (92) this season, according to pro-football-reference.com.
- The Packers had three players record 100-yard receiving games in Week 6 (WR **Davante Adams**, 10-132; TE **Jimmy Graham**, 5-104; WR **Marquez Valdes-Scantling**, 103), just the second time in franchise history (per Elias Sports Bureau) that Green Bay has had three 100-yard receivers in a single game (Oct. 12, 1980, at Tampa Bay with RB Eddie Lee Ivery, TE Paul Coffman and WR Aundra Thompson).
- QB **Aaron Rodgers** ranks in the top 10 of the NFL this season in numerous fourth-quarter passing categories (min. 50 pass att.):
  - Interceptions, 0 (t-No. 1)

### CLAY FINDS HIS WAY TO THE BALL

LB **Clay Matthews** continues to make an impact on opposing offenses. He is tied for the team lead in QB hits (seven) and ranks No. 2 on the team in QB pressures (13) this season.

- ▶ In 2017, Matthews recorded a sack in three consecutive games that he appeared in (Weeks 11, 13-14), marking the eighth time he has recorded a sack in at least three straight games that he has played in during the same regular season.
- ▶ For the seventh time in his career, Matthews registered at least six sacks (team-high 7.5) and forced a fumble in 2017, which **tied for the second-most seasons** with six-plus sacks and one or more forced fumbles since 2009 (Julius Peppers, nine).
- ▶ In Week 4 of 2017, Matthews registered a sack/forced fumble of Bears QB Mike Glennon to move past DE Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila to set the team record:

### KENNY KEEPS IMPROVING

In 2016, DL **Kenny Clark** became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930. After starting two of 16 games played as a rookie, Clark has started all 24 games he has played in since the start of the 2017 season.

- ▶ Clark is **tied for No. 11** among players listed as defensive tackles and defensive lineman with five sacks this season (Sportradar).
- ▶ He ranks No. 2 on the team in QB hits (six) this season.
- ▶ Clark is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL** with two defensive fumble recoveries this season. He forced and recovered a fumble of Bills QB Josh Allen in Week 4. In Week 1, he recovered a fumble forced by LB **Nick Perry** on a sack of Chicago QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth down late in the fourth quarter.
- ▶ In Week 8, Clark tied his career high with two sacks against the Rams. Dating back to 2016, he ranks No. 2 on the Packers in multi-sack games (Perry, three), according to pro-football-reference.com.
- ▶ In Week 3, he matched his career high in tackles (10) and solo tackles (seven).
- ▶ The former All-American from UCLA finished **No. 4 on the team** and led the defensive line with 78 tackles (39 solo) in 2017.
- ▶ According to STATS, Clark's 4.5 sacks in December 2017 were the **most by a Packer defensive tackle in the month of December** in a single season (since 1982).

### CONTINUAL IMPACT

In his career, DL **Mike Daniels** has seen his playing time steadily increase as well as his production, earning him a role as a standout on the defense.

- ▶ Leads the team in QB hits (eight) and QB pressures (14) this season.
- ▶ After being selected as an alternate three straight seasons (2015-17), he was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- ▶ He finished **No. 4 on the team** with five sacks in 2017, the third-most sacks of his career (6.5 in 2013, 5.5 in 2014), and recorded a career-best 72 tackles.
- ▶ Daniels has two sacks this season. He has recorded at least four sacks in five seasons since 2013, which is **tied for No. 2 in the NFL among defensive tackles** (according to pro-football-reference.com):

- ▶ Crosby has been named NFC Special teams Player of the Week a team-record seven times in his career, including this season after hitting a game-winning field goal in Week 6.
- ▶ Crosby ranks **No. 8 in the NFL** in scoring this season with 83 points.
- ▶ Crosby has recorded a game-winning field goal in each of the last three seasons (2016 at Chicago, 2017 vs. Cincinnati, 2018 vs. San Francisco).
- ▶ In Week 4, Crosby hit two 52-yard field goals, joining Ryan Longwell (at Atlanta, Nov. 13, 2005) as the only Packers to make two 50-plus-yard field goals in a regular-season game. It was the first time two field goals of 50-plus yards had been made by a kicker at Lambeau Field. Crosby had previously connected on two 50-plus field goals (56, 51) in the 2016 NFC Divisional Playoff win at Dallas.
- ▶ Crosby tied his career high (two previous times) and matched the single-game franchise record with five field goals in Week 2 (37, 40, 31, 48, 36). He finished with a career-high 17 points, the most by a Packers kicker since Ryan Longwell recorded 17 at Arizona on Sept. 24, 2000.
- ▶ Crosby has played in 186 straight games for the Packers, the **third most all-time** behind only QB Brett Favre (255) and T Forrest Gregg (187).
- ▶ Crosby passed Longwell in Week 2 of the 2015 season to become the franchise career points leader:

### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Green Bay went 7-1 away from Lambeau Field in 2011, with the seven road wins setting a single-season franchise record.

- ▶ The Packers have been able to stay above the .500 mark on the road during Head Coach **Mike McCarthy's** tenure, a notable achievement in the National Football League.
- ▶ Since 2006, McCarthy's first season as the head coach in Green Bay, only seven of 32 NFL teams have regular-season road records at or above .500.

### 339 AND COUNTING

Another packed house at Lambeau Field against the Miami Dolphins in Week 6 of 2018 brought the stadium's consecutive-sellouts streak to 339 regular-season games (not including replacement games).

- ▶ The league's longest-tenured stadium, Lambeau Field is hosting its 62nd season of football in 2018. For the victory over Dallas in the Divisional round of the 2014 playoffs, Packers fans set a new Lambeau Field paid-attendance record (79,704).
- ▶ Across American professional sports, only Boston's Fenway Park (1912) and Chicago's Wrigley Field (1914) have longer tenures.

### THE LAMBEAU ADVANTAGE

The crown jewel of the National Football League, Lambeau Field has long been known as one of the tougher venues to play in, particularly during the harsh Wisconsin winter.

- ▶ Re-establishing home-field advantage after a 4-4 mark in 2008 was one of the goals of 2009, and with the Packers finishing 6-2 at home, they accomplished that goal. Green Bay followed that up with a 7-1 mark at Lambeau Field in 2010, a perfect 8-0 record in 2011, the first undefeated home mark since 2002, and a 7-1 mark in 2012. The Packers were one of two teams to finish undefeated at home during the 2014 regular season (Denver). Green Bay is 4-0-1 at home this season.
- ▶ Head Coach **Mike McCarthy** stated consistently upon his arrival in Green Bay that one of the team's goals would be to reclaim the mystique of playing at Lambeau Field. Mission accomplished. The team is 73-26-2 (.733) at home in the regular season since 2006, **No. 2 in the NFL**.
- ▶ Since **Ron Wolf** and **Mike Holmgren** began the revitalization of the franchise in 1992, Green Bay owns the best home record in the NFL. A look at the top regular-season home W-L records since the '92 season:

### A LOOK AT THE SCHEDULE

The Green Bay Packers' 98th NFL regular-season schedule – highlighted by five prime-time contests (subject to flexible scheduling) – was released April 19 by the National Football League.

- ▶ For the second consecutive season, the Packers opened the season at home and will play three of their first four games at Lambeau Field.
- ▶ In Week 1, Green Bay hosted Chicago on Sunday night, marking the 13th consecutive regular season that the Packers and Bears have squared off in primetime.
- ▶ It was the first time Green Bay opened the season at home against the Bears since playing them on Sunday night in Week 1 of the 2009 season, a 21-15 win for the Packers.
- ▶ Green Bay hosted Minnesota in Week 2, marking the first time since 2012 that the Packers played two home games to open the season. It also marked just the third time (2003, 2008) since the NFC North was formed in 2002 that Green Bay has played division opponents in both of the first two games.
- ▶ The Packers' first road contest was at the Redskins, marking Green Bay's first September visit to Washington.
- ▶ The Packers returned home to take on the Buffalo Bills in Week 4. It was the second-coldest September game (49 degrees at kickoff) at Lambeau Field (since 1959) behind only the contest between the Packers and Washington Redskins on Sept. 24, 2001 (46 degrees).
- ▶ In Week 5 they traveled to Detroit to play the Lions.
- ▶ In Week 6, Green Bay hosted the San Francisco 49ers on *Monday Night Football*. It was the fifth time in the last six seasons the Packers have played at Lambeau Field on *MNF*. The temperature at kickoff was 37 degrees, the second-coldest October game at Lambeau Field (since 1959) behind only the contest between the Packers and Minnesota Vikings on Oct. 26, 1980 (36 degrees).
- ▶ After the second Week 7 bye for Green Bay in the last four seasons (2015), the Packers will play four of five games on the road.
- ▶ Green Bay made its first trip to the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum since 1990 to play the Rams.
- ▶ In Week 9, the Packers traveled to the other side of the country to play the Patriots on Sunday night.
- ▶ It was the second consecutive time the Packers and Patriots faced off on a Sunday night in New England (2010).
- ▶ Green Bay returned home to take on the Miami Dolphins before a quick turnaround to play the Seahawks, marking the Packers' second Thursday night game at Seattle (Week 1 in 2014). Including the postseason, it was the seventh time Green Bay and Seattle have played since 2012.
- ▶ November finishes with a trip to play the Vikings on Sunday night, marking the sixth straight season that the teams have met in a prime-time game.
- ▶ Green Bay opens the final month of the regular season against Arizona, only the second time the Cardinals have played at Lambeau Field in December (Dec. 21, 1969).
- ▶ The Packers will play back-to-back home games for only the second time in 2018 when they host the Atlanta Falcons in Week 14. It will be the fourth matchup (including postseason) between Green Bay and Atlanta in the last three seasons.
- ▶ The Packers end the season with two road games in the final three weeks for the seventh straight year.
- ▶ In Week 15, Green Bay will face the Bears in Chicago, a place it has won in the regular season each of the last seven years. The Packers have scored 30-plus points at Chicago in four of the last five matchups (33, 38, 31, 30, 23).
- ▶ The Packers' road slate will finish up with a game at the New York Jets, the third December game at the Jets in team history (1981, 2002). Three of the last four games at New York have been decided by single digits, including one game that went to overtime.
- ▶ Green Bay will close out the regular season against the Lions for the third straight year and the fourth time in the last five seasons. Green Bay has an 18-6 overall mark (.750) and a 10-2 home record (.833) against Detroit under Head Coach **Mike McCarthy**.

**PACKERS STARTERS – OFFENSE**

**WR Randall Cobb, 7th Year, Kentucky, D2-11**

- ▶ In Week 1, led the Packers with a career-high 142 receiving yards (13th 100-yard receiving game of his career) on nine receptions (15.8 avg.), including the game-winning 75-yard TD catch that was a career long.
- ▶ Despite missing a game, was No. 2 on the team with 66 receptions in 2017. It was the fourth consecutive season he registered 60-plus receptions.
- ▶ Led the team with a 13.5-yard punt-return average in 2016.
- ▶ Led the team in receptions (79), was No. 2 in receiving yards (829) and was No. 3 in touchdown receptions (six) in 2015.
- ▶ Set a new single-season career high with five 100-yard receiving games during the 2014 season (three-2012). Earned first trip to the Pro Bowl.
- ▶ His career-best 91 receptions in 2014 are the eighth most in team history.
- ▶ Set a franchise single-season record with a league-high 2,342 combined net yards in 2012, topping the previous team mark of 2,250 yards by RB Ahman Green in 2003.

**LT David Bakhtiari, 6th Year, Colorado, D4a-13**

- ▶ Earned second-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2016 and 2017, joining Forrest Gregg (1959-60, 1962-67) as the only Green Bay tackles to be named to an AP All-Pro team in consecutive seasons.
- ▶ Named to first career Pro Bowl in 2016.
- ▶ Has started all but six games at LT since the start of the 2013 regular season. Missed Weeks 2-5 during the 2017 season and the final two games of the 2015 regular season due to injury.
- ▶ Started all 16 games at left tackle in 2013, the only rookie in the NFL to do so in 2013 and the first Packer rookie to do so since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Became just the fourth Green Bay rookie to start at LT in the season opener since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger and the first since 1985.

**LG Lane Taylor, 6th Year, Oklahoma State, FA-13**

- ▶ Has played in 72 regular-season games for Green Bay, with all but three of his 43 starts (LT in Week 4-5 of 2017, RG in Week 13 of 2015) taking place at LG.
- ▶ Made the first starts of his career in 2015, opening at RG at Detroit in Week 13 in place of an injured T.J. Lang and at LG in Week 17 vs. Minnesota with Josh Sitton sliding to LT in place of an injured David Bakhtiari.
- ▶ A four-year letterman at OSU, starting 47 of 50 games played at right guard. Unanimous first-team All-Big 12 selection by the conference's coaches as a senior.

**C Corey Linsley, 5th Year, Ohio State, D5a-14**

- ▶ Has started every game at C since Week 9 of 2016. Was the only Packers offensive lineman to start every game during the 2017 season.
- ▶ Was on reserve/physically unable to perform for the entire preseason and the first seven regular-season games of the 2016 season.
- ▶ Started 29 games and four postseason contests in his first two seasons.
- ▶ Was the first rookie center to start every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.
- ▶ Named to PFWA's All-Rookie team, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

**RG Byron Bell, 8th Year, New Mexico, FA-18**

- ▶ Signed by Green Bay as a free agent during the 2018 offseason and has seen action in all 10 games with seven starts, all coming at right guard.
- ▶ Originally signed as an undrafted free agent out of New Mexico by the Carolina Panthers in 2011. After four seasons (2011-14) with the Panthers, spent two years with the Tennessee Titans (2015-16) and a season with the Dallas Cowboys (2017).
- ▶ Played in 90 games with 74 starts from 2011-17, and started all three postseason contests he appeared in.
- ▶ Played in 37 games with 36 starts at New Mexico, starting 24 games at LT over his final two seasons after making 12 starts at RT as a sophomore.

**RT Bryan Bulaga, 9th Year, Iowa, D1-10**

- ▶ Has played in 95 career regular-season games with 91 starts at right tackle.
- ▶ Started 43 of 48 regular-season games from 2014-16 and five games in 2017 before a knee injury in Week 9 ended his season.
- ▶ Missed the second part of the 2012 season after suffering a hip injury vs. Arizona on Nov. 4 and missed all of the 2013 season after injuring his knee on Aug. 3.
- ▶ Started 37 games at RT in his first three seasons in the league.
- ▶ Named to the *Pro Football Weekly*/PFWA All-Rookie team in 2010.
- ▶ Capped his rookie season by becoming the youngest player at the time, according to STATS LLC, to ever start in the Super Bowl (21 years, 322 days).

**TE Jimmy Graham, 9th Year, Miami, FA-18**

- ▶ Ranks No. 4 in the NFL among tight ends (min. 30 rec.) with an average of 13.3 yards per reception this season.
- ▶ His 71 career touchdowns rank No. 4 in NFL history among tight ends.
- ▶ Last season, led NFL tight ends with 10 receiving TDs, which marked his fourth season with 10-plus touchdown receptions to tie Antonio Gates for the second most 10-touchdown-catch seasons among tight ends (Rob Gronkowski, five).
- ▶ Has been selected to the Pro Bowl five times in his career (2011, 2013, 2014, 2016, 2017) and was named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2013.
- ▶ Is the only tight end in NFL history to have two seasons with 1,200-plus receiving yards and 10-plus receiving TDs (2011, 2013).
- ▶ From 2015-17, he played for the Seattle Seahawks but entered the NFL with New Orleans in 2010 as a third-round pick (No. 95 overall) and played five seasons (2010-14) for the Saints.

**WR Davante Adams, 5th Year, Fresno State, D2-14**

- ▶ Became the first player in franchise history to record five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games of the season.
- ▶ Leads the NFL with four games with 130-plus receiving yards this season, tied for the second most in franchise history (Don Hutson, five in 1942) according to the Elias Sports Bureau.
- ▶ Registered the fourth-most receptions (237) and receiving touchdowns (26) by a Green Bay player in their first four seasons (2014-17) in the NFL (according to the Elias Sports Bureau).
- ▶ Selected to his first Pro Bowl in 2017 after leading the Packers with 74 receptions for 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 receiving touchdowns (tied for No. 2 in the NFL).
- ▶ With 12 receiving touchdowns in 2016, joined Jordy Nelson (2014, 2016), Antonio Freeman (1997-98), Sterling Sharpe (1992-94) and Don Hutson (1941-43) as the only players in franchise history to register 10-plus TD catches in consecutive seasons.

**WR Marquez Valdes-Scantling, Rookie, South Florida, D5c-18**

- ▶ Leads the team with 17.1 yards per reception (min. 10 receptions).
- ▶ In Week 8 at New England, totaled 101 yards on three receptions (33.7 avg.), becoming the first Packer since McGee (1959) to have two 100-yard receiving games in a season on three or fewer receptions.
- ▶ Posted an average of 17.3 yards per catch on his 75 receptions at USF, the top mark in school history (min. 70 receptions).
- ▶ Played first two seasons at North Carolina State (2013-14), posting 44 receptions for 538 yards (12.2 avg.) and a TD before transferring to USF, where he played two seasons (2016-17).

**QB Aaron Rodgers, 12th Year, California, D1-05**

- ▶ His career passer rating of 103.7 ranks No. 1 in NFL history.
- ▶ In 152 regular-season starts (98-53-1 record), has posted 55 games with 300-plus passing yards, 93 without an interception and 85 with a 100-plus passer rating (min. 15 attempts).
- ▶ Earned his sixth selection to the Pro Bowl in 2016, the second-most selections by a Green Bay quarterback behind Brett Favre's nine (1992-93, 1995-97, 2001-03, 2007).
- ▶ Finished the 2014 regular season ranked No. 2 in the NFL in passer rating (112.2), touchdown percentage (7.3), No. 1 in interception percentage (1.0) and No. 3 in touchdown passes (38).
- ▶ Recorded a passer rating of at least 120.0 in seven regular-season games in 2014, setting a single-season career high and tying for the third most in a single season in the NFL, dating back to 1960.
- ▶ In 2011, set an NFL record with a 122.5 passer rating and set franchise marks for TD passes (45), passing yards (4,643), completion percentage (68.3), yards per attempt (9.25) and 300-yard games (eight) on his way to earning NFL Most Valuable Player honors from *The Associated Press*.

**RB Aaron Jones, 2nd Year, Texas-El Paso, D5b-17**

- ▶ Leads the Packers with 534 rushing yards and ranks No. 1 in the NFL with an average of 6.4 yards per carry (min. 50 att.) this season.
- ▶ Is the first Packer since QB Tobin Rote (1951) with three straight games with 75-plus rushing yards and 15 or fewer carries (Weeks 8-10).
- ▶ Recorded 448 rushing yards and four TDs as a rookie and his 5.53-yard rushing average ranked No. 6 in franchise single-season history (min. 75 att.)
- ▶ Registered two 125-yard rushing games in 2017, tied for the most in franchise history by a Green Bay rookie.
- ▶ Finished career at UTEP ranked No. 1 in school history in rushing yards (4,114).



## PACKERS STARTERS – DEFENSE

### **DE Dean Lowry, 3rd Year, Northwestern, D4b-16**

- ▶ Tied for No. 3 on the team with 12 QB pressures this season.
- ▶ Made first career start in the 2017 season-opening win over Seattle and went on to start at total of 11 games while playing in all 16 last season.
- ▶ Saw action in 15 games as a rookie (2016) and registered 14 tackles (eight solo), two sacks, three tackles for a loss, nine QB pressures and three QB hits. Also appeared in all three postseason contests and posted two tackles (one solo) and a QB pressure.
- ▶ Posted sacks in back-to-back games in 2016, recording one in Week 13 vs. Houston and one in Week 14 vs. Seattle.
- ▶ Played in 48 games with 33 starts for Northwestern.
- ▶ Earned second-team All-Big Ten honors as a senior in 2015 after posting 46 tackles (27 solo), 13.5 tackles for a loss (second on the team), three sacks, an interception, a fumble recovery and seven passes defended.

### **NT Kenny Clark, 3rd Year, UCLA, D1-16**

- ▶ Ranks No. 2 on the team with five sacks this season.
- ▶ Has 9.5 sacks since Week 13 of 2017, the second most on the Packers over that span (according to Sportradar).
- ▶ Despite missing Week 12 due to injury, set career highs in tackles (78, No. 4 on the team) and sacks (4.5, No. 4 on the team) in 2017.
- ▶ Finished the 2016 regular season ranked No. 3 on the GB defensive line in tackles (33).
- ▶ Became the youngest player to appear in a season opener for the Packers since Arnie Herber (20 years old) in 1930.
- ▶ Earned third-team All-America honors from *The Associated Press* and first-team All-Pacific-12 recognition from the coaches and media as a junior in 2015.

### **DE Mike Daniels, 7th Year, Iowa, D4a-12**

- ▶ Leads the team in QB hits (eight) and QB pressures (14) this season.
- ▶ Leads Packers defensive linemen with 27.0 sacks since the start of the 2013 regular season.
- ▶ After being selected as an alternate each of the previous three seasons (2015-17), was named to the 2017 Pro Bowl as an injury replacement for Los Angeles Rams DT Aaron Donald.
- ▶ Ranked No. 4 on the team with five sacks in 2017 and set a career high with 72 tackles.
- ▶ Has recorded at least four sacks in each season since 2013, which is tied for No. 1 in the NFL among defensive tackles (according to pro-football-reference.com).
- ▶ Led the defensive line in both tackles and sacks in 2014 and 2015.
- ▶ Starred as an interior pass rusher at Iowa, posting a team-high 24.5 tackles for a loss and 13 sacks from 2010-11.

### **OLB Clay Matthews, 10th Year, Southern California, D1b-09**

- ▶ Ranks No. 2 on the team in QB hits (seven) and QB pressures (13) this season.
- ▶ With 82.5 career sacks, passed Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila (74.5) for the most sacks in Packers history. Led the team with 7.5 sacks in 2017 despite missing two games.
- ▶ Despite injuries forcing him to miss four games and limiting him in six others, finished No. 3 on the team with five sacks in 2016.
- ▶ For the first time in his career, recorded at least one sack in each of the first three regular-season games he played in (2016).
- ▶ Selected to his sixth Pro Bowl and first as an inside linebacker in 2015 after recording 6.5 sacks (second on the team), 15 QB hits (No. 1 on the team) and a career-high 85 tackles (No. 2 on the team).
- ▶ With a team-high 11.0 sacks in 2014, is tied for the most 10-plus sack seasons in franchise history (four).
- ▶ Is the only player in franchise history to score a defensive TD (interception or fumble return) in each of his first three seasons in the NFL (2009-11).

### **ILB Blake Martinez, 3rd Year, Stanford, D4a-16**

- ▶ Leads the Packers in total tackles (88) and solo tackles (60) this season.
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 on the Packers with 158 total tackles (107 solo) during the 2017 season. Dating back to 1975, it was the 14th time and first time since A.J. Hawk (153) in 2013 that a Green Bay player reached 150 tackles in a season.
- ▶ Registered 10-plus tackles in seven games in 2017 (12 vs. Cincinnati, 13 at Dallas, 14 at Minnesota, 15 vs. New Orleans, 12 vs. Detroit, 17 at Pittsburgh, 10 vs. Tampa Bay).
- ▶ Became the first rookie to start on defense for Green Bay in Week 1 since LB Nick Perry in 2012.
- ▶ Started all 27 games played in his final two seasons, leading the team in tackles as a junior (102) and senior (141).

### **ILB Antonio Morrison, 3rd Year, Florida, FA-18**

- ▶ Has played in all 10 games with four starts this season.
- ▶ Acquired by the Packers in a trade with the Indianapolis Colts on Aug. 26, 2018, in exchange for CB Lenzy Pipkins.

- ▶ Originally selected by the Colts in the fourth round (No. 125 overall) of the 2016 NFL Draft out of the University of Florida.
- ▶ In two seasons with Indianapolis, played in 31 games with 19 starts and registered 154 tackles (91 solo), six tackles for a loss and a pass defended. Started all 15 games he played in at inside linebacker last season and led the team with a career-high 108 tackles (64 solo).

### **OLB Nick Perry, 7th Year, Southern California, D1-12**

- ▶ Sealed the Week 1 victory over the Bears with a sack/forced fumble of QB Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 1:06 on the clock and the ball at the Chicago 46-yard line. The fumble was recovered by DL Kenny Clark.
- ▶ Finished second on the team with seven sacks in 2017. Registered a career-high three sacks against the Chicago Bears in Week 10. It was the first time a Packers player had three-plus sacks in a game since LB A.J. Hawk (three) on Oct. 13, 2013, at Baltimore.
- ▶ Led the team with a career-high 11.0 sacks in 2016.
- ▶ Registered multiple sacks in each of his first five seasons in the NFL and has posted a two-sack game in each of the last four seasons (2013-16).
- ▶ Has totaled seven sacks in eight playoff games, ranking No. 3 in franchise history (since 1982) behind Matthews (11) and Reggie White (eight).

### **CB Jaire Alexander, Rookie, Louisville, D1-18**

- ▶ Has played in nine games with six starts this season, ranking No. 1 on the team with 11 passes defended.
- ▶ Registered five passes defended against the Los Angeles Rams in Week 8, the most by a Green Bay defender this season.
- ▶ Was just the third Louisville defensive back in school history to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft.
- ▶ Played in 31 games with 19 starts during his three seasons with the Cardinals, earning second-team All-Atlantic Coast Conference recognition as a sophomore in 2016.

### **CB Kevin King, 2nd Year, Washington, D1-17**

- ▶ Appeared in nine games with five starts as a rookie in 2017, registering 31 tackles (23 solo), a tackle for a loss and eight passes defended before being placed on injured reserve (shoulder) on Dec. 6.
- ▶ Despite being limited to nine games due to injury, his five starts were the third most among Packers rookies in 2017 (S Josh Jones and RB Jamaal Williams both had seven).
- ▶ Played in all 48 games with 35 starts in his four seasons at Washington and registered 165 tackles (107 solo), 8½ tackles for a loss, six interceptions, 28 passes defended, two forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Earned honorable mention All-Pacific-12 recognition as a junior and senior.
- ▶ Was named first-team All-East Bay by the *Contra Costa Times* as a senior at Bishop O'Dowd High School in Oakland, Calif., where he was coached by former NFL linebacker Hardy Nickerson.

### **S Tramon Williams, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-18**

- ▶ After starting the first seven games of the season at CB, started at S in each of the past three games.
- ▶ Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players.
- ▶ Is the only active player in the NFL with at least one INT in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).
- ▶ Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.
- ▶ Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).
- ▶ Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

### **S Kentrell Brice, 3rd Year, Louisiana Tech, FA-16**

- ▶ Ranks No. 4 on the team in tackles (45) this season.
- ▶ Recorded his first career sack in Week 1 as part of a 12-tackle (nine solo) performance.
- ▶ Started a career-best three games in 2017 and set career highs in tackles (24), solo tackles (21), interceptions (one) and passes defended (four) despite only playing in six contests before being placed on injured reserve with an ankle injury on Nov. 3.
- ▶ Was one of five rookie free agents to make Green Bay's Week 1 roster and joined S Marwin Evans as the only rookie free agents to play in all 16 regular-season games and three postseason contests for the Packers in 2016.
- ▶ Started 33 of 49 games played at Louisiana Tech, recording 210 tackles (154 solo), 10 tackles for a loss, five sacks, three interceptions, four forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and 13 pass breakups.

**GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP)**—Aaron Rodgers heard the applause after walking out of the stadium tunnel and back on to the field. The team doctor had checked out his left knee after the Green Bay Packers quarterback was carried off the field in the second quarter. Rodgers, it seemed, had avoided a major injury. He was good to go. The adrenaline kicked in.

The hobbling wide-time NFL MVP threw three touchdown passes in the second half after returning from injury, and the Green Bay Packers overcame a 20-point deficit for a thrilling 24-23 win over the Chicago Bears on Sunday night.

Rodgers connected with receiver Randall Cobb for a catch-and-run on the secondary for a 75-yard touchdown and the go-ahead score with 2:13 left in the game.

Nick Perry sacked the Bears' Mitchell Trubisky on fourth-and-10 with 58 seconds to complete the comeback.

Sunday marked the first time in franchise history that the Packers won after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

The Packers posted the second-largest comeback in franchise history at Lambeau Field, behind only a rally from 21 points down to beat New Orleans on Sept. 17, 1989.

For Rodgers, this was special. And especially because how awful the Packers played in the first half.

A Chicago offense featuring newly acquired star linebacker Khalil Mack dominated until the third quarter. Mack had a 27-yard interception return for a touchdown against backup quarterback Desmond Haizer in the second quarter.

A gimpy Rodgers returned in the second half and finally figured out the Bears. He also found Davante Adams and Jeronimo Allison for touchdowns passes. He finished 20 of 30 for 286 yards, including 17 of 23 for 273 yards in the second half.

It was Rodgers' first regular-season home game since Sept. 28 against the Bears. He was limited to seven games in 2017 because of a collarbone injury.

Mack nearly stole the show. He also stripped the ball for a turnover in the red zone off Kizer in the second quarter. Mack made an immediate impact in his first game since the Bears acquired the premier pass rusher in a blockbuster deal with the Oakland Raiders.

The Bears led 20-0 at one point and their defense dominated until the second half. Then Rodgers returned, and the Packers' defense held the Bears in check.

Trubisky was 23 of 35 for 171 yards. He also ran for 32 yards on seven carries, including a 2-yard touchdown run in the first quarter.

LANDOVER, Md. (AP) — Things have not gone all that well for Aaron Rodgers and Co. so far, and as the Packers (1-1-1) fail to the Redskins (2-1) on a rainy afternoon.  
That was certainly the case in a 31-17 loss at the Washington Redskins on Sunday, when Green Bay fell behind 14-0 and trailed 28-10 at halftime after giving up TD drives of 74, 75, 79 and 98 yards.  
Among McCarthy's ailments were his team's 11 penalties for 115 yards - including three for pass interference on one drive - and the most-discussed among those flags was linebacker Clay Matthews' for roughing the passer after he sacked Alex Smith late in the third quarter.

A week after gaining 20 yards on 11 attempts, Adrian Peterson went for 120 yards on 19 runs with a pair of 2-yard TDs.  
Smith went 12 for 20 for 220 yards. He also had his streak of 156 consecutive passes without an interception, the longest active run in the league, and in the second quarter, Safety Ha Ha Clinton-Dix made the pick when Jordan Reed went one way and Smith threw another. Rodgers, who was 27 for 44 for 265 yards passing with two touchdowns - of 64 yards to Germaine Akins and 2 yards to Davante Adams - said he expects to start against Buffalo after again dealing with an injured left knee, which he hurt in Week 1. He wore a bulky brace on his left knee against Washington, and he came up hobbling a bit after some plays where he moved around in the pocket or scrambled for a gain.  
Green Bay's receivers had problems with drops, plus Randall Cobb was stripped of the ball by Fabian Moreau - Josh Norman recovered the fumble - after a completion with about 5½ minutes remaining in the fourth quarter.  
The Packers' ground game was limited to 15 carries for 87 yards by running backs.

**GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP)** — This is more like it for the Green Bay Packers.

The offense built a big lead as quarterback Aaron Rodgers quited through another game with a brace on his injured left knee. The defense had seven sacks and pitched a shutout for the first time in eight seasons.

They put together their most complete game of the year in a 22-0 win over the Buffalo Bills (1-3) on Sunday. It was just the edge that the Packers (2-1-1) needed with Rodgers not necessarily playing at his best. He was 22 of 40 for 298 yards with one touchdown. Green Bay had decisive edges in total offense (423-145) and first downs (22-11).

Rodgers also threw an interception off a deflected pass and tumbled the ball away on a sack early in the fourth quarter. The offense wasn't as productive in the second half after a last start.

Bills rookie quarterback Josh Allen accounted for three turnovers, including two interceptions and a fumble late in the fourth quarter that stood on review. He was 16 of 33 for 151 yards.

Buffalo did manage to force Rodgers to throw his first interception of the year.

But a 16-0 lead at the half was more than enough cushion against Buffalo's feeble offense. Even the return of running back LeSean McCoy, who missed a game because of a rib injury, didn't help the Bills.

Rodgers and Jimmy Graham connected on their first touchdown pass of the year. Signed in the offseason as a free agent, the athletic tight end made his first official Lambeau Leap and finished with 21 yards on three catches.

RB Aaron Jones added 65 yards and a score on 11 carries for the Packers.

A physical defense for Green Bay held the Bills to eight punts and three turnovers on their first 11 drives. Allen was sacked seven times, three by Kyler Fackrell.

**LOS ANGELES (AP)** — Aaron Rodgers can't lead a game-winning drive if he never gets the ball. That was the whole idea when Los Angeles Rams kicker Matt Scott blocked Green Bay's Ty Montgomery on a late kickoff return. That was also Todd Gurley's thought moments later when he stopped running with a clear path to the end zone, keeping Rodgers stuck on the sideline in the unbeaten Rams' eighth victory.

Greg Zuerlein hit a 34-yard field goal with 2:05 left before Wilson forced and recovered Montgomery's fumble on the ensuing kickoff, and Gurley's prudent decision to go down wrapped up the Rams' 29-27 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Sunday.

Jared Goff passed for 295 yards and three touchdowns while the Rams (8-0) were sternly tested by the Packers (3-3-1).

Both teams rallied from 10-point deficits to take a lead in front of a rollicking, bipartisan Coliseum crowd, but the Rams extended their best start since 1969 by capitalizing on two crushing special-teams mistakes by Green Bay.

Rodgers threw for 286 yards, but he didn't get a snap in the final 5:20.

Marquez Valdes-Scantling caught a 40-yard touchdown pass from Rodgers with 8:50 left to put the Packers ahead 27-26, but Goff and Gurley drove the Rams into range for Zuerlein's second field goal of the fourth quarter after a 25-yard punt by JK Scott.

Montgomery then coughed up his return, and Wilson pounced on the ball. Packers coach Mike McCarthy said the return man was supposed to take a touchback.

In the final minute, Gurley ran 17 yards for a key first down and stopped before reaching the end zone, allowing the Rams to run out the clock.

Just Reynolds caught two touchdown passes for Los Angeles. Gurley had 114 yards rushing and 81 yards receiving, and he scored a touchdown in his franchise-record-tying 11th consecutive game on a 30-yard pass in the third quarter.

The Rams faced their largest deficit of the remarkable season when they trailed 10-0 early in the second quarter, but they calmly turned it into a 23-13 lead late in the third.

Rodgers answered with two touchdown drives to grab a one-point lead for Green Bay in the fourth quarter, but Goff countered his fallop Cal product and childhood hero after Aaron Donald sacked Rodgers on third down to stop the Packers' next drive.

Both teams had loud contingents of fans at the Coliseum, where Green Bay won the first Super Bowl in 1967. The Packers were greeted by a raucous bunch of California Greshams in Green Bay's first trip to Los Angeles since the NFL returned in 2016.

After Reynolds scored on a 19-yard grab late in the third, the Packers responded with Aaron Jones' 33-yard TD draw run up the middle with 13 seconds left.

## GAME 10

**SEATTLE (AP)** — After a shaky beginning, Russell Wilson got hot in the fourth quarter. Bobby Wagner and Seattle's defense stymied Aaron Rodgers and the Seahawks stayed in the middle of the NFC playoff race.

Wilson threw for 225 yards, and his 15-yard touchdown pass to Ed Dickson with 5:08 left was the difference in the Seahawks' 27-24 victory over the Green Bay Packers on Thursday night.

In a key matchup in the battle for the two NFC wild-card spots, Seattle (5-5) snapped a two-game losing streak by overcoming an early 14-3 deficit. Wilson was inconsistent at times early, but was outstanding in the fourth quarter, capping the winning drive by recognizing a blitz and hitting Dickson quickly for his second TD pass of the night.

Seattle still has not lost three straight games since the middle of the 2017 season, and the Seahawks finally closed out a one-score victory after consecutive close losses to the Chargers and Rams. Seattle was 1-8 in its previous nine games decided by one score.

Rodgers had a huge first half and threw for 332 yards, but the Packers (4-5-1) had just one scoring drive in the second half, helped by a 57-yard strike from Rodgers to Davante Adams. Rodgers threw a pair of touchdown passes in the first half, but never got the ball back after Green Bay punned with 4:20 left. Seattle got first-down runs from Wilson and Mike Davis and finished the game kneeling three times. Chris Carson rushed for 83 yards and a touchdown, overcoming the mistake of fumbling on the first play of the game and setting up Green Bay's opening score. Tyler Lockett had two key receptions late in the fourth quarter and Doug Baldwin had his first TD catch of the season for Seattle.

Rodgers was 21-of-30 passing with 10 of those going to Adams for 166 yards receiving. Backup tight end Robert Tomyan had the first catch of his career on for a 54-yard touchdown to give Green Bay an early 14-3 lead. The Packers led 21-17 at halftime after Aaron Jones caught a 24-yard TD pass from Rodgers in the final minute of the half, but Green Bay's offense was stymied in the second half.

Jones finished with 40 yards rushing after going for a career-high 149 a week ago. Rodgers was sacked five times, four of those in the second half. The Packers gained just 114 yards in the second half, half coming on the one throw from Rodgers to Adams. That pass set up Mason Crosby's 36-yard field goal with 8:23 left to give Green Bay a 24-20 lead.

Wilson had one more answer. Wilson hit Lockett on consecutive plays for 18 yards — to convert a third-down — and 34 yards to the Green Bay 16. Two plays later, facing another third-and-long, Wilson recognized the blitz and hit Dickson quickly over the middle to put Seattle in front.

That proved to be enough. On Green Bay's next drive, Rodgers short-hopped a pass on third-and-2.

Rather than going for it on fourth down, Green Bay punned and never got the ball back.

## **17 Davante Adams, WR, 5th Year, Fresno State**

- Has 31 receiving touchdowns since 2016, No. 2 in the league over that span behind only Steelers WR Antonio Brown (32). Has caught at least one TD pass in 24 games since '16, tops in the NFL over that span.
- Was the only player in the NFL with 70-plus receptions and 10-plus TD catches in both of the last two seasons (2016-17).
- Leads the league with 22 receiving TDs in the red zone since 2016, three more than any other player.
- Posted 237 catches from 2014-17, the fourth most in franchise history by a player in his first four NFL seasons behind WRs Sterling Sharpe (281), Greg Jennings (246) and James Lofton (242).
- Led the team with 74 catches for a team-high 885 yards (12.0 avg.) and 10 TDs in 2017. Was tied for No. 2 in the NFL in TD receptions and was named to his first career Pro Bowl (injury replacement for Falcons WR Julio Jones).

**2018 SEASON:** Has started all 10 games and has posted a team-high 72 receptions for 953 yards (13.2 avg.) and a team-best nine TDs...Is tied for No. 3 in the NFL in receiving TDs and ranks No. 5 in receptions and No. 7 in receiving yards...Leads the league with eight TD catches in the red zone, two more than any other player...Has posted a TD catch in seven games this season, tied for No. 2 in the NFL...His 72 receptions are the most in team history through the first 10 games of the season...Registered five-plus receptions in each of the first eight games this season, the first player in franchise history to accomplish that feat...Has a team-high 12 receptions of 20-plus yards...Has averaged 111.3 receiving yards per game since Week 5, No. 1 in the league over that span.

► **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Started and played 75 of 77 snaps, leading the team with eight receptions for 64 yards (8.0 avg.) and a TD...It marked his third straight game with a TD catch against the Vikings and his career-high fourth consecutive regular-season game overall with a TD reception...Early in the second quarter, caught a quick-out from Rodgers near the 2-yard line, eluding LB Anthony Barr and CB Xavier Rhodes on his way to the end zone for the score.

- With 954 receiving yards and 964 kickoff return yards in 2012, is the only player in NFL history to post 900-plus yards in each category in the same season.

- Registered a franchise-record 10 straight 100-point seasons (2007-16), one of only three players in NFL history to register 100-plus points in 10-plus consecutive seasons (Jason Elam, 16, 1993-2008; Adam Vinatieri, 13, 1996-2008).

- Set a franchise record with 23 consecutive field goals made (2010-11), topping Chris Jacke's mark of 17 straight in 1993.

**2018 SEASON:** Has connected on 20 of 26 field goals and 23 of 25 extra points, ranking No. 9 in the league in scoring with 83 points...Has posted 29 touchbacks on 55 kickoffs (53.7 pct.) and a tackle on special teams.

### **93 Reggie Gilbert, LB, 1st Year, Arizona**

• Originally signed by Green Bay as an undrafted free agent on May 6, 2016. Was on the Packers' practice squad for his entire rookie season in 2016 and the first 15 weeks of the 2017 season before being elevated to the active roster on Dec. 2.

• Played in two games last season and registered three tackles (two solo), a sack, five quarterback pressures and three QB hits...Was tied with LB Kyler Fackrell for the most QB pressures on the team (five) over the final two games.

• Has been selected to five career Pro Bowls (2011, 2013-14, 2016-17) and earned first-team All-Pro honors from *The Associated Press* in 2013.

• Has posted four seasons with 10-plus TD catches, tied for No. 2 in league annals among TEs behind only Patriots TE Rob Gronkowski (five).

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in all 10 games with nine starts and ranks No. 2 on the team with 34 receptions for 452 yards (13.3 avg.) and two TDs...Among TEs, ranks No. 8 in the league in receiving yards and No. 6 in yards per catch.

• Started a career-high 16 games for the Los Angeles Rams in 2016 and posted a career-best 50 receptions for 499 yards (10.0 avg.) and two TDs, becoming just the fifth tight end in franchise history to register 50-plus catches in a season.

• Posted 17 TD catches during his six seasons with the Rams, the second most by a TE in franchise history behind only Damone Johnson (18, 1986-92).

• Ranked No. 1 among NFL tight ends with an average of 16.2 yards per catch in 2009, the top mark by an NFL tight end (min. 32 rec.) since Jaguars TE Ernest Wilford registered a 16.6-yard average in 2005.

• Helped block for the top four single-season rushing-yardage totals in franchise history (2006-07, 2010, 2017). In 2017, helped the Jaguars lead the league in rushing (141.4 ypg) for the first time in franchise history.

• Started every game in 2014, becoming the first rookie center to open every game for the Packers since the league went to a 16-game schedule in 1978.

• Was named to the PFWA's All-Rookie team in '14, the first Green Bay center to be honored since its inception in 1974.

**2018 SEASON:** Has started all 10 games at C and has played every offensive snap...Has helped the Packers rank No. 2 in the NFL in yards per carry (5.08), No. 1 in rushing first-down percentage (30.4), No. 8 in total offense (398.8 ypg) and No. 7 in net passing yards (290.0 ypg).

►**Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started at C and played all 60 snaps, helping to protect QB Aaron Rodgers as he connected on 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 286 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 130.7 passer rating...Part of a line that did not allow a sack in the second half.

- Has 11 sacks in 15 career playoff games, the most in franchise postseason history (since 1982) and tied for No. 5 in NFL playoff history.
- Joined Carolina Panthers DE Julius Peppers (84 and seven) as the only players in the NFL with 80-plus sacks (80) and five-plus interceptions (six) from 2009-17.
- Named first-team All-Pro by *The Associated Press* in 2010, the first Green Bay LB to earn that honor since Tim Harris in 1989. Finished second to Pittsburgh safety Troy Polamalu in the AP's Defensive Player of the Year voting in 2010.

- Has been named the NFL's Most Valuable Player by *The Associated Press* twice in his career (2011, 2014), one of only eight players in league history to win the award multiple times.
- Is the only quarterback in league history to record a 100-plus passer rating in six consecutive seasons (2009-14), with no other QB doing so in more than four straight seasons. Has posted a 100-plus rating in seven seasons (2009-14, 2016), tied with Saints QB Drew Brees for the most in NFL history.
- Is one of only three QBs in NFL annals with 40,000-plus passing yards and 2,500-plus rushing yards (Fran Tarkenton, John Elway).
- Is the lone QB in NFL history to throw 40-plus TD passes with seven or fewer INTs in a season, having done it twice in his career (45/6 in 2011, 40/7 in 2016).
- In 152 career regular-season starts (since 2008), has posted 55 games with 300-plus passing yards (tied for No. 4 in the NFL over that span), 91 without an interception (No. 1, min. 15 attempts) and 84 with a 100-plus passer rating (No. 2).
- Has been selected to the Pro Bowl in six of the last nine seasons (2009, 2011-12, 2014-16).
- In the franchise record books, holds seven of the top eight single-season marks for passer rating (2009-14, 2016), four of the top six for passing TDs (2011-12, 2014, 2016), six of the top seven for completion percentage (2010-14, 2016) and four of the top six for passing yards (2009, 2011, 2014, 2016).

**2018 SEASON:** Has started all 10 games and has completed 238 of 385 passes (61.8 percent) for 3,073 yards and 19 TDs with one INT for a 102.2 passer rating...Ranks No. 5 in the league in passing yards, No. 1 in interception percentage (0.3) and No. 5 in passing attempts...His 3,073 passing yards are the second most in team history through the first 10 games behind only his 3,168 yards in 2011...Leads the league with nine completions of 50-plus yards and 14 completions of 40-plus yards...Has posted a 110.1 passer rating on third down this season, good for No. 6 in the league...Ranks No. 1 in the league with 895 yards passing on third down...Is tied for No. 1 in the NFL (Drew Brees) with nine zero-INT games (min. 15 att.) this season...Joins Brees (25/1) as the only QBs in the league this season with 15-plus TDs and one/zero INT...Has added 148 rushing yards on 29 carries (5.1 avg.)...Has rushed for 12 first downs on his 29 carries, a 41.4 percentage that ranks No. 4 in the NFL among players with 25-plus attempts...Has posted five runs of 10-plus yards, good for No. 3 on the team.

Chicago (Sept. 9):** Completed 20 of 30 passes (66.7 percent) for 286 yards and three TDs with no INTs for a 130.7 passer rating as he led the Packers to the second-largest comeback win in Lambeau Field history after Green Bay trailed 20-0 late in the third quarter...It marked the first time in team annals that the Packers won a game after trailing by 17-plus points entering the fourth quarter...It marked his sixth regular-season game since 2008 with a 125-plus rating against the Bears, the most in the league over that span with no other QB posting more than one 125-plus game against Chicago...With just over nine minutes remaining in the second quarter, sustained a knee injury when he was sacked by DE Roy Robertson-Harris at the Green Bay 27...Was sidelined for the final

- Selected to an All-American team in three of his four seasons at Alabama, earning first-team honors in 2014 and second-team honors in '16 and '17.
- Voted first-team All-Southeastern Conference by the coaches three times (2014, 2016-17).

• Signed with the Packers as a free agent on Sept. 3 after spending the off-season and preseason with the San Francisco 49ers. Played in 46 games with 16 starts from 2014-17 and registered 115 total tackles (68 solo), two sacks, an interception he returned 59 yards for a touchdown, five forced fumbles, a fumble recovery and 14 special teams tackles.

• Was originally drafted by the Seattle Seahawks in the fifth round (No. 154 overall) of the 2012 NFL Draft out of the University of Idaho. Toomer spent a few weeks of his rookie season on Seattle's practice.

• Appeared in one game for the Dallas Cowboys and seven games for the St. Louis Rams in 2014. Played in 10 games for the Oakland Raiders in 2015 and appeared in 28 contests with 16 starts for the San Diego/Los Angeles Chargers in 2016-17.

**2018 SEASON:** Has appeared in six games, seeing time on defense and special teams...Has posted three tackles (two solo) on defense and two tackles on special teams...Dressed, but did not play, in two contests and was inactive for two games.

►**Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Played 19 snaps on special teams in his Green Bay debut.

►**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Appeared on seven plays on defense and 22 on special teams...Recorded three tackles (two solo) on defense and a tackle on special teams.

• Set the school single-season record with 879 yards on a team-high 53 receptions (16.6 avg.) with six touchdowns for the Bulls as a senior in

2017.

• Ranks No. 10 in school history for career receiving yards (1,294) and No. 6 in TD catches (11) despite only playing two seasons for the Bulls.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in all 10 games with seven starts and has posted 24 catches for 410 yards (17.1 avg.) and two TDs...Ranks No. 7 in the NFL in yards per catch...Of his 24 receptions, seven have been for 20-plus yards, the second most on the team behind only WR Davante Adams (12)...Has three receptions of 40-plus yards, No. 2 on the team behind only Adams (five)...Is tied for No. 2 in franchise history among rookies with two 100-yard receiving games on the season, trailing only Billy Howton (six in 1952)...Has one kickoff return for 21 yards...Is tied for No. 2 on the team with two tackles on special teams.

►**Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Played two snaps on offense and 11 on special teams in his NFL debut...Returned one kickoff for 21 yards.

►**Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Appeared on six plays on offense and seven on special teams...Posted his first NFL reception, hauling in a 3-yard pass near the sideline from QB Aaron Rodgers in the first quarter.

►**At Washington (Sept. 23):** Played 12 snaps on offense and 10 on special teams...Registered a career-high two tackles on special teams, bringing down CB Greg Stroman at the Washington 17 on a kickoff return in the third quarter and Stroman again in the fourth quarter on a punt return...Downed a 41-yard JK Scott punt at the Washington 2-yard line midway through the second quarter.

►**Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30):** Made his first career start, opening as the third WR with Randall Cobb (hamstring) sidelined...Played a career-high 54 snaps and posted a career-long 38-yard reception...With just over four minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, beat CB Ryan Lewis down the right sideline to catch a deep pass from Rodgers to the Buffalo 28, helping to set up a 52-yard Mason Crosby field goal.

►**At Detroit (Oct. 7):** Started for the second straight week with Cobb (hamstring) and WR Geronimo Allison (concussion/hamstring) sidelined, appearing on 77 of 81 plays and posting a career-high seven receptions for 68 yards (9.7 avg.) and a TD...Early in the third quarter, posted his first TD catch as a pro, hauling in a 3-yard TD pass as he found himself wide open in the end zone with two defenders going to cover Adams.

►**Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15):** Started his third straight game and appeared on 66 of 71 snaps...Posted a career-high 103 receiving yards on just three catches (34.3 avg.), becoming just the sixth Green Bay rookie since 1950 to register 100-plus receiving yards in a game on three or fewer catches (Howton, Max McGee, James Lofton, Greg Jennings, James Jones)...On the Packers' first play from scrimmage, found himself wide open down the left sideline, hauling in a pass from Rodgers near midfield and taking it down the sideline to the San Francisco 17...Early in the third quarter, made an out-and-up move and then came back on the ball to make a leaping 30-yard catch near the sideline with S Jaquiski Tarrt covering him.

►**At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28):** Started his fourth consecutive game and played 31 snaps, catching two passes for 45 yards (22.5 avg.) and a TD...With the Packers trailing, 26-20, midway through the fourth quarter, got inside on CB Troy Hill and caught a deep pass from Rodgers for a 40-yard TD, outrunning S Lamaricus Joyner after making the catch on his way to the end zone.

►**At New England (Nov. 4):** Made his fifth straight start, appearing on 60 of 74 snaps and leading the team with 101 yards receiving on three catches (33.7 avg.), with all three grabs coming in the second half...Became the first Packer since McGee in 1959 to register two 100-yard receiving games on three or fewer catches in a season and is only the third NFL player to accomplish that feat since the 1970 AFL-NFL merger (Rams WR Drew Hill, 1980; Patriots WR Stanley Morgan, 1978, 1980, 1984)...All three of his receptions were for 20-plus yards, bringing his streak to four straight catches of 20-plus yards...On the third play of the second half, beat CB Jason McCourty on a post for a 51-yard gain to the New England 21 on third-and-6...Late in the third quarter, made an out-and-up move before making a leaping 24-yard reception down the right sideline on third down over CB J.C. Jackson...On the next play, came across the field to beat

Jones for a 26-yard grab to the New England 34.

► **Vs. Miami (Nov. 11):** Started for the sixth straight game and led the team with six receptions for 44 yards (7.3 avg.), with three of the catches picking up first downs...Made a pair of 11-yard receptions on back-to-back plays late in the first half.

► **At Seattle (Nov. 15):** Started and played 48 snaps, posting an 8-yard reception.

### **96 Muhammad Wilkerson, DL, 8th Year, Temple**

- The former Pro Bowler (2015) and second-team All-Pro member (*The Associated Press* in 2013 and 2015) joins the Packers after spending the first seven seasons of his career with the N.Y. Jets, who selected him in the first round (No. 30 overall) of the 2011 NFL Draft.

- Registered three-plus sacks and at least one forced fumble in six different seasons, tied for the most among defensive linemen since 2011.

- From 2011-17, was part of a defense that ranked No. 4 in the league over that span in opponent rushing average (3.84). Helped the Jets rank No. 6 in the league (103.7 ypg) in run defense from 2011-17.

- Has registered 50-plus tackles in each of his seven seasons, including 90-plus tackles twice (90 in 2012 and 91 in 2013).

**2018 SEASON:** Started the first three games and posted six tackles (four solo), a tackle for a loss and two QB hits...Was placed on injured reserve (ankle) on Sept. 29.

► **Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started and played 43 snaps in his Green Bay debut, finishing with four tackles (three solo), a tackle for a loss and a QB hit.

► **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Started and played 49 snaps, posting a solo tackle and a QB hit...Part of a line that helped limit the Vikings to just 68 yards on 18 carries (3.8 avg.).

► **At Washington (Sept. 23):** Started and played 23 snaps, recording an assisted tackle, but was carted off the field after sustaining an ankle injury with just over two minutes remaining in the first half.

### **30 Jamaal Williams, RB, 2nd Year, Brigham Young**

- Rushed for a team-high 556 yards last season, the fourth most by a Green Bay rookie in team history, and four TDs on 153 carries (3.6 avg.).

- Added 262 receiving yards and two TDs on 25 catches (10.5 avg.), the most receiving yards by a Green Bay rookie running back since Keith Woodside totaled 352 yards in 1988.

- Became the first rookie in team history to register a rushing TD/receiving TD in two games (Week 12 at Pittsburgh, Week 14 at Cleveland).

- After moving into the starting lineup in Week 11, posted 672 yards from scrimmage over that span (No. 11 in the NFL) and 455 rushing yards (No. 10). Registered 100-plus yards from scrimmage in four of the final six games.

**2018 SEASON:** Has played in all 10 games with five starts and ranks No. 2 on the team with 275 rushing yards and a TD on 74 carries (3.7 avg.)... Also has 10 receptions for 77 yards (7.7 avg.).

► **Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started and led the team with 47 rushing yards on 15 carries (3.1 avg.)...Had a key blitz pickup on QB Aaron Rodgers' 51-yard completion to WR Davante Adams in the fourth quarter, stuffing LB Danny Trevathan as he came up the middle to give Rodgers a clean look on the big gain.

► **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Started and rushed for a team-high 59 yards on 16 carries (3.7 avg.), picking up a career-high six first downs... Also caught three passes for 12 yards (4.0 avg.).

► **At Washington (Sept. 23):** Started and rushed for 29 yards on five carries (5.8 avg.) with two receptions for 16 yards (8.0 avg.).

► **Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30):** Started and posted 27 rushing yards on 11 carries (2.5 avg.).

► **At Detroit (Oct. 7):** Started and rushed for 33 yards on six attempts (5.5 avg.) with two receptions for 19 yards (9.5 avg.)...Early in the third quarter, posted his first career two-point conversion, freeing himself from LB Jarrad Davis to haul in a pass from QB Aaron Rodgers in the end zone.

► **Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15):** Posted 29 rushing yards on six carries

(4.8 avg.) along with a 10-yard reception.

► **At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28):** Carried the ball four times for 9 yards (2.3 avg.) and scored his first TD of the season on a 1-yard run in the first quarter.

► **At New England (Nov. 4):** Posted 34 rushing yards on seven carries (4.9 avg.) and added two receptions for 20 yards (10.0 avg.)...Made a 16-yard reception down the sideline from a scrambling Rodgers midway through the second quarter.

► **Vs. Miami (Nov. 11):** Carried the ball three times for 3 yards (1.0 avg.).

► **At Seattle (Nov. 15):** Had a 5-yard run in four snaps of action.

### **38 Tramon Williams, CB/S, 12th Year, Louisiana Tech**

- Has 32 career interceptions, tied for No. 4 among active NFL players. Is the only active player in the NFL to have at least one interception in each of the last 11 seasons (2007-17).

- Returns to the Packers after spending the last three seasons with the Cleveland Browns (2015-16) and Arizona Cardinals (2017). The former undrafted free agent and practice-squad player appeared in 127 regular-season games for the Packers from 2007-14.

- Has three career TDs, including INT returns of 43 yards (2011) and 70 yards (2010 postseason) and a 94-yard punt return (2007).

- Ranked No. 1 in the NFL with a combined nine interceptions in 2010 (six in regular season, three in postseason) and was chosen for the Pro Bowl as an injury replacement.

- Was the only undrafted free agent in the NFL to post four-plus INTs each season from 2008-11. Was tied for No. 4 in the NFL with 19 INTs over that span.

**2018 SEASON:** Has started all 10 games (seven at CB, three at S) and has posted 44 tackles (33 solo), a fumble recovery and a pass defended... Has returned nine punts for 60 yards (6.7 avg.).

► **Vs. Chicago (Sept. 9):** Started and played all 70 snaps, one of five Green Bay defenders to do so...Finished third on the team with seven tackles (five solo).

► **Vs. Minnesota (Sept. 16):** Started and was one of four Green Bay defensive players to appear on all 73 snaps...Finished with six tackles (five solo).

► **At Washington (Sept. 23):** Started and played 59 of 61 snaps, posting two tackles (one solo).

► **Vs. Buffalo (Sept. 30):** Played all 58 snaps, one of four players on Green Bay's defense to do so, and recorded four tackles (all solo) and a pass defended...With WR Randall Cobb (hamstring) sidelined, handled punt-return duties, matching his career high with five returns for 20 yards (4.0 avg.).

► **At Detroit (Oct. 7):** Started and played 61 of 62 snaps, posting three tackles (all solo)...Had one punt return for 2 yards.

► **Vs. San Francisco (Oct. 15):** Started and played all 57 snaps, finishing with four tackles (three solo)...Also had one punt return for 6 yards.

► **At L.A. Rams (Oct. 28):** Started and played all 78 snaps, posting four tackles (one solo)...Returned one punt on the afternoon for 13 yards.

► **At New England (Nov. 4):** Made the third start of his career at safety (two starts with Cleveland in 2016) and was one of two defensive players to play all 71 snaps for Green Bay...Registered six tackles (five solo).

► **Vs. Miami (Nov. 11):** Started at safety for the second straight game and posted a solo tackle...Added a 19-yard punt return.

► **At Seattle (Nov. 15):** Started at safety for the third straight game, appearing on 69 of 70 snaps and posting seven tackles (five solo) and a fumble recovery...On Seattle's first play from scrimmage, recovered a RB Chris Carson fumble that was forced by LB Clay Matthews, diving on the ball at the Seattle 29 to help set up a Green Bay TD.
